REGULATION OF THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

Regulation of the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners made under and by virtue of "The Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1876."

In pursuance of the said Act, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following regulation:—

Where any goods are by the said Act liable to pay a wharfage rate or toll at the rate of Five shillings per ton, such rate or toll shall, so far as regards each package, wrapper, or case in which the said goods are contained, be reduced to Three shillings per ton.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby make the following Bye-law for amending the Staff Regulations, dated 27th November 1874 (that is to say):—

1. Clause 22 of the above-named regulations is hereby repealed, and on and after the 1st May 1883 ballast trains or engines working for contractors will be subject to the staff regulations. When a ballast train has to work on a single line, the staff is to be given to the guard in charge of it, or, in his absence, to the engine-man. This will close that section of the line while the ballast train is at work. The ballast train must proceed to the station whence the staff was obtained, at the time appointed for the resumption of the ordinary traffic.

2. Clause 7 of the above-named regulations is amended by the addition of the following, viz.:—"And no engine-driver is to leave any station on a staff ticket until he has seen the staff itself."

POWER TO COMPEL CESSPOOLS IN THE BOROUGH OF MARYBOROUGH TO BE FILLED UP.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign, called *The Public Health Amendment Act 1876*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the said Act to any part of Victoria, and from and after three months from the coming into operation of the said section in any part of Victoria, if the owner of land whereon there should be a cesspool for the reception of nightsoil, which cesspool in the opinion of the local Board should be in such a condition or position as to be calculated to generate disease or be a public nuisance, should be required by notice from the local Board to fill up the same within a time to be expressed in such notice not being more than one month from the date thereof, such owner should be liable to a penalty not exceeding

Five pounds for every day from the expiration of the time mentioned in such notice that such cesspool should not be filled up as thereby required: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the above-recited Act to the Borough of Maryborough.

WHEREAS by the *Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* it was amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application, or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly; And it was further enacted that, if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations, or additions, or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: and every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should state—

(a.) The amount of money which the Governor in Council would grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same, and paying the cost and expense of the plans an

application for the same; and also the rate of interest which would be charged for such loan, such rate being at least One-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted.

(b.) Should proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks within which such trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District:

(c.) Should state what are the principal works proposed to be constructed: and

(d.) Should contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the now in part recited Act) as according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case the Governor in Council should think fit.

And it was further enacted by the said Act that whenever any Waterworks District was comprised wholly within one municipal district, although portion of the works might be outside same, the Governor in Council might appoint the municipal council thereof for the time being, together with one other commissioner, to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description as set forth in a certain application of the President and Rate-payers of the Shire of Romsey for a Loan of Four thousand pounds, to carry out certain waterworks for the domestic supply of a Waterworks District under the said Act, embracing certain land within the Shire of Romsey, as shown on the general plan and description accompanying the said application deposited in the Department of Mines and Water Supply, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

(1.) The construction of the said waterworks as are herein-after described:

(2.) The Municipal Council of the Shire of Romsey for the time being and one other commissioner to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District:

(3.) That the amount of the loan hereby granted shall be Four thousand pounds sterling, for the purpose of carrying out approved works and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payment of which interest shall be made half-yearly:

(4.) By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; a Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

YARCK COMMON.—Five thousand acres, more or less, county of Anglesey, parishes of Yarck, Maintongoon, and Brankeet, being the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the following boundaries, viz.:—Commencing at a point on the left bank of Spring Creek in line with the north-eastern boundary of allotment 63A, parish of Yarck; thence south-easterly by a line and the said allotment to the road from Doon to Yarck; thence south-westerly by that road to the north boundary of section 4, at Yarck; thence east by that section, south-westerly by that section and section 3, east and south by H. and A. WHEREAS by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Board of Land and Works from time to time to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection and management of all Public Parks and Reserves and for the preservation of good order and decency therein. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind the regulations confirmed and adopted by such Board on the eighth day of May, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, for management of the "Lake Goldsmith Reserve," and doth hereby make the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the land temporarily reserved by Order of the twenty-eighth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, as a site for Water Supply purposes in the parish of Yangerahwill (Lake Goldsmith) and of the land temporarily reserved by Order of thirtieth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, as a site for Water Channel from Mount Emu Creek to Lake Goldsmith in the said parish.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserves shall be under the control of the Council of the Shire of Ripon, as a Committee of Management thereof.
2. The Committee of Management may by resolution appoint a caretaker of the reserves, and define the duties to be performed by and fix the salary to be paid to such caretaker.
3. No person other than a ratepayer, holder of miner's or business license residing within a distance of five miles of the reserves shall be entitled to depasture stock thereon.
4. No person shall be permitted to depasture on the reserves more than twenty head of large cattle, and the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, maros, goldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules.
5. The fees for depasturing stock on the reserves shall be four shillings per head per annum, and shall be payable to the caretaker half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January, and the first day of July in every year.
6. Sheep or goats shall not be depastured on the reserves but may be allowed to water thereon.
7. No person shall discharge within the reserves swivel or other larger sized guns, except ordinary fowling pieces.
8. No person shall throw or convey, or cause or permit to be thrown or conveyed into the reserves or into the lake or channels therein any dead animal, rubbish, dirt, weeds, filth, or any

noisome thing, or shall wash or cleanse therein any cloth, wool, ether, or skin of any animal or any article whatsoever.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with Section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

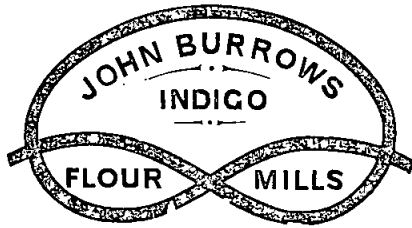
