SHIRES OF ALBERTON AND BULN BULN.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act* 1874 (No. 506, § 40), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of Alberton Shire which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from that shire and annexed to the Shire of Buln Buln.

Area described in the petition:— Commencing on the boundary between the counties of Mornington and Buln Buln, at its intersection with the south boundary of the parish of Korumburra; thence eastwards along the last-named boundary and the south boundary of the parish of Koorooman to a point south of the south-west angle of allotment 44 parish of Mardan; thence south to a point east of the boundary between the parishes of Kongwah and Kinak; thence west to that boundary; thence along that boundary to the boundary between the counties of Mornington and Buln Buln; thence northwards along that county boundary to the commencing point.

Petitioners state that there has been no money expended within 25 miles of the area sought to be severed. That being between 70 and 80 miles from the Alberton Shire Hall they have no reasonable possibility of reaping the benefits of the rates they pay. That they have no interest in the direction of Alberton but are constantly using the roads in the Buln Buln Shire. That they are within 30 miles of the Buln Buln Shire Hall.

That the Buln Buln Shire have extended roads to within ten miles of the area sought to be severed, and are now surveying roads in the same direction. That when the remaining few miles of country are opened up they will be enabled to reach the Metropolis in one day.

Petitioners therefore pray "That an Order be made severing the area above described from the Shire of Alberton and annexing it to the South Riding of the Shire of Buln Buln."

WHEREAS by *The Importation and Custody of Gunpowder Statute 1864* and the Act No. 440, and *The Explosives Act 1877*, power is given to the Governor Sec. 1 No. 440 in Council to make and to rescind regulations providing for the storage of gunpowder, guncoiton, and any substance used for blasting or exploding mines, and to license on such conditions as he may deem fit any private magazine for the storage of any such substance as aforesaid: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order rescind clause 10 of the Regulations dated the 28th day of November 1882, and with the advice aforesaid doth substitute the following clause in lieu thereof, viz. :-

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby diminish the undermentioned common in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE RUTHERGLEN COMMON, proclaimed by Order of 24th January 1876, and increased by Order of 8th December 1879, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom the portion of land, in the parish of Carlyle, lying between R. J. Burrows' 19th section blocks, Nos. 4140 and 4153, and the Murray River, and comprising an area of thirty-four acres, more or less.

MCLEOD'S MORASS COMMON—REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the Regulations made by the Governor in Council on the 1st April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale having drafted the following Regulations for management of McLeod's Morass Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council:—

Regulations.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.
2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the common may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.
3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of April and the first day of October in every year:—For every mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, Four shillings (4s.) per annum. For every cow, heifer, ox, steer, sheep, or goat, Two shillings (2s.) per annum. Progeny, under six months old, of stock legally depasturing on the common.—Free.

4. No stock shall be considered as registered unless the prescribed fees be paid at the time of entering, by the herdsman, their brands or other distinguishing marks and descriptions.

5. No bulls or entire horses shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the written consent of the managers first obtained.

6. All stock shall bear a distinguishing brand, and all horned stock shall be marked with the common brand.

7. The herdsman shall attend at the common yards every Monday, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., to register and brand all stock brought to him, the owners of which shall assist in the performance of this duty.

8. The managers shall not be responsible for stock depasturing on the common, but the herdsman shall give immediate notice to owners when he becomes aware of their stock having strayed from the common, and the managers shall not be responsible for any neglect or irregularity in this respect on the part of the herdsman.

9. No person shall be allowed to remove stock from the common without giving not less than twelve hours' notice in writing to the herdsman, and no person shall disturb or remove any stock from the common in the absence of the herdsman.

10. The managers shall cause to be removed from the common stock infected with any contagious disease.

11. Persons desirous of registering stock shall furnish a written description of the brands and other distinguishing marks thereof.

12. At the request of the person registering, the herdsman may register and brand elsewhere than at the common branding-yard, in which case an additional fee of One shilling for one, and Sixpence per head for two or more head of stock will be made.

13. The general mustering of stock shall take place in the first week in April and the first week in October in each year, the three first days in each of these weeks to be set apart for the mustering of stock other than neat and small cattle, which shall be mustered on the remaining days of such weeks. Stock so mustered for registration shall, if not registered and paid for, be liable to be impounded on the third of the respective days set apart for such mustering.

