REGULATION OF THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation of the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners, made under and by virtue of *The Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1876*.

In pursuance of the said Act, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulation :—

Whereas by *The Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1876*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners may, from time to time, by regulation approved by the Governor in Council, alter, raise, and lower at discretion all tolls, rates, and charges which they are authorized to demand, collect, and receive under the said Act : Now the said Commissioners, in pursuance of the said powers, do make the following regulation, *viz.* :—

From and after the publication of this Regulation in the *Government Gazette*, a toll, rate, and charge of One shilling shall be payable in respect of each empty iron tank landed from any vessel at any wharf, dock, pier, jetty, landing stage, slip, or platform within the port of Melbourne.

The births of 928 children, viz., 451 boys and 477 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of August. In the month of July, 751 births were registered, or 177 less than in the month under review. The births were 165 above the average of the previous eight years, but only 87 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in August numbered 482, viz., 273 of males and 209 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 446. The deaths were fewer than those in July by 12, but above the average of July during the previous ten years by 102. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of the month in those ten years by 54 only.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.26, and of deaths registered 1.69.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 73.1° on the 24th, and the lowest was 34.1° on the 11th. The mean temperature of the month (49.9°) was nearly a third of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (27.9°) took place on the 20th, viz., from a maximum of 67.0° to a minimum of 39.1°. The least range (7.3°) was on the 7th, viz., from a maximum of 49.3° to a minimum of 42.0°. The mean daily range was 14.00°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.960 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Males contributed 57 per cent. and females 43 per cent. respectively to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 31 per cent. to that mortality, as against 33 per cent. in August 1881; 43 per cent. in August 1880; 36 per cent. in August 1879; 31 per cent. in August 1878; 34 per cent. in August 1877; 32 per cent. in August 1876; 33 per cent. in August 1875; 30 per cent. in August 1874 and August 1873; and 33½ per cent. in August 1872.

The deaths of 31 persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were registered during the month, viz.:—Those of a female, aged 75, who died of hæmoptysis; 2 females, aged 78 and 79 respectively, of brain disease; a dealer, aged 78, of hydatids; a female, aged 82, of phthisis; a laborer, aged 76, a female, aged 81, and a cabinetmaker, aged 85, of apoplexy; a female, aged 78, a female, aged 81, and a bricklayer, aged 82, of bronchitis; a female, aged 75, and a boatman, aged 82, of pneumonia; a baker, aged 77, a female, aged 79, a hawker, aged 83, and a laborer, aged 90, of congestion of the lungs; a ship chandler, aged 80, of cirrhosis of the liver; a farmer, aged 81, of cancer; a gentleman, aged 82, of cystitis; a female, aged 85, of gastritis; a cooper, aged 86, of paralysis; a female, aged 89, of fracture of the left femur; a schoolmaster and a widow, each aged 81, a seaman and a female, each aged 83, a female, aged 84, a storeman, aged 86, a female, aged 87, and a female, whose age was stated to be 103, of old age.

Eighteen deaths were due to accidental causes during the month under notice, of which 15 were set down to accident and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A laborer, aged 13, was killed by being passed over by a dray he was driving; a laborer, aged 23, by the capsizing of a dray; a carter, aged 25, by being run over by a cart; a pointsman, aged 19,

by being crushed by a railway truck; a laborer, aged 38, and a male, of occupation unknown, aged 70, by trains passing over them; a clerk, aged 19, a publican, aged 44, and a female, aged 89, died of injuries resulting from falling; and a laborer, aged 63, of burns. A boy, aged 10, a laborer, aged 50, and a male, of occupation unknown, aged 55, were drowned. A newly-born male infant died of suffocation, and a male infant, aged 11 days, of umbilical hemorrhage. The suicidal deaths were those of a selector, aged 40, who poisoned himself with opium, and of a female, aged 16, and a clerk, aged 61, who drowned themselves.

