VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

*The Public Works Statute 1865, section 123.*—"It shall be lawful for any officer or agent of the board or company, and all persons called by him to his assistance, to seize and detain any person who shall have committed any offence against the provisions of this part of this Act or of the bye-laws made under the authority of this Act, and whose name and residence shall be unknown to such officer or agent, and give him in charge to a police constable who shall convey him with all convenient despatch before some justice without any warrant or other authority than this Act; and such justice shall proceed with all convenient despatch to the hearing and determining of the complaint against such offender."

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby authorize and appoint the person named in the schedule hereto annexed as its agent and officer for the purpose of carrying into effect (so far as applicable to each respective case) the 123th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, and also at any time hereafter to lay any information or complaint before any justice against any person for any offence against the provisions of Part III. of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, or of any bye-law made or to be made under the authority of such Act; and to summon such person before any justice or justices for such offence, or to charge him or her with such offence

This authority is not to supersede any authority for the like purpose heretofore made and given by the Board of Land and Works.

## PROGRAMME OF THE SECTION FOR COLONIAL MEDICINE.

At the invitation of the Dutch Association for the advancement of medical science, the Executive Committee of the Colonial Exhibition have resolved to add a section for colonial medicine, to be opened simultaneously with the colonial exhibition. Whereas it is the object of the colonial exhibition to diffuse general knowledge of colonies and transoceanic possessions, the aim of this medical section is a more limited one, and of a strictly scientific character, viz., to promote our knowledge of the sanitary and medical conditions of the colonies.

It will be divided into three classes.

The first class will embrace everything relative to the public health in the colonies and transoceanic possessions.

It is generally admitted that the welfare of colonies is closely connected with the health as well of the European population as of the natives, but the opinions as to the best way to attend to the health of the population, under the various conditions of climate, tropical diseases, customs, and habits, are still unsettled, principally from want of a sufficient knowledge of facts. A comparative exhibition, therefore, of all that is done in this direction, affording at the same time as much information as possible for an accurate knowledge of the state of health of the population, may be called one of great interest. It will serve, it is hoped, as a guide to the governments in introducing sanitary improvements or in remedying to existing defects in the various colonies.

The second class is of equally practical importance. It will be devoted to all data connected with the organization of the medical service in the colonies, in regard to which the several colonial governments follow different systems, and it is only by a careful study of them that a correct judgment can be formed as to the best system to be adopted.

The third class will have for its scope the attendance to the sick and wounded, and their transport, and also their treatment by the natives. In all civilized countries this attendance is a subject of public care and interest; but in the colonies there are special circumstances to be taken into consideration, such as are connected with the nature of the tropical diseases, the habits of the population, and the difficulties in obtaining the necessary means for the proper treatment, transport, and attendance of the patients. It is not too much to say that a collection, as complete as possible, of everything bearing upon this subject, would be instructive in the highest degree. A comparison of what is achieved in the colonies under extraordinary circumstances with what is done in the mother countries will undoubtedly lead to results beneficial both to science and humanity.

This class will also comprise everything connected with the mode of treatment of the sick and wounded by the natives themselves. Both the natives and the colonists are in this respect actuated by the same motives of humanity, but the means they use are different. Although it may be contended that the means employed by the natives are for the greater part of a primitive character, yet it should not be forgotten that many medicaments and modes of curing applied in medical science have been discovered by these very natives, and their salutary effect acknowledged by popular experience long before they were used in scientific medicine. All objects relative to these modes of treatment by natives, even those of which the origin is not or little known, will be very welcome to the committee.

The committee is well aware that these three classes do not comprise all that a programme of a medical exhibition relative to colonies should contain in order to be in any way complete, nor does the committee forget that in the subdivisions of the three classes a great many things are omitted that are important in more than one respect. But, in view of the limited time allowed before the opening of the Exhibition, the committee has been compelled to confine itself to the three classes mentioned. As, however, the subject is one of a strictly scientific character, it is, of course, not intended to exclude whatever may not have been specially mentioned. On the contrary, every contribution which may serve to promote the object of the Medical Exhibition will be thankfully received.

