## EXAMINATION FOR LAND SURVEYORS.

THE Board of Examiners which has been appointed in connection with the Department of Lands and Survey to enquire into the qualification of surveyors who desire to obtain certificates of competency, hereby notifies that the next examination will commence on Monday, 19th November 1883.

Intending candidates must give notice of their intention in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; shall also specify the optional subjects in which they desire to be examined; and upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

All applications must be in the hands of the Secretary by the 19th October next.

### PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, or the examination prescribed for candidates for admission into the Civil Service of Victoria (including in either case the subjects of Arithmetic, Euclid, and Algebra), or such other examination as shall in the opinion of the Board be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some authorized surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some certificated surveyor of recognized standing, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must, if required, give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed his first and second year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and must have served in the field for two years with some qualified surveyor employed by the Crown Lands Department of Victoria.

IV. Or he must have completed his third year in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and have served one year in the field as above.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of country lands.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with either of the above conditions will be examined in each of the seven compulsory subjects, and in one at least of the optional subjects included in each of the groups; but he will only be examined in such optional subjects as he shall have given notice of at the time of making his application.

Compilation of charts from detached plans and notes;

### CERTIFICATES WITHOUT EXAMINATION.

Certificates will be granted by the Board without examination to gentlemen who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the examiners that they have complied with the following conditions, and shall have paid the prescribed fee. But such certificates shall state on the face of them that they have been granted without examination:

Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British colony, and having been in practice there during not less than one year; having been engaged in this colony under some authorized surveyor for not less than six months; and having a favorable report on his qualifications from the Assistant Surveyor-General, or the Surveyor in charge of the district in which the applicant shall have been employed.

## VESSELS ENTERING NEW RIVER.

THE New River Harbor Board has notified that the sand-spit which, during the past three years, has choked up the channel, is now cleared away, and that the old channel along the rocks is open.

To strangers requiring a pilot.—In case there should be too much sea and the pilot not able to board, the vessel will be steered by the semaphore up to the Bombay Rock, on which there is an iron beacon, surmounted by a barrel painted white. The course from abreast of the beacon to the first white buoy, proceeding upwards, is N.E. by N., where vessels can anchor in safety half-way between the buoy and the west shore, and where the pilot can board with safety. The depth on the bar at high-water ordinary tides is fourteen feet. Masters should not run in for the harbor during ebb tide unless with a good commanding breeze.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council, in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Water Works Act 1865*, has made the Rules, Regulations, and Orders following respecting the Castlemaine and Sandhurst District Water Supply, being a work constructed under the authority of the said Act:—

1. The district which shall be rated for the Castlemaine and Sandhurst District Water Supply shall be the whole of the borough of Castlemaine, the whole of the borough of Chewton, the whole of the united shire of Mount Alexander, the whole of the united shire of Metcalfe, the whole of the city of Sandhurst, the whole of the borough of Eaglehawk, the whole of the shire of Marong, the whole of the shire of Huntly, the whole of the shire of Strathfeldsaye, and that portion of the shire of Maldon comprised in the extension to Winter's Flat.

2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the board within the said district, that is to say:—

(1.) On every house or tenement of £20 annual value and under, One pound per annum.

(2.) On every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £300 inclusive; Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £700; and Two pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £700.

(3.) On every shop, not used as a domicile, above the annual value of £20, a rate of Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £300 inclusive; Two pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £700; and One pound five shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £700.

(4.) The rates to be charged for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be One shilling per 100 gallons.

(5.) The rate to be charged for water supplied by the board from the mains by measure shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, except in the cases hereinafter specially mentioned.

(6.) For water supplied from the mains for sluicing purposes, the rate shall be Twopence per 1,000 gallons.

(7.) For water supplied from the mains for mining purposes other than sluicing, the rate shall be Fourpence per 1,000 gallons.

(8.) For water supplied from the channels to crushing-mills, pyrites-works, &c., the rate shall be Threepence per 1,000 gallons.

(9.) For water supplied to gardens and nurseries, cultivated for trade purposes, and to cricket-grounds, the rate shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

(10.) For water supplied to any cemetery, the rate shall be Fourpence per 1,000 gallons.

(11.) For water supplied to any public parks or gardens, the rates shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

(12.) a. The rate to be charged for water supplied from the main aqueducts and from any of the branch aqueducts which diverge therefrom shall be One halfpenny per thousand gallons, in quantities of not less than one million gallons per month.

b. The rate to be charged for water supplied in fixed quantities of less than one million gallons from any portion of the main aqueduct, or from any of the branch aqueducts, shall be for quantities:—

Under 250,000 gallons ... 2d. per 1,000 gallons.

Above 250,000 gallons but under 500,000 gallons—

The first 250,000 gallons ... 2d. per 1,000 gallons.

For the excess ... 1d. "

Above 500,000 gallons but under 1,000,000 gallons—

The first 500,000 gallons ... 1d. per 1,000 gallons.

For the excess ... 3d. "

Delivery of the water shall be taken within one month from the time of purchase, failing which, the purchaser shall forfeit all his right thereto.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—

(1.) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity of which, the charge at 1s. per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure; and

(2.) If for other than domestic purposes only, 25,000 gallons per quarter.

4. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carrier's stables, or a supply for any manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labor), or for water-power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees or plants, or washing the house walls, or a carriage, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

5. Any person receiving water from the board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the board who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the board, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the board, he shall obtain from the board a license in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. Before any such license shall be granted by the board, the person applying for same shall satisfy the board that he is a competent plumber.

9. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the board, without giving two days' notice to the board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the board, without the permission in writing of the board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

10. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe, to communicate with the pipes of the board, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board. Wrought-iron piping, of approved quality, and lead piping of the following weights only, will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:—

No service of a larger bore than  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch will be permitted, unless by special consent of the board.

11. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the board may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.



12. Any person supplied with water by the board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

13. If any meter should cease registering, and, during the time it is undergoing repairs, the board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

14. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

15. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

16. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

17. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

18. If any person supplied with water by the Board does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought not to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the board may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

19. The streets shall not be watered from hydrants or fireplugs by means of a hose, but the water is to be applied to the streets by carts or by manual labor, or by special stand-pipes of approved size and form.

20. The water supplied in the above-named district shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the same regulations and not otherwise.

21. In the construction of these rules and regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole; and the word "board" shall mean the Board of Land and Works.

22. The Rules, Regulations, and Orders affecting the Castle-maine and Sandhurst District Water Supply, made on the 7th January 1878, the 4th February 1878, the 4th March 1878, the 12th August 1878, the 28th October 1878, the 4th March 1879, the 28th February 1881, and the 26th September 1882, respectively, are hereby repealed.

## TOWN OF WARRNAMBOOL.

LANDS RESERVED FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES, ETC., PARISH OF YANGERY, AND TOWN OF WARRNAMBOOL.—REGULATIONS.

THE Council of the Town of Warrnambool, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the undermentioned reserved lands, viz. :—

The land in the parish of Yangery, temporarily reserved by Order of the twentieth day of October One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine for "Public purposes;"

The land in the parish of Yangery, near Warrnambool, permanently reserved by Order of the twenty-eighth day of April One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three "For the purpose of being sown and planted to preserve the irruption of sand;"

And the land in the town of Warrnambool, temporarily reserved by Order of the second day of August One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five for "Public purposes;"

having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

## REGULATIONS.

1st. The use of the reserves by the public shall be restricted to the paths or tracks therein set out by the Council.

2nd. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3rd. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, fences, gates, or erections in the reserves, or put offensive matter in the trough or reservoir therein.

4th. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

5th. No person shall put into the reserves any cattle, sheep, goats, geese, or pigs.

6th. No person shall bring into the reserves any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Council.

7th. All cattle, sheep, and dogs (except as aforesaid) found within the reserves shall be taken possession of by the ranger, and if not claimed and all expenses paid within three days, shall be liable to be sold by public auction.

8th. All pigs, goats, and geese found within the reserves may be either assessed, for amount of damages, or destroyed.

9th. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserves, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.

10th. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserves, shall enter any plots therein, which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 (Five pounds) for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10 (Ten pounds).

## BOROUGH OF HAMILTON.

## BYE-LAW No. 22.

*A Bye-Law of the Borough of Hamilton made under subdivision 3 of section 213 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 22, for prohibiting the shooting of waterfowl upon, and regulating the taking of fish in, the reservoir situated in the Park, North Hamilton, under the control of the Council of the Borough of Hamilton.*

**IN** pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Hamilton order as follows:—

The shooting of waterfowl upon the reservoir in the Park, North Hamilton, under the control of the Council of the Borough of Hamilton, or within the fence forming the enclosure for the said reservoir, is hereby prohibited.

No person shall be allowed to fish for perch or any other species of fish in the said reservoir, except such person shall first pay a license fee of Ten shillings per annum; upon payment of which such person shall be entitled to receive a license authorizing him to fish therein, the conditions of such license being numbered 1 to 10 as follows:—

1. Fishing season to begin on the 1st November, and end on the 30th April following.
2. No one shall be allowed to fish without a license (except children under 15 years of age, and then only if accompanied by their parents, who must have a license), and every applicant for a license must pay a yearly sum of Ten shillings. License not transferable.
3. Catching fish either by net, hand-lines, side-lines, or night-lines is strictly prohibited.
4. No person shall use more than one rod and line, or shall angle with more than one hook at one and the same time.
5. No person shall angle, or remove, or take from the reservoir any fish which may be therein during the months of May, June, July, August, September, and October in every year.
6. Any person who shall catch any fish in the said reservoir under four ounces in weight shall forthwith return the same to the water.
7. No person shall be allowed to remove or take away any ova or spawn from the said reservoir without the consent of the borough council.
8. Fishing can only be allowed in the reservoir from 4 o'clock in the morning to 8 o'clock in the evening, and no longer.
9. Licenses may be revoked at any time during the period for which they are issued, and must be produced whenever required by either the caretaker or other officer of the council duly authorized.
10. In the event of the breach of any of these rules by any one holding a license, his license shall be cancelled, and he shall be summoned for the offence committed by him.

Every person who shall offend contrary to the provisions of this bye-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds.