14. Sheep shall be depastured on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for the purpose.

15. Persons removing stock from the common shall be allowed to substitute others upon payment of a registration fee of One shilling per head.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

The births of 850 children, viz., 427 boys and 423 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of May. In the month of April 922 births were registered, or 72 more than in the month under review. The births were 73 above the average of the previous eight years, and only 6 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in May numbered 478, viz., 273 of males, and 205 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 372. The deaths were 6 above those in April, and exceeded the average of May during the previous ten years by 37. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than the average of those ten years by 18.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 2.92, and of deaths registered 1.64.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 78.5° on the 5th, and the lowest was 35.8° on the 10th. The mean temperature of the month (52.3°) was nine-tenths of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (31.4°) took place on the 4th, viz., from a maximum of 76.9° to a minimum of 45.5°. The least range (4.9°) was on the 7th, viz., from a maximum of 58.9° to a minimum of 54.0°. The mean daily range was 16.8°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.932 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Males contributed 57 per cent., and females 43 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 34 per cent. to that mortality as against 30 per cent. in May 1882; 31 per cent. in May 1881 and 1880; 39 per cent. in May 1879; 26 per cent. in May 1878; 34 per cent. in May 1877; 38 per cent. in May 1876; 37 per cent. in May 1875; 39 per cent. in May 1874; and 40 per cent. in May 1873.

The month was unusually fatal to old people, no less than 36 deaths of persons who had attained the age of 75 years or upwards having been recorded, viz.:—A carpenter, aged 75, who died of hæmoptysis; a shoemaker, aged 75, and a female, aged 76, of congestion of the lungs; a female, aged 75, of gastritis; a female, aged 75, who was burnt to death; a gardener, aged 75, and two females, aged 76 and 80 respectively, who died of brain disease; a female, aged 75, a mariner aged 78, and an architect, aged 81, of heart disease; two females, each aged 82, of bronchitis; a female, aged 84, of diarrhoea; a laundress, aged 85, of congestion of the lungs; a bootmaker, aged 85, of fracture of the thigh bone; a farmer, aged 88, of cancer of the tongue, a stonemason, aged 77, a councillor, a fellmonger, and a pensioner, each aged 78; a carpenter and a butcher each aged 79, a laborer, a storeman, a farmer, and 2 females, each aged 80, two females, each aged 82, a female, aged 83, a laborer, a farmer, and a female, each aged 84, an army-captain, aged 85, and a farmer, aged 100, of old age.

Twenty-two deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 20 were set down to accident and 2 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A carter, aged 16, a clerk, aged 18, a watchmaker, aged 29, two laborers, aged 55 and 57 respectively, were killed by railway trains; an engineer, aged 34, died of fracture of the ribs and other injuries, caused by falling into the fly-wheel of an engine; a laborer, aged 43, of fracture of the spine, occasioned by being crushed in a hydraulic lift; a medical man, aged 55, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall from a buggy; a female, aged 52, and a bootmaker, aged 85, of fracture of the skull and thigh-bone respectively, resulting from falls; a female, aged 48, died of burns, occasioned by falling into the fire while in a fit; a female hawkler, aged 75, was burnt to death, her clothes catching fire; a boy, aged 8, and a commercial agent, aged 37, were accidentally poisoned, the former with carbolic acid, and the latter with an overdose of prussic acid; a female, aged 37, an accountant, aged 53, a produce merchant, aged 70, were drowned, the first through slipping into the Yarra whilst walking on the bank; a female infant, aged 1 month, and 2 male infants, aged 2 weeks and 2 months respectively, were suffocated in bed. The suicidal deaths were those of a lodginghouse-keeper, aged 41, who threw himself from a window while in a state of delirium tremens, and a gentleman, aged 60, who drowned himself.

One hundred and seven deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—51 in the Melbourne Hospital, 13 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 7 in the Children's Hospital, 5 in the Lying-in Hospital, 11 in the Immigrants' Home, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Austin Hospital, and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 123, of which 65, or 53 per cent., were of males, and 58, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 85 were under one year of age, 15 were between one and two, 10 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 355. Of these, 208, or 59 per cent., were males, and 147, or 41 per cent., were females: 16 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 18 were between fifteen and twenty, 19 were between twenty and twenty-five, 25 were between twenty-five and thirty, 23 were between thirty and thirty-five, 23 were between thirty-five and forty, 33 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 33 were between fifty and fifty-five, 31 were between fifty-five and sixty, 25 were between sixty and sixty-five, 20 were between sixty-five and seventy, 20 were between seventy and seventy-five, 15 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 21 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the previous month, deaths from scarlatina and diphtheria fell from 2 to 1 each, those from croup from 5 to 3, those from dysentery and diarrhoea from 27 to 22, those from rheumatism from 3 to 1, those from want of breast milk from 5 to 4, and those from hydatids from 5 to 2. On the other hand, deaths from measles increased from *nil* to 1, those from typhoid fever from 40 to 49, and those from syphilis from *nil* to 4. Deaths from phthisis also increased from 48 to 62.

five members—three to form a quorum; one to be designated the house committee, and the other the finance committee, and, when practicable, two or more members of an old may be members of a new committee. The committee of management may also at any time appoint sub-committees for any purpose connected with the institution or its management, and may fix and alter the quorum of, and continue, alter, or discontinue, such committees. The president and vice-presidents shall be *ex officio* members of all committees, and the treasurer shall be *ex officio* member of the finance committee.

