SIR,—With reference to my Circular Despatch of the 20th of January last, I have the honor to transmit to you, for information in the Colony under your Government, copies of Revised Regulations governing the examination and entry of Naval Cadets, which will come into effect for the examinations taking place after June next.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING NAVAL CADETS.

(For the Information of Candidates.—To take effect after June 1882.)

1. Appointments to naval cadetships will be made by limited competition, with the undermentioned exceptions:—

Four cadetships given annually to sons of gentlemen in the colonies, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

Service cadetships, the total number of which is not to exceed five in any one year. Service cadets will be selected by the Board of Admiralty from (a) sons of officers of the army, navy, or marines who have been killed in action, or who have been lost at sea on active service, or killed on duty, or who have died of wounds received in action or injuries received on duty within six months from the date of such action or injury, (b) sons of officers of the navy who have performed long or distinguished service, and who hold or have held rank or relative rank on the Active List not lower than that of commander; not more than two such service cadets to be nominated annually.

Applications for service cadetships should be addressed to the Military Secretary, Horse Guards, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the army; to the Secretary of the Admiralty, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the navy or marines; and to the Military Secretary, India Office, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Indian Army.

Colonial and service cadets will be entered on passing the test examination specified in paragraph 8, and will in all other respects be subject to these regulations.

The examination of candidates nominated to compete, and also of service cadets, will be conducted by the Civil Service Commissioners. A fee of Ten shillings will be required from each candidate.

2. Except in special circumstances not more than one-third of the number of candidates actually presenting themselves before the Civil Service Commissioners will be entered.

3. Nominations for naval cadetships will take place half-yearly as soon as convenient after the report of the last examination has been received.

4. Examinations of the young gentlemen who have obtained nominations will be held in London, and will commence on the second Wednesday in June and the last Wednesday in November in each year, and the appointments will date from the 15th July and 15th January following respectively.

5. No candidate will be eligible for examination in June whose age will not be within the following limits on the 15th July following, viz., not less than twelve nor more than thirteen and a half years of age, nor in November whose age will not be within those limits on the 15th January following.

6. Every candidate must be in good health, and free from any physical defect of body, impediment of speech, defect of sight or hearing, and also from any predisposition to constitutional or hereditary disease or weakness of any kind, and in all respects well developed and active in proportion to his age. Before being examined by the Civil Service Commissioners he will be required to pass the medical examination according to the prescribed regulations, and must have been found physically fit for the navy; rejection at such examination will finally exclude him from the navy.

7. The candidate will be required to produce (1) a certificate of the date of his birth; or a declaration thereof made before a magistrate; (2) a certificate of good conduct from the masters of the school or schools at which he may have been educated during the two previous years, or, if educated at home, from his tutor or the clergyman of the parish in which he resides; and (3) a certificate of good health.

8. The candidates will be tested by examination in the following subjects:—

Candidates will be further examined in any two of the following subjects they may select:—

The final order of merit will be determined by the sum of the marks obtained in the test, as well as in the further examination.

In arithmetic the candidate will be required to obtain five-tenths, and in each of the other subjects of the test examination four-tenths of the marks allotted thereto. In English the candidate must obtain four-tenths of the marks allotted for each of the two subdivisions of the subject.

9. Colonial and service cadets will be appointed on passing the test examination; they must, however, obtain 600 marks in the aggregate, as well as the proportion of marks in arithmetic and other subjects required from the candidates who compete.

10. A candidate who passes the test examination, but does not succeed in the competition, will be entitled to compete at the next examination, provided he is within the regulations as to limits of age at that time. No candidate will be allowed to compete more than twice. A candidate who fails to pass the test will not be entitled to another trial, but he will be allowed to compete at the next examination if he receives a fresh nomination and is still within the limits of age.

11. A candidate who, owing to illness, fails to appear at the examination for which he has obtained his nomination may receive a second nomination, provided he is still within the limits of age.

12. For all cadets entered under these regulations, the payment will be at the rate of £70 per annum for the period in the *Britannia*, to be paid half-yearly in advance to the Accountant-General of the Navy. But the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty reserve the power of selecting from among the cadets entered at each half-yearly examination a number, not to exceed 10, being sons of officers of the navy, army, or marines, or of civil officers under the board of admiralty, with respect to whom the annual payment will be £40 only. In this selection their Lordships will have regard solely to the pecuniary circumstances of the cadets.

13. The period of training on board the *Britannia* will be four terms; there will be two terms in each year. The first term of each year will be from February to July, the second from September to December.

The vacations will be five weeks at Christmas, two weeks at Easter, and six weeks at Midsummer.

14. There will be examinations in seamanship and study at the end of each term.

Cadets who pass unsatisfactory examinations, or who are reported for unsatisfactory conduct, will be "warned," and they will be liable to be discharged at the end of the following or any subsequent term, should they again be reported as failing to attain the proper number of marks at the examinations, or for unsatisfactory conduct.

If a cadet is reported for unsatisfactory conduct during his final term he will be discharged without being allowed to present himself at the examination for passing out of the *Britannia*.

