WHEREAS by The *Phylloxera Vine Disease Act 1880* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might by order from time to time prohibit or restrict the importation into or the removal in Victoria of any Vines, or Vine Cuttings, or Grapes, either generally or from any place or places to be named in such order, and every such order might alter or revoke; and while any such order should be in force all vines or vine cuttings or grapes imported or brought into Victoria contrary to the tenor of such order should be forfeited, and should be destroyed or otherwise disposed of as the Minister might direct: And whereas, by an Order bearing date the twenty-seventh day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one the importation into Victoria, from all countries outside Australasia, of Grape Vines and Grape Vine Cuttings was prohibited: And whereas the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, it is expedient to extend the prohibition: Now therefore doth hereby revoke the said Order bearing date the twenty-seventh day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and with the advice aforesaid, doth prohibit the importation into Victoria of Grape Vines, Grape Vine Cuttings, and Grapes from all countries outside Australasia, unless the Grape Vines, Grape Vine Cuttings, and Grapes be of the varieties which are known to be proof against the disease, *Phylloxera Vastatrix*, in which case the certificate of an inspector of vineyards to the effect that they are exempt from such disease shall be obtained prior to landing of such exempted Grape Vines, Grape Vine Cuttings, and Grapes.

And the Honorable James Howlin Graves, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Trade and Customs for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

No. 506), § 19, 38, and 49, it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition by a number of the ratepayers of the Shire of Wyndham therein described (notices of which said petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act): Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the Shire of Wyndham the portion of the shire described in such petition, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the Parwan Riding of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby adjust the boundaries of the said Shire of Bacchus Marsh hereby enlarged and of the Parwan Riding thereof, and of the said Shire of Wyndham as hereby reduced and of the North Riding thereof, in manner following, that is to say:—

BACCHUS MARSH ENLARGED AND REDEFINED.

Commencing at the junction of the Myrniong Creek and the Werribee River; thence northerly by the Myrniong Creek to the most northern part of portion 54, parish of Blackwood; thence by a direct line north to the northern boundary of the county of Bourke; thence easterly by the said boundary to a point in the boundary due south of the west southerly to the township of Woodend; thence by a direct line southerly to the west boundary of the parish of Bullengarook; thence south by the said west boundary of the said parish to its south-west angle; thence east

The Public Works Statute 1865, section 128.—"It shall be lawful for any officer or agent of the board or company, and all persons called by him to his assistance, to seize and detain any person who shall have committed any offence against the provisions of this part of this Act or of the bye-laws made under the authority of this Act, and whose name and residence shall be unknown to such officer or agent, and give him in charge to a police constable who shall convey him with all convenient despatch before some justice without any warrant or other authority than this Act; and such justice shall proceed with all convenient despatch to the hearing and determining of the complaint against such offender."

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby authorize and appoint the persons named in the schedule hereto annexed as its agents and officers for the purpose of carrying into effect (so far as applicable to each respective case) the 128th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, and also at any time hereafter to lay any information or complaint before any justice against any person for any offence against the provisions of Part III. of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, or of any bye-law made or to be made under the authority of such Act; and to summon such person before any justice or justices for such offence, or to charge him or her with such offence.

REGULATIONS FOR HIRING OF TRUCKS FOR LIVE STOCK.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby make the following Bye-law for Regulating the Hiring of Trucks for the Conveyance of Live Stock, and fixing the charges relating thereto, that is to say:—

1. All orders for live stock per goods trains to be made to the General Traffic Manager on the printed form provided for that No. 5.—JANUARY 20, 1882.—2.

purpose. Those sent by telegram, letter, or through a station-master, to be subject to the same conditions as if made on the printed form.

2. Every order must be accompanied with a deposit of Twenty shillings for each truck, which deposit will be forfeited in case the conditions are not complied with. Recognized agents can lodge a sufficient sum to cover the extent of their orders in hand at any one time.

3. No order can be accepted or taken till within fourteen days of the date on which the stock is to be conveyed.

4. An order once lodged and accepted may be withdrawn, or number of trucks reduced, seven clear days before date of conveyance, by paying forfeit of Twenty shillings a truck.

5. No order can be withdrawn or reduced within seven days of date of conveyance, except on payment of full freight of trucks from station to station shown on the order.

6. The loading or receiving stations can only be altered by special sanction of the General Traffic Manager, to remove any unforeseen difficulties that may arise, up to Four p.m. on the Wednesday immediately preceding the Monday or Tuesday on which the stock is to be carried.

7. All trucks ordered under 14 in one order, and not used on the date and at the station specified in the order, will be charged for as if used. In orders of 14 trucks and upwards, a margin of one truck to every 14 will be allowed.

8. Trucks must be loaded and despatched on trains, to be specified at the General Traffic Manager's Office on Friday morning, for the following Monday and Tuesday.

