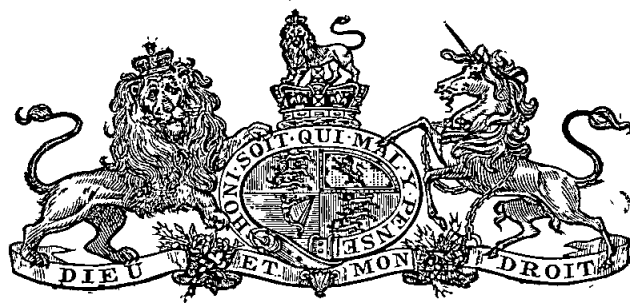

ESTABLISHMENT OF A BATTERY OF GARRISON ARTILLERY UNDER "THE DISCIPLINE ACT 1870."

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the formation of a Battery of Garrison Artillery, subject to the provisions of *The Discipline Act 1870*, and of the strength and upon the terms set forth below, viz. :-

1	Major at £365 per annum.
1	Captain at £300 "
2	Lieutenants at £250 "
1	Battery Sergeant Major at 9s. per day.
5	Sergeants at 6s. 6d. per day.
5	Corporals at 5s. 6d. "
5	Bombardiers at 5s. "

103	Gunners at 4s. "

Total, 125 all ranks, with quarters fuel, light and water.

Contingencies, Allowances, &c.

Allowance for the provision of uniform to officers on appointment, £50 each.
 Command allowance to officer commanding the battery, 1s. 6d. per day.
 Allowance to officer acting as barrack and quarter-master, for the battery only, 1s. 6d. per day.
 Allowance to a non-commissioned officer acting as barrack pay, and quarter-master sergeant, 1s. 6d. per day.
 Allowance to one orderly-room clerk, 1s. per day.
 Allowance to hospital cook and wardman, 2s. 6d. per day; and assistant wardman, when required, 6d. per day.
 Non-commissioned officers, trumpeters, and gunners, a free kit on joining, and annually one suit of uniform and two pairs of boots each.
 Lodging allowance for limited number of married men not provided with quarters in barracks, or on detachment duty.
 Allowance for the services of a medical officer, £200 per annum.

Conditions of Service.

Recruits to be sworn in under *The Discipline Act 1870*, to be not less than 19, nor more than 30 years of age; minimum height, 5 feet 8 inches; chest measurement, not less than 35 inches; of good character, able to read and write fairly, and to pass medical examination. Men recently discharged from the Imperial service, under 45 years of age, and men with special qualifications may be enlisted if "approved" by the Commandant, Local Forces.

The number of married men to be admitted into the corps to be limited.

Sixpence (6d.) per day of the pay of all non-commissioned officers, trumpeters, and gunners, to be retained and placed in a "Deferred Pay Fund," to be drawn on termination of engagement, or retirement with good character.

Men dismissed for misconduct, or discharged at their own request prior to completing term of engagement to forfeit all claim on the "Deferred Pay Fund."

One shilling (1s.) per day to be also retained from the pay of all non-commissioned officers, trumpeters and gunners, to meet the expenses of rations, &c.

It is to be distinctly understood that no man shall have a right to quit the Battery until the expiration of his term of service, but a man of good character may, if he be permitted by the officer commanding the forces, purchase his discharge during the first year of service for the sum of £20; during the second year, for the sum of £10, and thereafter may be granted a free discharge.

In every case of discharge, except for disability, or reduction of establishment, or on completion of the full term of service, deferred pay to be forfeited.

REGULATIONS OF THE MILITARY TORPEDO CORPS.

THE Governor in Council has, in pursuance of the provisions of *The Discipline Act 1870* (34 Vic. No. 389, sec. 8), made the following Regulations.

REGULATIONS OF THE MILITARY TORPEDO CORPS.

1. All persons whose services are engaged as members of the Military Torpedo Corps, in the service of Her Majesty's Government in Victoria, shall be subject to the provisions of the above said Act and to the following regulations :-

2. The Military Torpedo Corps shall consist of such commissioned and non-commissioned officers and men as may from time to time be duly appointed or engaged under the provisions of the said Act, and each member shall, subject to these regulations, be entitled to receive annual allowance, or retainer, as provided.

