#### MONEY PRIZES.

#### ESSAYS.

##### PRELIMINARY NOTICE.

Prizes of £100 will be given for each of the following subjects, viz. :—

1. The Natural History of Commercial Fishes of Great Britain, with especial reference to such parts of their Natural History as bear upon their production and commercial use.
2. Relations of the State with fishermen and fisheries, including all matters dealing with their protection, regulation, &c.
3. On the possible increase of the supply of Fish, and on improved facilities for their economic transmission and distribution.

Conferences are proposed to be held for the purpose of reading and discussing papers on subjects connected with the Exhibition.

#### REGULATIONS.

##### THE GREAT INTERNATIONAL FISHERIES EXHIBITION.—LONDON, 1883.

1. *Royal patronage.*—A Great International Fisheries Exhibition, under the patronage of Her Majesty the Queen and the presidency of H.R.H. the Prince of Wales, will be held in London in 1883.

2. *Date.*—The exhibition will be opened on the 1st of May, and continue open for a period of not less than six months.

3. *Objects.*—The principal objects to be admitted are comprised in the annexed classification, which is intended to include all kinds of specimens of fish life, and to illustrate all the modes by which the marine and fresh water animals of economic value are captured and utilised, together with the commercial, scientific, social, historic and legislative aspects of such fisheries.

4. *Rewards.*—Medals in gold, silver, and bronze, and diplomas of honor, will be awarded by a jury, the composition of which will be settled later.

5. *All expenses to be borne by exhibitors.*—No charge will be made for space, but exhibitors will have to pay every expense of transit, delivery, fixing, and removing their exhibits, and they must, either personally, or by their agents, superintend the reception and installation, and at the close of the exhibition, the removal of their goods; in default thereof, the committee reserves to itself the right of doing whatever may be considered necessary, and at the expense of the exhibitor.

6. *Applications.*—Applications for admission must be made on printed forms, which will be supplied on application; these are to be sent to the General Secretary in London on or before the 1st July 1882, except under special arrangements or concessions.

7. *Allotment.*—The general secretary will, before the 1st October 1882, or as soon after as practicable, notify to applicants the decision of the committee, and will indicate the space, if any, which has been accorded them, and give to each a number.

8. *Loan department.*—Contributors to the loan department are requested to communicate with the secretary, who will supply forms to be filled up by them.

9. *Foreign countries.*—The foreign correspondents that may be appointed are invited to enter as soon as possible into communication with the general secretary. The correspondent will be charged with the consideration of all questions relative to the distribution of the space allotted to his country. The committee will therefore not correspond directly with foreign exhibitors, except in those countries where no correspondent is appointed.

10. *Foreign countries.*—The committee will place at the disposal of foreign correspondents all information and plans that may be useful for their arrangements.

11. *Foreign countries.*—The applicants for space from countries in which no correspondent has been appointed will correspond directly with the general secretary of the committee.

12. *Railway rates.*—The committee will endeavor to obtain from the various English railway companies special terms for the conveyance of exhibits to and from the Exhibition, and should they succeed in doing so, such arrangements will be communicated to intending exhibitors.

13. *Railways, &c.*—The committee will not interfere in any way between the railway companies, the carriers, and the exhibitors, with reference to the dispatch, transmission, reception, management, or return of goods exhibited.

14. *Marks on packages.*—All packages containing goods intended for exhibition must have painted on them the distinctive mark (I.F.E.) in red paint, and they must also have painted on them the name and number of the exhibitor.

15. *Waybills.*—The waybill accompanying all packages must contain the name of the exhibitor, his number, and address.

16. *Exhibitors or agents to receive own goods, &c.*—Each exhibitor must provide, either personally or through an agent, for the despatch, transmission, reception, unpacking, and arrangement of his goods, and for the verification of their contents when unpacked. If neither the exhibitor nor his agent be present to receive the packages on their arrival at the Exhibition, the carrier will be directed to take them away; but should any goods be deposited in the Exhibition premises during the absence of the exhibitor or his agent, the committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage from whatever cause arising.

