The births of 712 children, viz., 350 boys and 362 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of December. In the month of November, 827 births were registered, or 115 more than in the month under review. The births were 59 above the average of the previous eight years, but 8 below that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in December numbered 581, viz., 321 of males and 260 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 131. The deaths outnumbered those in November by 3, and were above the average of December during the previous ten years by 75. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by only 10.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.50, and of deaths registered 2.04.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 96.2° on the 28th, and the lowest was 47.1° on the 1st. The mean temperature of the month (63.0°) was slightly above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (37.9°) took place on the 27th, viz., from a maximum of 92.1° to a minimum of 54.2°. The least range (7.1°) was on the 29th, viz., from a maximum of 61.1° to a minimum of 54.0°. The mean daily range was 21.6°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.787 inches) was a fraction below the average.

The proportion of deaths of males to the total mortality of the month was 55 per cent., and that of deaths of females was 45 per cent. The proportion of children dying under 5 years of age was 48 per cent. as against 51 per cent. in December 1881; 42 per cent. in December 1880; 46 per cent. in December 1879; 48 per cent. in December 1878; 50 per cent. in December 1877; 46 per cent. in December 1876; 45 per cent. in December 1875; 60 per cent. in December 1874; 45 per cent. in December 1873; and 55 per cent. in December 1872.

The deaths of twenty persons who had attained the age of 75 years or upwards were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a bootmaker, aged 76, who died of dysentery; a male servant and a female, each aged 76, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 78, of diabetes; a female music teacher, aged 79, of cancer; a female, aged 82, of apoplexy; a watchmaker, aged 84, of erysipelas; a gentleman, aged 89, of catarrh; a laborer and a female, each aged 75; a carpenter, aged 77; a schoolmaster and a female, each aged 78; a gentleman and a fruit vendor, each aged 81; a gardener, aged 82, a female aged, 83; a shepherd, aged 84; a widow, aged 86; and a gentleman, aged 92, of old age.

Twenty-six deaths were due to external causes during the month, of which 23 were set down to accident, and 3 to homicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A female child, aged 2, was killed, a dray-wheel passing over her head; a watchmaker, aged 18, died of peritonitis, resulting from the bicycle he was riding coming into contact with a cart; a laborer, aged

25, of injury to the knee whilst sheep shearing; a laborer, aged 29, of injury to the head; a cabman, aged 56, of injury to the spine and a blacksmith, aged 63, of fracture of skull—all the result of falls; a nurse, aged 69, died of injury to the spine, caused by a slip which twisted her back; a gentleman, aged 72, was knocked down by a cart and killed; a boy, aged 11, was shot by accident; a male child, aged 1, died of scalds; a female, aged 40, was burnt to death in a dwelling-house; 2 boys, aged 7 and 14 respectively, died of sunstroke; and a confectioner, aged 55, of lead poisoning. A female child, aged 1, a boy aged 6, and a seaman, aged 15, were drowned—the latter whilst bathing. A schoolboy, aged 8, a female, aged 17, 2 males, of occupation unstated, aged 28 and 40 respectively, and a bank manager, aged 57, were found drowned. A female infant, aged 8 days, died of umbilical hemorrhage. The homicidal deaths were those of a seaman, aged 34, who was shot in the head and neck, verdict of wilful murder against his assailant; a caretaker of the Wesleyan Church, aged 54, who was killed by a collision between two trains on the Hawthorn line of railway—a verdict of manslaughter against stationmaster and guard; and a dressmaker, aged 41, who died of abortion criminally procured, verdict of manslaughter brought in against one Elizabeth Taylor.

One hundred and twelve deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—43 in the Melbourne Hospital, 17 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 7 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Lying-in Hospital, 11 in the Immigrants' Home, 8 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Austin Hospital for Incurables, 3 in the Industrial Schools, and 2 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 279, of which 141, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 138, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 239 were under one year of age, 27 were between one and two, 6 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 302. Of these 180, or 60 per cent., were males, and 122, or 40 per cent., were females; 21 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 17 were between fifteen and twenty, 22 were between twenty and twenty-five, 27 were between twenty-five and thirty, 18 were between thirty and thirty-five, 15 were between thirty-five and forty, 24 were between forty and forty-five, 29 were between forty-five and fifty, 29 were between fifty and fifty-five, 17 were between fifty-five and sixty, 23 were between sixty and sixty-five, 13 were between sixty-five and seventy, 23 were between seventy and seventy-five, 10 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 10 were upwards of eighty, and 1 was unspecified.

