SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your government, a copy of a letter from the Foreign Office, enclosing an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the 16th of December 1882, for giving effect to the Treaty between this country and the Republic of Salvador, signed on the 23rd of June 1881, for the mutual surrender of Fugitive Criminals.

SIR,—I am directed by Earl Granville to transmit to you, to be laid before the Earl of Derby, copies of *The London Gazette* of the 2nd instant, publishing an Order of Her Majesty in Council for carrying into effect the Extradition Treaty between Great Britain and Salvador, signed on the 23rd June 1881, the ratifications of which were exchanged at London on the 8th of November last.

The Treaty will come into operation in the United Kingdom on the 13th instant.

At the Court at Windsor, the 16th day of December 1882.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty.

His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught and Strathearn.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts 1870 and 1873, it was amongst other things enacted, that where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender of such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the twenty-third day of June, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, between Her Majesty and the President of the Republic of Salvador, for the Mutual Extradition of Fugitive Criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

"Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and His Excellency the President of the Republic of Salvador, having judged it expedient, with a view to the better administration of justice and to the prevention of crime within the two countries and their jurisdictions, that persons charged with or convicted of the crimes or offences hereinafter enumerated, and being fugitives from justice, should, under certain circumstances, be reciprocally delivered up, have named as their Plenipotentiaries to conclude a Treaty (that is to say):—

"Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, the Right Honorable Richard Bickerton Pemell, Lord Lyons, a Peer of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, one of Her Britannic Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, and Her Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the French Republic;

"And His Excellency the President of the Republic of Salvador, Señor Don José María Torres-Calcado, Minister Plenipotentiary of the Republic of Salvador to Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Grand Officer of the Legion of Honour;

"Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

## "ARTICULO I.

"The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other, under the circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty, those persons who, being accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences enumerated in Article II., committed in the territory of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party.

## "ARTICULO II.

"The extradition shall be reciprocally granted for the following crimes or offences:—

"1. Murder (including assassination, parricide, infanticide, poisoning), or attempt to murder.

"2. Manslaughter.

"3. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of women.

"4. Rape.

"5. Aggravated or indecent assault; carnal knowledge of a girl under the age of 10 years; carnal knowledge of a girl above the age of 10 years and under the age of 12 years; indecent assault upon any female, or any attempt to have carnal knowledge of a girl under 12 years of age.

"Su Majestad la Reina del Reino Unido de Gran Bretaña é Irlanda, y Su Excelencia el Presidente de la República de Salvador, habiendo juzgado conveniente con la mira de mejorar la administración de justicia y prevenir los crímenes en ámbos países y sus jurisdicciones, que las personas acusadas ó convictas de los delitos ó crímenes que en seguida, se enumerarán huyendo la justicia, sean, bajo ciertas circunstancias, recíprocamente entregadas, han nombrado por sus Plenipotenciarios para concluir un Tratado, á saber:—

"Su Majestad la Reina del Reino Unido de Gran Bretaña é Irlanda, al Muy Honorable Richard Bickerton Pemell, Lord Lyons, Par del Reino Unido de Gran Bretaña é Irlanda, Gran Cruz de la Muy Honorable Orden del Baño, Gran Cruz del la Muy Distinguida Orden de San Miguel y San Jorge, uno de los Más Honorables Consejeros de Su Majestad Británica, Embajador Extraordinario y Plenipotenciario de Su Majestad Británica ante la República Francesa;

"Y Su Excelencia el Señor Presidente de la República del Salvador, al Señor Don José María Torres-Calcado, Ministro Plenipotenciario de la República del Salvador, acreditado ante el Gobierno de Su Majestad la Reina de la Gran Bretaña é Irlanda, Gran Oficial de la Legion de Honor;

"Quienes, después de haberse comunicado mutuamente sus respectivos plenos poderes y encontrádoslos en buena y debida forma, han aceptado y admitido los Artículos siguientes:—

## "ARTICULO I.

"Las Altas Partes Contratantes se comprometen á entregarse recíprocamente en las condiciones y circunstancias expresadas en el presente Tratado, las personas que siendo acusadas ó convictas de los delitos ó crímenes enumerados en el Artículo II., cometidos en el territorio de una de las Partes, se encuentren dentro del territorio de la otra Parte.

## "ARTICULO II.

"La extradición será recíprocamente acordada por los siguientes crímenes ó delitos:—

"1. Homicidio premeditado (incluyendo el asesinato, el parricidio, el infanticidio, el envenenamiento), ó tentativa de homicidio premeditado.

"2. Homicidio.

"3. Administración de drogas ó el uso de instrumentos afín de ocasionar el aborto en las mujeres.

"4. Estupro.

"5. Atentado al pudor con violencia; relaciones sensuales con una muchacha menor de diez años; relaciones sensuales con una muchacha mayor de diez años y menor de doce años; atentado al pudor con cualquiera mujer, ó tentativa alguna para tener relaciones sensuales con una muchacha menor de doce años.

"6. Kidnapping and false imprisonment, child-stealing, abandoning, exposing, or unlawfully detaining children.

"7. Abduction of minors.

"8. Bigamy.

"9. Wounding, or inflicting grievous bodily harm.

"10. Assaulting a magistrate, or peace or public officer.

"11. Threats, by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or other things of value.