The space allotted to the Medical Exhibition being a limited one, the models, plans, drawings, &c., of the objects will be preferred to the objects themselves, if the latter should be too voluminous. This, however, does not apply to those subdivisions of classes for which objects *in natura* have been solicited.

The space required for the medical section is allotted free of any cost. Objects of a commercial or not strictly scientific character shall not be admitted. Exceptions may be made in such cases where duplicates are already exhibited in one of the other sections.

The objects intended for the medical section will be received here up to the 1st April 1883, and the packages should be marked:—"Exhibition of Amsterdam.—Section: Colonial Medicine."

It is intended to hold an International Congress for Colonial Medicine during the Exhibition in September 1883. The programme will be published hereafter.

## CLASS I.

*The Ministration of Public Health in the Colonies.*

1. Sanitary Commissions, their organization and labors, regulations and reports.

2. Supply and testing of water for drinking purposes. Models of artesian wells, aqueducts, reservoirs, ice fabrics. Distilling apparatus, filters, &c.

3. Regulations against the adulteration of food. Testing of foods. Adulterated foods.

Rules and regulations on the sale of opium, hashich, alcoholic and other intoxicating drinks.

Intoxicating drinks made and used by natives.

4. Bathing and sanitary establishments.

5. Schools, dwellings for the laboring classes, barracks, prisons, &c., from a hygienic point of view. Sanitary control.

6. Burial grounds and cremation. Sewerage, sewers, cess-pools, tubs, &c.

7. Trades, professions, and cultures detrimental to health. Communications in regard to the diseases caused thereby; sanitary control; means of improvement.

8. Measures against endemic, epidemic, and contagious diseases.

Measures against diseases caused by marshes, even when drained, by inundations, &c., in connection with the origin of malaria, bilious and yellow fever, cholera, dysentery, &c.

Measures for the prevention of parasitical diseases. (The committee particularly desires the contribution of objects relative to parasitical diseases proper to the colonies.)

Rules and regulations on prostitution, and measures for preventing the spread of venereal diseases.

Rules and regulations on vaccination. Establishments for animal vaccination.

Models, plans, and drawings of establishments for quarantine. (Buildings, vessels, barges, &c.)

Regulations for the prevention of epizootic diseases (rinderpest, &c.) Objects relative to these diseases.

9. Death rates. Diagrams of mortality in colonies, if possible with indication of the sources whence the returns have been compiled, and of the method followed in grouping them.

## CLASS II.

*Organization of the Medical Service in the Colonies.*

10. Direction and administration of the Civil and Military Medical Service.

Laws and regulations relative to the qualifications for the practice of medicine, surgery, midwifery, pharmacy, and veterinary surgery.

Laws and regulations relative to the Military Medical Service. Rules and regulations on the practice of medicine, pharmacy, and veterinary surgery by Chinese and other native practitioners.

The distribution of physicians, surgeons, midwives, apothecaries, and veterinary surgeons in the colonies.

11. Special medical education of colonial doctors in the mother country.

Medical schools in the colonies. (Education of Doctors-Djawa, district doctors, &c.)

Regulations. Buildings. Text-books and other auxiliary means of education (anatomical preparations of tropical and exotic diseases, &c.)

Schools for midwives. Regulations. Buildings.

Text-books. Educational accessories.

The instruction of vaccinators. Regulations. Text-books.

## CLASS III.

*Attendance to and transport of the Sick and Wounded; their treatment by the natives.*

12. Models, plans, and drawings of civil and military hospitals, lying-in hospitals, lunatic asylums, leprosies, ambulances in the colonies, &c. Objects used in nursing the sick, and derived from the colonies.

Means of transport of sick and wounded; *by land*: preliminary assistance, ambulance carriages, brancards; *by water*: hospital and transport ships and boats.

14. Medical literature, printed and published in the colonies (periodicals, pamphlets, treatises, and other medical publications).

15. The medical treatment and hygienic customs (circumcision, &c.) of the natives.

Instruments, contrivances, belonging thereto.

The drugs of the natives, if possible with a correct description of their origin and application.

Medical literature of the natives.

Chinese apothecary's shop.