17. *Foreign packages.*—Packages from foreign countries must likewise have painted on them in distinctive marks the letters (I.F.E.) in red paint. They must be addressed to the exhibitor himself or his agent. They must all be marked in such a way as to show distinctly from whence they come, the name of the country and the number of the exhibitor being painted legibly thereon.

18. *Passages.—Exhibition spaces.*—The space granted to an exhibitor within the building is available for floor space exclusive of the passages for the public.

19. *Show cases.*—No particular form or design is prescribed for cases, counters, platforms, &c., but they must not exceed the following heights without the special written permission of the Committee :—

Show-cases and partitions 10 feet above the floor.  
Counters ... 3 " " "  
Platforms ... 1 foot " " "

20. *Railings.*—Exhibitors may place railings of a uniform height of 2 feet 6 inches above the floor level. In every instance the railings must be within the area of the "stand," i.e. the space allotted.

21. *Floors.*—The flooring must not be altered, removed or strengthened for the convenience of arrangement, except by sanction of the committee, and at the expense of the exhibitor.

22. *No obstructions.*—No exhibitor will be permitted to display exhibits in such a manner as to obstruct the light or vistas

N.B.—With reference to Rule "6," an extension of time till 1st September 1882, will be granted to distant colonies and countries.

45. *Non-liability for accidents.*—If any damage or injury shall be caused or occasioned during the exhibition by any exhibited machine, implement, or article to any visitor or other person, or to any officer, servant, or others then and there employed by the committee of the Great International Fisheries Exhibition, 1883, then the exhibitor to whom such machinery, implement, or article may belong shall indemnify and hold harmless the said committee from and against all actions, suits, expenses, and claims on account or in respect of any such damage or injury which may be so caused or occasioned.

N.B.—This form should be filled up and sent to the Secretary of "The Great International Fisheries Exhibition, London 1883," 24 Haymarket, S.W., before the 1st July 1882.

Exhibitors are requested to keep a copy of their applications for reference in future correspondence. Wall space will most likely *not* be contiguous to the stands for other exhibits.

## MEMORANDUM FOR COLONIES.

I. In order to secure uniformity of action as regards the exhibitors residing in any colony, it is of importance that there should be in each one central representative (or correspondent) to act on behalf of the exhibitors in such colony.

1st. The central representative (or correspondent) should undertake to distribute prospectuses, application forms, &c., to those likely to become exhibitors.

2ndly. He should receive the forms (when filled up) applying for space, the list of articles, &c.

3rdly. He should communicate upon all matters directly with the general secretary in London (Sir Brandreth Gibbs, 24 Haymarket, London), and should inform him, from time to time, of any applications for space and of the exact nature of such applications.

4thly. He should act generally as the representative of the exhibitors in such colony.

5thly. When the committee in London shall have decided how much space is allotted to such colony, it will be the duty of the representative to divide it among the exhibitors who have applied.

II. The prospectus (sent herewith) sets forth the "divisions" under which the objects will be grouped. In correspondence respecting any regulation in the prospectus its number should be quoted, and in the case of reference to objects to be exhibited, the division number should be named.

III. It is quite necessary that each exhibitor should keep a copy of his entire entry for future reference.

IV. Special attention should be paid to the date by which all applications should be lodged with the general secretary in London. (See Regulation 6 in the prospectus.)

V. In the case of any colony whose fishing operations are so limited as not to require a representative of the exhibitors, communications can be addressed by individual exhibitors direct to the general secretary in London.

VI. A further supply of prospectuses, blank application forms, blank list of articles, &c., can be obtained on demand made to the general secretary in London.

VII. Immediately a central representative is appointed in any colony his name and address should be communicated to the general secretary in London.

VIII. Any expenses of whatsoever nature connected with the representation of any colony, if not borne by the respective authorities of such colony, must be defrayed by the colonial exhibitors themselves.

