ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have, this day assented, in her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

An Act to provide for adding certain portions of Pall Mall, Sandhurst, to Rosalind Park, and for setting apart portion of Pall Mall as a site for a Post Office and other Public Buildings.

An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million and thirty-eight thousand four hundred and fifty pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two and three.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-ninth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and in the forty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

PROCLAMATION UNDER THE GUNPOWDER ACT REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Importation and Custody of Gunpowder Statute 1864 it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council might proclaim any town, township, or borough, not being a seaport town, as a district into which no

gunpowder should be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine; and if any person should bring more than one hundred pounds of gunpowder into any such district, and should not forthwith deposit the same in a magazine as aforesaid, it should be forfeited: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the thirteenth day of January One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, the Municipal District of Inglewood was proclaimed to be a district into which no gunpowder should be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine: And whereas by another Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fifteenth day of May One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, the aforesaid Proclamation was revoked: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the last-named Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation bearing date the fifteenth day of May One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

MURDER NEAR DEEP LEAD, VICTORIA.

NOTICE.

ON the 17th January 1882 the headless body of a man was found near the Deep Lead Railway Station, Stawell, Victoria, and at an inquest held, subsequently, it was shown that the man had been wilfully murdered. WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do revoke the Proclamation bearing date the fifteenth day of May One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, so far as it relates to prohibiting the cutting, digging, or removing of timber which, at the height of two feet is of less diameter than twelve inches, from the Crown lands not included in a State forest within a radius of ten miles from the Beaufort Post Office, and, with the advice aforesaid, do hereby declare—

That no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove timber which, at the height of two feet, is of less diameter than eight inches, from the Crown lands not included in a State forest within a radius of ten miles from the Beaufort Post Office.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee first obtained.
8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction

before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

vi. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £40, and not exceeding £45, the annual sum of Nine pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

vii. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £45, and not exceeding £50, the annual sum of Eight pounds fifteen shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

viii. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £50, and not exceeding £55, the annual sum of Eight pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

Bye-law No. 2.

FIXING THE SCALE OF CHARGES FOR WATER SUPPLIED BY MEASURE, ETC.

THE Council of the Borough of Stawell doth hereby, in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the "Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872," fix the following scale of charges for water supplied by measure, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied, and determine the time at which such charge shall be payable, that is to say:—

1. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carriers' stables, or a supply for any manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labor), or for water-power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose; no hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants, or washing the house walls, or carriage, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged by meter. Siphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

2. The charges for water supplied by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Council, shall be at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case, except in the case of quartz-crushing mills, sluicing, or other cases of special agreement with the Council where water is supplied by measure, shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate, if water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

4. The charges for water supplied for quartz crushing shall be 9d. per thousand gallons up to the amount of rate on valuation; all water supplied beyond that shall be charged for at the rate of 3d. per thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for water supply for such purposes shall be 156,000 gallons per stamp-head per annum.

5. Water for sluicing, puddling, &c., shall be supplied under special agreement.

6. The charges for water supplied under special agreement, or by meter or measure, shall be paid monthly, or as may be agreed upon.

7. The charges for water supplied at stand-pipes shall be one shilling for each 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons, provided that any person rated for water supplied shall not be called upon to pay for water drawn from stand-pipes if such water is to be used for domestic purposes.

8. Any person receiving water from the Council, who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

9. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Council, who shall take or carry away any water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

10. Any person supplied with water by the Council who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable, for each offence, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Council.

11. If any person supplied with water by the Council does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of any of these rules and regulations, or fails to pay his rates and charges when due, or fails to do anything which, under any of these regulations, ought to be done; or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Council may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied, or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.
