PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF ARRA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of The Local Government Act 1874 (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published,

been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:—
The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of Alberton Shire which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from that shire and annexed to the Shire of Buln Buln. Area described in the petition:—
Commencing on the houndary between the counties of Mornington and Buln Buln, at its intersection with the south boundary of the parish of Korumburra; thence castwards along the last-named boundary and the south boundary of the parish of Korumburra; thence castwards along the last-named boundary and the south of the south-west angle of allotment 44 parish of Mardan; thence south to a point east of the boundary between the parishes of Kongwah and Kinak; thence west to that boundary; thence along that boundary to the boundary between the counties of Mornington and Buln Buln: thence northwards along that county boundary to the commencing point.

Betticages state that there has been no money expended

between the counties of Mornington and Duin Duin; meines northwards along that county boundary to the commencing point.

Petitioners state that there has been no money expended within 25 miles of the area sought to be severed. That being between 70 and 80 miles from the Alberton Shire Hall they have no reasonable possibility of reaping the benefits of the rates they pay. That they have no interest in the direction of Alberton but are constantly using the roads in the Buln Buln Shire. That they are within 30 miles of the Buln Buln Shire hall.

That the Buln Buln Shire have extended roads to within ten miles of the area sought to be severed, and are now surveying roads in the same direction. That when the remaining few miles of country are opened up they will be enabled to reach the Metropolis in one day.

Petitioners therefore pray "That an Order be made severing the area above described from the Shire of Alberton and annexing it to the South Riding of the Shire of Buln Buln."

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations

McLeod's Morass Common-Regulations.

In pursuance of the Regulations made by the Governor in Council on the 1st April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale having drafted the following Regulations for management of McLeod's Morass Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council .—

Regulations.

- In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.
- "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

 2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the common may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

 3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall head.
- 3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of April and the first day of October in every year:—For every mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, Four shillings (4s.) per annum. For every cow, heifer, ox, steer, sheep, or goat, Two shillings (2s.) per annum. Progeny, under six months old, of stock legally depasturing on the common—Free.

- 4. No stock shall be considered as registered unless the pre-scribed fees be paid at the time of entering, by the herdsman, their brands or other distinguishing marks and descriptions.
- 5. No bulls or entire horses shall be allowed to depasture on common without the written consent of the managers first
- 6. All stock shall bear a distinguishing brand, and all horned stock shall be marked with the common brand.
- 7. The herdsman shall attend at the common yards every Monday, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., to register and brand all stock brought to him, the owners of which shall assist in the performance of this duty.
- 8. The managers shall not be responsible for stock depasturing on the common, but the herdsman shall give immediate notice to owners when he becomes aware of their stock having strayed from the common, and the managers shall not be responsible for any neglect or irregularity in this respect on the part of the herdsman.
- 9. No person shall be allowed to remove stock from the common without giving not less than twelve hours' notice in writing to the herdsman, and no person shall disturb or remove any stock from the common in the absence of the herdsman.
- 10. The managers shall cause to be removed from the common stock infected with any contagious disease.
- 11. Persons desirous of registering stock shall furnish a writ-ten description of the brands and other distinguishing marks
- 12. At the request of the person registering, the herdsman may register and brand elsewhere than at the common branding-yard, in which case an additional fee of One shilling for one, and Sixpence per head for two or more head of stock will be made.
- 13. The general mustering of stock shall take place in the first week in April and the first week in October in each year, the three first days in each of these weeks to be set apart for the mustering of stock other than neat and small eattle, which shall be mustered on the remaining days of such weeks. Stock so mustered for registration shall, if not registered and paid for, be liable to be impounded on the third of the respective days set apart for such musterings.
- 14. Sheep shall be depastured on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for the purpose.
- 15. Persons removing stock from the common shall be allowed to substitute others upon payment of a registration fee of One shilling per head.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regula-tions shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

