MY LORD,—With reference to that portion of my predecessor's despatch of the 24th of August 1880 which relates to a proposal that preliminary examinations for the Royal Military College, Sandhurst, should be conducted by means of papers sent out to the Colonies by the Civil Service Commissioners, I have the honor to transmit to you, to be laid before your Government, an extract of a letter from the War Office, stating that the Civil Service Commissioners will be prepared, upon being informed that a person residing in any of the more important distant colonies is desirous of passing the preliminary examination for admission, to forward to the Governor of the colony in question a sealed packet of examination papers, with explanations as to the mode of conducting the examination; or, should the demand for examination be recurrent, they would be willing to supply papers beforehand, to be used by the Governor as occasion might require.

It will be noticed that this arrangement supersedes that which was previously announced in Lord Kimberley's despatch of the 30th of June 1881, under which preliminary examinations for Sandhurst would have been conducted in accordance with the prescribed regulations by the authorities of any universities or colleges possessing Royal charters, but that it does not affect the annual grant of a cadetship to such universities.

Your Government will also observe that, in consequence of the increased facilities afforded by the present arrangement, it will now be unnecessary to take any steps in the direction indicated in the earlier of the two despatches referred to, with the view of choosing a common centre of examination in Australia.

Extract from a letter from the War Office to Colonial Office, dated  
9th March 1883.

I am to observe that a communication has been received from the Civil Service Commissioners from which it appears that, upon its being notified to them that a person residing in any of the more important distant colonies is desirous of passing in the colony the "preliminary" examination for admission to Sandhurst, they will be prepared to forward to the Governor of the colony in question a sealed packet of examination papers, accompanied by instructions as to the mode of conducting the examination; or, should the demand for examination in the colony be likely to be recurrent, they would be willing, for the purpose of avoiding delay, to supply the Governor with papers beforehand, to be used by him when the occasion should arise.

This course will accordingly be adopted in preference to the arrangement originally proposed of holding preliminary examinations in the colonies under the authority of chartered colonial universities.

VICTORIA.  
COASTING SERVICE.

SECTION 8 of the Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates for Certificates of Competency provides that service in the coasting trade may be allowed to count as service, in order to qualify a candidate for examination for a certificate of competency for foreign-going vessels. The service required by the Regulations is service at sea, and as vessels engaged in the coasting trade must, necessarily, spend a large proportion of time in port, the board have decided that the same rule shall apply to masters and mates as to engineers. They accordingly give notice that in cases where the whole or any part of the service of a candidate for a master or mate's certificate of competency, for foreign-going vessels has been performed in the coasting trade, such service will only be accepted in the proportion of half as much again as that required by the Regulations, i. e. 18 months of such service will only be considered as equal to 12 months in the foreign trade.

SERVICE AS 3RD AND 4TH MATE.

Referring to notice dated the 21st July 1882, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 4th August 1882, permitting service as 3rd and 4th mate while holding a 2nd mate's certificate of competency, and in charge of a watch, to be accepted to the same extent as 2nd mate's service to qualify a candidate to be examined for a 1st mate's certificate of competency, the board give notice that 3rd and 4th mate's service may under the same conditions be accepted to qualify a candidate to be examined for a master's

certificate of competency, provided the candidate has also served at sea at least 12 months in a position not lower than that of 2nd mate while in possession of a 1st mate's certificate of competency.

If a candidate has had no service as 1st mate he must have been 6½ years at sea, of which 2½ years must have been as mate of a lower grade under the above-named conditions. It will also be noted that occasional service in charge of a watch in the day-time will not be accepted as mate's service under the Regulations.

RIVER AND SMOOTH WATER SERVICE.

The board think it necessary to point out that the service required to qualify candidates for masters and mates' certificates of competency is sea service, and that service performed on rivers, no matter of what size, or within smooth water, or partially smooth water limits, cannot be accepted.

COLOR BLINDNESS.

Referring to clauses 30 to 40 inclusive of Regulations, candidates for examination for certificates of competency who may desire to be examined first in colors only should fill up Form Exn. 2A, instead of Form 2. This will enable them, in case of failure in the color test, to be examined again in colors at any time, as in the case of persons not applying for certificates, on payment of a fresh fee of 1s. When, however, they go up for certificates of competency they will have to fill up Form Exn. 2, and be again examined in colors, and in case of failure to pass the color test will be put back three months, as specified in the Regulations.

It illuminates of the sea horizon a sector of 264 degrees, but it is within that sector on a few spots hidden by small islands.

It is visible from sea, between W. 3° S. through south and east till N. 3° E., within a range of visibility of 23 miles.

The lighthouse with its buildings are to be seen from the sea. The two mentioned lights form, with the one that is in building on the west point of Poeloe Mendanao, a system for the illuminating of Stolze Strait.

SHIRE OF KORONG.—TERRAPPEE TANK RESERVE.—REGULATIONS.

THE Council of the Shire of Korong, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of the 9th April 1883, as a site for Conservation of Water in the parish of Terrappee, and hereinafter styled Terrappee Tank Reserve, having framed the following regulations in respect thereof, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. Every person using or carrying away water from Terrappee Tank Reserve shall pay therefor to any person duly appointed by the committee of management in that behalf, and duly authorized to demand the same, the fees hereinafter specified:—

1. For each of the three first hogsheds of water taken away in any one day, Sixpence.

2. For every hogshed of water after the three (3) first hogsheds taken away in any one day, One shilling; provided that no person shall be permitted to take for his own use more than six hogsheds in one day.

3. For every horse or head of cattle brought to water at any one time, Twopence.

2. No person shall permit or cause to enter within the fence enclosing Terrappee Tank Reserve, any horses, cattle, goats, pigs, or geese, without the written authority of the committee of management or their officers duly appointed.

3. No person shall wash any auriferous or other earth in the water within Terrappee Tank Reserve, nor allow any sludge, drainage from house, stable, yard, pigsty, or foul water of any description to flow into it; nor bathe or wash in it; nor deposit any earth, manure, or other similar matter within the reserve, or in any way pollute the water therein.

4. No person shall remove any portion of any fence, or break or damage any fence, gates, pumps, trough, bank, or drain within Terrappee Tank Reserve.

Every person offending against these regulations, or refusing to pay on demand the fees specified therein, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

(3.) For every horse or head of cattle brought to water at any one time, Twopence.

2. No person shall permit or cause to enter within the fence enclosing McArthur's Tank Reserve any horses, cattle, goats, pigs, or geese, without the written authority of the committee of management or their officers duly appointed.

3. No person shall wash any auriferous or other earth in the water within McArthur's Tank Reserve, nor allow any sludge, drainage from house, stable, yard, pigsty, or foul water of any description to flow into it; nor bathe or wash in it; nor deposit any earth, manure, or other similar matter within the reserve, or in any way pollute the water therein.

4. No person shall remove any portion of any fence, or break or damage any fence, gates, pumps, trough, bank, or drain within McArthur's Tank Reserve.

Every person offending against these regulations, or refusing to pay on demand the fees specified therein, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing regulations were framed by the Shire Council of Korong this 15th day of May 1883.