16. Means used by natives (antidotes and medical treatment) in cases of poisoning and poisoned wounds (bites of poisonous or injurious animals, as snakes, spiders, centipedes, scorpions, mosquitoes, &c.; contact of toads, bats, &c.; stings of some fishes; wounds from poisoned arrows, &c.). It is requested to send the native poisons themselves, with a correct description of their effect according to the appreciation of the natives, adding also the animals or insects, arrow-poisons, &c.

Treatment of the chicha (*pulex penetrans*) by the natives.

17. Obstetrical help, and treatment of mother and child during and after the confinement, as practised by the natives. Instruments, &c.

HAURAKI GULF, NORTH ISLAND, N.Z.—EXHIBITION OF LIGHT ON MOKO HINOI ISLAND, AND ALTERATION TO TIRI TIRI LIGHT.

NOTICE is hereby given that a Lighthouse is in course of erection at Moko Hinou Islands, and it is anticipated that the light will be ready for Exhibition about the month of April next.

The following is a description of the light that will be exhibited:—

The lighthouse is situated on Burgess Island, one of the Moko Hinou Group, at the entrance to Hauraki Gulf, North Island, New Zealand, lat. 35° 55' 15" S. long. 175° 8' 47" E. The light will be a first order flashing white light, visible all round seaward, and will show a flash every ten seconds. Further particulars will be published in a future notice.

PACIFIC OCEAN.—[Notice No. 60.]—SOUTHERN AND WESTERN PARTS.

THE following information, relating to the Solomon Islands, is derived chiefly from remarks made by Lieutenant V. D. Hughes, H.M.S. *Cormorant*, 1881.

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation 8½° easterly in 1882.]

SOLOMON ISLANDS.

UGI ISLAND.—*Selwyn Bay (Etc-etc)*.—This bay, situated on the west side of Ugi Island, affords during the season of the S.E. trade sheltered anchorage in 16 or 17 fathoms water, over fine black sand.

During the N.W. monsoon the anchorage in the northern part of the bay is also reported (from local information) to be sheltered, but the surf on the beach is too heavy to admit of boats landing.

*Supplies*.—Wood and excellent water can be obtained at Ugi Island; also pigs and yams, the latter being brought from San Christoval Island.

*Climate*.—During May and June 1881, the weather experienced at Ugi Island was generally fine, but heavy showers of rain were occasionally experienced.

*Population*.—The number of inhabitants of Ugi Island is estimated at 900.

*Anchorage*.—The *Cormorant* anchored in 18 fathoms, white sand, with the traders' but bearing N. 80° E.; long vessels should anchor in not less than 20 fathoms.

At the anchorage a current setting to the north-westward was frequently experienced; on one occasion it set N.W. by W. with a velocity of one mile an hour; round Pauna-pauna Point (south of the anchorage) the current sets about 2½ knots an hour.

FLORIDA ISLAND.—PORT PURVIS (native name Utaka).—The *Cormorant* entered this port by keeping in mid-channel. Anchorage was obtained off the entrance to Utaka Passage, in which

position the S.E. trade was experienced; the various bays in Port Purvis were found to afford anchorage, but in some cases only near the head.

Numerous crocodiles were seen, and fish and birds were numerous. There is no native village in Port Purvis.

*Mboli Harbor*.—The *Renard* proceeded from Port Purvis to Mboli, passing through Utaka Passage; this channel appeared to be clear of dangers, with depths of 10 fathoms in mid-channel and 4 and 5 fathoms close to the mangroves on either side; the least water found was 16 feet on a small shoal in the centre, at about 1 mile from the northern entrance. Utaka Passage is about 4 miles long, and from a quarter to half a mile wide, with two sharp turns near the northern end.

H.M.S. *Miranda* also passed through Utaka Passage and found the tidal stream running strongly.

*Sail Rock*.—This rock, marked by five palm trees, is about 40 yards in diameter.

*Black Rock*.—This rock is about 12 feet high, and lies 2 cables from the shore; a rock, about 3 feet high, lies between Black Rock and the shore.

*Shoal Ground*.—Shoal ground, over which a depth of 5 fathoms was obtained, lies eastward of Mboli Harbor; from this depth Mboli Point bears S. 75° W., and the east extreme of Florida Island bears S.E.