The births of 850 children, viz., 427 boys and 423 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of May. In the month of April 922 births were registered, or 72 more than in the month under review. The births were 73 above the average of the previous eight years, and only 6 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in May numbered 478, viz., 273 of males, and 205 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 372. The deaths were 6 above those in April, and exceeded the average of May during the previous ten years by 37. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than the average of those ten year by 18.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 2.92, and of deaths registered 1.64.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 78.5° on the 5th, and the lowest was 35.8° on the 10th. The mean temperature of the month (52.3°) was nine-tentls of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (31.4°) took place on the 4th, viz., from a maximum of 76.9° to a minimum of 45.5°. The least range (4.9°) was on the 7th, viz., from a maximum of 58.9° to a minimum of 54.0°. The mean daily range was 18.8°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.932 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Males contributed 57 per cent., and females 43 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 34 per cent. to that mortality as against 30 per cent. in May 1882; 31 per cent. in May 1881 and 1880; 39 per cent. in May 1879; 26 per cent. in May 1878; 34 per cent. in May 1877; 38 per cent. in May 1876; 37 per cent. in May 1875; 39 per cent. in May 1876; 41 and 40 per cent. in May 1878.

The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A carter, aged 16, a clerk, aged 18, a watchmaker, aged 29, two laborers, aged 55 and 57 respectively, were killed by railway trains; an engineer, aged 34, died of fracture of the ribs and other injuries, caused by falling into the fly-wheel of an engine; a laborer, aged 43, of fracture of the spine, occasioned by being crushed in a hydraulic lift; a medical man, aged 55, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall from a buggy; a female, aged 52, and a bootmaker, aged 85, of fracture of the skull and thigh-bone respectively, resulting from falls; a female, aged 48, died of burns, occasioned by falling into the fire while in a fit; a female hawker, aged 75, was burnt to death, her clothes catching fire; a boy, aged 8, and a commercial agent, aged 37, were accidentally poisoned, the former with carbolic acid, and the latter with an overdose of prussic acid; a female, aged 37, an accountant, aged 53a, a produce merchant, aged 70, were drowned, the first through slipping into the Yarra whilst walking on the bank; a female infant, aged 1 month, and 2 male infants, aged 2 weeks and 2 months respectively, were suffocated in bed. The suicidal deaths were those of a lodginghouse-keeper, aged 41, who threw himself from a window while in a state of delirium tremens, and a gentleman, aged 60, who drowned himself.

One hundred and seven deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—51 in the Melbourne Hospital, 13 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 7 in the folliders' Hospital, 5 in the Lying-in Hospital, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

BYE-LAWS.

THE following are the Bye-Laws of the Geelong Infirmary and Benevolent Asylum (Incorporated) made by the Contributors thereof on the 11th April 1883, and confirmed by a General Meeting of Contributors specially convened for that purpose on the 20th April in same year, and published in Government Gazette:—

BYE-LAWS.

1. All bye-laws made prior to the date of making these bye-laws are hereby repealed, provided always that any regulations made or agreements entered into under bye-laws now in force shall be taken to have been made under these bye-laws, until the same is amended or rescinded.

OBJECTS.

Same is amended or rescinded.

OBJECTS.

2. That the objects of the Infirmary be to afford medical and surgical aid to poor persons requiring it; to a limited number of paying patients whose admission under special circumstances may be sanctioned by the committee of management; and for casualties; but no person who shall meet with casualties, and shall be found able to pay for surgical aid, shall receive further than temporary assistance. That the object of the Benevolent Asylum be the reception of the poor and distressed, with a view to afford them consolation and assistance.

Appropriation of BUILDINGS.

3. That a portion of the buildings shall be set apart for the purposes of an Infirmary, and a portion for the purpose of the Benevolent Asylum, at the discretion of the committee, who shall also be empowered to permit the reception of lunatics, on remand for medical examination, in a ward erected for that purpose.

CONSTITUTION.

4. The corporation shall consist of a president, two vice-presidents, treasurer, governors, and contributors.

QUALIFICATION AND PRIVILEGES OF BENEFACTORS.

5. The following shall be the qualification and privileges of governors and contributors, viz.:—

Every firm or partnership subscribing may exercise their privileges through some one member of such firm to be nominated, in writing, by such firm, and the trustees or executors of every estate subscribing may exercise their privileges through one of themselves to be nominated, in writing, by such trustees or executors, and every public or corporate body subscribing may exercise their privileges through some person in their employ to be nominated, in writing, by such public or corporate body, the power of voting by nominees at annual or special meetings being limited to three votes for all they represent.