9. Sundays are included in the number of days to be reckoned.

ROADS PROCLAIMED UNDER "THE LAND ACT 1869."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor might from time to time by a notice in the *Government Gazette* proclaim as a street or road or as a town or village any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such town or village should be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road should have been proclaimed should be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim as roads the portions of Crown lands in the several parishes mentioned in the schedule hereto annexed, such roads being shown by pink tint on plans which are deposited

GRANTS FOR AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES AND FOR PARKS AND GARDENS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named Grants-in-aid, 1881-2, viz.:-

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

Regulations for the Distribution of the Sum of Twelve thousand pounds (£12,000), granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies, 1881-2.

1. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 5th February 1882, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.

2. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement so verified, the Minister of Lands and Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to two-thirds of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to) on condition that this sum do not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

3. Of the whole grant (£12,000), a sum not exceeding Eleven thousand five hundred and fifty pounds shall be so divided; and if the sums claimable be in excess of this amount they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. A sum not exceeding Four hundred and forty-eight pounds shall be paid to the Ballarat Agricultural and Pastoral Society towards the expenses of its spring show, held on the 27th and 28th October 1881, under the patronage of the Department of Agriculture.

5. No society located within twenty miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such society as hereinbefore specified amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least.

Instructions.

1. The blank spaces in the declaration form E, for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations, between the 1st January 1881 and the 31st December 1881, must be filled up in words as well as in figures, and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account is then to be prepared by making the Government Dr. for two-thirds of the amount declared to have been awarded and paid in prizes, if the members' subscriptions and private donations were not less than two-thirds. If the members' subscriptions and private donations were, however, less than two-thirds of the amount awarded and paid in prizes, the amount of the claim must be made equal to the amount of the members' subscriptions and private donations.

3. The account must be signed by the treasurer and be countersigned by the president, or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management. It should then be returned to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne, with the declaration and statements appended.

[It may expedite the payment of the money to fill in at the top of the account the name of the nearest pay office in the space left blank for the purpose. It is also necessary to bear in mind that, if that space should not be filled up, the account will be payable at Melbourne only. A form of order on the Treasury deputing another person to draw the amount granted is appended in case it may be wanted.]

4. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid, unless such cups have been finally awarded.

NOTE.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

Regulations in connection with the vote of Eight thousand pounds (£8,000) for Fencing and Improving Public Parks and Gardens under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c.

1. A sum not exceeding Ten shillings shall be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such

body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve in such park or garden between 1st January 1881 and 31st December 1881, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 27th February 1882. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st of January 1881 and 31st December 1881; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January 1881.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1881 (vide form A), and a sum equal to one-half of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the vote they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. In every case in which a claim sent in is deemed unsatisfactory, an officer of the department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused, the claim shall be disallowed.

5. Moneys expended in street planting must not be included in any claim upon the vote.

6. The foregoing shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melbourne, nor to the Botanical Garden of Geelong.

SHIRE OF TRARALGON.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF LOY YANG COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 1st April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Traralgon, having drafted the following Regulations for management of the Loy Yang Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle.

A farmer, having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock upon the common shall be, as follow:—

For every horse	7/- per annum
For every head of other large cattle	4/- "
For every sheep or goat	2/- "

such fees shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year.

3. The full fee shall be payable in respect of all licenses applied for and issued during the currency of a term; but in case of the removal from the common of any stock legally depasturing thereon, an equivalent number will be allowed to be placed on the common in their stead for the unexpired term of the license: Provided that the licensee deliver to the herdsman a statement in writing of the number and description of the substituted stock.

4. The progeny of stock depasturing on the common shall be free from the payment of the prescribed fees till they are eight months old.

5. All sheep depasturing on the common must be tended by, and be in charge of, a shepherd.

6. Before any stock are turned out upon the common they shall be duly registered, and given into the hands of the herdsman, who will be in attendance at the mustering yards.

7. No stock will be allowed to be turned out on the common unless the same are marked with the proper brands of the person registering such stock, and with the common brand in pitch or tar.

8. All persons depasturing stock on the common shall assist at the bi-annual mustering of such stock, or in default pay 6d. for every head they may have turned out on the common.

9. The license of any person turning out on the common more stock than he has registered will be liable, at the discretion of the managers, to cancellation.

10. No entire horse or bull over six months old will be allowed on the common, without the consent in writing of the managers.

11. No person shall remove stock from the common without first applying to the herdsman.

12. All stock suspected of being diseased shall be removed from the common by the owners within twenty-four hours after notice, in writing, to do so has been served upon them; and should they fail to comply with the requirements of such notice, the managers may destroy such stock at the expense of the owner or owners thereof.

13. The managers will not be responsible for the loss of or injury to any stock depasturing on the common.

14. All stock placed on the common must be the *bonâ fide* property of the persons registering the same.

15. Any person having the right of commonage, or the managers of any neighboring common, may register with the herdsman, in a book to be kept for the purpose, the description and brands of any missing stock which, if found on the common, shall not be impounded until notice has been given to the owner or person registering the same, who shall be required to remove such stock within fourteen days from the date of such notice, otherwise they shall be liable to be impounded.