As compared with the previous month, deaths from zymotic diseases increased from 119 to 163. Under this head deaths from typhoid fever, rose from 5 to 11; those from dysentery and diarrhoea, from 79 to 105; and those from want of breastmilk, from 5 to 18. Under the constitutional head deaths from cancer, increased from 17 to 20; but deaths from tumor, fell from 4 to 1; those from scrofula, from 8 to nil; and those from phthisis, from 55 to 50.

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

# GRANTS FOR AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES AND FOR PARKS AND GARDENS, 1882-3.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named grants, viz. :—

## AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Six thousand pounds (£6,000), granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies, 1882-3.

1. Each society shall furnish to the Acting Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 20th February 1883, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.

2. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement so verified, the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to two-thirds of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to), on condition that this sum do not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

3. Of the whole grant (£6,000), a sum not exceeding Five thousand five hundred pounds shall be so divided; and if the sums claimable be in excess of this amount they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. A sum not exceeding Five hundred pounds shall be paid to the Bendigo Agricultural and Horticultural Society towards the expenses of its spring show, held on the 25th and 26th October 1882, under the patronage of the Department of Agriculture.

5. No society located within twenty miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such society as hereinbefore specified amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least.

### Instructions.

1. The blank spaces in the Declaration Form E for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations between the 1st January 1882 and the 31st December 1882 must be filled up in words as well as in figures; and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account is then to be prepared by making the Government Dr. for two-thirds of the amount declared to have been awarded and paid in prizes, if the members' subscriptions and private donations were not less than two-thirds. If the members' subscriptions and private donations were, however, less than two-thirds of the amount awarded and paid in prizes, the amount of the claim must be made equal to the amount of the members' subscriptions and private donations.

3. The account must be signed by the treasurer and be countersigned by the president or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management; it should then be returned to the Acting Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne, with the declaration and statements appended.

[It may expedite the payment of the money to fill in at the top of the account the name of the nearest pay office in the space left blank for the purpose. It is also necessary to bear in mind that, if that space should not be filled up, the account will be payable at Melbourne only. A form of order on the Treasury deputing another person to draw the amount granted is appended in case it may be wanted.]

4. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize-moneys paid, unless such cups have been finally awarded.

NOTE.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

### PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

Regulations in connection with the Vote of Four thousand pounds (£4,000) for Fencing and Improving Public Parks and Gardens under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c.

1. A sum not exceeding Ten shillings shall be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of

roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 1st January 1882 and 31st December 1882, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Acting Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 27th February 1883. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st of January 1882 and 31st December 1882; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January 1882.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1882 (*vide* form A), and a sum equal to one-half of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the vote they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. In every case in which a claim sent in is deemed unsatisfactory, an officer of the department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused, the claim shall be disallowed.

5. Moneys expended in street planting must not be included in any claim upon the vote.

6. The foregoing shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melbourne, nor to the Botanical Garden of Geelong.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE NORTH OVENS COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 1st day of April 1879, the Council of the Shire of North Ovens, having drafted the following Regulations for the management of the North Ovens Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council.

## Regulations.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations, the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, stags, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.
2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.
3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be paid half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of October in every year:—

4. Sheep, other than travelling sheep, shall only be allowed to depasture on such part or parts of the common as may be set apart by the managers for that purpose.
5. No bull or entire horse will be allowed on the common without the written sanction of the managers first obtained.
6. The herdsman of the common shall attend on the seven days immediately preceding the first day of each half-year, at a place to be named, for the purpose of registering cattle and receiving fees; and due notice of such attendance, and the time and place thereof, shall be given by the managers.