"12. Perjury or subornation of perjury.

"13. Arson.

"14. Burglary or housebreaking, robbery with violence, larceny, or embezzlement.

"15. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member, or public officer of any company, made criminal by any law for the time being in force.

"16. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods by false pretences; receiving any money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen or unlawfully obtained.

"17. (a.) Counterfeiting or altering money, or bringing into circulation counterfeit or altered money.

"(b.) Forgery, or counterfeiting or altering, or uttering what is forged, counterfeit, or altered.

"(c.) Knowingly making, without lawful authority, any instrument, tool, or engine, adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of coin of the realm.

"18. Crimes against Bankruptcy Law.

"19. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger persons in a railway train.

"20. Malicious injury to property, if such offence be indictable.

"21. Crimes committed at sea:—

"(a.) Piracy by the law of nations.

"(b.) Sinking or destroying a vessel at sea, or attempting or conspiring to do so.

"(c.) Revolt, or conspiracy to revolt, by two or more persons on board a ship on the high seas against the authority of the master.

"(d.) Assault on board a ship on the high seas with intent to destroy life, or to do grievous bodily harm.

"22. Dealing in slaves in such manner as to constitute an offence against the laws of both countries.

"The extradition is also to take place for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes as an accessory before or after the fact, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both Contracting Parties.

"ARTICLE III.

"No Salvadorian shall be delivered up by the Government of Salvador to the Government of the United Kingdom, and no subject of the United Kingdom shall be delivered up by the Government thereof to the Government of Salvador.

"ARTICLE IV.

"The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed on the part of the Government of the United Kingdom, or the person claimed on the part of the Government of Salvador, has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial in the territory of Salvador or in the United Kingdom respectively for the crime for which his extradition is demanded.

"If the person claimed on the part of the Government of the United Kingdom, or on the part of the Government of Salvador, should be under examination for any other crime in the territory of Salvador or in the United Kingdom respectively, his extradition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial and the full execution of any punishment awarded to him.

"ARTICLE V.

"The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime, or the institution of the penal prosecution or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applied to.

"ARTICLE VI.

"A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he prove that the requisition for his surrender has, in fact, been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character.

"ARTICLE VII.

"A person surrendered can in no case be kept in prison or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made, for any other crime, or on account of any other matters, than those for which the extradition shall have taken place. This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

"ARTICLE VIII.

"The requisition for extradition shall be made through the Diplomatic Agents of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

"The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

"If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent Court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

"A requisition for extradition cannot be founded solely on sentences passed *in contumaciam*, but persons convicted for contumacy shall be deemed to be accused persons.

"6. Hurto de niños ó adultos para trasportarlos á otro país ó conservarlos en el mismo (plagio); indebida encarceracion, abandono, exposicion, y encierro ilegal de niños ó adultos.

"7. Rapto de menores.

"8. Bigamia.

"9. Heridas ó golpes graves en el cuerpo.

"10. Violencias contra algun magistrado, oficial de paz ó publico.

"11. Amenazas por medio de cartas o de otra manera, con ánimo de obtener indebidamente dinero ó otras cosas de valor.

"12. Perjurio, suborna para perjurio.

"13. Incendio voluntario.

"14. Robo con efraccion, robo con violencia, rateria, y hurto.

"15. Fraude cometido por un depositario de bienes, banquero, mandatario, comisionista, administrador de bienes ajenos, tutor, curador, liquidador, síndico, oficial ministerial, director, miembro ó oficial público de alguna compañía, considerado el fraude como criminal por alguna ley vigente.

"16. Estafa ó todo lo que sea obtener dinero, fianza ó mercaderias por medio de falsos datos; recibir dinero, fianza ó cualesquiera otros valores, sabiendo que han sido robados ó adquiridos en oposicion á las leyes.

"17. (a.) Falsificar ó alterar moneda, ó poner en circulacion moneda falsa ó alterada.

"(b.) Contrahacer falsificar ó alterar, ó poner en circulacion lo que está falsificado, contrabicho ó alterado.

"(c.) Hacer premeditadamente, sin permiso de la autoridad constituida, algun instrumento, herramienta ó máquina con la intencion de falsificar ó contrahacer la moneda nacional.

"18. Crímenes cometidos contra la ley de quiebras.

"19. Cualquier acto doloso ejecutado con la mira de poner en peligro las personas que viajen en trenes de ferro carriles.

"20. Perjuicio malicioso causado á la propiedad, si el delito es justiciable.

"21. Delitos cometidos en el mar:—

"(a.) Pirateria, segun la ley de las naciones.

"(b.) Echar á pique ó destruir un buque en el mar, ó esforzarse ó conspirar para hacerlo.

"(c.) Sublevacion ó conspiracion para rebelarse, de dos ó más personas á bordo de un buque, en alta mar, contra la autoridad del capitán.

"(d.) Ataques á bordo de un buque en alta mar, con intencion de quitar la vida ó de hacer otro daño grave corporal.

"22. Darse al Trafico de Esclavos, si fuese con violacion de las leyes de ámbos países.

"La extradicion tambien se puede pedir por la participacion en cualquiera de los crímenes mencionados más arriba, como un accesorio ántes ó despues del hecho, con tal que dicha participacion sea castigado por las leyes de las dos Partes Contratantes.

