POPULATION OF VICTORIA.

NOTE.—The increase during the quarter by excess of registered births over registered deaths was 2,505, viz., 1,058 males and 1,447 females; that by excess of recorded arrivals by sea over recorded departures by sea was 1,645, viz., 1,355 males and 290 females. The total increase of population from these sources was thus 4,150, viz., 2,413 males and 1,737 females, as shown in the table. This is slightly less than the increase in the corresponding quarter of the previous year, viz., 4,274. It should be stated that whilst it is probable nearly all the deaths and arrivals by sea are noted, there is reason to believe that some births and departures by sea are not recorded; it should moreover be borne in mind that no account is or can be taken of persons who come and go overland.

A check upon the total figures is afforded by means of estimates of the population of their respective districts made once a year by the municipal authorities throughout the colony. According to these estimates, supplemented by an allowance for persons living outside local jurisdiction, the population of Victoria on the 31st March 1883 was 910,139, or 236 less than that shown by the table.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE PILOT BOARD OF VICTORIA.

IN accordance with the provisions of the 64th section of *The
Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865*, the
Governor in Council has approved of the undermentioned altera-
tions made by the Pilot Board of Victoria in the Rules and
Regulations of the said Board.

Rules and Regulations Nos. 17, 18, 19, 20, 34, 35, 38*d*, and 50
to be repealed, and the following Rules and Regulations to be
substituted in their stead, namely:—

CLASSIFICATION OF PILOTS: THEIR EARNINGS AND EXPENSES.

17*a*. *Division and classification of pilots.*—The pilots shall be
divided into two classes—(1) sea pilots, and (2) harbor and river
pilots. The first class to pilot vessels of all descriptions within
the limits as defined in the Rules and Regulations, and the
second class to pilot vessels in rivers, harbors, and ports only
where their services are required.

17*b*. *Sea pilots to work in companies.*—Sea pilots shall work in
companies only, and each company shall provide its own vessel,
boats, and gear, in which each member of such company shall as
nearly as possible hold an equal share. Provided that no person
not a licensed pilot shall hold any share or portion of a share in
any licensed pilot vessel.

17*c*. *Each company of sea pilots to appoint a treasurer.*—Each
company of sea pilots shall from time to time appoint one of
their number to act as its treasurer. Such treasurer to be ap-
pointed by the majority in number of the members of the com-
pany; and in the event of either company refusing, neglecting,
or failing to appoint a treasurer when required by the Board to
do so, then the Board may appoint some person to act as such
treasurer. The treasurer for the time being of each company shall
receive from the Board all moneys which may from time to time
be due to his company, and his receipt shall in all cases be a full
and complete discharge, release, and satisfaction of all claims
which the members of his company may have against the Board
in respect of all moneys so paid to him as aforesaid.

18. *Receipt of earnings.*—The Board may deduct from the gross
earnings of every pilot such proportionate sum towards the sup-
port of the pilot establishment as the Board may from time to
time direct; and each harbor and river pilot and the treasurer of
each company of sea pilots shall respectively be entitled to
receive only the net amount of such earnings remaining after
such deductions (if any) have been made; and it shall be dis-
tinctly understood that no pilot shall receive any pilotage or
detention money. All such moneys shall be paid at the Custom-
house or to some duly appointed officer of Her Majesty's
Customs.

19. *Valuation of plant.*—The treasurer of each company of sea
pilots shall, at the expense of his company, cause the pilot vessel,
boats, gear, and plant of all descriptions belonging to his com-
pany to be valued by a competent marine valuer during the

months of June or July, and shall furnish the Board with a cer-
tified copy of such valuation on or before the first day of August
in each year; and in the event of the treasurer of either com-
pany refusing or neglecting to cause such valuation to be made,
and to furnish the Board with such certified copy on or before
the said first day of August in any year, the Board shall be at
liberty to appoint a marine valuer for the purpose of valuing the
pilot vessel, boats, gear, and plant of all descriptions belonging
to the company so refusing or neglecting as aforesaid.

