FRIDAY THE 9TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Warrnacknabeal, Minyip, Murtoa, and Dimboola;

TUESDAY THE 13TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Avenel.