7. Recommendations shall be made by ticket, and shall be only used for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for medical attendance; the reception of such persons shall be subject to the approval of the committee of management, and provided that the funds and accommodation of the institution admit of their reception. When recommendations cannot be acceded to, a ticket in lieu of that used shall be returned to the subscriber. Tickets will be issued by the secretary to subscribers at the time of payment of subscriptions; but in cases where the payment is made after the £1st of July in any year, the subscribers shall have the option of taking tickets for that or the following year. Tickets shall only be available till the £1st January in the year after that for which issued. Subscribers shall also have the privilege at any time, on application to the secretary, of exchanging out-patients' tickets for in-patients', and rice terso, one in-patient's ticket being equivalent to three out-patients'.

8. Subscribers of £1 and upwards shall have full power to vote at all meetings from time of payment, and shall be deemed annual subscribers from date of payment, and shall be deemed annual subscribers from date of payment.

9. At all annual and special meetings of the corporation, life governors shall have three votes; £1, one vote.

10. No person shall vote or take part in any meeting while he is a salaried officer or pupil of the institution.

11. Notices of all general and special meetings shall be sent (by post) by the secretary to such contributors as shall leave their address for that purpose in writing under their hands at the institution.

12. An annual meeting of the contributors shall be held on the econd Thursday in the month of January in every year for the

(4.) For the transaction of any business of which notice has been given, or that may arise at such meeting connected with the institution.

13. If required by the committee of management, or upon the requisition in writing of six members of the committee or of ten contributors, the secretary shall, without delay, convene a special meeting of contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in such requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned.

14. All meetings of contributors shall be called by the secretary by advertisement in one or more newspapers published in Geelong, for at least one week previous to such meeting.

15. At all meetings of contributors, the president, or in his absence one of the vice-presidents, shall take the chair; but in their absence the meeting shall choose its own chairman, who shall have a casting vote only.

16. Ten contributors entitled to vote shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of contributors, and as soon as a quorum be present the chair shall be taken; but if no quorum is present within half-an-hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week at the same day and hour.

17. Every question submitted to a general meeting, and all elections, shall be decided by a majority of votes of governors and contributors present entitled to vote, and shall be taken by show of hands, unless a ballot shall have been previously demanded by any three persons entitled to vote; in which case the voting shall be by ballot, and for such purpose scrutineers shall be appointed before the ballot is taken.

COMMITTER OF MANAGEMENT.

Committee of Management.

18. The institution shall be governed by a committee, each of whom shall be a subscriber of not less than £1 per annum, and shall consist of the president, two vice-presidents, treasurer, and eighteen governors or contributors. The honorary medical officers of the institution may be members of the committee. Four members of committee (but not including more than one of the honorary staff) shall form a quorum.

19. The names of candidates for any offices shall be advertised in one or more newspapers published in Geelong, three clear days before the date of meeting for election. No person shall be considered eligible for election at the annual meeting unless he or some one duly authorized on his behalf shall have given notice, in writing, to the secretary at least four days before the date of such meeting, of his intention to become a candidate for one or more of the annual offices, but no person shall hold more than one office whereby a seat at the board may be vacated. Provided always that in the event of sufficient nominations not being sent in to supply all the offices, it shall be competent for the annual meeting to dispense with the above condition, and to fill up any vacancies which may exist after the formal nominations have been disposed of.

20. The president, vice-presidents, treasurer, honorary medical staff, and auditors, shall retire annually from their respective offices at the annual meeting of contributors, but nevertheless be eligible for re-election; and in the event of the annual election to fill vacancies from any cause not taking place on the day appointed, they shall hold office until the elections take place.

21. Whenever any vacancy shall occur in the office of president the committee shall appoint one of the vice-presidents to fill the same; and if any vacancy should occur in the office of vice-president, the committee shall elect one of their number to the office until the next annual meeting.

