VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby authorize and appoint each and every of the persons named in the schedule hereto annexed (being servants or employés of the Board) as its agent for the purpose of severally carrying into effect (so far as applicable to each respective case) the under-mentioned provisions of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, that is to say:—

Under the 128th section of the said statute to seize and detain any person trespassing on any line of state railway, or on any state railway premises whose name and residence shall be unknown to such agent, and to give such person in charge to a police constable, whose duty it is to bring the offender before a justice, and also to complain to any justice against such offender, and charge him with an offence against the 155th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*.

Also to complain to any justice against any person trespassing on any line of railway or on any railway premises for an offence against the 155th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, and to summons such person before a justice and charge him with such offence.

This authority is not to supersede any authority for the like purpose heretofore made and given by the Board of Land and Works.

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- 1st. All charges must be paid when the order for burial is given.
- 2nd. Application for a burial or for permission to make a vault or erect a monument or fence in the cemetery must be made to the trustees, when a certificate of permission will be granted.
- 3rd. Charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on a certificate from the trustees or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, and that the relations of the deceased were unable to pay the usual fee.
- 4th. The sexton shall dig ordinary graves and fill up again for the fee. Parties requiring brick graves or vaults

will be required to construct them subject to the approval of the trustees.

5th. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones, and fences must be kept in repair and proper condition by the owners.

6th. A drawing or plan of any stone, tomb, monument, or fence to be erected, and a copy of any epitaph or inscription must be submitted to the trustees for their approval before admitted into the cemetery.

7th. All persons destroying the fence or in any manner injuring the cemetery will be prosecuted.

8th. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alterations from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council.
