## FUGITIVE OFFENDERS ACT 1881.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave, of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the twenty-third day of August One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, Her Majesty has been pleased to order that on and after the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, Part II. of the Act of the Imperial Parliament, entitled *The Fugitive Offenders Act 1881* shall apply to the British Possessions therein named, including the Colony of Victoria, and that the Governor of each of the said Possessions shall cause the said Order to be proclaimed: Now therefore I, the Governor of the colony of Victoria, one of the said Possessions, in pursuance of the said Order do hereby proclaim, set forth, and publicly make known in the said colony of Victoria the Order of Her Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-third day of August One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three aforesaid, a copy of which Order, and also Part II. of the Act referred to, is herewith, directing that, on and after the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, Part II. of the Act of the Imperial Parliament entitled *The Fugitive Offenders Act 1881* shall apply to the Colony of Victoria.

Whereas by reason of the contiguity of the Australasian Colonies, including New Zealand and Fiji, and the frequent intercommunication among them, it seems expedient to Her Majesty, and conducive to the better administration of justice therein, that Part II. of *The Fugitive Offenders Act 1881*, should apply to the said Colonies.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by *The Fugitive Offenders Act 1881*, or otherwise, in Her Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

On and after the 1st day of January 1884, Part II. of *The Fugitive Offenders Act 1881*, shall apply to the group of British Possessions hereunder mentioned; that is to say:—

New South Wales,	Victoria,
South Australia,	Queensland,
New Zealand,	Tasmania,
Western Australia, and	Fiji.

2. The Governor of each of the said Possessions shall cause this Order to be proclaimed in the Colony under his government.

FUGITIVE OFFENDERS ACT 1881.—44 AND 45 VICT. CH. 60.—PART II.—INTERCOLONIAL BACKING OF WARRANTS AND OFFENCES.

## APPLICATION OF PART OF ACT.

12. *Application of part of Act to group of British possessions.*—This part of this Act shall apply only to those groups of British possessions to which, by reason of their contiguity or otherwise, it may seem expedient to Her Majesty to apply the same.

It shall be lawful for Her Majesty from time to time, by Order in Council, to direct that this part of this Act shall apply to the group of British possessions mentioned in the Order, and by the same or any subsequent Order, to except certain offences from the application of this part of this Act, and to limit the application of this part of this Act by such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient.

## BACKING OF WARRANTS.

13. *Backing in one British possession of warrant issued in another of same group.*—Where in a British possession of a group to which this part of this Act applies, a warrant has been issued for the apprehension of a person accused of an offence punishable by law in that possession, and such person is or is suspected of being in or on the way to another British possession of the same group, a magistrate in the last-mentioned possession, if satisfied that the warrant was issued by a person having lawful authority to issue the same, may endorse such warrant in manner provided by this Act, and the warrant so endorsed shall be a sufficient authority to apprehend, within the jurisdiction of the endorsing magistrate, the person named in the warrant, and bring him before the endorsing magistrate, or some other magistrate in the same British possession.

14. *Return of prisoner apprehended under backed warrant.*—The magistrate before whom a person so apprehended is brought, if he is satisfied that that the warrant is duly authenticated as directed by this Act, and was issued by a person having lawful authority to issue the same, and is satisfied on oath that the prisoner is the person named or otherwise described in the warrant, may order such prisoner to be returned to the British possession

in which the warrant was issued, and for that purpose to be delivered into the custody of the persons to whom the warrant is addressed, or any one or more of them, and to be held in custody and conveyed by sea or otherwise into the British possession in which the warrant was issued, there to be dealt with according to law as if he had been there apprehended. Such order for return may be made by warrant under the hand of the magistrate making it, and may be executed according to the tenor thereof.

A magistrate shall, so far as is requisite for the exercise of the powers of this section, have the same power, including the power to remand and admit to bail a prisoner, as he has in the case of a person apprehended under a warrant issued by him.

