### ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

THE Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a Despatch bearing date the 23rd June 1883, intimated to the Governor of Victoria that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise Her power of disallowance with respect to the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the 46th year of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates of which are hereto subjoined, viz. :—

46 VICTORIAE.

No. 746.—“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Five Hundred and eighty-seven thousand five hundred pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two and three.” [Assented to 8th March 1883.]

## SOUTH-EAST COAST OF NEW GUINEA.

THE following information respecting the navigation of the S.E. coast of New Guinea has been furnished by Mr. H. J. Liljeblad, master of the London Missionary steamer *Ellengowan*.

A dangerous reef, with less than 9 feet of water over it and with sharp coral rocks, lies 4 miles E.S.E. from the north point of Bampton Island.

A clear passage (Missionary Passage) with not less than 4½ fathoms at low-water springs, runs to the northward of the Great Warrior Reef, Tauan Island (Mount Cornwallis) bearing W.S.W.

A sunken reef, with not more than 2 fathoms over it at low-water springs, lies in Caution Bay, 4 miles S. ½ E. from Redscar Head.

A clear passage through the Barrier, 1½ miles wide, with not less than 4½ fathoms at low-water springs, lies with Lily Island bearing east.

Between Round Head and the Barrier Reef, in the neighborhood of Round Head entrance, are numerous sunken reefs, the ground not being navigable for vessels (drawing more than 13 feet.

A clear passage through the Barrier (Ellengowan Entrance), one cable in width, and with a depth of 16 fathoms, lies with Round Head bearing N.N.W.

Another, but not very clear passage through the Barrier, lies with Coutance Island bearing W.N.W., distant about 1 mile; and a passage (Sunday Passage) at a distance of about 4 miles from the island, two conspicuous marks on the side of a hill on the mainland bearing N.N.E. ¼ E.

There is a clear passage through the Barrier on the west side of Grange Island—off which a reef extends some 2 miles to the S.E., and another passage to the eastward of this reef.

A sunken coral reef (Kidd Reef), plainly visible, and with but little water over it, lies with Table Point bearing N.W. by W. ½ W., distant 2 miles.

There is a good anchorage inside the Leocadie Islands, in not less than 8 fathoms, mud, with an entrance from either side.

Nothing less than 20 fathoms was found in the position assigned to Heath's Reefs, and no danger was seen there except the reefs fringing the shore.

## TRINCOMALEE HARBOR.

*Rock off York Shoal.*

*Euryalus*, Trincomalee, 21st May 1883.

General Memorandum.—The B.I.S.S. *Kerbela*, when approaching the Merchant Ships' anchorage at this port, having struck a rock which is not laid down on chart No. 816 (Trincomalee Harbor), the following particulars respecting the same are hereby communicated for general information and guidance.

The rock, which lies about 1 cable north of the middle part of York Shoal, has only 15 feet of water on it at low-water. It appears to consist of a rocky uneven bottom with soft mud all round, the shallowest part being almost a pinnacle and difficult to find with a lead.

The approach is sudden on the north side, but between the rock and York Shoal there are 3 fathoms of water. From the rock the following bearings and distances were taken:—

Dockyard Flagstaff	S. 18° E.
West extremity York Island	N. 87° E.

## GILCHRIST SCHOLARSHIP.

THE Trustees of the Gilchrist Educational Trust having decided to offer an annual Scholarship of the value of £100 per annum, and tenable for three years, for competition by candidates from any colony of Australia, or from Tasmania, under the same conditions, *mutatis mutandis*, as those for the West India Colonies, which are annexed, it is notified that so far as regards the Colony of Victoria the first Examination will be held at Melbourne during the month of January 1884, at the University of Melbourne, under the conduct of the Council.

The following Regulations prescribe the details of the Examination.

## REGULATIONS.

## MATRICULATION.

A fee of Two pounds shall be paid at Matriculation. No candidate shall be admitted to the Examination unless he have previously paid his fee. If, after payment of his fee, a candidate withdraws his name, or fails to present himself at the Examination, or fails to pass it, the fee shall not be returned to him, but he shall be allowed to enter for any subsequent Matriculation Examination upon payment, at every such entry, of an additional fee of One pound, provided that he give notice at least *fourteen days* before the commencement of the Examination.