3. All members of the Military Torpedo Corps, when called out by proclamation for actual service, shall be entitled to receive during such period of actual service pay and allowances at such rates as the Governor in Council may from time to time direct.

4. Members of the Military Torpedo Corps will be enrolled under three sections—

Section A.—Persons having had scientific training as electricians, telegraphists, civil engineers, surveyors, &c.

Section B.—Artisans and mechanics.

Section C.—Boatmen.

5. No person will be enrolled unless he is a British subject, free from physical defect, and in health, character, and every other respect eligible, and unless he can also show by evidence satisfactory to the commanding officer that he is eligible by prior training for the section into which he seeks admission.

6. When any person is enrolled in the Military Torpedo Corps a certificate will be delivered to him by the officer who enrolls him.

7. Any member of the Military Torpedo Corps who, after being enrolled, is discovered to have been at the time of enrolment laboring under disease, or to have sustained injury which incapacitates him, and who has concealed such disease or injury, or who is discovered to have made any false representation, or to have produced any false papers on the occasion of enrolment, will at once be struck off the lists, and will forfeit all claim to retainer or other advantages of the service.

8. No member of the Military Torpedo Corps may be enrolled in any other corps.

9. Under ordinary circumstances, leave of absence may be granted by the commanding officer to members of the corps for periods not exceeding three weeks in the year, provided always that such members are not in arrears for drill. Leave for longer periods will only be granted under special circumstances, and by the authority of the officer commanding the forces.

10. Every member of the Military Torpedo Corps must give immediate notice to his commanding officer of any change of residence or of the place to which letters and notices for him are to be addressed.

11. The time for which each member of the Military Torpedo Corps will be required to drill in each year is two hundred and twenty (220) hours, to be made of one hundred and thirty (130) hours' daylight drill and ninety (90) hours' night drill. Times and places of drill will be fixed and notified from time to time by the officer commanding; such notifications will be posted in the orderly rooms.

12. Any members of the Military Torpedo Corps who, without satisfactory cause, shall neglect to attend drill, or who during drill shall absent himself without leave, is, in addition to such penalty as the Act provides, liable to loss of retainer or such portion of it as the commanding officer may decide.

13. The annual retainer will be paid in four quarterly instalments.

14. When a member of the Military Torpedo Corps applies for payment of his retainer he must produce his certificate, and satisfy the commanding officer that he has complied with the conditions as to drill, leave of absence, &c.

15. The service shall be for a term of three years, but after the termination of one year any member of the Military Torpedo Corps may, on giving three months' notice in writing to the officer commanding, obtain his discharge.

16. Any member of the Military Torpedo Corps, when not called out for actual service, may, under special circumstances, and with the consent of the officer commanding the Military Forces of Her Majesty's Government in Victoria, obtain his discharge from the said corps on payment of the sum of £2, if required, to replace his uniform.

17. Any member of the Military Torpedo Corps may be discharged from the corps after 55 years of age, or for inefficiency or physical inability to serve, or may be dismissed for misconduct, in addition to loss of retainer, and such other penalty as the Act provides.

ADDITIONAL RED LIGHT, BURNETT RIVER.

On and after this date a red light will be exhibited from the end of the Boat Jetty, at the Pilot Station, inside the South Head of the Burnett River. Its position during the day will be marked by a small white beacon.

Directions.—Cross the Bar with the leading beacons or lights in line, and keep them in this position until the small white beacon or the red light is brought in line with the Lighthouse, on an east and west bearing; steer with them in line until the first white steering mark is reached, and then proceed up the river as usual.

ROCKS AT ENTRANCE TO MORRILYAN HARBOR.

CAPTAIN PENNFATHER, of the Government schooner *Pearl*, reports having found a rock with only 4½ feet of water over it at low-water springs, lying S. ½ E. 60 yards from Goodman Rock, at the entrance to Morrilyan Harbor; and also other rocks awash at low-water, bearing S.E., and distant 30 yards from Goodman Rock.

The available channel, which is between these dangers, is only 40 yards wide, and must be used with the greatest caution.