15. *Backing in one British possession of summons, &c., of witness issued in another possession of same group.*—Where a person required to give evidence on behalf of the prosecutor or defendant on a charge for an offence punishable by law in a British possession of a group to which this part of this Act applies, is or is suspected of being in or on his way to any other British possession of the same group, a judge, magistrate, or other officer who would have lawful authority to issue a summons, requiring the attendance of such witness, if the witness were within his jurisdiction, may issue a summons for the attendance of such witness, and a magistrate in any other British possession of the same group, if satisfied that the summons was issued by some judge, magistrate, or officer having lawful authority as aforesaid, may endorse the summons with his name; and the witness, on service in that possession of the summons, so endorsed, and on payment or tender of a reasonable amount for his expenses, shall obey the summons, and in default shall be liable to be tried and punished either in the possession in which he is served or in the possession in which the summons was issued, and shall be liable to the punishment imposed by the law of the possession in which he is tried for the failure of a witness to obey such a summons. The expression "summons" in this section includes any subpoena or other process for requiring the attendance of a witness.

16. *Provisional warrant in group of British possessions.*—A magistrate in a British possession of a group to which this part of this Act applies, before the endorsement in pursuance of this part of this Act of a warrant for the apprehension of any person, may issue a provisional warrant for the apprehension of that person, on such information and under such circumstances as would in his opinion justify the issue of a warrant, if the offence of which such person is accused were an offence punishable by the law of the said possession, and had been committed within his jurisdiction; and such warrant may be backed and executed accordingly; provided that a person arrested under such provisional warrant shall be discharged unless the original warrant is produced and endorsed, within such reasonable time as may under the circumstances seem requisite.

17. *Discharge of prisoner not returned within one month to British possession of same group.*—If a prisoner in a British possession, whose return is authorized in pursuance of this part of this Act, is not conveyed out of that possession within one month after the date of the warrant ordering his return, a magistrate or a superior court, upon application by or on behalf of the prisoner, and upon proof that reasonable notice of the intention to make such application has been given to the person holding the warrant and to the chief officer of the police of such possession, or of the province or town where the prisoner is in custody, may, unless sufficient cause is shown to the contrary, order such prisoner to be discharged out of custody.

Any order or refusal to make an order of discharge by a magistrate, under this section, shall be subject to appeal to a superior court.

18. *Sending back of prisoners, not prosecuted or acquitted, to British possession of same group.*—Where a prisoner accused of an offence is returned, in pursuance of this part of this Act, to a British possession, and either is not prosecuted for the said offence within six months after his arrival in that possession, or is acquitted of the said offence, the Governor of that possession, if he thinks fit, may, on the requisition of such person, cause him to be sent back, free of cost, and with as little delay as possible, to the British possession in or on his way to which he was apprehended.

19. *Refusal to return prisoner where offence too trivial.*—Where the return of a prisoner is sought or ordered under this part of this Act, and it is made to appear to a magistrate or to a superior court that by reason of the trivial nature of the case, or by reason of the application for the return of such prisoner not being made in good faith in the interests of justice or otherwise, it would, having regard to the distance, to the facilities of communication, and to all the circumstances of the case, be unjust or oppressive, or too severe a punishment, to return the prisoner either at all or until the expiration of a certain period, the court or magistrate may discharge the prisoner either absolutely or on bail, or order that he shall not be returned until after the expiration of the period named in the order, or may make such other order in the premises as to the magistrate or court seems just.

Any order or refusal to make an order of discharge by a magistrate under this section shall be subject to an appeal to a superior court.

# GRANT TO THE VICTORIAN RIFLE ASSOCIATION. CONDITIONS TO BE OBSERVED IN THE EXPENDITURE OF THE GRANT TO THE VICTORIAN RIFLE ASSOCIATION FOR THE YEAR 1883-84.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the following Conditions to be observed in the Expenditure of the Grant to the Victorian Rifle Association for the year 1883-84:—