*East Islet*, about 60 feet high and covered with trees, is 200 yards long, and the same in breadth. A reef extends from the south side, but the north side can be passed at the distance of half a mile.

*Discolored Water*.—Discolored water (indicating probably a depth of 6 or 7 fathoms) was observed with East Islet bearing N. 35° W., and the Outer Islet on the south coast bearing S. 66° W.

NOTE.—Southward of a line drawn from East Islet to the point eastward of Tree Islet there are several shoals, having over them depths of about 5 fathoms.

*Asses Ears*.—These rocks are about 30 and 40 feet high respectively, and lie off a low shelving point; a reef which breaks extends about a quarter of a mile from the Asses Ears, but no indications of shoals, were observed to the southward or south-eastward of them.

*Landmark*.—A remarkable conical hill about 400 feet high, with a tree on the summit, is situated on the north coast, about half a mile west of Asses Ears.

SAVO ISLAND.—The anchorage off this island is in 8 fathoms off a small indentation of the coast on the western side, having a black pyramidal rock on the beach on the southern side, and a remarkable sharp peak a short distance inland on the northern side.

ISABEL ISLAND.—*Cockatoo Anchorage*.—Vessels having passed northward of the detached shoal of 3 fathoms lying north-west of Cockatoo Island, should keep the extreme of Isabel Island well open of Sandy Point, in order to avoid the reef extending N.W. from Cockatoo Island; when nearing the anchorage these points should be brought nearly in line.\*

*Round Islet*.—This islet bears about W. by N. ½ N. from the north extreme of Cockatoo Island, distant 2½ miles; between Round Islet and the main are numerous reefs, some of which are above water.

*Pigeon Islet*.—This islet, lying about W. by S. ½ S. from Cockatoo Island, distant 1½ miles, is half a mile long in a N.E. and S.W. direction, with a reef extending about 3 cables from the western side.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale has requested that certain streets, in the township of Bairnsdale, in that shire, be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands acquired or used for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate in the township of Bairnsdale, in the Shire aforesaid, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :—

##### BOROUGH OF INGLEWOOD.—REGULATION No. 2.

A Regulation of the Borough of Inglewood, made under the first subdivision of Part V of the Thirteenth Schedule of the "Local Government Act 1874," in force in the borough by virtue of a bye-law of the above-named borough, No. Twenty-seven, for regulating the height, thickness, construction, or materials of party-walls of buildings adjoining each other, and the external walls and buildings of chimneys, and the materials for and the mode of enclosing the same.

IN pursuance of the "Local Government Act 1874," No. 506, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses make the following regulation as to party or external walls:-

Foundations shall not be less than two feet deep, and must be composed of brick or stone and laid in good lime, mortar, or cement, and in such a manner as to produce solid work.

Party or external walls shall not be less than fourteen inches thick; and every such wall must be built of brick or stone, or of bricks and stones together, and laid in with good lime, mortar, or cement, and in such a manner as to produce solid work; and every such wall must be carried up to its full thickness, to the underside of the plate under the roof, save and except all requisite openings for doors and windows.

Every party and side external wall must be carried up and remain two feet at the least above the gutter, so as to form a parapet-wall, and such parapet must be nine inches thick.

Provided that the above regulation shall not apply to dividing-fences or out-houses.

Adopted on the 20th December 1882, and confirmed on the 17th day of January 1883.

## BYE-LAWS OF THE COLAC DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

## OBJECTS :

THE objects of the institution are to afford medical aid to destitute persons requiring it, and for the necessary treatment of casualties; but no person who shall be found able to pay for surgical aid shall receive further than temporary assistance: Provided always that persons willing to pay may be admitted to the institution at the direction of and on such terms and conditions as the committee may deem fit.

## GOVERNMENT.

2. The institution shall be governed by a committee of management, consisting of a president, vice-president, treasurer, and nine ordinary members of committee, all of whom shall be contributors or benefactors, and shall be elected in accordance with the provisions of the *Hospital and Charitable Institutions Act, 27 Victoria No. 220, Sec. 12.*

## CONTRIBUTORS.

3. Benefactors of £5 shall have the privilege of recommending two out-door patients annually, and shall be entitled to vote at all general meetings.