The Examination shall be conducted by means of printed papers; but the Examiners shall not be precluded from putting, for the purpose of ascertaining the competence of the candidates to pass, *ad hoc* questions to any candidate in the subjects in which they are appointed to examine.

Candidates shall not be approved by the Examiners unless they have shown a competent knowledge in each of the following subjects, according to the details specified under the several heads:—

1. Latin;
2. Any two of the following Languages:—(a) Greek, (b) French, (c) German, and (d) either Sanskrit or Arabic<sup>1</sup>;
3. The English Language, English History, and Modern Geography;
4. Mathematics;
5. Natural Philosophy;
6. Chemistry.

The following are the particulars of the foregoing subjects of Examination:—

## LANGUAGES.

## Latin:

Sallust ... The Conspiracy of Catiline.

The paper in Latin shall contain passages to be translated into English, with questions in History and Geography arising out of the subjects of the book selected. Short and easy passages shall also be set for translation from other books not so selected. A separate paper shall be set containing questions in Latin Grammar, with simple and easy sentences of English to be translated into Latin.<sup>2</sup>

Greek:<sup>4</sup>

Homer ... Odyssey, Book vij.

The paper in Greek shall contain passages to be translated into English, with questions in Grammar,<sup>3</sup> and with questions in History and Geography arising out of the subjects of the book selected. Short and easy passages shall also be set for translation from other books not so selected.

## French:

The paper in French shall contain passages for translation into English, and questions in Grammar, limited to the accidence.

## German:

The paper in German shall contain passages for translation into English, and questions in Grammar, limited (except when German is taken as alternative for Greek) to the accidence.

## Sanskrit; Arabic:

The paper in Sanskrit and the paper in Arabic shall contain passages for translation into English, and questions in Grammar.

## The English Language, English History, and Modern Geography:

Orthography; Writing from Dictation; the Grammatical Structure of the Language.

History of England to the end of the Seventeenth Century, with questions in Modern Geography.

<sup>1</sup> No credit will be given for more than two of these Languages.  
<sup>2</sup> Candidates desiring to be examined in either Sanskrit or Arabic must give at least *two calendar months'* notice to the Registrar, and must mention the other optional Language which they select.

<sup>3</sup> Special stress is laid on accuracy in the answers to the Grammar questions, and on the correct rendering of English into Latin.

<sup>4</sup> Candidates may substitute German for Greek.

<sup>5</sup> Special stress is laid on accuracy in the answers to the questions in Greek Grammar.

Oxygen, Hydrogen, Carbon, Nitrogen. Chlorine, Bromine, Iodine, Fluorine. Sulphur, Phosphorus, Silicon.

Combining Proportions by weight and by volume. General nature of Acids, Bases, and Salts. Symbols and Nomenclature.

The Atmosphere—its constitution; effects of Animal and Vegetable life upon its composition.

Combustion. Structure and properties of Flame. Nature and composition of ordinary Fuel.

Water. Chemical peculiarities of Natural Waters, such as rain-water, river-water, spring-water, sea-water.

Carbonic Acid. Carbonic Oxide. Oxides and Acids of Nitrogen. Ammonia. Olefant Gas, Marsh Gas, Sulphurous and Sulphuric Acids, Sulphuretted Hydrogen.

Hydrochloric Acid. Phosphoric Acid and Phosphuretted Hydrogen. Silica.

## INSTRUCTIONS TO CANDIDATES FOR MATRICULATION.

Care should be taken, in sending notice, to give a correct postal address; and the candidate's full name should be distinctly written.

Fees should not be sent by post.

Candidates entering their names for the Examination for the first time should on no account send a notice of entry unaccompanied by the requisite document giving proof of age. No candidate is admitted to the Examination without the production of such a document.

A certificate must in all cases be accompanied by a letter stating that the person to whom it relates wishes to enter for the Examination.

The age of a candidate with regard to entry is reckoned from the first day of the several Examinations, that day being computed to fall as late as the Regulations will possibly allow.