1. Any member of the Local Forces of Victoria who shall, in the opinion of the Commandant, have presented himself to shoot on any rifle range in Victoria, with a Government Martini-Henry rifle or carbine, the sights of which have been altered or tampered with, or to fire in any match or competition with a Government rifle, any portion of which has been altered contrary to regulations, shall be disqualified from taking any prize and from competing in any match under the direction of the Victorian Rifle Association for a period of twelve (12) months.
2. In matches restricted to members of the Local Forces of Victoria, and in all matches depending upon the aggregate scores made in two or more of those matches, prizes shall be awarded only to those who were "effective," as per Regulations, for their respective branches of the service at the last preceding classification, and who from that period up to the time of firing had attended an average number of parades and drills sufficient, if continued, to render them "effective" on the 1st July following.
3. In the case of members of the local forces joining for the first time after the 31st March, an average monthly performance of duty from the time of their joining to the date of the matches sufficient, if continued, to render them "effective" on the 1st July next following, shall render them eligible to be prize-takers.
4. Former members of the local forces, who had resigned, and whose names have not been on the roll of any corps during the twelve (12) months ended 30th June preceding the matches shall, on rejoining, be deemed new members joining for the first time.
5. In cases of sickness, members of the local forces having applied for and obtained leave of absence, shall, on presenting a medical certificate, be eligible as prize-takers, provided they were unable to render themselves "effective" during the remainder of the year, reckoning the time both before and after their illness.
6. Notwithstanding anything contained in the above regulations, where members of the local forces, who were "effective" on the 1st July 1883, have since attended a sufficient average number of drills per month to have been "effective," had the required number of men been in attendance to form a parade, the conditions of effectiveness shall be deemed to have been complied with.

# DIRECTIONS FOR ENTERING THE BULLER RIVER.

The following particulars respecting change of position of signal-staff at Westport, furnished by the Harbor-master at that port, are published for general information.

The flagstaff has been removed half-a-mile seaward of its former position, and now stands on the South Spit, on the south side of entrance to the river. The directions for crossing the bar and entering the river are the same as heretofore, namely:—

The leading beacon, surmounted by a pole bearing a red flag (at tide-time) during the day, and the flagstaff in one, leads over the bar.

During the night (at tide-time) a red light is shown on the leading beacon. This is to be kept in one with the harbor light (white) on the flagstaff until the bar is crossed and the river fairly entered, which will be known by two red lights being seen. Those lights lead up the river, in deepest water, to the stone groyne, about a mile inside the bar, where the front red light is placed. Before reaching this point, however, two green lights will be visible. These green lights lead up the river to the top wharf from mid-channel off S.W. end of stone groyne.

When the bar is crossed during the day, the fairway up to stone groyne is marked by two triangular-shaped beacons—front beacon painted white, and back beacon a black band across centre; and at the top wharf by two white beacons, surmounted by a circle and triangle, the latter at back.

The harbor light (white) is exhibited on flagstaff from sunset to sunrise, at an elevation of some 50 feet above sea-level, and can be seen about five miles in clear weather from an ordinary vessel's deck.

Masters of sailing vessels must not attempt to sail in during the night when the red light is shown, that light being for steamers only, or sailing vessels in tow of a steamer. All masters are cautioned not to take the bar until the proper signal (four balls, horizontal on yard) is shown to do so. Steam and sailing vessels have got into trouble by going in opposition to these instructions.

A red flag is shown at the masthead of flagstaff during thick or dirty weather, in addition to the balls, when the bar is safe to cross. The commercial code of signals is used at the signal station.

The flagstaff yard, signal-balls, and leading beacons are painted white.

High-water at full and change ten hours twenty minutes; springs rise 9 feet 6 inches, neaps rise 5 feet 6 inches on the bar. Shipmasters are cautioned not to take the bar during the night until the red light is shown in conjunction with the harbor light (white). Any colored lights visible are merely leading river lights not connected with the bar or entrance from seaward.

#### SHIRE OF STAWELL (NORTH-EAST RIDING) WATERWORKS TRUST REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Shire of Stawell (North-east Riding) Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 44 of the *Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, do make the following Regulations, viz.:-

##### No. 1.

#### REGULATIONS AS TO ORDINARY AND SPECIAL MEETINGS.

**Ordinary meetings.**—The ordinary meeting of the Commissioners shall be held at the Shire Hall, Stawell, on the first Tuesday in each month, at the hour of twelve o'clock noon, and such meetings may be adjourned from time to time if the commissioners see fit.

**2. Special meetings.**—The commissioners may hold special meetings, and the chairman or any three or more of the commissioners may call a special meeting, but no such special meeting shall be held unless four clear days' notice thereof at least be given to each commissioner, and no business shall be transacted at any special meeting except such as is stated in the notice thereof.