4. Benefactors of £10, or contributors of £1, shall be called annual subscribers, and shall have the privilege of recommending one in-door or three out-door patients annually; they shall also be entitled to one vote at all general meetings.

5. Benefactors of £25, or contributors of £10, shall be called life subscribers, and shall have for life the same privileges as the annual subscribers.

6. Benefactors of £20, or annual contributors of £2 shall be called annual governors, and shall be entitled to recommend two in-door or six out-door patients, or have the alternative of recommending one in-door and three out-door patients annually; they shall also have two votes at all general meetings.

7. Benefactors of £50 or contributors of £20 shall be called life governors, and shall have for life the same privileges as the annual governors.

8. Any additional benefaction or contribution shall entitle to additional privileges, in accordance with the above scale in respect of recommending patients only.

9. The current year shall, with respect to each benefaction or contribution, be reckoned from the day of payment.

10. That it is hereby understood that the word "benefaction" shall mean a sum of money received from the public by collection or otherwise, and the word contribution a personal gift.

11. Every firm or partnership contributing shall exercise the privileges through some one member of the firm only.

12. No person shall hold or be eligible for any honorary office (except that of honorary consulting medical officer), nor have any vote, nor exercise any privilege connected with the institution unless his subscription shall have been paid at least seven clear days previous.

## GENERAL MEETINGS.

13. The annual meeting of contributors to the hospital shall be held on the second Thursday in the month of January in every year, for the following purposes, viz.:-

To receive the annual reports.

To elect a president, vice-president, and treasurer.

To fill vacancies in the committee of management.

To elect an honorary consulting medical officer.

To elect two auditors and fix remuneration (if any) to same.

14. No candidate shall be nominated as member of committee unless his consent has been obtained in writing.

15. All votes at the annual and other meetings of contributors shall be taken by a show of hands, unless a ballot shall have been previously demanded by three of the contributors present, in which case the vote or votes referred to shall be by ballot.

16. At all meetings of contributors ten shall constitute a quorum, and as soon as a quorum is present the chair shall be taken; but if no quorum be present within one hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned to the following week at the same day and hour.

17. It shall be competent for a majority of the committee of management or ten or more contributors, by a writing under their hands, to require the secretary to summon a special meeting of contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting to be specified in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting but that so specified; and every such meeting shall be convened by the secretary by advertisement in one or more local papers, at least one week before the day of meeting.

## COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

18. The committee of management shall direct the general business of the hospital, enter into all contracts connected therewith, and direct payment of the same; they shall appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants of the institution.

19. They shall meet on the second Tuesday in every month at three o'clock p.m., and at such other times as may be necessary. Four members shall constitute a quorum.

20. The chairman of committee (who shall be the president, if present, or the vice-president in his absence, or some other member in their absence) shall have a casting vote.

21. The president shall be empowered to convene a meeting of the committee at any time he may consider necessary, and the secretary shall, on receiving a requisition from three members of committee, convene a special meeting thereof.

22. The committee of management shall, at the first committee meeting subsequent to the annual meeting of subscribers in each year, elect from among themselves a house committee of three, one of whom shall retire from office in rotation at each monthly meeting, at which meeting the vacancy shall be filled up. The duties of the house committee shall be to visit the hospital at least once a week to examine buildings, inspect the wards, make enquiry respecting the quality and quantity of the rations, enforce the rules, investigate accounts, and report upon same and all other matters connected with the management of the institution. At the next monthly meeting of the general committee the office of any member of the house committee shall cease by his ceasing to be a member of the general committee.

23. The committee of management shall, at the first committee meeting held subsequently to the annual meeting of subscribers in each year, elect from among themselves a finance committee of three, whose duty shall be to examine all accounts for disbursement and certify as to their correctness, and also see that the money received by the collector has been paid into the bank to the credit of the hospital.