16. Dead stock on the common, if not removed within twelve hours after notice in writing, has been given to the owner thereof, may be removed at his expense.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations, shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.

SHIRE OF ST. ARNAUD:

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE RICH AVON EAST COMMON.
IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the first day of April 1879, the

Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, having drafted the following regulations for management of the Rich Avon East Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The scale of fees payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of March and the first day of September, in every year, for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follows:—

For every head of large cattle	5s. per annum
" " of small cattle	2s. "
" pig	6s. "

Progeny of horned cattle and horses under six months old, if running with their mothers, Free.

3. Every person depasturing stock on the common must be the *bonâ fide* owner of such stock.

4. Bulls or entire horses over the age of nine months will not be allowed on the common without the written sanction of the managers.

5. Sheep will be allowed to depasture on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for that purpose.

6. The herdsman of the common shall be in attendance at a place to be named on the seven days immediately preceding the first day of each half-year, for the purpose of registering stock, and due notice of such attendance, and the time and place thereof, shall be given by the managers.

7. All persons taking stock to depasture on the common shall deliver them into the charge of the herdsman at the time and place appointed as aforesaid, together with a written statement of the number and brands of such stock; and the managers shall, on receiving the fees payable on such stock, give a receipt for the same, and the herdsman shall forthwith, with the assistance of the owner or the person in charge, brand such stock in a conspicuous place with the common brand, which shall be of pitch or tar, and such brand shall be renewed whenever necessary, so as to be plainly legible during the whole period such stock are depasturing on the common.

8. No stock duly registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the common unless notice of intention to remove be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the stock so removed.

9. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of any stock from the common, save as provided in clause 10.

10. The herdsman shall, on any stock straying from the common, or being removed therefrom without the owner's consent, notify the owner thereof within ten days, and should the herdsman fail or neglect to give notice to the owner within that time the herdsman shall, if such stock be lost, be held responsible for the loss which shall be computed at the rate of Two pounds sterling per head for horses, and Two pounds sterling per head for horned cattle, and shall be deducted from the remuneration payable to the herdsman.

11. All stock on which the prescribed fees shall not have been paid within ten days after the date for renewal of licenses will be liable to be impounded.

12. All dead carcasses found on the common which the owner or owners thereof may refuse or neglect to remove, after receiving twenty-four hours' notice, in writing, from the managers or herdsman, shall be removed, by burning or otherwise, at the expense of such owner or owners.

13. The herdsman shall report immediately to the managers the indication of any contagious disease in any stock on the common, and shall give notice, in writing, to the owner of such stock to remove the same. The managers shall at once take precautionary measures to remove stock so diseased from the common, but they shall not be responsible for any loss the owners of such stock may sustain.

14. The herdsman shall take the necessary steps for the effectual destruction of thistles growing on the common, the expense of such destruction to be defrayed out of the common fund, provided that express authority for such expenditure be first obtained from the managers.

15. Whenever in these regulations any act or thing is required to be done by the managers, it shall be considered to be well and truly done if done by any two or more of them duly appointed from time to time to act on their behalf.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations, shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

SHIRE OF ST. ARNAUD.—"TRAINOR'S LAGOON RESERVE."

Regulations fixing the amount to be paid by persons using or carrying away water from that portion comprising forty acres of the reserve for Camping and affording access to Water, in the parish of Banyena, known as "Trainor's Lagoon Reserve," and for the care, management, and protection of the said reserve.

WHEREAS, by a regulation of the Board of Land and Works, made on the 7th day of December 1881, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud was duly appointed a Committee of Management of that portion, comprising Forty acres, of the land temporarily reserved by Order of the 10th January 1876, as a site for Camping and affording access to Water, in the parish of Banyena, hereinafter styled "Trainor's Lagoon Reserve": Now therefore the said Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, having framed the following regulations for the care, management, and protection of the said reserve, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such board in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

Regulations.

1. Every person using or carrying away water from "Trainor's Lagoon Reserve" shall pay therefor to any person duly appointed by the committee of management in that behalf, and duly authorized to demand the same, the fees hereinafter specified:—

- i. For one hogshead of water taken away in any one day—Sixpence.
- ii. For every hogshead of water after the first hogshead taken away in any one day—One shilling.
- iii. For each head of cattle brought to water at any one time—Threepence.

2. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in the said reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals, without the written authority of the committee of management, or their officer duly appointed.

3. No person shall climb, or jump over, or break, or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the said reserve, or break or otherwise damage the pumps and troughs attached thereto.

The Bishop, or such person as aforesaid, to have power to remove trustees and to appoint new trustees and to fill up all vacancies occurring in trusteeship. The land, until otherwise disposed of, to be held for the purposes for which it was granted or reserved by the Crown.

Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.—To such purposes of the Church of England in the Diocese of Melbourne as may be agreed upon by (1) the Bishop, or during his absence from his See, or during the vacancy thereof, by the person for the time being administering the affairs of the Diocese, (2) the trustees, and (3) the minister entitled to officiate in or occupy any building upon the land.