**3. Resolutions, how revoked.**—No resolution at any meeting of the trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless notice of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given to each of the commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the commissioners present at such subsequent meeting; if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

##### No. 2.

#### REGULATIONS OF PROCEEDINGS OF MEETINGS OF THE SHIRE OF STAWELL (NORTH-EAST RIDING) WATERWORKS TRUST OFFICERS, ETC.

**1. General conduct of business.**—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the trust.

**2. Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.**—At every meeting of the trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and

the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the chairman; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the trust at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting.

**3. Order of business at meetings.**—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follow, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but for the greater convenience of the trust at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the trust.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions, of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notice of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

**4. Divisions.**—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any commissioner, the commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

**5. Addresses to Governor.**—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the secretary of the trust, unless otherwise ordered by the trust.

**6. Motions.**—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the secretary at the close of the meeting of the trust, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of the trust; and such secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

**7. Notice of motion to be given.**—No commissioner shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

**8. Petitions.**—No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of the trust after that at which it has been presented.

**9. Motions to be moved in order in motion book.**—Except by leave of the trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

**10. Motion to be proceeded with by commissioner giving same, except with consent.**—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

**11. Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.**—No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

**12. Order, &c., of debate.**—Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chair, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

**13. Nature of motion to be stated.**—Any commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the trust thereon.

**14. Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.**—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the trust.

**15. Motion to be seconded.**—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the trust unless it be seconded, but a commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

**16. Mover of motion.**—A commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

**17. Designation of commissioners.**—The commissioners, in meeting of trust, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of chairman or commissioner, as the case may require.

**18. Priority of commissioners.**—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

**19. Chairman to rise in addressing trust.**—The chairman shall rise in addressing the trust to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

**20. Commissioner not to speak a second time on same question.**—No commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

**21. Points of order.**—The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

**22. Commissioners not to digress, &c.**—No commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion,



or comment upon the words used by any other commissioner in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. *Commissioners to apologise for disorderly, &c., expressions.*—Whenever any commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the trust.

24. *Commissioner called to order to sit down.*—A commissioner called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

25. *Commissioner twice offending guilty of an offence.*—Any commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologise for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. *Strangers.*—Any person, not being a commissioner, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and he shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. *Commissioners not attending order for call.*—Any commissioner not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole trust, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

28. *Commissioners may demand documents.*—Any commissioner may, of right, demand the production of any of the documents of the trust applying to the question under discussion.

29. *Voting.*—The trust shall vote by show of hands, and any commissioner present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. *Question, how declared.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the trust, put the question first in the affirmative then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. *Motions, &c., to be in writing.*—At every meeting of the trust all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. *No second amendment until previous one disposed of.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

33. *Effect of rejection of original motion.*—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. *If amendment be negatived a second one may be moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the trust for discussion at a time.

35. *Mover of motion to have right of reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. *Motion for adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the trust, but, if on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

37. *Protests.*—Any commissioner may protest against any resolution of the trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered, three days at least, before the next ordinary meeting of the trust by the protesting commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary and signed by such commissioner, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the trust.

38. *Lapsed questions.*—If a debate on any motion, moved and seconded, be interrupted by the number of the commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

39. *Lapsed order of the day may be restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

40. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute book, and, being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the trust; and the secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

41. *Meetings of the committee.*—The secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the trust, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee, or of any two members of the committee.

42. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day,

43. *Petitions to be respectful.*—It shall be incumbent on every commissioner presenting a petition, to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the trust, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision hereof.

44. *Commissioners to affix their names.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the trust, shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

45. *Petitions to be in writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

46. *To be signed by petitioners.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

47. *No letters, &c., to be attached.*—No letters, affidavits, or other documents, shall be attached to any petition.

48. *Commissioners confined to statement of certain facts.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the trust, shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

49. *Appointment of officers, &c.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the trust shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given, by advertisement, in one or more newspapers circulating in the waterworks district, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

50. *Salaries of officers, &c.*—The salary or allowance attached to all officers and places at the disposal of the trust shall, in all cases, be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

51. *No commissioner, &c., to be surety for officer.*—No commissioner or officer of the trust, and no assessor or auditor of the trust shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the trust, or for any work to be done for the trust.