24. If any member of committee shall die or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the president of the committee, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanor, or be absent from four consecutive ordinary meetings of committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of committee may temporarily appoint thereto some contributor until the next annual meeting for the election of the committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who by provision of the Act 27 No. 220 are required to go out of office.

25. The general committee shall present a report of the affairs of the hospital at each annual meeting, which report shall be presented at a special meeting of the committee for revision and approval at least one week before the annual meeting.

26. The president, vice-president, and treasurer shall be *ex officio* members of all sub-committees.

27. The committee shall be empowered to frame such bye-laws and regulations as they may deem necessary for the proper internal government of the institution in its different departments, provided such bye-laws are not repugnant to the laws of the institution or an Act of Parliament.

## TREASURER.

28. All moneys received on account of the hospital shall be paid to the treasurer (or his account at the bank) and appropriated by him to the purposes of the institution on the authority of the committee of management.

29. All moneys received by the treasurer on account of the hospital shall be paid into the credit of the institution at the bank within forty-eight hours after such moneys shall amount to five pounds (£5) and receipt of same made known to the collector as early as possible.

30. The treasurer shall close his accounts on the 30th June in every year.

## SECRETARY.

31. The secretary shall attend all meetings, take minutes of the same, conduct all correspondence, and carry out the directions of such meetings in the particulars incident to his duties. He shall submit a balance-sheet at every ordinary meeting of the committee of management, showing the receipts and expenditure since the previous meeting.

## AUDITORS.

32. The auditors shall, in the second week of July in every year, or as soon as conveniently may be prior to the annual meeting of contributors, examine the collector's books, cash-book, and balance-sheet, with all accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto, and shall report thereon to the general committee at the meeting appointed by them. In the event of the office of auditor becoming vacant between the annual meetings of subscribers, the committee of management shall be empowered to fill up such vacancy or vacancies.

## HONORARY CONSULTING MEDICAL OFFICER.

33. The honorary consulting medical officer shall attend at the hospital for consultation or co-operation whenever requested by the medical officer, and shall have access to the institution at all times.

## MEDICAL OFFICER.

34. The medical officer shall be a duly qualified medical practitioner. He shall hold office under the direction of the committee, and will be allowed private practice.

35. He shall receive the certificates from applicants for admission, examine the nature of each case, and decide on its fitness for admission, and discharge such patients as he considers fit to be discharged.

36. He shall have charge of all patients in the hospital, and their treatment.

37. He shall perform all surgical operations and *post mortem* examinations.

38. He shall superintend and control all servants in the hospital and have power, in case of insubordination or neglect of duty, to suspend any of them until the decision of the committee, and, if necessary, to hire temporary substitutes for servants thus suspended.

39. He shall visit the hospital daily. He shall admit or exclude patients every Tuesday and Friday, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 noon, and on such days and between such hours shall afford relief to out-patients holding a ticket of recommendation.



40. He shall keep all accounts and make such reports as may be directed by the committee.

41. He shall carry out all regulations made by the committee for the internal management of the hospital.

42. He shall have no power to decide as to the paying capabilities of patients.

#### STEWARD AND MATRON.

43. The steward shall reside on the premises, and have charge, control, and management of the institution and the inmates thereof, subject to the regulations and orders of the general and visiting committee and the paid medical officer. Neither steward nor matron shall be absent between the hours of 9 p.m. and 8 a.m., nor more than two hours at a time, without permission from the visiting committee or the paid medical officer (except on Sundays for three hours). The steward and matron are never to be absent from the institution at the same time without special permission of the president and visiting committee.

44. The steward shall have the immediate superintendence of the matron and servants, and shall see that they do their duty, and he shall enforce order, sobriety, personal cleanliness, neatness, and obedience to orders. In case of any misbehaviour, disobedience, or neglect of duty by any of them, he shall have power to suspend the offender, and report to the visiting committee, who shall discharge the offender or deal with the case as they may deem fit.

45. He shall regularly visit every part of the institution and see that the wards and other parts of the house and grounds are kept in a proper state of cleanliness and order, and that all inmates whom the doctor shall certify as able be employed in the grounds or otherwise.