"ARTICULO III.

"Ningun Salvadoriano será entregado por el Gobierno del Salvador al Gobierno del Reino Unido, y ningun súbdito del Reino Unido será entregado por su Gobierno al Gobierno del Salvador.

"ARTICULO IV.

"La extradicion no se efectuará si la persona reclamada por parte del Gobierno del Reino Unido, ó la persona reclamada por parte del Gobierno del Salvador, ha sido ya juzgada, absuelta ó castigada, ó está aún procesandose en el territorio del Salvador ó del Reino Unido respectivamente, por el delito por el cual se pide la extradicion.

"Si la persona reclamada por parte del Gobierno del Reino Unido, ó por parte del Gobierno del Salvador, estuviese sometida á juicio por algun otro delito en el territorio del Salvador ó del Reino Unido respectivamente, se diferirá su extradicion hasta el fin del juicio y la plena ejecucion de cualquiera castigo á que fuese condenada.

"ARTICULO V.

"La extradicion no se efectuará si, subsecuentemente á la ejecucion del crimen ó al empezar el proceso, ó á la conviccion del reo, se puede oponer la prescripcion para que sea exento de proceso ó del castigo, segun las leyes del Estado al cual se reclama.

"ARTICULO VI.

"El reo fugitivo no será entregado si el delito por el cual se pide la extradicion es de un carácter político, ó si se prueba que la peticion para entregarlo se ha hecho en efecto con la mira de juzgarlo ó castigarlo por un delito de carácter político.

"ARTICULO VII.

"Una persona entregada no podrá, en ningun caso, ser mantenida en prision ó procesada en el Estado al que se ha hecho la entrega, por ningun otro crimen ó delito, ó por ninguna otra causa que aquella por la cual se ha efectuado la extradicion. Esta estipulacion no se aplica á crímenes cometidos despues de la extradicion.

"ARTICULO VIII.

"La peticion de extradicion se hará respectivamente por medio de los Agentes Diplomáticos de las Altas Partes Contratantes.

"La demanda de extradicion de una persona acusada debe ir acompañada de una orden de prision, dictada por la autoridad competente del Estado que pide la extradicion, y fundada en testimonios tales que segun las leyes del lugar donde se encuentre el acusado, justifiquen su prision como si el delito hubiese sido cometido allí.

"Si la demanda se refiere á una persona ya convicta, debe ir acompañada de la sentencia de condenacion pronunciada contra la persona convicta por el Tribunal competente del Estado que hace la demanda de extradicion.

"Una demanda de extradicion no puede fundarse solamente en sentencias dictadas por contumacia; pero las personas convictas de contumacia deben ser consideradas como acusadas.

## "ARTICLE IX.

"If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

"The prisoner is then to be brought before a competent Magistrate, who is to examine him, and to conduct the preliminary investigation of the case, just as if the apprehension had taken place for a crime committed in the same country.

## "ARTICLE X.

"A fugitive criminal may be apprehended under a warrant issued by any Police Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, or other competent authority in either country, on such information or complaint, and such evidence, or after such proceedings as would, in the opinion of the authority issuing the warrant, justify the issue of a warrant if the crime had been committed or the person convicted in that part of the dominions of the two Contracting Parties in which the Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, or other competent authority exercises jurisdiction: provided, however, that in the United Kingdom the accused shall, in such case, be sent as speedily as possible before a Police Magistrate in London. He shall, in accordance with this Article, be discharged, as well in Salvador as in the United Kingdom, if within the term of thirty days a requisition for extradition shall not have been made by the Diplomatic Agent of his country in accordance with the stipulations of this Treaty.

"The same rule shall apply to the cases of persons accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences specified in this Treaty, and committed on the high seas on board any vessel of either country which may come into a port of the other.

## "ARTICLE XI.

"The extradition shall take place only if the evidence be found sufficient, according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime had been committed in the territory of the same State, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the Courts of the State which makes the requisition, and no criminal shall be surrendered until after the expiration of fifteen days from the date of his committal to prison to await the warrant for his surrender.

## "ARTICLE XII.

"In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the State applied to shall admit as entirely valid evidence the sworn depositions or statements of witnesses taken in the other State, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, provided such documents purport to be signed or certified by a Judge, Magistrate, or Officer of such State, and are authenticated by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice or some other Minister of State.

## "ARTICLE XIII.

"If the individual claimed by one of the two High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other powers, on account of other crimes or offences committed upon their respective territories, his extradition shall be granted to that State whose demand is earliest in date, unless any other arrangement should have been made between the different Governments to determine the preference, either on account of the gravity of the crime or offence or for any other reason.

## "ARTICLE XIV.

"If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive he shall be set at liberty.

## "ARTICLE XV.

"All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension shall, if the competent authority of the State applied to for the extradition has ordered the delivery of such articles, be given up when the extradition takes place: and the said delivery shall extend, not merely to the stolen articles, but to everything that may serve as a proof of the crime.

## "ARTICLE XVI.

"The High Contracting Parties renounce any claim for the reimbursement of the expenses incurred by them in the arrest and maintenance of the person to be surrendered and his conveyance till placed on board ship; they reciprocally agree to bear such expenses themselves.

## "ARTICLE XVII.

"The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty.