52. *Expense of preparing security.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

53. *Suspension of rules.*—Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this sub-division may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended, except by a unanimous vote of the trust.

54. *Penalty.*—If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance, or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this sub-division, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

55. *Bank account and signing cheques.*—All moneys of the trust, amounting to twenty pounds and upwards, shall, within seventy-two hours, or such shorter period as the trust may direct, after they have come to the hands of the proper officer of the trust, be paid into such bank, and in such manner as the trust shall from time to time appoint and direct for that purpose; and no such money shall be drawn out of such bank, save by cheque signed by any three commissioners authorized from time to time by the trust in that behalf, and countersigned by the secretary.

### NO. 3.

#### REGULATIONS AS TO WATERWORKS, DRAINS, ETC.

1. *Polluting water, reservoir, &c.*—Whosoever shall bathe in any stream, reservoir, conduit, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to or under the management or control of the trust, or shall wash, cleanse, throw, or cause to enter therein any animal, whether alive or dead, or any rubbish, filth, stuff, or thing of any kind whatsoever, or shall cause or permit or suffer to run or be brought therein the water of any sink, sewer, drain, engine or boiler, or other filthy, unwholesome or impure water, or shall do anything whatsoever whereby any water or waterworks belonging to the trust or under their management or control shall be fouled, obstructed, or damaged, shall for every such offence forfeit, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

2. *Wilful waste of water.*—Whosoever being supplied with water by the trust from any waterworks of or belonging to or under the control or management of the trust, or having access to any such waterworks for the taking of water therefrom, shall wilfully or negligently suffer any water to run to waste from any pipe or conduit from or by which he shall be so supplied, or to which he shall have such access shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

3. *Damming up water without consent.*—Whosoever shall without the consent, in writing, of the trust, construct or place any dam or embankment in or across any river, creek, or natural watercourse, or permanently obstruct the same in any way shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

4. *Diverting water from reservoirs of trust in certain cases.*—In any case in which the trust have the exclusive right of collecting, for the supply of any reservoir or waterworks belonging to the trust or under their management or control, the stormwater having fallen on any gathering ground, whosoever shall by any means whatsoever divert any such water from the course of its natural flow so that the same shall tend to flow elsewhere than to such reservoir or waterworks, or some watercourse leading thereto, or shall flow to the same respectively in a foul state, shall forfeit, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

5. *Shooting or faking in or near reservoirs.*—It shall be lawful for the trust, from time to time, to make regulations for prohibiting or regulating the shooting of waterfowl and the taking of fish upon, or in, or within one-quarter of a mile of any stream,

reservoir, or other waterworks belonging to or under the management or control of the trust; and every person who shall offend contrary to any such regulation shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding *Five pounds*.

6. *Obstructing, &c., culverts, &c.*—Whoever shall obstruct or damage any culvert, sewer, or drain belonging to or under the control of the trust shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding *Five pounds*.

The foregoing regulations, numbered One, Two, and Three, were made by the Commissioners of the Shire of Stawell (North-east Riding) Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of Section 44 of the *Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, this second day of October 1883.

WHEREAS by *The Juries Statute 1876* (No. 560) it was amongst other things enacted that on any Court of Assize or of General Sessions or any County Court being appointed to be newly held, the Clerk of the Court of Petty Sessions held at or nearest to the Court House of such Assize, Sessions, or County Court town, and the clerks of all courts held elsewhere within the jury district of such Assize, Sessions, or County Court town, and all clerks, constables, sheriffs, and Courts of Petty Sessions should, in manner therein provided, and at and within the times and intervals which the Governor in Council should order, do, with respect to that district, all acts and things therein required to be by any clerk, constable, sheriff, or Court of Petty Sessions ordinarily done with respect to a jury district; and all jurors' books made out under the now reciting section should be brought into use, and the persons whose names were therein set down should be liable to serve immediately after such books should have been so made out; and the said books should be used until new books should have been completed under the provisions thereinbefore contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order the undermentioned times and intervals at and within which the provisions of Part III. of the said Statute are to be carried out with respect to the Jury District of the County Court appointed to be held at Nhill, that is to say:—

Section 18.—The Clerk of Petty Sessions to issue his warrant to constable before the 5th day of November next.