WHEREAS by *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* it was amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application, or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly: And it was further enacted that, if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations, or additions, or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: and every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should state—

(a.) The amount of money which the Governor in Council would grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same, and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and also the rate of interest which would be charged for such loan, such rate being at least One-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted:

(b.) Should proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks within which such trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District:

(c.) Should state what are the principal works proposed to be constructed: and

(d.) Should contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the now in part recited Act) as according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case the Governor in Council should think fit.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description as set forth in a certain application of the Municipal Councils of the Shires of East Loddon, Korong, Marong, and Swan Hill, and deposited in the Department of Mines and Water Supply, for a Loan of Thirty thousand pounds sterling, to carry out certain waterworks for the supply of a Waterworks District under the said Act, embracing portions of the Shires of East Loddon, Korong, Marong, and Swan Hill, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

(1.) The construction of the said waterworks:

(2.) The constitution of a Waterworks Trust for such Waterworks District—to consist of two members from each of the councils of the Municipal Districts of East Loddon and Swan Hill, and one member from each of the councils of the Municipal Districts of Korong and Marong, and of one other Commissioner:

(3.) That the amount of the loan hereby granted shall be Thirty thousand pounds sterling, for the purpose of carrying out the proposed works and paying the cost and expense of the application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, such interest to be paid half-yearly:

(4.) That the area of the Waterworks District within which such Trust shall have authority shall consist of lands included within the following boundaries, being portions of the shires of East Loddon, Korong, Marong, and Swan Hill, that is to say: Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 11, parish of Kinypaniel; thence westerly by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 16 of the said parish; thence southerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 164A of the said parish; thence westerly by a road to the north-east angle of the parish of Borung; thence in a general direction westerly by the northern boundary of that parish to the south-east angle of the parish of Wychitella; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of said parish to the south-east angle of allotment 72 of the last-named parish; thence westerly by the southern boundary of said allotment 72 and the southern boundaries of allotments 71, 69, 66, and 64 in the same parish to the south-west angle of last-named allotment; thence northerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 59 of the last-named parish; thence westerly by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 47 on the western boundary of the parish of Wychitella; thence northerly by the western boundary of the parish of Wychitella to the north-west angle of allotment 38 of said parish; thence easterly by the northern boundary of said allotment 38 to the north-east angle of same; thence northerly

##### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

## MURDER NEAR DEEP LEAD, VICTORIA.

## NOTICE.

ON the 17th January 1882 the headless body of a man was found near the Deep Lead Railway Station, Stawell, Victoria, and at an inquest held, subsequently, it was shown that the man had been wilfully murdered. The remains are believed to be those of one Charles Forbes, or Forbys, who worked on the Dimboola line of railway during the months of October, November, and December 1881, with a man named Robert Francis Burns. ## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Parliament of Victoria in the twenty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to consolidate and amend the Law relating to the Distillation, Rectifying, and Compounding of Spirits, to the granting a Duty upon Spirits Distilled in Victoria, and to regulate the Brewing of Beer and the Sale of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors in certain cases*, it was, amongst other things, enacted that any person, except as thereinafter excepted, who should carry on the business of a distiller or rectifier and compounder of spirits, or who should have in his possession, or who should make use of any still or other utensil for distilling or rectifying and compounding spirits, excepting in such place as the Governor in Council should, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, direct, should be liable to a penalty of not less than One hundred pounds nor more than Five hundred pounds: And whereas by a proclamation, under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the

colony, bearing date the seventeenth day of June One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, certain premises at Warrenheip were proclaimed as a place wherein the distillation of spirits might be carried on: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the proclamation of the premises in question, and to re-proclaim the same, with amended boundaries, as a place wherein the distillation of spirits may be carried on: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the proclamation of the premises hereinbefore referred to, and do proclaim the undermentioned place as a place wherein the distillation of spirits may be carried on, that is to say:—

Premises known as the Warrenheip Distillery, situated on a portion of allotment 2, section 5, county of Grant, colony of Victoria, and bounded as follows:—Beginning at the north-west corner of the said premises and running east two hundred and four feet along a private road; thence by a line bearing south two hundred and thirty-eight feet; thence by a line at right angles bearing west one hundred and fourteen feet; thence by a line south twenty feet; thence by a line at right angles bearing west ninety feet; thence by a line bearing north two hundred and fifty feet to the commencing point.

Given under my hand and the seal of the colony, at Melbourne, this third day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and in the forty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.