"The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any of such colonies or foreign possessions shall be made to the Governor or chief authority of such colony or possession by the Chief Consular Officer of the Republic of Salvador in such colony or possession.

"Such requisition may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, to the provisions of this Treaty, by the said Governor or chief authority, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to his Government.

"Her Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British colonies and foreign possessions for the surrender of Salvadorian criminals who may take refuge within such colonies and foreign possessions, on the basis, as nearly as may be, of the provisions of the present Treaty.

"The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal from any colony or foreign possession of Her Britannic Majesty shall be governed by the rules laid down in the preceding Articles of the present Treaty.

## "ARTICULO IX.

"Si la demanda de extradición está de acuerdo con las precedentes estipulaciones, las autoridades competentes del Estado al que se dirige la petición procederán a la prisión del fugitivo.

"El prisionero será conducido entónces ante el Magistrado competente, quien debe examinarlo y hacer la investigación preliminar del caso, como si la aprehensión se hubiese efectuado por un delito cometido en el mismo país.

## "ARTICULO X.

"Un delincuente fugitivo puede ser aprehendido en virtud de una orden de prisión dictada por cualquier Magistrado de Policía, Juez de Paz u otra autoridad competente en ámbos países, teniendo á la visto tales informes ó quejas, y tales pruebas, ó habiéndose procedido á tales diligencias que, en la opinión de la autoridad que dicta la orden de prisión, justificaria dicha orden si el crimen hubiese sido cometido ó si la persona hubiese sido convencida en la parte del territorio de las dos Partes Contratantes en la cual el Magistrado, Juez de Paz, u otra autoridad competente ejerce jurisdicción; con tal, sin embargo, de que en el Reino Unido el acusado sea en tal caso conducido tan pronto como se pueda ante un Magistrado de Policía en Londres. El criminal fugitivo será, según este Artículo, puesto en libertad, sea en el Salvador ó en el Reino Unido, si en el término de treinta días no se hubiese hecho la demanda de extradición por medio del Agente Diplomático de su país, conforme á las estipulaciones de este Tratado.

"La misma regla será aplicada al caso de las personas acusadas ó convictas de alguno de los delitos ó crímenes especificados en este Tratado, y cometidos en alta mar á bordo de cualquier buque de uno ú otro país que entre en un puerto del otro.

## "ARTICULO XI.

"La extradición se efectuará solamente si los testimonios se encuentran suficientes según las leyes del Estado á que se hace la demanda, ya sea para justificar el sometimiento á juicio del preso, en caso en que el crimen hubiese sido cometido en territorio de dicho Estado, ó para probar la identidad del preso convencido por los Tribunales del Estado que hace la demanda, y ningún delincuente ó criminal puede ser entregado ántes de pasados quince días desde la fecha de su sometimiento á juicio, en tanto que se dicte la orden de entrega.

## "ARTICULO XII.

"En el exámen que se haga de conformidad con las precedentes estipulaciones, las autoridades del Estado á que se ha recurrido reconocerán como plena prueba las deposiciones juradas y las relaciones de los testigos hechas en el otro Estado ó las copias de aquellas, y asimismo las órdenes y sentencias pronunciadas, con tal que esos documentos estén firmados ó certificados por un Juez, Magistrado, ó Oficial de dicho Estado, y sean autenticados por el juramento de algun testigo, ó que sean sellados con el sello oficial del Ministro de Justicia ó de algun otro Ministro de Estado.

## "ARTICULO XIII.

"Si el individuo reclamado por una de las Altas Partes Contratantes, conforme al presente Tratado, fuese reclamado simultáneamente por uno ó varios otros Estados, por otros delitos ó crímenes cometidos en sus respectivos territorios, su extradición ser otorgada al Estado que ha presentado primero la demanda de extradición; á ménos que algun otro arreglo no haya sido estipulado entre los diferentes Gobiernos, para determinar la preferencia, ya sea en vista de la gravedad del crimen ó delito, ó ya por cualquiera otra causa.

## "ARTICULO XIV.

"Si despues de dos meses de la aprehension del fugitivo no se hubiere aducido prueba bastante para la extradición, será puesto en libertad.

## "ARTICULO XV.

"Cualesquiera artículos que se embarguen á la persona aprehendida, si la autoridad competente del Estado requerido para la extradición ha ordenada la entrega de ellos, serán entregados al tiempo de verificarse aquella; y se hará no solo de los artículos robados sino de todo lo que pueda servir como prueba del crimen.

## "ARTICULO XVI.

"Las Altas Partes Contratantes renuncian á cualquier reclamación por el reembolso de los gastos hechos en la captura y mantenimiento de la persona que há de entregarse, y en su conducción hasta ponerla á bordo de el buque, comprometiéndose recíprocamente á hacer ellas mismas tales gastos.

## "ARTICULO XVII.

"Las estipulaciones del presente Tratado serán aplicables á las Colonias y Posesiones extranjeras de Su Majestad Británica.

"La petición para la entrega de un criminal fugitivo que se haya refugiado en alguna de tales Colonias ó Posesiones extranjeras se hará al Gobernador ó principal autoridad de tal Colonia ó Posesion por el principal Agente Consular de la República del Salvador en dicha Colonia ó Posesion.