Any cadet who shall appear to their Lordships for any reason to be unfit for the service will be removed from the *Britannia*.

15. It is to be distinctly understood that the period of training on board the *Britannia* is a time of probation, and the parent or guardian of every cadet will be required to sign a declaration (on the admission of the cadet to the *Britannia*) to the effect that he shall be immediately withdrawn on the receipt of an official intimation of his being considered unfit for the navy.

16. Cadets will, on passing out of the *Britannia*, rank according to the amount of sea time they obtain at their final examination, and those who obtain equal amounts of sea time will rank in the order of merit in which they pass out of the *Britannia*.

17. The parent or guardian of every cadet will be required to provide outfit under the regulations in force.

18. Pay and pocket-money will not be allowed by Government to cadets entered in and after June 1881.

The births of 860 children, viz., 430 boys and 430 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of May. In the month of April, 739 births were registered, or 121 less than in the month under review. The births were 95 above the average of the previous seven years, but only 25 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in May numbered 510, viz., 290 of males and 220 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 350. The deaths were fewer than in April by 16, but above the average of May during the previous ten years by 91. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of that month in those ten years by only 37.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.02, and of deaths registered 1.79.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 69.0° on the 4th, and the lowest was 38.0° on the 20th. The mean temperature of the month (54.3°) was nearly two degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (26.6°) took place on the 20th, viz., from a maximum of 64.6° to a minimum of 38.0°. The least range (3.3°) was on the 30th, viz., from a maximum of 54.2° to a minimum of 50.9°. The mean daily range was 13.8°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.934 inches) was a fraction below the average.

! Males contributed 57 per cent. and females 43 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 30 per cent. as against 31 per cent. in May 1881, and 1880; 39 per cent. in May 1879; 26 per cent. in May 1878; 34 per cent. in May 1877; 38 per cent. in May 1876; 37 per cent. in May 1875; 39 per cent. in May 1874; 40 per cent. in May 1873; and 46 per cent. in May 1872.

The month was unusually fatal to old people, no less than 35 deaths of persons who had attained the age of 75 years or upwards having been recorded, viz.—A female, aged 75, a female, aged 77, and a male calico printer, aged 78, who died of diarrhoea; a groom, aged 76, of cancer; a farmer, aged 76, of stone in the bladder; a farmer, aged 77, of effusion in the brain; a female, aged 77, of heart-disease; a widow, a gentleman, and a laborer, each aged 78, a farmer, aged 80, and a female, aged 81, of

bronchitis; a female, aged 78, of dropsy; a laborer, aged 78, of pneumonia; a grocer, aged 80, of congestion of the brain; a dressmaker, aged 80, of heart disease; a hawker, aged 82, of cancer; a nurse, aged 83, of rheumatism; a patient in the Lunatic Asylum, aged 73, of brain disease; a female, aged 84, of congestion of the liver; a carpenter, aged 94, of apoplexy; a female, aged 75, a female, aged 76, a female, aged 79, a carter and an ironmoulder, each aged 80, a gardener, aged 81, two laborers, each aged 82, a gentleman, aged 83, a female, aged 83, a bricklayer and a shoemaker, each aged 84, a wheelwright, aged 88, and a female, aged 92, of old age.

Twenty-six deaths from external causes were registered during the month, of which 19 were ascribed to accident, 3 to homicide, and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A plate-layer, aged 21, was killed by a railway train on the North-Eastern Railway; a laborer, aged 33, died of injury to the leg, sustained while sitting on a lorry which was run into by a hansom cab; a dairyman, aged 39, of injuries received through being passed over by a cart; a clerk, aged 49, of concussion of the brain, the result of a fall; a female, aged 53, of fracture of the skull, caused by falling whilst in a fit; a painter, aged 69, of fracture of the thigh, through falling off a step-ladder; a female infant, aged 7 months, of burns; a female, aged 40, of severe burns about the legs and body, her clothes having caught fire whilst she was asleep; 2 male children, aged 2 and 5 years, respectively, of scalds; the legs and body, her clothes having caught fire whilst she was asleep; 2 male children, aged 2 and 5 years, respectively, of drowning, he falling into a creek; a carpenter, aged 24, and a merchant, aged 60, were found drowned; a female infant was suffocated by having walked into a night-pan at birth; a female infant, aged 24 days, a female infant, aged 11 months, and a male child, aged 8 years, falling into a night-pan at birth; a female infant, aged 24 days, a female infant, aged 11 months, and a male child, aged 8 years, were suffocated—the two first in bed. The homicidal deaths were those of 2 male infants, who were murdered at birth; and a seaman, aged 30, who was stabbed by a knife in the lung. Of those who committed suicide, a tailor, aged 54, and a gentleman, aged 26, shot themselves; a female, aged 58, cut her throat, and a cabman, aged 46, hanged himself. The last three were set down as insane at the time of committing self-destruction.