Section 19.—Compiler to prepare his list before the 19th day of November next.

Section 20.—Compiler to transmit list to the Sheriff by the 21st November, and Sheriff to return the same by the 24th day of November next.

Section 21.—Compiler to post notices, and permit list to be inspected to 8th December next.

Section 22.—Revision Court to be held on the 14th day of December next.

Section 23.—Jury books to be made up and brought into use before 2nd January 1884.

And the Honorable George Briscoe Kerferd, in the place of Her Majesty's Minister of Justice for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein

publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation dated the third day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty three, proclaiming an area of half a mile radius around the Mitiamo Railway Station a district where publicans' licenses may be specially granted, under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act.

The births of 831 children, viz., 415 boys and 416 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of September. In the month of August 1011 births were registered, or 180 more than in the month under review. The births were 74 above the average of the previous nine years, but 11 below that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in September numbered 395, viz., 234 of males, and 161 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 436. The deaths were fewer than those in August by 72, but exceeded the average of September during the previous ten years by 23. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than the average of those ten years by 23.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 2·85, and of deaths registered 1·35.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 76·2° on the 11th, and the lowest was 36·4° on the 29th. The mean temperature of the month (52·5°) was nearly a third of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (29·9°) took place on the 29th, viz., from a maximum of 66·3° to a minimum of 36·4°. The least range (5·8°) occurred both on the 12th and 13th, viz., in the first instance from a maximum of 55·2° to a minimum of 49·4°, and in the second from a maximum of 55·8° to a minimum of 50·0°. The mean daily range was 17·1°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29·929 inches) was about the average.

Males contributed 59 per cent., and females 41 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 32 per cent. to that mortality as against 33 per cent. in September 1882; 28 per cent. in September 1881; 36 per cent. in September 1880; 31 per cent. in September 1879; 30 per cent. in September 1878; 38 per cent. in September 1877; 28 per cent. in September 1876; 35 per cent. in September 1875; 25 per cent. in September 1874; and 36 per cent. in September 1873.

As many as 28 persons died during the month at the age of 75 years or upwards, viz.:—A laborer, aged 76, who died of "Bright's disease"; a laborer, aged 78, of cancer; a galvanist, aged 77, a female, aged 80, and a gardener, aged 82, of paralysis; a carpenter, aged 75, an undertaker, aged 79; a miner, aged 79; a gentleman, aged 83, and a female, aged 84, of heart disease; 2 females, aged 79 and 85 respectively, of bronchitis; a timber merchant, aged 79, of stomach disease; a female, aged 82, of erysipelas; a laborer, aged 82, of asthma; a printer, aged 75, a gardener and a female, each aged 83, and a farmer, aged 85, of congestion of the lungs; a female, aged 77, a male dealer, aged 78, a shepherd, aged 78, a merchant, aged 79, a bootmaker, aged 79, a female, aged 80, a female, aged 83, a female, aged 84, and a male of occupation unstated, aged 95, of old age.

Twenty-eight deaths were ascribed to external causes, of which 25 were set down to accident and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male child, aged 4, and a girl, aged 6, died of injuries resulting from being passed over by drays; a male servant, aged 15, of laceration of the brain, caused by a fall from a horse; a carpenter, aged 49, of fracture of the thigh, caused by a fall from a cab; a cordial maker, aged 31, of injuries received by being thrown from a cart; a contractor, aged 45, of concussion of the brain, caused by the fall of a building; a miner, aged 54, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall down a shaft; a laborer, aged 58, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall in the street; a boy, aged 5, a girl, aged 6, 2 boys, aged 8 and 9 respectively, a girl, aged 11 were burnt to death in a dwelling house and a female, aged 62, died of sunstroke; a female child, aged 3, died of alcoholic poisoning; a railway guard, aged 31, of the effects of chloral, on a stomach weakened by intemperance; and a carpenter, aged 55, of the inhalation of chloroform improperly administered. A female, aged 17, a laborer, aged 33, a fireman, aged 38, and a male, of occupation unknown, aged 58, were drowned in the Yarra; a boy, aged 9, and a grocer, aged 30, were found drowned; a female infant was found dead, the cause of death being asphyxia; a gatekeeper, aged 47, died of a shock, caused by falling into the river. The suicidal deaths were those of a female, aged 32, who cut her throat; a female, aged 45, who drowned herself; and a collector, aged 61, who strangled himself with a rope, he being at the time of unsound mind.