"Podrá darse curso á tales peticiones, sujetándose siempre lo más aproximadamente posible á lo estipulado en este Tratado, por dicho Gobernador ó principal autoridad, quien, sin embargo, estará en libertad de conceder la entrega ó referir el asunto á su Gobierno.

"Su Majestad Británica quedará, sin embargo, en libertad de hacer arreglos especiales en las Colonias Británicas y Posesiones extranjeras para la entrega de los Salvadoreños criminales que puedan refugiarse dentro de tales Colonias y Posesiones extranjeras, observando, lo más que se pueda, las estipulaciones del presente Tratado.

"La demanda para la entrega de un criminal fugitivo de alguna Colonia ó Posesion extranjera de Su Majestad Británica estará sujeta á las reglas establecidas en los Artículos precedentes del presente Tratado.

ARTICLE XVIII.

"The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties, but shall remain in force for six months after notice has been given for its termination.

"The Treaty, after receiving the approval of the Congress of Salvador, shall be ratified and the ratifications shall be exchanged at London as soon as possible.

"In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

"Done at Paris, the twenty-third day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

And whereas the ratifications of the said Treaty were exchanged at London on the eighth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Her by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the thirteenth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Salvador, and of the said Treaty with the President of Salvador.

At the Court at Windsor, the 30th day of November 1882.

Present:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty,

His Royal Highness Prince Leopold, Duke of Albany, Lord Privy Seal, Lord Steward,	Mr. Gladstone, Secretary Sir William Vernon Harcourt.
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WHEREAS by "The Extradition Acts 1870 and 1873," it was, amongst other things, enacted that where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State, and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient.

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the twenty-ninth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, between Her Majesty and His Majesty the King of Tonga, of which Treaty Article IV., relating to the extradition of fugitive criminals, is in the terms following:—

"Her Britannic Majesty agrees to surrender to His Majesty the King of Tonga any Tongan subject who, being accused or convicted of any of the undermentioned crimes, committed in the territory of the King of Tonga, shall be found within the territory of Her Britannic Majesty. The crimes for which such surrender may be granted are the following:—Murder, or attempt to murder; embezzlement or larceny; fraudulent bankruptcy; forgery.

"Her Britannic Majesty may, however, at any time put an end to this Article by giving notice to that effect to His Majesty the King of Tonga. The Article shall, however, remain in force for six months after the notice of its termination."

And whereas, previously to the exchange of the ratifications of the said Treaty, a Protocol bearing date the third day of July, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, was signed and sealed by the Plenipotentiaries of Her Majesty and of His Majesty the King of Tonga respectively, being duly authorized for that purpose, which Protocol is in the terms following:—

"It is agreed that the arrangement contained in Article IV. of the said Treaty shall be subject to the restrictions on the surrender of fugitive criminals contained in the Acts respecting extradition, which are in force in the dominions of Her Britannic Majesty, and the procedure to be adopted with respect to the surrender of such criminals shall be in conformity with the provisions of the said Acts."

And whereas the ratifications of the said Treaty were exchanged at Nukualofa on the third day of July, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two:

Now therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Her by the said recited Acts, doth order and it is hereby ordered that the said Acts shall apply in the case of Tonga and of Article IV. of the said Treaty with His Majesty the King of Tonga, and of the said Protocol.

LEADING LIGHT, CAPE CAPRICORN.

ON and after this date a small catoptric light will be exhibited from the north-western slope of Cape Capricorn at an elevation of 100 feet above the sea level.

This light in line with the main light on the cape, and bearing from it N. 70° W., leads clear of the Cottier Bank, and intersects the line of leading lights from Sea Hill at a distance of nearly 3 miles from the Timandra Buoy.

In south-easterly weather small craft can pick up a good anchorage under the lee of the cape, in 3 fathoms, on the line of lights, with the main light just dipped behind the buildings, and at a distance of a short quarter of a mile from the shore.

The light, will, in fine weather be visible in the direction of the line of lights to a distance of 14 miles.

SOUTH-WESTERN PART.  
SOLOMON ISLANDS.

THE following information relating to the Solomon Islands has been received from Lieutenant Frederick Elton, H.M.S. *Diamond*, Captain Alfred T. Dale, 1882.<sup>1</sup>

All bearings are magnetic. Variation in 1882, 8° 6' E.

**MALAYTA ISLAND.**—The bay upon the north-east coast in latitude 8° 45' S., longitude 161° E., is about 8 or 10 miles wide from Cape Arsacides to the point forming the south limit. A large low island of a horse-shoe shape, the concave side to the S.S.W., and from the extremities of which reefs extend about half a mile, is situated nearly in the centre of the bay. Between this island and the land at the head of the bay there are several reefs and shoal patches easily discernible from aloft when the sun is in a favorable position, but no dangers were seen from the masthead to the north of the island, and no anchorage was found around it except for small vessels.

**QUI and QUAHQUAHROO HARBORS**<sup>2</sup> lie about 3 miles westward of the above-mentioned island, and may be identified by the two small islands, Qui and Rongahseayah.

*Qui Harbor* affords accommodation for two or three large vessels, the water shoaling gradually from 26 fathoms in the centre to the immediate vicinity of the reefs.

*Quahquahroo Harbor* is merely an arm of Qui harbor, and is suitable for small vessels only.