20. *Certified statement of pilots' expenses.*—Each harbor and
river pilot and the treasurer of each company of sea pilots shall
respectively furnish to the Board, on or before the tenth day of
each month, a duly certified detailed statement, in writing, of all
expenses incurred by him or by the several members of the com-
pany, as the case may be, during the preceding month in connec-
tion with the pilot service, pilots' boats, vessels, &c., accompanied
by vouchers and certified in such form as the Board may from
time to time direct.

34. *Pilotage inwards.*—Duty of sea pilot to ascertain final
destination of vessel before mooring. The sea pilot before
anchoring any vessel in Hobson's Bay shall ascertain from
the master whether the vessel is to be taken alongside any
of the wharfs or piers, or moored in the inner harbor; and
he is to be guided by the master's instructions. He is not
to give up pilotage charge of the vessel until she has been
finally moored in the berth determined upon by the master,
unless his services are required on the outer station, in which
case another pilot belonging to the same company shall moor her
as required without any additional charge being made. Provided
that in all cases where it is necessary to discharge cargo to enable
the vessel to arrive at its final destination, or the vessel is not
moored at its final destination within forty-eight (48) hours after
its arrival at its anchorage (Sundays and delay occasioned by
stress of weather only excepted), a removal pilotage must be
paid. Pilots shall anchor vessels having gunpowder on board in
accordance with the rules of the port.

35. *Duty of sea pilot when vessel is bound outwards.*—The sea
pilot shall also pilot all vessels bound to sea from the berths they
occupy, and may remove any vessel from any wharf or pier to
the inner anchorage at the request of the master, provided such
vessel proceed thence to sea within twenty-four (24) hours
(Sundays excepted) from the time of leaving such wharf or pier,
or unless detained through stress of weather or other unavoidable
causes, which shall be determined by the Board. But in all
cases where vessels require to take in ballast or cargo, after
leaving the wharf or pier, a removal pilotage fee must be paid.

38*d*. *Pilots to work in turns.*—Sea pilots shall take pilotage
charge of ships inwards and outwards according to their turns
in their respective companies; and in case of any dispute as to
turns between the pilots, the secretary of the Board shall decide,
and his decision shall be final. No exchange of turns by any
pilot shall be permitted without the authority, in writing, of the
secretary first obtained.

50. *Pilots to make entry in log-book, and to report to Board.*—The
sea pilot in charge of any pilot vessel under weigh shall cause an
entry to be made in the log-book of the vessel's actual position by
cross bearings every two hours; and whenever any pilot vessel is
brought inside the Heads during the currency of the outer station,
the pilot in charge of such vessel shall immediately thereafter
report to the Board, in writing, the cause or reason why the
vessel was brought inside the Heads, the hour at which she came
in, and also the time at which she again reached the outer
station.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Bairnsdale has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act, and no counter petition received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order abolish all previous subdivisions of the Shire of Bairnsdale, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned doth hereby re-subdivide the said Shire of Bairnsdale into four separate ridings, the names and boundaries of which shall be as follow, that is to say:—

THE EAST RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the shire boundary at the mouth of the Nicholson River; thence northerly, westerly, and southerly by the shire boundary to the junction of the Dargo and Mitchell rivers; thence southerly by the Mitchell River to the shire boundary at Jones Bay; and thence easterly by the shire boundary to the commencing point.

THE CENTRE RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the Mitchell River at the north-east angle of the parish of Moormung; thence south by the east boundary of said parish to the road forming the north boundaries of allotments 197 E, 184 A, parish of Bairnsdale; thence easterly by that road and a line in continuation thereof to the road between allotments 6 and 7, section H, same parish; thence north-easterly by said road to the Mitchell River; and thence northerly and westerly by that river to the commencing point.

THE WEST RIDING.

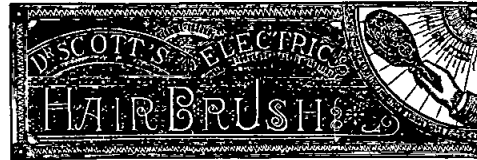