46. He shall have the charge of and be accountable for the surgical instruments, furniture, bedding, linen, glass, cutlery, cooking and kitchen utensils, medicines and stores, and all other property of the institution, and he shall make an exact inventory of the same in a book to be kept for that purpose, in which he shall regularly enter the receipt, loss, or breakage of any article, and he shall, on the last days of June and December in each year and at such other times as the general committee may require, prepare and submit such inventory to the committee.

47. He shall receive the stores and supplies furnished by the contractor, or others, and he shall see that they correspond in description, quality, and quantity with the tenders and orders; and in case they do not, he shall report accordingly to the visiting committee at the next meeting.

48. He shall keep an exact account of the admission and discharge of inmates, with ages and religious denominations, and also of all outdoor recipients, the nature of the relief given, and its period of continuance, in the register book; also a discharge book in which each patient leaving may make any remark.

49. The matron shall be subject to the same regulations respecting living in the house and absence therefrom as the steward; she shall see that the female servants do their duty, and shall report any neglect or disobedience of orders on their part to the steward.

50. She shall visit each ward daily, and shall see that the beds, linen, and clothes of any patients are clean and in good order, and shall cause such of the bedding, &c., as require it to be replaced by others, and furnish an inventory of goods belonging to her department to the steward.

51. She shall superintend the cooking of all food for the inmates, and shall generally discharge the duties of matron as shall be directed by the committee.

#### PATIENTS.

52. All applicants for admission must be provided with a recommendation ticket; the medical fitness of the applicant shall be determined by the medical officer.

53. All patients shall be required to pay the actual expenses of their maintenance as far as circumstances may enable them, and all property found on deceased patients shall be appropriated to the defraying of the expenses of their maintenance and burial, and the residue, if any, to be handed to their legal representatives.

54. Severe accidents and cases of decided emergency may be admitted at any time by the visiting committee, medical officer, or honorary medical officer.

55. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement, no child under two years of age, no person insane, or laboring under *districtum tremens*, or infectious disorder, or subject to epilepsy, or any one who, in the opinion of the examining physician or medical officer, might receive equal benefit as an outdoor patient, shall be admitted into the hospital.

56. Patients shall conduct themselves orderly, and shall strictly observe all the directions of the medical officer, honorary medical officer, wardsmen, and nurses.

57. They shall take their medicines at the times directed, and they shall not take any other medicines than those prescribed, and they shall not conceal or put away any portion of the medicines or diet administered to them.

58. No one shall leave his or her ward and go into another ward or department, nor leave the house, nor remain out for a longer time than is granted, nor shall introduce visitors, nor receive medicines, victuals, liquor, or tobacco, or anything, without the express leave of the medical officer.

59. They shall not gamble nor smoke nor spit on the floor, nor deface or injure any parts of the ward, nor any furniture, bedding, or clothing therein, nor sing, blaspheme, nor use any rude or indecent language, on pain of dismissal.

60. No patient shall give reward or gratuity to any of the wardsmen, nurses, or any of the other servants.

61. Any patient having any cause of complaint, shall make the same known to the medical officer, whose duty it shall be to enter such complaint immediately, in the presence of the nurse or wardsmen of the ward, in a book kept for that purpose, which book shall be laid before the visiting committee at each meeting.

62. Patients considered by the medical officer sufficiently convalescent to be able to assist in the work of the institution may, at the direction of the medical officer, be so employed.

63. Patients shall not sit up after eight o'clock p.m. in the winter, or after nine o'clock p.m. in the summer, and all patients considered by the medical officer able to do so shall rise at seven o'clock a.m. in the summer and before eight (8) o'clock a.m. in the winter.

#### OUT-PATIENTS.

64. Out-patients holding a ticket of recommendation will receive out-door relief on Tuesday and Friday mornings only, between the hours of ten and twelve o'clock, except in cases of emergency.

65. Each outdoor patient having a recommendation from a subscriber will be entitled to receive medical relief for eight weeks from the date of first advice, but should the disease from which the person is suffering require more than eight weeks' attendance it will be necessary to obtain another ticket of recommendation.