At the northern part of Malayta Island, a low thickly wooded island fringed with coral reefs, lies about 2 miles from the shore off Cape Simson, and several small islets were seen near the mainland to the south-eastward.

**FLORIDA ISLAND.**—*Gaieta Village.*—At about half a cable S.S.E. of Flat-top Rock, off Gaieta village, is a coral patch not easily seen, upon which 3 fathoms least water was found.

A larger shoal and more easily discernible, upon which 3½ fathoms least water was found, lies about a quarter of a mile west of Flat-top Rock.

*Anchorage.*—The *Diamond* found temporary anchorage, the day being calm, in 17 fathoms, coral and sand, in a small bay westward of Flat-top Rock.

*Nogy Island* has been expunged from the charts, it having been reported upon good authority to be identical with Sesarga Island.

The island lying 2½ miles east of Gaieta village, is named Mandoliana.<sup>3</sup>

*Sandfly Passage.*—*Anchorage.*—The *Diamond* moored, head and stern, in 17 fathoms, mud, off the village of Nago, in a small harbor, the approach to which is narrow but deep, near the middle of the south shore of Sandfly Passage.

*Directions.*—To find this obscure anchorage when entering Sandfly Passage from the south-westward, keep mid-channel until a well-defined conical hill, with a rounded knoll to seaward of it, is seen to form the north-east boundary of a comparatively deep bay. Enter this bay with the conical hill upon the port hand, pass between some coral reefs and patches easily seen with the sun astern, proceed to the extreme head of the bay, and anchor.

*Tides.*—Along the southern coast of Florida Island the flood stream was found to run to the westward.

Eddies and rips were observed to cover much space between Florida and Guadalcanar islands, these eddies having the appearance of shallow water render the shoals more difficult to distinguish.

**RUSSEL ISLANDS.**—*Anchorage.*—In passing through the central channel of these islands, anchorage was found in a small inlet, about mid-way, upon the eastern shore in 20 fathoms, mud and coral, with just room to stern; in latitude 9° 4' S., longitude 159° 7½' E.

Anchorage was obtained at the head of an inlet in latitude 9° 2' S., longitude 159° 5' E. to the south-east of Nono Island in 23 fathoms, with swinging room.

No anchorage could be found in Paddy Bay, south of Kobiloko Island.

*Current.*—The *Diamond* found a current setting to the southward one knot per hour, in the channel between Guadalcanar and San Christoval islands upon each of the three occasions of her visit.

*Unsuccessful search for Beaver Reef.*

The following information has been received from Staff Commander Coghlan, Admiralty Surveying Officer, dated 21st October 1882, relative to a further unsuccessful search made in the Colonial Government surveying schooner *Meda* for the Beaver Reef, said to be situated about 60 miles westward of Swan River:—

This reef was reported by the schooner *Beaver*, in the year 1864, to be in lat. 32° 6' S., long. 114° 37' E., and subsequently reported by the schooner *Giff* in 1869 (about 11 miles west of that position), to break heavily, and to extend about half a mile in a north and south direction, with depths of 15 to 18 fathoms at the distance of a quarter of a mile from the southern end.

During this further examination by the *Meda*, extending over a period of eleven days, soundings with no bottom at 360 fathoms and no bottom at 300 fathoms were obtained at the positions given, and no bottom at 850 fathoms about midway between.

This unsuccessful search, combined with similar results from four examinations previously made in the *Meda*, the whole covering the area included between lat. 32° S. and 32° 20' S., and long. 114° E. and 115° E., is considered to establish the non-existence of the reported Beaver Reef—it has therefore been removed from the Admiralty Charts.

Prisoners under sentences exceeding eight years, and under twenty years, will be eligible for the fourth class, under the said Regulations of the 21st of March 1876, when they have arrived at the period of five years from the probable date of their discharge, as ascertained according to the same Regulations.

Prisoners under sentences of twenty years and upwards will be eligible for the said fourth class when they have arrived at the period of seven years from the probable date of their discharge, as ascertained as aforesaid.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Moss, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

No. 219) it was amongst other things enacted, that all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises thereafter to be erected, built, enclosed, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments within Victoria, which were from time to time proclaimed by the Governor in Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, as such public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, should, from and after the publication of such notice, be severally deemed and taken to be the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments (hereinafter called "gaols") respectively of the place or district where the same are situated, and should be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected (also hereinafter called "gaols"), and of the prisoners confined within the same; and it was also enacted that, except where it was otherwise proclaimed by the Governor in Council, every gaol should be and be taken for all purposes as being equally a house of correction and a prison for debtors, and also every house of correction should be taken to be a prison: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the fourteenth day of August One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, the buildings and premises therein described and situate at Hamilton were proclaimed a public gaol, prison, and house of correction: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Proclamation and to re-define the site on which such gaol is situate, and to re-proclaim the same: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act and all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the hereinbefore mentioned Proclamation, and do by this notice proclaim, declare, and notify that the buildings and premises situate at Hamilton hereinafter described are and shall be a public gaol, prison, and house of correction within the meaning and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

HAMILTON GAOL.—Comprising all buildings, erections, houses, and enclosed places on the following site, viz.:—Five acres thirty-one perches, county of Dundas, municipal district of Hamilton, being part of section 11: Commencing at the intersection of the north-western side of Craig street and the north-eastern side of Kennedy street; bounded thence by the last-named street bearing N. 41° W. five chains fifty links; thence by a line bearing N. 49° E. ten chains; thence by Thompson street bearing S. 41° E. three chains twenty-eight links; thence by a line bearing S. 10° 22' W. three chains fifty-six links; and thence by Craig street aforesaid bearing S. 49° W. seven chains twenty-two links to the point of commencement.

Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Five hundred pounds (£500) granted by Parliament to Horticultural Societies, 1882-3.

1. That each society claiming to participate in the grant shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 10th April 1883, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.
2. The distribution of the vote will be made one month after the above-mentioned date, when a sum equal to the amount of the prize money awarded and paid away will be allotted to each society having a claim, and be made payable to the treasurer thereof, provided that the sums claimed do not exceed in the whole Five hundred pounds, and if they do exceed this amount then they will be reduced *pro rata*, and the allotment made accordingly.
3. No society whose expenditure in prizes between the 1st January 1882 and the 31st December 1882 amounts in the total to less than Fifty pounds shall be entitled to participate in the vote.

The births registered in 1882 numbered 9,576, as against 9,237 in 1881, and 8,645 in 1880. The number in the year under review was the highest on record.

As compared with every 1,000 of the population, the births numbered 32.85 in 1882, as against 32.42 in 1881. In every year of the previous decenniad, except 1880 and 1881, the births in proportion to the population were more numerous than in 1882.

The deaths in 1882 numbered 6,127, which exceeded the number in 1881 by 622, and also exceeded the number in all the other years of the previous decenniad, except 1875, in which an epidemic of measles prevailed, and as many as 6,317 deaths were recorded.

In 1882 the proportion of deaths to every 1,000 of the population was 21.02, which was .56 above the average of the previous 10 years. This proportion was lower than in the three epidemic years, 1874 to 1876, or than in 1877, but much higher than in the other six years of the same decenniad.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the year was 110.5° on the 19th January, and the lowest was 31.5° on the 9th June. The former high temperature was exceeded on only three previous occasions, according to the records of the last 24 years, viz.:—111.2° on the 14th January 1862, 111.0° on the 22nd January 1860, and 110.7° on the 15th December 1876; whilst the maximum temperature in the sun (maximum solar radiation) on that day, viz., 168.9°, was absolutely the highest on record, the highest point previously recorded being 160.0° on the 14th January 1862. The mean temperature of the year (57.4°) was about a fifth of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (48.4°) took place on the 18th January, viz., from a maximum of 104.0° to a minimum of 55.6°. The least range (3.2°) was on the 28th November, viz., from a maximum of 57.2° to a minimum of 54.0°. The mean daily range was 18.6°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.902 inches) was a fraction below the average. Rain fell during the year on 131 days—nearly an average number—and the total amount of rain was 22.4 inches, being the fourth lowest rainfall during the last 19 years, and about 3½ inches below the average. A fall of snow took place on the 26th July, on which day the lowest temperature in the shade was 37.0°, and the highest 44.0°. This is a most unusual occurrence in Melbourne, no other such instance being remembered since the 29th and 30th August 1849, when snow fell heavily.

Of the births registered in 1882, 51.1 per cent. were of males, and 48.9 per cent. were of females. Of the deaths during the year, 55.3 per cent. were of males, and 44.7 per cent. were of females. Children under the age of 5 years contributed 40 per cent. to the total mortality, as against 38 per cent. in 1881; 40 per cent. in 1880 and 1879; 37 per cent. in 1878; 42 per cent. in 1877; 40 per cent. in 1876; 48 per cent. in 1875; 43 per cent. in 1874; 42 per cent. in 1873; and 47 per cent. in 1872.

The deaths of 278 persons, viz., 157 males and 121 females, of the age of 75 years or upwards, occurred during 1882. Of these, 137 were between 75 and 80; 106 between 80 and 85; 27 between 85 and 90; 7 between 90 and 95; and 1 (a female) aged 103. Of the deaths recorded during the year, 281—of which 212 were of males and 69 of females—were from external causes; 241 being ascribed to accident, 12 to homicide, and 28 to suicide. Eleven hundred and seventy-three deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—562 in the Melbourne Hospital, 130 in the Alfred Hospital, 20 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 33 in the Children's Hospital, 85 in the Lying-in Hospital, 98 in the Immigrants' Home, 93 in the Benevolent Asylum, 51 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 61 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 10 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, 9 in the Industrial Schools, 3 in the Protestant Refuge, 2 in the Blind Asylum, 8 in the Infant Asylum, 5 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Deaf and Dumb Asylum, and 1 in the Police Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 2449, of which 1332, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 1117, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of these who died, 1856 were under one year of age, 354 were between one and two, 104 were between two and three, 74 were between three and four, and 61 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 3678. Of these, 2059, or 56 per cent., were males, and 1619, or 44 per cent., were females; 156 were between five and ten, 108 were between ten and fifteen, 172 were between fifteen and twenty, 272 were between twenty and twenty-five, 279 were between twenty-five and thirty, 248 were between thirty and thirty-five, 278 were between thirty-five and forty, 269 were between forty and forty-five, 311 were between forty-five and fifty, 331 were between fifty and fifty-five, 273 were between fifty-five and sixty, 294 were between sixty and sixty-five, 205 were between sixty-five and seventy, 203 were between seventy and seventy-five, 137 were between seventy-five and eighty, 141 were upwards of eighty, and of 1 the age was unspecified.