One hundred and nine deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—46 in the Melbourne Hospital, 12 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 11 in the Lying-in Hospital, 11 in the Immigrants' Home, 12 in the Benevolent Asylum, 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, and 2 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 152, of which 92, or 60 per cent., were of males, and 60, or 40 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 100 were under one year of age, 25 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 9 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 358. Of these, 198, or 55 per cent., were males, and 160, or 45 per cent., were females; 20 were between five and ten, 5 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 26 were between twenty and twenty-five, 24 were between twenty-five and thirty, 21 were between thirty and thirty-five, 26 were between thirty-five and forty, 36 were between forty and forty-five, 31 were between forty-five and fifty, 28 were between fifty and fifty-five, 34 were between fifty-five and sixty, 20 were between sixty and sixty-five, 23 were between sixty-five and seventy, 18 were between seventy and seventy-five, 15 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 20 were upwards of eighty.

In May, as compared with the previous month, deaths from zymotic diseases fell from 119 to 90, diminution having occurred in deaths from whooping-cough, which fell from 6 to 4, and in those from dysentery and diarrhoea, which fell from 50 to 14. On the other hand deaths from scarlatina rose from 4 to 5, those from metria from *nil* to 4, and those from rheumatism from 2 to 4. Six deaths were set down to the consequences of childbirth, or 1 death of a mother to every 143 children born alive.

**ORDER OF THE COUNCIL OF THE SHIRE OF STAWELL, MADE ON

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

or removing of timber from the portion of the State Forest in the parishes of Coliban and Glenlyon comprised within the boundaries therein described.

DISPOSITION OF CHURCH LAND ALLOWED.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of Wesleyan Methodists, under the provisions of the Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion, for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the nineteenth day of June 1882, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

Description of land.—All that piece of land in the town of Mordialloc, and county of Bourke, being allotment 11 of section 1, and containing by admeasurement One acre one rood twenty-eight perches: Commencing at the south angle of the allotment, being a point formed by the junction of the northern side of Fowlett street with the eastern side of Main street; bounded thence by the first-named street bearing north seventy degrees four minutes east seven chains sixteen links; thence by allotment 10 of section 2, bearing north nineteen degrees fifty-six minutes west two chains; thence by allotment 10 of section 1, bearing south seventy degrees four minutes west seven chains nine links to Main street aforesaid; and thence to the point of commencement, by that street bearing southerly two chains one link in an arc of a circle whose radius is seventeen chains eighty-one links and whose centre lies easterly of the said arc.

Names of trustees.—James Jamison, of Brighton, gentleman; Robert Patterson, of Cheltenham, gardener; William Winter, of Mordialloc, stable proprietor; William Henry Noy, of Kingstown, gardener.

Power of disposition.—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, exchange, transfer, or deal with the whole or any part or parts of the land when and as the trustees, or the major part of them, shall, with the approval of the annual conference regulating the affairs of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Victoria think most advantageous. The authorized representative for the time being of the said church shall have power to fill up all vacancies occurring in the trusteeship, to appoint new or additional trustees, and to register these trusts under the provisions of the *Successory Trusts Act 1878*. The printed minutes of the meetings of the said annual conference shall for the purposes hereof be received and taken as sufficient evidence of its acts and proceedings. Subject to such power as aforesaid the land or such part thereof as shall be undisposed of as aforesaid shall be held upon the trusts of the Wesleyan Model Deed, enrolled in the Supreme Court of New South Wales under the Act of Council of that colony, 2 Victoria, No. 7, so far as such trusts can be applied and are not inconsistent herewith.

Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.—To the purchase of another piece of land in the township of Mordialloc, and the erection of a Wesleyan Church thereon as may be approved by a majority of the trustees.

LORNE PUBLIC PARK.—REGULATIONS.

WE, John Stirling, Edmund Hayman, Thomas Mountjoy, Thomas Frederic Anderson, and John Elkington, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Public Park at Lorne, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 103 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the fences, gates, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the park, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the park.

5. No person shall put in the park any horses, cattle, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring any dog into the park unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the park, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management being first obtained.

8. No person except laborers and workmen employed in the park shall enter any plots which may be therein enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. Any person who may have secured the consent (in writing) of the committee of management to the erection of any dwelling, booth, tent, or other structure within the park for any special purpose, shall be bound by any order given by such committee of management in such matter.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1863*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

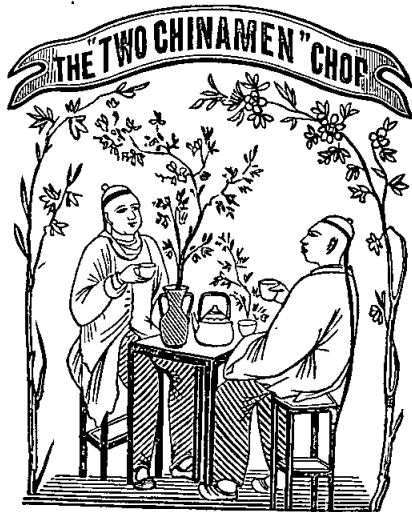