The Admiralty Directory, vol. ii., page 234—from information supplied by Captain Moresby, R.N., of H.M.S. *Basilik*—states that the least depth of water in the channel is 28 feet, and that its width is barely 200 yards.

SHIRE OF STAWELL (NORTH-EAST RIDING)
WATERWORKS TRUST.—LOAN.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventh day of August 1882.

WHEREAS by the Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881 it was amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect

of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application, or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks: and the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly: And it was further enacted that, if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations, or additions, or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: and every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should state—

(a.) The amount of money which the Governor in Council would grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same, and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and also the rate of interest which would be charged for such loan, such rate being at least One-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted.

(b.) Should proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks within which such trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District:

(c.) Should state what are the principal works proposed to be constructed: and

(d.) Should contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the now in part recited Act) as according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case the Governor in Council should think fit.

And it was further enacted by the said Act that whenever any Waterworks District was comprised wholly within one municipal district, although portion of the works might be outside same, the Governor in Council might appoint the municipal council thereof for the time being, together with one other commissioner, to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description as set forth in a certain application of the President and Ratepayers of the Shire of Stawell for a Loan of One thousand three hundred and seventy pounds sterling, to carry out certain waterworks for the domestic supply of a Water Supply District under the said Act, embracing certain land within the said shire, as shown on the said general plan and description deposited in the Department of Mines and Water Supply, Melbourne, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

(1.) The construction of the said waterworks:

(2.) The Municipal Council of the Shire of Stawell for the time being and one other Commissioner to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District:

(3.) That the amount of the loan hereby granted shall be One thousand three hundred and seventy pounds sterling, for the purpose of carrying out the proposed works and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payable half-yearly:

(4.) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be the lands included within the North-East Riding of the Shire of Stawell, and more particularly described as follows:—Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 179, parish of Wirchilleba; thence north to the north-east angle of allotment 136; thence north-westerly to the north-west angle of allotment 137; thence northerly to the north-west angle of allotment 129; thence westerly to the south-west angle of allotment 79, all in the parish of Wirchilleba; thence north to the south-west angle of allotment 7, parish of Burrum Burrum; thence east by the southern boundary of that parish to the south-western angle of the parish of Marmoo; thence north by the western boundary of that parish to the south-western angle of allotment 96; thence east to the south-east angle of allotment 99; thence north-westerly to the southern angle of allotment 100; thence north to the south-east angle of the water reserve on allotment 26; thence west, north, and east by the boundaries of the said reserve to the north-east angle of the said allotment 26; thence north to the north-east angle of allotment 3, all in the parish of Marmoo; thence east by the northern boundary of last-named parish to the north-west angle of the township reserve of Korokubeal; thence south by the western and east by the southern boundaries of the said township reserve to the east boundary of the parish of Marmoo; thence south and south-easterly by the boundary of the shire of Stawell to the south-eastern angle of the north-east riding of the said shire; thence westerly and north-westerly by the southern boundary of the said riding to the western boundary thereof: thence north by that boundary to the south-east angle of allotment 176, parish of Wirchilleba; thence west to the south-east angle of allotment 179 of last-named parish, the point of commencement.

(5.) That the principal works to be constructed shall consist of the formation and also the enlargement of tanks and dams.

And the Honorable Charles Young, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

1. Every person using or carrying away water from the Reserve shall pay therefor to any person duly appointed by the Committee of Management in that behalf, and duly authorized to demand the same, the fees hereinafter specified:—

(1.) For each of the three (3) first hogsheds of water taken away in any one day, Sixpence.

(2.) For every hogshed of water after the three (3) first hogsheds taken away in any one day, One shilling; provided that no person shall be permitted to take for his own use more than six hogsheds in one day.

(3.) For every horse or head of cattle brought to water at any one time, Twopence.

2. No person shall permit or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the Reserve any horses, cattle, goats, pigs, or geese, without the written authority of the Committee of Management, or their officer duly appointed.

3. No person shall wash any auriferous or other earth in the water within the Reserve, nor allow any sludge, drainage from house, stable yard, pigsty, or foul water of any description to flow into it, nor bathe or wash in it, nor deposit any earth, manure, or other similar matter within the Reserve, nor in any way pollute the water therein.

