VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby make the following Bye-law for fixing the charges for Carriage of Goods upon railways vested in the Board, that is to say :-

On and after the 1st October 1882 clause 5 of the Bye-law, bearing date 11th August 1882, and relating to the carriage of goods for Albury, will be repealed, and the following substituted in its place, namely :-

All goods of the Miscellaneous, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, or 4th Classes forwarded from Melbourne, Williamstown, or Sandridge to Wodonga for Albury will be allowed the rebates set forth in the above-mentioned bye-law, provided they are consigned in truck loads of one class of goods only. Less than 5 tons in a truck to be charged as 5 tons, or else ordinary rates. No further rebate will be allowed on these goods if subsequently sent beyond the boundary-line laid down in clause 1 of the before-mentioned Bye-law.

SHIRES OF WARRAGUL AND BULN BULN.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:-

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of Warragul Shire, which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from that shire and annexed to the Shire of Buln Buln.

Area described in the petition :-

Commencing at the intersection of Lardner's Track with the north boundary of the Gippsland Railway Reserve; thence south-easterly along that boundary to its intersection with the south boundary of allotment 88, parish of Drouin East; thence along that boundary to the south-east angle thereof; thence north along the eastern boundaries of allotments 88 and 370 to the south boundary of allotment 84; thence west north and east around that allotment to the south-east angle of allotment 85; thence north to the north-east angle thereof; thence by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 38; thence north and west along the boundary of that allotment to the south-west angle of allotment 23; thence north and north-easterly by the western boundary of last-named allotment and of allotment 29, all in the parish of Drouin East, to the Main Gippsland road; thence by that road to its intersection with Lardner's Track; thence by Lardner's Track, being the eastern boundary of the Shire of Buln Buln, to the commencing point.

Petitioners state that they were included in the new Shire of Warragul against their wish; that they have no interests in the roads in Warragul, and the roads through Buln Buln are much shorter and more direct to their market; that they are dependent upon Buln Buln to construct the roads they require to use; that they will suffer serious injustice unless a further adjustment of the boundaries of the two shires is made.

Petitioners therefore pray, "That an Order be made, severing the area above described from the Shire of Warragul and annexing it to the Shire of Buln Buln."

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of Corio Shire, which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from that shire and annexed to the Shire of Bacchus Marsh.

Petitioners state that their interests are closely identified with Bacchus Marsh, and not in any way with Corio; that the Council of Corio Shire could not execute any works or make any roads that would be of the slightest benefit to them, as the whole of their traffic is conveyed over roads in the Bacchus Marsh Shire; and they do not, nor are they at any time likely to use any roads in Corio Shire; that the rates paid by them cannot be expended to their advantage in any way, but if they were paid to the Shire of Bacchus Marsh they would be spent on works that would benefit them; that their properties are situated in an outlying part of the shire, and they have no interests in common with it; and that, during the many years that rates have been levied, the council have not expended any moneys to their advantage; that Bacchus Marsh is their market and post town.

Petitioners therefore pray that the area above described may be severed from the Shire of Corio and annexed to the Parwan Riding of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, sec. 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:-

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Wimmera, known as the Horsham Village Reserve, and which is described in their

petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Wimmera and constituted a separate municipality, under the title of the Borough of Horsham.

Area described in the petition :-

Commencing at the north-west corner of allotment 1, section 1, parish of Horsham; thence easterly by the parish boundary to the north-east angle of allotment 2, section 3; thence southerly to the south-east angle of allotment 8, section 8; thence westerly to the south-west angle of allotment 5, section 10; and thence northerly to the point of commencement.