27. The house, finance, or other sub-committee shall appoint their own chairman, and meet as directed by the bye-laws, or as they may determine, and whenever convened by order of the chairman. Minutes of their proceedings shall be recorded in a book, and be read to the committee of management at each monthly meeting.

28. The house committee shall meet once at the least in each week, and oftener if necessary. They shall have power, subject to the approval of the committee of management, to admit patients, and to confirm or otherwise the admission of any cases received during the intervals of their meetings; they shall examine into and report to the general committee upon all complaints, and be empowered to dismiss patients for misconduct or breach of the rules of the institution, recording in their minutes reasons for the non-admission or for dismissal; they may engage and discharge servants, order necessary supplies, call for and inspect the half-yearly tenders, and recommend any to the general committee for acceptance; they shall inspect all books connected with the admission and discharge of patients, receipt and issue of stores, medicines, medical instruments, furniture, bedding, and supplies generally; they, or some of their number, shall weekly inspect the wards, kitchen, and other portions of the institution; they shall check the tradesman's monthly bills and other accounts for supplies, and recommend the same to the finance committee for payment; and generally shall supervise and regulate the internal management of the institution, under the direction of the committee of management.

29. The finance committee shall meet at least twice in each month, and shall examine the secretary's cash and other books of account, and compare same with treasurer's bank pass-book; they shall also compare the collector's books, and receipt butts with advertised list of subscriptions and donations, check additions, and see that the totals correspond with each other and with the amounts acknowledged by the treasurer; they shall give all needful instructions to the secretary and collector with reference to keeping books of account and collection of subscriptions and donations, and shall monthly prepare an abstract of all accounts for payment, and submit the same to the committee of management at their monthly meetings, and shall, in conjunction with the president, or a vice-president and secretary, be empowered to make necessary special payments in the intervals between the monthly meetings; they shall see that the vouchers connected with the previous abstract have been properly received, and shall also examine the returns prepared for Government, and annual statements of accounts.

30. In all cases where books or vouchers are checked by the house or finance committee, the signature of some member thereof shall be appended, with the date of examination.

31. At the monthly meetings of committee of management, the minutes of the previous monthly meeting, and of special meetings during the month, shall be read and confirmed, no discussion being allowed thereon, except as to their accuracy; the minutes and reports of all sub-committees shall also be read, and on all questions votes shall be taken by show of hands, each member having one vote only. The committee shall also from among themselves appoint two members (not being members of the house committee) to be visitors for the month, who shall at the next monthly meeting report the state of the institution as found by them at their visits. At the monthly meeting in December of each year the committee shall consider and determine the rate of salaries and wages of the officers and servants of the institution for the ensuing year; and should vacancies occur, or by giving three months' notice, they shall have power to alter or amend rates of salaries and wages then determined upon.

32. The committee of management may suspend any honorary medical officer, or one or more of its own members, on any well-founded charge, provided that such suspension be approved of by a majority of the members present at a special meeting convened for the consideration of such charge, and provided that the suspension and cause thereof be reported to a general meeting of contributors, to be specially convened for that purpose within two weeks after the order of suspension is made; and the house committee may suspend any paid officer of the institution, and make arrangements for the performance of the duties by other officer or person, provided the suspension be reported to the committee of management, and a meeting of such committee be specially convened for the consideration thereof within one week of such suspension. The committee of management shall present a general report of the affairs of the institution, together with a duly audited balance-sheet, at the annual meeting of governors and contributors, in January of each year, such balance-sheet to be published once in one or more of the local papers at least three days before such meeting.

35. No regulation or alteration of any regulation made by the committee of management shall be valid (although *ad interim* the same may be enforced) unless confirmed at the next subsequent monthly meeting of the committee to that at which it was decided on; and no resolution passed by the committee shall be

rescinded within three months, unless one month's notice respecting same shall be first given. Any regulation may be considered and altered by the contributors at the annual meeting in January, or at a special meeting.

COMMON SEAL.

36. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept in the iron chest at the hospital, in a box with two different locks and keys, one of which shall be kept by the president, and the other by the secretary.