22. The committee shall meet at the institution on the second Wednesday in every month, and on such other days as they may appoint for the transaction of general business. The committee of management shall direct the general business of the institution, and frame regulations for its internal management (such regulations not to be repugnant to the Hospital Statute and bye-laws); they shall appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants of the institution; and enter into all necessary contracts for the supply of provisions and other articles; and for the repair, alteration, and extension of buildings; they shall direct the collection of the funds, and make all necessary payments in connection with the institution. They shall superintend or give instructions, and make regulations for the admission, discharge, or dismissal of patients and innates, in accordance with the objects of the institution and bye-laws.

26. The committee of management shall, at its first meeting in each year, after the annual meeting of subscribers, choose from among themselves two sub-committees, each to be composed of

THEASURER.

38. All moneys received on account of the institution shall be paid to the treasurer forthwith, and be deposited without delay to the credit of the institution, in such bank as the committee may from time to time appoint.

39. Upon receipt of any moneys from the secretary or collector, the treasurer shall sign a book, to be kept for the purpose by each, for the amount so paid.

40. All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be signed by the president or a vice-president, the treasurer, and countersigned by the secretary.

41. Previous to signing any cheque for payment the treasurer shall require a warrant, signed by the president or chairman of the meeting of committee of management at which the accounts were passed, and countersigned by the secretary; special payments may nevertheless be made during the month in accordance with bye-law No. 29; such special payments to be included in the next warrant passed by the committee.

42. If any vacancy shall occur in the office of treasurer the committee of management may appoint another to hold office until the annual meeting in January.

45. He shall compile all needful returns, statements, and reports required by Government and any of the committees, and shall in every year make application by circular or otherwise to corporate bodies, socioties, squatters, and country residents for contributions to the funds of the institution.

46. He shall not in any way be engaged in private business; and under the direction of the committee he shall, as superintendent, be responsible for the proper government and due observance of all the rules and regulations of the institution, excepting those relating to the medical and surgical departments; he shall comply with the regulations which may from time to time be made with respect to the discharge of the duties of his office.

47. He shall give security for his faithfulness in all matters of finance for the sum of £250 of some guarantee company, to be approved by the committee of management.

48. He shall have power to suspend any warder or nurse (after consultation with the resident surgeon, who shall have equal power as to warders and nurses). He shall also have power to suspend any other servant of the institution, such suspension to be reported to the house committee at their next meeting, and if necessary arrangements be made for the performance of the duties in the interim.

AUDITORS.

49. Two auditors shall be appointed at the annual meeting of governors and contributors in January in each year, and the remuneration to them, if any, shall then be fixed. In default of such appointment, or in the event of any vacancy occurring during the year, the committee of management shall make the appointment.

50. They shall have access to all the books and accounts of the institution at any time, to check the same; and shall report to the committee of management anything with respect to the finances and accounts which they may deem necessary to bring

They stall, in the first week in January in each year, examine the treasurer's annual financial statement, with all books, accounts, and documents relating thereto, and list of subscriptions and donations, and shall certify to their correctness; and make any special report thereon which they consider necessary to the annual meeting.

52. The collector shall, under the direction of the finance committee and secretary, canvass for subscriptions and donations to the funds of the institution. He shall give a printed receipt for every sum he receives, and keep a counterpart of such receipt in a book which shall be provided for that purpose by the committee. He shall furnish to contributors from whom he receives a subscription of £1 and upwards the admission-tickets (signed by the secretary) to which they are entitled, and shall also furnish them with a copy of the annual report of the preceding year. He shall enter all subscriptions received by him in a book specifying dates of receipt, and once at least in every week he shall copy all entries into a duplicate book to be kept at the institution. He shall pay over to the treasurer, once in every week, and oftener if the receipts exceed £20, all monies received by him, and shall furnish to the treasurer a list of the contributions so paid over, and shall obtain the treasurer's receipt in his book for such payments.

53. The books used by the collector shall be provided by the committee, and shall be deemed to be the property of the institution; and the collector shall at any time, upon demand, deliver up his books and butts for examination or rotention. He shall, when required, be in attendance at the meetings of the finance committee, and shall act in the discharge of his duties under their instructions. He shall give security for the faithful discharge of his duties in the sum of £150 of some guarantee company, to be approved by the committee of management. He shall be paid monthly, in such manner as the committee shall determine, and shall be liable to be removed from office at any time without notice.
