PART I. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and might define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and might revoke any such proclamation; and upon any such proclamation the provisions so proclaimed should extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby extend all the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to the Town of Glenrowan and an area of one mile and a half radius from the Glenrowan Railway Station.

PANMURE RECREATION RESERVE.—
REGULATIONS.

WE, Joseph Drayton, Thomas Murnane, William O'Brien, Alexander Rollo, and William Wickington, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land at Panmure, temporarily reserved by Order of 3rd May 1875, for Recreation Purposes, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

Regulations.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. No person except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. No person shall discharge firearms in the reserve.

Every person offending against these regulations, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five

4. Subject to the foregoing regulations, the water in Reilly's Water Reserve shall be for the free use of the public for domestic purposes and for watering stock.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE ROSEDALE TOWN COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the first day of April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Rosedale, having drafted the following

Regulations for management of the Rosedale Town Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The scale of fees, payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of April and the first day of October in every year, for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follows:—

- For every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule ... 10s. per annum.
- For every cow, heifer, ox, or steer ... 6s. "
- For every sheep or goat (for any number not exceeding 25) ... 3s. "
- For any number from 25 to 50 ... 4s. each per annum.
- For any number over 50 ... 5s. "
- For every calf from 6 to 12 months old ... 3s. per annum.
- Calves under 6 months old, the progeny of cows legally depasturing on the common ... Free.

3. All sheep depasturing on the common must be tended by and be in charge of a shepherd.

4. The managers may consent, in writing, to bulls or entire horses being depastured on the common.

5. The managers or herdsman will not be responsible for any stock depasturing on the common, but the herdsman shall see all registered stock on the common once at least in every seven days; and in the event of any straying, he shall give notice, in writing, to the owners thereof within twenty-four hours after being missed by him.

6. The brand for the common shall be R pitch brand.

7. Due notice, by advertisement in the local papers circulating in the district, shall be given of the mustering of the stock on the common every six months, and every owner shall assist or authorize some person to represent him in branding them with the common brand; or the owner of such stock may have them branded at his own yard on payment of Threepence per head to the herdsman, which fee shall be paid to the common fund.

8. The herdsman may impound all stock found trespassing on the common, and the fees derived from this source shall be paid to the common fund.

9. Owners of diseased stock shall at once remove them from the common after being duly notified by the herdsman so to do; and owners of dead stock must either remove the carcasses or destroy the same by fire within six hours after written notice by the herdsman or managers.

10. No person shall remove his stock from the common without giving twenty-four hours' notice, in writing, to the herdsman.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

MURDER NEAR DEEP LEAD, VICTORIA.

NOTICE.

ON the 17th January 1882 the headless body of a man was found near the Deep Lead Railway Station, Stawell, Victoria, and at an inquest held, subsequently, it was shown that the man had been wilfully murdered.