4. No person shall remove any portion of any fence, or break or damage any fence, gates, pumps, troughs, bank, or drain within the Reserve.

Every person offending against these regulations, or refusing to pay on demand the fees specified therein, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

YARRAWONGA PUBLIC PARK AND SHOW YARDS RESERVE.

W¹ B. James Reilly, John Joseph Reilly, John Davis, John Murray Gorman, John Mitchell, Alfred Hunt, and John Cornelius Catlin, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Public Park and Show Yards at Yarrawonga, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

Regulations.

- The reserve is divided into the following divisions, viz.:—
1st. Agricultural Show Yards.
2nd. Public Park, being the residue of the reserve.
 - All persons paying for admission to the first division, or to any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which they shall on demand produce, and (if required) surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand the production or surrender of the same.
 - The reserve shall be open, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, excepting the portion contained in the first division, when on days set apart for an agricultural show or public sports, &c., a charge for admission to such portion of the reserve may be made as may be determined by the committee of management, not exceeding Three shillings for each adult.
 - No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
 - No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers, fences, gates, or erections, or put offensive matter in the lagoons or waterholes in the reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein.
 - No person shall clamber over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage the same, nor roll or throw stones in the reserve, nor discharge firearms therein.
 - No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pig, without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management.
 - No person shall bring any dog into the reserve, unless led by a chain or cord.
 - No person shall engage in any game or sport in the reserve on Sunday.
 - No person shall erect any building in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management.
 - Any person who may have obtained the consent, in writing, of the committee of management to the erection within the reserve of any structure, booth, &c., for special purposes shall be bound by any order made by the committee of management in regard thereto.
 - No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
 - The committee of management may allow any part of the reserve to be depastured by quiet cattle or horses; the proceeds of agistment to be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.
 - Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased or may or shall be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof:—
(1.) Assaulting any other person.
(2.) Being drunk.
(3.) Crossing or trespassing on the trying or convincing ground or enclosure, or interfering with any of the judges while in the execution of their duty.
(4.) Using profane, indecent, or abusive language.
(5.) Using threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
(6.) Behaving improperly or riotously.
(7.) Not surrendering (if required) to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand production of the same any ticket authorizing admission to that part where such person shall be found.
 - Such entrance and other fees for the exhibition of stock and other property may from time to time be charged as may be approved by the committee of management.
 - Persons renting or having any stand, building, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any show, public sports, &c., may be required to deposit any sum not exceeding Ten pounds, which the committee of management may determine by way of guarantee that due care will be taken of such stand, buildings, erection, or enclosure; and the committee of management may make repairs to, or make good, any damage or loss sustained by such buildings, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by such lessee by way of guarantee as and for liquidated damages.
- Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith ap-

prehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the Reserve for Conservation of Water in the parish of Karrabumet, known as "McQualter's Dam Reserve."

WHEREAS by a regulation of the Board of Land and Works, made on the twenty-first day of June, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, the Council of the Shire of Yarrowonga was duly appointed a Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of 30th May 1882, as a site for conservation of Water in the parish of Karrabumet, and hereinafter styled "McQualter's Dam Reserve": Now therefore the said Council of the Shire of Yarrowonga, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said reserve, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in McQualter's Dam Reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals, without the written authority of the committee of management or their officer duly appointed.
2. No person shall allow any foul or deleterious matter injurious to health to run into, or to be placed within the said reserve; nor shall any person bathe or wash in, or otherwise pollute the water therein.
3. No person shall climb or jump over, or break or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the said reserve; or break or otherwise damage the pumps, troughs, platform, or other appliances attached thereto.
4. Subject to the foregoing regulations, the water in the said reserve shall be for the free use of the public for domestic purposes and for watering stock.

MURDER NEAR DEEP LEAD, VICTORIA.

NOTICE.

ON the 17th January 1882 the headless body of a man was found near the Deep Lead Railway Station, Stawell, Victoria, and at an inquest held, subsequently, it was shown that the man had been wilfully murdered.