Eighty-eight deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—37 in the Melbourne Hospital, 5 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 7 in the Lying-in Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 13 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Industrial Schools, 1 in the Eye Hospital, and 2 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 125, of which 71, or 57 per cent., were of males, and 54, or 43 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 102 were under one year of age, 7 were between one and two, 9 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 270. Of these, 163, or 60 per cent., were males, and 107, or 40 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 12 were between ten and fifteen, 10 were between fifteen and twenty, 13 were between twenty and twenty-five, 20 were between twenty-five and thirty, 15 were between thirty and thirty-five, 15 were between thirty-five and forty, 20 were between forty and forty-five, 25 were between forty-five and fifty, 27 were between fifty and fifty-five, 26 were between fifty-five and sixty, 19 were between sixty and sixty-five, 12 were between sixty-five and seventy, 14 were between seventy and seventy-five, 14 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 14 were upwards of eighty.

The number of deaths from zymotic diseases, viz., 39 was the same as in the previous month, in the report for which the number was stated to be the lowest since September 1872. Childbirth proved fatal in four instances during the month under view, the proportion being 1 death of a mother to every 208 infants born alive. Under the head of constitutional diseases, deaths from cancer fell from 17, in August, to 11, and deaths from phthisis fell from 62 to 59.

### TALBOT AND CLUNES BOROUGHES AND TALBOT SHIRE WEIGHTS AND MEASURES DISTRICT.

#### BYE-LAW No. 1.

A BYE-LAW made under section 30 of the "Weights and Measures Statute 1864," and numbered "One," for regulating the meetings for the transaction of the business of the union, appointment of chairman, &c., and fixing the amount of fees to be paid to the inspector for examining and comparing weights and measures within the said union.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Weights and Measures Statute 1864 the Councils of the Borough and Shire of Talbot and Borough of Clunes, proclaimed under the said Statute to be a union for the purposes of the said Act, order as follows:—

1. *Ordinary meetings.*—That the union shall hold quarterly meetings in the months of March, June, September, and December, for the transaction of general business at the Borough Hall, Talbot, and Town Hall, Clunes, alternately at each place; and the chairman and secretary shall have power to fix the days and hours at which such meetings shall be held.

2. *Special meetings.*—Two members of the union or the secretary shall have power to call special meetings for the transaction

of special business. No meeting of the union shall be held unless six clear days' notice thereof at least be given to each of the members of said union.

3. *Election of chairman.*—On the day of the September quarterly meeting in each year, the members present shall proceed to the election of a chairman.

4. *Quorum.*—All powers vested in the union may be exercised at any legally constituted meeting by any five members present, and no business shall be transacted at any meeting of the union unless the said number of members be respectively present.

5. *Adjournment of meetings.*—The members present at any meeting may from time to time adjourn such meeting, and if, at any meeting of the union, there be not present within half-an-hour after the time appointed for holding such meetings the number of members hereby authorized to exercise the powers vested in the union, the members present, or the major part of them, or any one member, if only one be present, or the secretary, if no member be present, may adjourn such meeting to any time not further distant than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment.

6. *Fees for comparison.*—The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector of Weights and Measures for the time being for the said union for comparing any weights, measures, scales, balances, steelyards, beams, or other weighing machines with the authorized copies of the standard weights and measures in his possession, according to the said Act, that is to say:—

8. The inspector shall attend at the Town Hall, Talbot, three times in each year, and at the Town Hall, Clunes, three times in each year, for the purpose of making the said comparison, on such days and at such hours as the union may appoint.

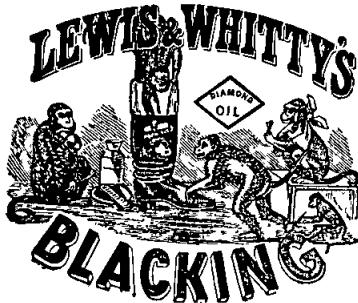