7. All persons taking cattle to depasture shall deliver them into the charge of the herdsman at the time and place appointed as aforesaid, together with a written statement of the number and brands of such cattle; and the herdsman shall, on receiving the fees payable on such cattle, give a receipt for the same on behalf of the managers; and shall forthwith, with the assistance of the owner or person in charge, brand such cattle in a conspicuous place with the common brand, which shall be of pitch or tar; and such brand shall be renewed whenever necessary, so as to be plainly legible during the whole period that such cattle depasture on the common.
8. On presentation of the before-mentioned receipt the managers shall deliver, or cause to be delivered, to the person named therein, a license for the period specified.
9. No cattle registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the common, unless notice of intention to remove same be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the cattle removed.
10. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of any cattle from the common.
11. The managers may grant to butchers or slaughtermen special licenses to depasture, for such periods of time as may be agreed upon, cattle intended for slaughter, on the following terms, viz.:—Large cattle (not to exceed fifteen (15) in number), Sixpence per head per week, to be paid in advance.
12. The herdsman shall impound all cattle not branded with the common brand trespassing on the common, and keep correct accounts of the same, so that the fees arising therefrom may be properly accounted for; and all fees arising from this source shall go to the credit of the common account.
13. All stock on which the prescribed fees shall not have been paid within ten days after date for renewal of license, shall be deemed to be trespassing and be liable to be impounded.
14. All carcasses found on the common which the owner or owners thereof may refuse or neglect to remove, after receiving twenty-four hours' notice, in writing, from the managers or herdsman, the managers or herdsman shall have power to remove, or cause to be removed or destroyed by burning or otherwise, at the expense of such owner or owners.
15. No animal affected with any disease shall be allowed on the common; and as soon as the herdsman shall discover any registered cattle on the common infected with any disease, he shall forthwith give notice thereof to the owner of such cattle, to the nearest inspector of stock having jurisdiction in the district in which the common is situated, and to the managers of the common.
16. Every person offending against any of these regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

## BOROUGH OF ARARAT.

## BYE-LAW, MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

**THE** Council of the Borough of Ararat doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872, make the following rate for one year from the 1st day of January 1883, that is to say:—

1. The rates and charges hereafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the council otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes:—

i. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £10 and under, the annual sum of Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation, and that Ten shillings be the minimum.

ii. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10, and not exceeding £14, the annual sum of Nine pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

iii. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £14, and not exceeding £19, the annual sum of Eight pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

iv. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £19, and not exceeding £29, the annual sum of Seven pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

v. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £29, and not exceeding £39, the annual sum of Six pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

vi. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £39, and not exceeding £49, the annual sum of Six pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

vii. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £49, and not exceeding £59, the annual sum of Five pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

viii. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £59, and not exceeding £250, the annual sum of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

ix. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £250, and not exceeding £300, the annual sum of Four pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

x. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £300 and over, the annual sum of Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

xi. Water supplied at stand pipes, One shilling per load of 120 gallons.

xii. Water for steam-boilers to be charged at the rate of 20s. per annum on each inch measurement of the cylinder of the engine. If not attached to an engine, a special rate to be agreed on.

xiii. Gardens to be charged at the following rates:—

One-fourth of an acre ... 20s. per annum.

One-half of an acre ... 40s. per annum.

Three-quarters of an acre ... 50s. per annum.

One acre ... 60s. per annum.

And at the rate of 60s. per acre for each additional acre.

xiv. Water supplied for mining purposes at 5s. per day, from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., and notice must be given to the town clerk the number of days required; part of a day not allowed for.

2. The council may cause meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, such meter to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for at rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallons over and above the amount for which they are rated. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering (1,000,000) one million gallons.

3. If any meter should cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repairs, the council shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

4. Any person receiving water from the council who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the council who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the council, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the council, he shall obtain from the council a license in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

7. Before any such license shall be granted by the council the person applying for same shall satisfy the council that he is a competent plumber, and pay the annual sum of Five shillings as the fee for such license. The council shall have the power of cancelling such license at any time.

8. Any person whether licensed as aforesaid or not who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the council, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the council without the permission in writing of the council being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

9. Any person whether licensed as aforesaid or not who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the council without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the council, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of

the council, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the council of a strength and material not sanctioned by the council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council. Wrought iron and lead piping of approved quality only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services. No service of a larger bore than  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the council.

10. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the council into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the council that such service-pipe requires repairing, the council may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as the said council may seem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any) and if none the owner shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

11. Any person supplied with water by the council who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

12. Any person whether licensed as aforesaid or not connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

13. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

14. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

15. If any person supplied with water by the council does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the council may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

16. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose except under the directions of the officers of the council shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

17. In the construction of this bye-law the word "council" shall mean the Borough Council of Ararat.

All bye-laws heretofore made relating to the Ararat Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed except as to anything done or committed, or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder.
