RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1st. All charges must be paid when the order for burial is given.

2nd. Application for a burial or for permission to make a vault or erect a monument or fence in the cemetary must be made to the trustees, when a certificate of permission will be granted.

3rd. Charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on a certificate from the trustees or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, and that the relations of the deceased were unable to pay the usual fee.

4th. The sexton shall dig ordinary graves and fill up again for the

fee. Parties requiring brick graves or vaults

will be required to construct them subject to the approval of the

will be required to construct them subject to the approval of the trustees.

5th. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones, and fences must be kept in repair and proper condition by the owners.

6th. A drawing or plan of any stone, tomb, monument, or fence to be erected, and a copy of any epitaph or inscription must be submitted to the trustees for their approval before admitted into the cemetery.

7th. All persons destroying the fence or in any manner injuring the cemetery will be prosecuted.

8th. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alterations from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council.