37. The common seal shall not be fixed to any deed or other instrument, except by order of the committee of management.

TREASURER.

38. All moneys received on account of the institution shall be paid to the treasurer forthwith, and be deposited without delay to the credit of the institution, in such bank as the committee may from time to time appoint.

39. Upon receipt of any moneys from the secretary or collector, the treasurer shall sign a book, to be kept for the purpose by each, for the amount so paid.

40. All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be signed by the president or a vice-president, the treasurer, and countersigned by the secretary.

41. Previous to signing any cheque for payment the treasurer shall require a warrant, signed by the president or chairman of the meeting of committee of management at which the accounts were passed, and countersigned by the secretary; special payments may nevertheless be made during the month in accordance with bye-law No. 28; such special payments to be included in the next warrant passed by the committee.

42. If any vacancy shall occur in the office of treasurer the committee of management may appoint another to hold office until the annual meeting in January.

THE SECRETARY AND SUPERINTENDENT.

43. He shall attend all general and special meetings of contributors, and all meetings of the general and sub-committees, and take minutes of the proceedings, and shall transcribe them into books kept for that purpose; he shall keep the records of the institution, conduct the correspondence, call all meetings, giving proper notice thereof, and bring the business before the same, and carry out the directions given to him by any of the committee.

44. He shall be responsible for the conduct of the clerical business of his department, and shall keep the necessary books of account, under the directions of the finance committee; and at each monthly meeting of the committee of management he shall submit the cash-book and bank pass-book of the institution, make up to date; and he shall also submit a list of subscriptions and a monthly progress balance-sheet in the prescribed form, showing the actual position of the hospital funds to the end of the previous month.

45. He shall compile all needful returns, statements, and reports required by Government and any of the committees, and shall in every year make application by circular or otherwise to corporate bodies, societies, squatters, and country residents for contributions to the funds of the institution.

46. He shall not in any way be engaged in private business; and under the direction of the committee he shall, as superintendent, be responsible for the proper government and due observance of all the rules and regulations of the institution, excepting those relating to the medical and surgical departments; he shall comply with the regulations which may from time to time be made with respect to the discharge of the duties of his office.

47. He shall give security for his faithfulness in all matters of finance for the sum of £250 of some guarantee company, to be approved by the committee of management.

48. He shall have power to suspend any warder or nurse (after consultation with the resident surgeon, who shall have equal power as to warders and nurses). He shall also have power to suspend any other servant of the institution, such suspension to be reported to the house committee at their next meeting, and if necessary arrangements be made for the performance of the duties in the interim.

AUDITORS.

49. Two auditors shall be appointed at the annual meeting of governors and contributors in January in each year, and the remuneration to them, if any, shall then be fixed. In default of such appointment, or in the event of any vacancy occurring during the year, the committee of management shall make the appointment.

50. They shall have access to all the books and accounts of the institution at any time, to check the same; and shall report to the committee of management anything with respect to the finances and accounts which they may deem necessary to bring to notice.

51. They shall, in the first week in January in each year, examine the treasurer's annual financial statement, with all books, accounts, and documents relating thereto, and list of subscriptions and donations, and shall certify to their correctness; and make any special report thereon which they consider necessary to the annual meeting.

COLLECTOR.

52. The collector shall, under the direction of the finance committee and secretary, canvass for subscriptions and donations to the funds of the institution. He shall give a printed receipt for every sum he receives, and keep a counterpart of such receipt in a book which shall be provided for that purpose by the committee. He shall furnish to contributors from whom he receives a subscription of £1 and upwards the admission-tickets (signed by the secretary) to which they are entitled, and shall also furnish them with a copy of the annual report of the preceding year. He shall enter all subscriptions received by him in a book specifying dates of receipt, and once at least in every week he shall copy all entries into a duplicate book to be kept at the institution. He shall pay over to the treasurer, once in every week, and oftener if the receipts exceed £20, all monies received by him, and shall furnish to the treasurer a list of the contributions so paid over, and shall obtain the treasurer's receipt in his book for such payments.

53. The books used by the collector shall be provided by the committee, and shall be deemed to be the property of the institution; and the collector shall at any time, upon demand, deliver up his books and butts for examination or retention. He shall, when required, be in attendance at the meetings of the finance committee, and shall act in the discharge of his duties under their instructions. He shall give security for the faithful discharge of his duties in the sum of £150 of some guarantee company, to be approved by the committee of management. He shall be paid monthly, in such manner as the committee shall determine, and shall be liable to be removed from office at any time without notice.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

54. The honorary medical staff shall be elected by the governors and contributors at the annual meeting in January of each year, and the number to be elected shall be decided by such meeting, but shall not exceed four; and should a vacancy occur during the year, then the power of filling the same shall rest with the general committee of management.