As compared with the previous year, there was an increase in the deaths from all classes of diseases except the violence class, in which the number of deaths was exactly the same in both years; thus deaths from zymotic diseases increased by 87, constitutional diseases by 79, local diseases by 280, and developmental diseases by 176. The increase under the head of zymotic diseases, however, was almost entirely confined to typhoid fever and dysentery and diarrhoea, which caused respectively 40 and 106 more deaths in 1882 than in 1881, a diminution having taken place in deaths from most of the other zymotic diseases, notably scarlatina, whooping-cough, erysipelas, and metria, which show decreases of 24, 14, 17, and 19 respectively. Under the head of local diseases, the increase was made up of 91 in diseases of the brain and nerves, 127 in diseases of the respiratory system, principally bronchitis and pneumonia, and 64 in diseases of the digestive organs, principally enteritis; the increases and decreases in the other diseases nearly counterbalancing one another. Of the increase in deaths from developmental diseases, 123 were in those from atrophy and debility. It is satisfactory to find that the mortality from childbearing, which was unusually high in 1881, fell from 103 in that year to 58 in the year under review.

On comparing the general results of the year under review with those of former years, it appears that the mortality from all the principal miasmatic diseases—except typhoid fever, and dysentery and diarrhoea—was below the average. The mortality from the former disease, which was unusually high in 1877 and 1878, but had gradually fallen to a minimum in 1880, has since been steadily increasing; whilst the latter diseases caused over 100 deaths—or about a third—more than in either of the three preceding years; but a greater mortality therefrom occurred on three previous occasions since 1870. The mortality from cancer was slightly exceeded on but one previous occasion; whilst the deaths from phthisis remained tolerably uniform during the last three years, during which period they were much more numerous than in previous years. As regards deaths from other diseases, those from diseases of the brain and nerves, bronchitis, pneumonia, and heart disease, were much above the average—although the mortality from the last-named was lower than in 1881. Childbirth was less fatal than usual, one death of a mother having occurred to every 165 births, as compared with the exceptionally high rate of one to every 90 in 1881, and an average of one to every 155 during the period 1871-80. The following is a summary of the deaths from the various diseases named during the last twelve years, the average of the ten years 1871-80 being also shown:—

**PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA.**

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, sec. 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of Alexandra Shire which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from that shire and annexed to the Shire of Mansfield.

Area described in the Petition:—Commencing at a point on the Puzzle Range where the southern boundary of the Junction run intersects the said range; thence by the boundary of the Junction run to the Branket Creek, being the Anglesea county boundary; thence southerly by the Branket Creek and the Delatite River; thence southerly by the Goulburn River; thence north-westerly along the top of the Puzzle Range which divides the waters of the U. T. Creek from those of the Delatite River to the starting point.

Petitioners state that from the geographical formation the area should be annexed to Mansfield.

That all their business is transacted with Mansfield, and their interests are identical.

That owing to the High Puzzle Range cutting off means of intercourse with Alexandra (the present seat of Local Government), it has caused partial failure and neglect in the distribution of the shire funds in the area above described.

Petitioners therefore pray that the area above described may be severed from the Shire of Alexandra and annexed to the Shire of Mansfield.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor might divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and might also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and might divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* might define the boundaries of such counties, parishes or towns, and might distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions should thenceforward be recognised as a county, parish or town, by the name so given as aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby define the boundaries of the town hereinafter described and do distinguish the same by the name prefixed thereto, that is to say:—

TOWN OF WARRAGUL.—County of Bala Bala, parish of Drouin East: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 89; bounded thence by a road, allotment 77; a line, and allotment 86 bearing S. 80° 35' E. seventy-eight chains ninety links; thence by allotment 75 bearing S. 9° 25' W. one chain fifty-four links and S. 80° 35' E. fifteen chains forty-four links; thence by a line, and allotments 1, 3, 5, 7, and 9 of section A, a line, allotment 26 and a line bearing S. 9° 25' W. seventy-eight chains fifty-six links; thence by a line and allotments 103a and 103 bearing S. 9° 6' W. thirty-four chains eighty-four links; thence by allotment 102 and a line bearing N. 81° 3' W. thirty-nine chains ninety-two links; thence by allotment 99 and a line bearing N. 80° 40' W. forty-one chains seventeen links; thence by allotments 95 and 93 bearing N. 9° 20' E. sixty-two chains sixty-six links, and by the latter allotment bearing N. 43° 8' W. six chains ninety-eight links and N. 80° 35' W. seven chains sixty-one links; and thence by allotment 92, a line, and allotment 89 aforesaid bearing N. 9° 25' E. forty-eight chains fifty-one links to the point of commencement. 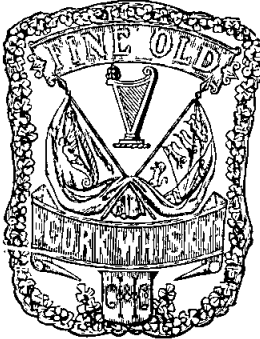