66. Any person or persons imposing on the charity of the institution will render themselves liable to prosecution.

67. Ministers of religion shall have access to sick persons of their respective denominations at such times as shall be appointed by the committee. Any minister may attend any patient at any time when requested by such patient, and in case of a death notice shall be forwarded to the clergyman of the denomination to which the deceased patient belongs stating the hour of burial.

#### VISITORS.

68. Visitors will be admitted on Sundays and Wednesdays in each week, between the hours of two o'clock and five o'clock in the afternoon.

69. Visitors may be admitted on special occasions by permission of the medical officer.

70. Visitors will not be allowed to go into any ward without the leave of the steward or matron, and must retire when requested to do so by either of them.

71. Visitors will not be permitted to give to, nor leave with any patient, medicine, food, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, nor any other thing, without the express sanction of the medical officer.

72. Visitors shall not give to any servant of the institution any money or gratuity of any kind.

73. Visitors shall not interfere with the wardsmen or nurses, nor disturb the patients by loud talking or unnecessary noise.

74. Any visitor violating any of the regulations of the institution, or behaving with impropriety, will be compelled to retire, and will not be re-admitted without special leave from the medical officer or house committee.

#### VOLENTARY DEPARTURE.

75. Patients quitting the hospital at their own desire shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving.

#### IMPOSTORS.

76. In the event of any person in a position to pay for medical or surgical advice elsewhere, being detected in the receipt of the charity of the institution, such person, if an in-patient, shall be liable to be prosecuted, and shall be charged at a rate not exceeding Ten shillings (10s.) per day for each day from the date of admission; or if an out-patient he may also be prosecuted, and shall be charged a sum not exceeding Ten shillings (10s.) for each occasion upon which he shall consult the medical officer, and the committee may order the removal of any such person from the hospital, provided the case is not one of emergency.

#### ENDOWMENT FUND.

77. (1) An endowment fund may be established, consisting of (a) all bequests not specially directed to be otherwise applied, (b) sums of money set aside by the committee from time to time from the proceeds of fêtes or other revenue locally raised, (c) special contributions, (d) interest accruing on the investment of the funds.

(2) All moneys to the credit of the fund from time to time shall be invested by the committee at their discretion in Colonial Government securities or bank stock in the name of the corporation, and the treasurer shall receive the income therefrom, and appropriate the same for the purposes of the institution on the authority of the committee of management.

(3) The principal moneys of the endowment fund shall not be transferred nor applied to any purpose whatever without the sanction of a majority of subscribers and governors at a special meeting called for that purpose.

(4) Contributors to this fund shall be entitled to all the privileges in respect of their contribution as if the same had been made to the ordinary annual revenue of the institution.

#### MEETINGS.

78. All meetings in connection with the hospital shall be open to subscribers and to representatives of the press, but no person present at committee meetings who is not a member of committee shall be permitted to interfere, or take part in the proceedings.

#### PREVIOUS BYE-LAWS.

79. All bye-laws previously made for the management of the institution are hereby repealed.

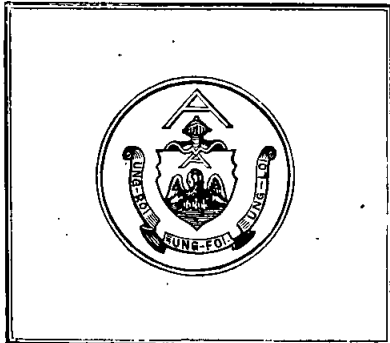

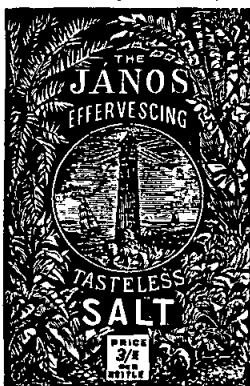

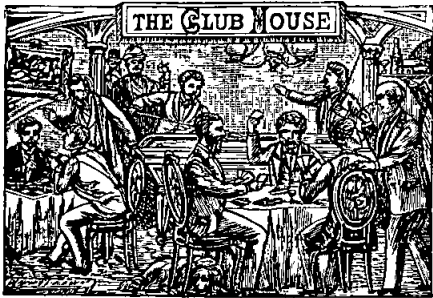