55. No person shall be eligible for election as an Honorary Physician or an Honorary Surgeon unless he shall be registered as a legally-qualified medical practitioner under any Act in force in Victoria relating to medical practitioners, and unless he shall possess (for the office of physician) a degree from some one of the Universities of the United Kingdom, or of the Australian Colonies, or a Foreign University recognised by them, or a Diploma from a College of Physicians in the United Kingdom; and unless he shall possess (for the office of Surgeon) a degree as Master of Surgery from some one of the aforesaid Universities, or be a member or Licentiate of some one College of Surgeons in the United Kingdom.

56. The Honorary Medical Staff shall in all respects comply with the Bye-laws and Regulations of the Institution.

SURGICAL OPERATIONS, ETC.

57. No one shall be present at the time of any operation or *post mortem* examination, except such persons as may be connected with the Institution, or members of the medical profession.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS INTO THE INFIRMARY.

58. Accidents, and such cases of decided emergency only, as in the opinion of the Resident Surgeon cannot be delayed, may be received in the Infirmary at any time without ticket; and the admission of patients, in ordinary cases, recommended by Subscribers tickets, shall be daily (Sundays excepted) between the hours of NINE and TWELVE o'clock in the forenoon, by the Secretary and the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or in the absence of such Staff by the Secretary and Resident Surgeon; such admission to be temporary, and subject to the approval of the House Committee at its next meeting.

ADMISSION OF PAYING PATIENTS.

59. Paying patients may be admitted at the discretion of the House Committee, who shall fix the weekly rate to be charged to each patient, and in the event of an operation being necessary may fix a fee therefor, and may require the same to be paid in advance; and every person admitted on the ground of emergency to the benefits of the Institution, and able in the estimation of the Committee to pay, shall be required to do so at such a rate as the Committee may determine. Each admission of a paying patient shall be reported to the General Committee at its next meeting, and shall be subject to confirmation.

60. The General Rules and Regulations of the Institution shall be applicable to and be observed by all paying patients.

PERSONS NOT ADMISSIBLE.

61. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no insane person, except on removal for medical examination in the Lunatic Ward; no one having a contagious or infectious disease; no one subject to epilepsy; nor any one who, in the opinion of the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or the Resident Surgeon might receive equal benefit as an out-patient, shall be admitted; and no child under five years of age shall be admitted, except in case of accident or for a surgical operation; nor, except under special circumstances shall patients be admitted from other districts where hospitals exist. Provided that the House Committee or Officers of the Institution shall have discretionary power to admit such prohibited cases, and shall report upon the exercise of such power to the next general meeting of the Committee of Management.

ADMISSION OF INMATES INTO THE BENEVOLENT ASYLUM.

62. The admission of inmates into the Benevolent Asylum shall be restricted to those days in each week upon which the House Committee meets, when applications shall be considered and decided upon. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no person insane; no child under twelve years of age; no one having a contagious or infectious disease shall be admitted.

OUT-PATIENTS.

63. Persons unable to pay for medicines and medical attendance (or for either) but not requiring admission to the house, shall be treated as out-patients on producing the recommendation, in proper form, of a Governor or Subscriber.

IMPOSTORS.

64. In the event of any person in a position to pay for medical or surgical advice, or to support himself or herself elsewhere, being detected in the receipt of the charity of the Institution, such person shall be charged as in-patients of the Infirmary or Benevolent Asylum, at the rate of ten shillings *per diem* from date of admission; or, if an out-patient, ten shillings for each occasion on which either of the Surgeons may have been consulted; and the Committee may order the removal of such person from the Institution, provided the case is not one of emergency.

RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION.

65. Ministers of Religion shall have free access to persons of their respective denominations, at such times as shall be appointed by the Committee of Management; and when a patient requests that any minister may be sent for, his wish shall be immediately complied with.

66. That the instruction of the patients in the Institution be left to the recognised religious teachers of the various denominations to which the patients belong; and it shall be understood that controversial works be prohibited.

REGULATIONS.

67. Copies of all Bye-laws and Regulations with respect to the officers or servants of the Institution, shall be furnished to them by the Secretary; and with respect to the patients and visitors the regulations affecting them shall be hung up in each ward of the Institution.

BYE-LAWS.

68. Any alterations, amendments, or additions proposed to be made in the Bye-Laws, shall be advertised once in one or more newspapers published in Geelong, at least seven days before the meeting at which the same are to be considered.