One hundred and five deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—57 in the Melbourne Hospital, 9 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 7 in the Lying-in Hospital, 9 in the Immigrants' Home, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Receiving House for Destitute Children, and 1 in the Infants' Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 148, of which 79, or 53 per cent., were of males, and 69, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died 110 were under one year of age, 21 were between one and two, 6 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 334. Of these 194, or 58 per cent., were males, and 140, or 42 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 18 were between fifteen and twenty, 24 were between twenty and twenty-five, 26 were between twenty-five and thirty, 20 were between thirty and thirty-five, 19 were between thirty-five and forty, 21 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 30 were between fifty and fifty-five, 25 were between fifty-five and sixty, 28 were between sixty and sixty-five, 17 were between sixty-five and seventy, 26 were between seventy and seventy-five, 9 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 22 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the previous month, deaths from zymotic diseases fell from 63 to 43. Under this head, deaths from measles fell from 2 to *nil*, those from diphtheria from 4 to 2, those from whooping-cough from 5 to 3, those from metria from 3 to 1, those from dysentery and diarrhoea from 9 to 4, and those from alcoholism from 6 to 3. On the other hand, deaths from constitutional diseases rose from 72 to 102, the chief increase being in the deaths from phthisis, which rose from 48 to 65. Only 4 deaths resulted from the effects of child-bearing, which is an unusually small number. As many as 11 such deaths took place in the previous month.

DISTRICT WHERE PUBLICANS' LICENSES MAY BE SPECIALLY GRANTED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein

publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: And whereas by a proclamation bearing date the fourth day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, Cowwar was proclaimed to be a district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to more particularly define the said district: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby define the said district as including the area contained within a radius of three miles from the centre of the township of Cowwar.

No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Maffra has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order subdivide the Shire of Maffra into three several subdivisions or ridings, the boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

EASTERN RIDING.—Commencing at a point where the Avon River intersects the northern boundary of the county of Tanjil; thence southerly by that river to a point due north from the north-eastern angle of George Clarke's selection, being allotment 2 of section 6, parish of Wa-de-lock; thence by a line due south to the said north-eastern angle of said allotment; thence southerly by the Warragul Tom's Creek road to its junction with the Newry to Boisdale road at the eastern angle of allotment 115, parish of Wa-de-lock; thence south-westerly and south by a road to the south-western angle of allotment 35A, said parish; thence east by a road to the Avon River; thence south-easterly along that river to the south-west corner of Raymond's pre-emptive right; thence east to the south-east angle of same; thence northward by the two-chain road, to and passing along the east boundary of the parish of Briagolong, and a line in continuation of such road, to the boundary of the said county of Tanjil; and thence westward along such boundary to the commencing point.

CENTRAL RIDING.—Commencing at the junction of the Macalister and Thomson rivers; thence down the latter river to the western boundary of the parish of Ball, north to its north-west angle, east to the south-east angle of allotment 29A, parish of Bundalagah, north to the north-east angle of allotment 13B, same parish; thence west to the south-east angle of the parish of Wa-de-lock; thence north and east along boundary of said parish to the River Avon; thence north-westerly along the River Avon to the south-east corner of allotment 12, section 5, same parish; thence west by a one-chain road to the south-west angle of allotment 35A of said parish; thence north and easterly by a one-chain road and the Newry to Boisdale road to the junction of the latter with Warragul Tom's Creek road; thence northerly by the latter road to the north-eastern angle of allotment 2, section 6, parish of Wa-de-lock (Clarke's selection); thence by a line due north to the Avon River; thence northerly by that river to its intersection with the boundary of the county of Tanjil; thence westerly along such boundary to its intersection with the Macalister River; and thence southerly by that river to the commencing point.

Wherever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

WATERWORKS TRUST.—LOAN.

WHEREAS by the *Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* it was amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application, or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly: And it was further enacted that, if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations, or additions, or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: and every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should state—

(a.) The amount of money which the Governor in Council would grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same, and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and also the rate of interest which would be charged for such loan, such rate being at least One-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted.

(b.) Should proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks within which such trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District:

(c.) Should state what are the principal works proposed to be constructed: and

(d.) Should contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the now in part recited Act) as according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case the Governor in Council should think fit.

