DESERTERS FROM DANISH MERCHANT VESSELS.

THE accompanying Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, which has been received by His Excellency the Governor from the Secretary of State, relative to the apprehension of deserters from Danish merchant vessels under *The Foreign Deserters Act* 1852, is published for general information.

AT THE COURT AT WINDSOR, THE 15TH DAY OF JULY 1881. PRESENT, THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

At the Court at Windsor, the 15th day of July 1881. Present, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. Whereas by The Foreign Deserters Act 1852, it is provided that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of any foreign power, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, stating that such facilities are or will be given declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from merchant ships belonging to a subject of such Power when within Her Majesty's dominions shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such Order, and may render the operation thereas it hath been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities for recovering and apprehending seamen (not being Danish subjects) who desert from British merchant ships in territories belonging to His Majesty the King of Denmark, will be given under an agreement between the Governments of Great Britain and Denmark, signed at London on the 21st of June 1881.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said Foreign Deservers Act 1832, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that from and after the publication hereof in the London Gazette, seamen, not being slaves (and not being British subjects), who desert from merchant ships belonging to subjects of the King of Denmark within Her Majesty's dominions, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships: Provided always, that if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions he may be detained until he has been tried by a competent Court, and until he has sentence (if any) has been fully carried into effect.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENTS OF GREAT BRITAIN AND DENMARK RELATIVE TO MERCHANT SEAMEN DESERTERS. Signed at London, June 21, 1881.

Signed at London Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Government of His Majesty the King of Denmark, being desirous, for the benefit of the commerce of the two countries, to facilitate the discovery, apprehension, and surrender of seamen who may desert from merchant vessels of either country, on the basis of a full and entire reciprocity, have agreed as follows:—

It is mutually agreed that if any seamen or apprentices, not being slaves, should desert from any ship belonging to a subject of either of the contracting parties, within any port in the territories or in the possessions or colonies of the other contracting party, the authorities of such port and territory, possession or colony, shall be bound to give every assistance in their power for the apprehension and sending on board of such deserters, on application to that effect being made to them by the Consul of the country to which the ship of the deserter may belong, or by the dejanty or representative of the Consul.

It is understood that the preceding stipulations shall not apply to subjects of the country where the desertion shall take place.

Each of the two high contracting parties reserves to itself the right of terminating this Agreement at any time, on giving to the other a year's notice of its wish to that effect.

In witness whereof the undersigned, duly authorized for that purpose, have signed the present Agreement, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

WHEREAS by The Phylloxera Vine Disease Act 1880 it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might by order from time to time prohibit or restrict the importation into or the removal in Victoria of any Vines, or Vine Cuttings, or Grapes, either generally or from any place or places to be named in such order, and every such order might after or revoke; and while any such order should be in force all vines or vine cuttings or grapes imported or brought into Victoria contrary to the tenor of such order should be to freited, and should be destroyed or otherwise disposed of as the Minister might direct: And whereas, by an Order bearing date the twenty-seventh day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one the importation into Victoria, from all countries outside Australasia, of Grape Vines and Grape Vine Cuttings was prohibited: And whereas it is expedient to extend the prohibition: Now therefore the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the said Order bearing date the twenty-seventh day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and with the advice aforesaid, doth prohibit the importation into Victoria of Grape Vines Grape Vine Cuttings, and Grapes from all countries outside Australasia, unless the Grape Vines, Grape Vine Cuttings, and Grapes be of the varieties which are known to be proof against the disease, Phylloxern Vosatorir, in which case the certificate of an inspector of vineyards to the effect that they are exempt from such disease shall be obtained prior to landing of such exempted Grape Vines, Grape Vine Cuttings, and Grapes.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Lowan, made under the 213th section of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered 2, for regulating the proceedings of the council, officers, &c.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lowan order as follows:—

Sections 1 to 57 of Part II. of the 13th schedule of the Local Government Act 1874 is hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Lowan.

I. In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to

1. In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings of the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the council at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting.

3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as

near thereto as may be practicable. But, for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

(t.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council.

(ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.

(II.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
(III.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
(IV.) Presentation of reports of committees.
(V.) Payments.
(VI.) Ordinary business.
(VII.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
(VIII.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.

(IX.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.

(X.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the clerk of the municipality, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

8. No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.

9. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall, at some previous meeting, have submitted a draft of the same.

12. Any councillor desirous of making a motion, or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same, before he addresses the council thereon.

14. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council unless it be seconded; but a councillor may however require the enforcement of any standing order of the council, by directing the mayor's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor, as the ca

discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. No conneillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on councillors shall the deemed highly disorderly.

23. Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

24. A councillor called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

25. Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw, and to apologise for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. Any person not being a councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereat of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave

when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an

offence.

27. Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council, without reasonable exuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty

of an offence.

28. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question

28. Any concillor may or right demand the production or any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

29. The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. At every meeting of the council all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

33. If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

unsertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first mentioned amendment was moved; but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

35. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

37. Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council by the protesting councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the municipal clerk, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the confirmation theroof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

38. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the council; and the municipal clerk, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

41. The town clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter, by order of the council, or on the written order of the committee.

46. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

47. No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

48. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

49. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal prayer thereof.

97. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the borough, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

50. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before

Whoseever shall bathe in any stream, reservoir, conduit, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to or under the management or control of the council, or shall wash, cleanse, throw or cause to enter therein any animal, whether alive or dead, or any rubbish, filth, stuff, or thing of any kind whatsoever, or shall cause or permit or suffer to run or be brought therein the water of any sink, sewer, drain, engine, or boiler, or other filthy, unwholesome, or impure water, or shall do anything whatsoever whereby any water or waterworks belonging to the council, or under their management or control, shall be fouled, obstructed, or damaged, shall for every such offence forfeit, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for each day while such offence is continued after written notice in that behalf.

2. Whoseever, being supplied with water by the council from any waterworks of or belonging to or under the control or management of the council, or having access to any such waterworks for the taking of water therefrom, shall wilfully or negligently suffer any water to run to waste from any pipe or conduit from or by which he shall be so supplied or to which he shall have such access, shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. Whoseever shall, without the consent in writing of the council, construct or place any dam or embankment in or

and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. Whosoever shall, without the consent in writing of the council, construct or place any dam or embankment in or across any river, creek, or natural watercourse, or permanently obstruct the same in any way, shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Five pounds for every day after such conviction during which such dam or embankment, or any part thereof, shall continue.

4. In any case in which the council has the exclusive right of collecting for the supply of any reservoir or waterworks belonging to the council, or under their management or control, the stormwater having fallen on any gathering ground, whosoever shall by any means whatsoever divert any such water from the course of its natural flow, so that the same shall tend to flow elsewhere than to such reservoir or waterworks, or some watercourse leading thereto, or shall flow to the same respectively in a foul state, shall forfeit, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every day after such conviction during which such water so tends to flow, or flows, as the case may be.

5. It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to

It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for prohibiting or regulating the shooting of waterfowl, and the taking of fish upon, or in, or within one-quarter of a mile of any stream, reservoir, or other waterworks belonging to or under the management or control of the council; and every person who shall offend, contrary to any such regulation, shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Whosever shall obstruct or damage any culvert, sewery or drain belonging to or under the control of the council shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and shall pay