And it was further enacted by the said Act that each Waterworks Trust should consist of commissioners to be elected from time to time by the council of each of the municipal districts which will, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, be directly benefited by the proposed waterworks, and which should be specified in the Order in Council approving the construction of such waterworks or in any subsequent Order, and of one other commissioner who should be appointed by the Governor in Council, and the number of commissioners to be elected by each council not exceeding two should be determined by the Governor in Council: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description as set forth in a certain application of the Municipal Councils of the Shires of Swan Hill, Korong, and St. Arnaud for a Loan of Fifteen thousand six hundred and thirty pounds sterling, to carry out certain waterworks for the supply of a Waterworks District under the said Act, embracing portions of the Shires of Swan Hill, Korong, and St. Arnaud as are shown on the general plan and description accompanying the said application deposited in the Department of Mines and Water Supply, Melbourne, and doth hereby order as follows:—

(1.) The construction of the said waterworks:

(2.) The Waterworks Trust for such Waterworks District hereby constituted shall consist of two members from each of the councils of the municipal districts interested and one other commissioner:

(3.) That the amount of the loan hereby granted shall be Fifteen thousand six hundred and thirty pounds sterling, for the purpose of carrying out the proposed works and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payable half-yearly:

(4.) That the area of the Waterworks District within which such Trust shall have authority shall consist of lands included within the boundaries hereunder described, and being portions of the shires of Swan Hill, Korong, and St. Arnaud (each of which shires or municipal districts will be directly benefited by the proposed waterworks): Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment 23, section 1, parish of Ninneunook; thence west by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 22, section 1, of said parish; thence by a road in a general direction southerly to the south-east angle of allotment 45, section B, of last-named parish; thence by a road in a general direction westerly to the north-east angle of allotment 54, section B, parish of Bunguluke, to the south-west angle of allotment 2, section 3, parish of Wycheproof; thence east by the southern boundary of said allotment 2 to the north-east angle of allotment 16, parish of Teidywaddy; thence southerly by the western boundary

SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA.—"DENNIS' WATER RESERVE."

Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the Reserve for Conservation of Water, in the parish of Boomahnnooonah, known as "Dennis' Water Reserve."

WHEREAS by a regulation of the Board of Land and Works, made on the twenty-eighth day of June One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, the Council of the Shire of Yarrawonga was duly appointed, temporarily, a Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of 5th June 1882, as a site for Conservation of Water, in the parish of Boomahnnooonah, and hereinafter styled "Dennis' Water Reserve": Now therefore the said Council of the Shire of Yarrawonga, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said reserve, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of The Land Act 1869.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in "Dennis' Water Reserve" any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals, without the written authority of the committee of management or their officer duly appointed.
2. No person shall allow any foul or deleterious matter injurious to health to run into, or to be placed within, the said reserve; nor shall any person bathe or wash in or otherwise pollute the water therein.
3. No person shall climb or jump over, or break or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the said reserve, or break or otherwise damage the pumps, troughs, platform, or other appliances attached thereto.

- Orders for interment must be given at the office of the trustees during the day previous to that on which it is intended to take place.
- All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
- Any person making a vault or erecting a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, and upon payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole use of such person and his or her representative for ever.
- Applications for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.
- The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, upon an order signed by a justice of the peace, or on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper or that the friends or relatives of deceased are unable to pay the charges.
- The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
- The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
- The time fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the months from September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. throughout the remainder of the year.
- All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at expense of the owners.
- Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

11. No fencing around any grave to be erected until approved by the trustees.

12. No dogs, horses, or conveyances will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

13. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, and register of all grants, will be kept at the office of the secretary, where they may be inspected.

14. The trustees reserve to themselves the right to make any alterations from time to time in these regulations.

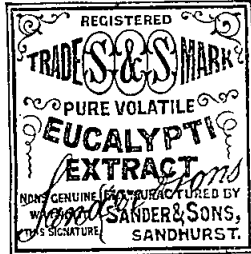

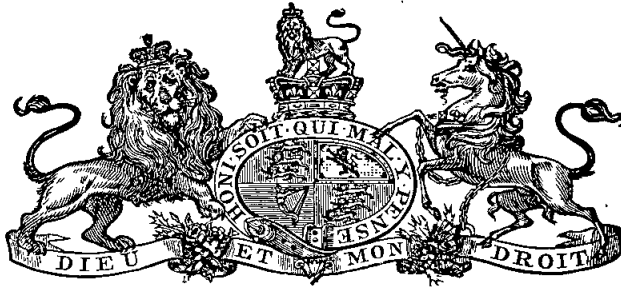

ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

An Act to amend "An Act to define the Boundaries of Bailiwicks."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and in the forty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.