Candidates who have previously presented themselves at the Examination need not send in their certificates of age a second time; but should state, when giving notice of entry, that they have so presented themselves.

Notice of entry should not be sent earlier than six weeks before the commencement of the Examination.

The full marks obtainable at the Matriculation Examination are 2,800. Of these 2,000 qualify for a Prize, 1,800 for Honors, and 1,400 for the First Division. There is no regulation fixing the number of marks required for a pass. No further details as to the marking at this or other Examinations can be furnished.

Further particulars as to the time and place of Examination will be announced in due course.

## CONDITIONS FOR SCHOLARSHIPS INSTITUTED BY THE GILCHRIST EDUCATIONAL TRUST FOR THE BENEFIT OF YOUTHS RESIDING IN THE WEST INDIA COLONIES.

A SCHOLARSHIP of the value of £100 per annum, and tenable for three years, will be annually awarded to a candidate resident in the West India colonies, who shall become eligible by competitive examination, and shall be desirous of prosecuting a further

course of academical study in Great Britain, with a view to graduation either in Arts, Science, Law, or Medicine, in the University of London, under the following conditions:—

1. Every candidate shall either be a native of one of the West India colonies or shall have resided therein for the five years immediately preceding the examination.
2. Every candidate must furnish proof satisfactory to the local authorities that he has completed his 16th year, and that his age does not exceed 22 years.
3. Every candidate must furnish proof satisfactory to the local authorities that, in regard to personal character, he is qualified to be admitted to competition for a scholarship.
4. Candidates approved by the local authorities shall present themselves at the January Matriculation Examination of the University of London, which will be held simultaneously in Barbadoes, Demerara, Jamaica, and Trinidad, commencing on the second Monday in January, under the direction of sub-examiners appointed by the Governors of the respective colonies.
5. The answers of the candidates approved as aforesaid will be forwarded, through the Colonial Office, to the Registrar of the University, who will cause them to be reviewed by its examiners, and who will forward their report through the Colonial Office, for transmission to the local authorities in the colonial capitals, to be by them announced to the candidates.
6. The scholarship shall be awarded to the candidate who shall come out highest at that examination, provided that he pass either in the honors or in the first division.
7. The successful candidate will be expected to arrive in London, and to present himself to the Secretary of the Gilchrist Trust, not later than the first week in the October following his appointment.
8. Each scholarship shall be considered as commencing from the 1st of July following the examination; and shall be paid in quarterly instalments on the first days of October, January, April, and July.
9. Each scholar shall be allowed an option as to place of study between the University of Edinburgh and University College, London: he shall attend in every session at least three courses of lectures at the institution in which he studies (unless specially excused by the trustees from so doing); and he shall transmit to the Secretary of the Gilchrist Trust, at the conclusion of each session, a certificate from each of the professors whose lectures he has attended, stating that his diligence and conduct have been satisfactory. Should he not be able to produce such a certificate, or should he be proved guilty of discreditable conduct elsewhere, he shall be considered to have forfeited all claim to the remaining instalments of his scholarship.
10. Each scholar will be expected to present himself at the first examination in that one of the Faculties of the University of London in which he intends to graduate, before the termination of the second (academical) year\* from the commencement of his scholarship, unless excused from doing so by the trustees; and if he do not so present himself (unless by permission of the trustees), or if he fail to pass he shall be considered as forfeiting his claim to the remaining instalments of his scholarship. After having passed the first examination he will be expected to pursue his studies with a view to presenting himself at the second examination within two (academical) years.
11. The foregoing scheme shall be subject to revision from time to time, the trustees reserving to themselves the power of altering the condition of the scholarships, or of altogether withdrawing them, if they deem it expedient to do either. But no change will be made in such a manner as to affect the interests of candidates already appointed to scholarships, or in any case without twelve months' notice.

\* Thus a candidate whose scholarship commences on the 1st of July 1881 would be considered as having fulfilled this condition if he pass the First L.L.B. Examination in January 1883; or the First B.A., the First B.Sc., or the Preliminary Scientific M.B. Examination, in July 1883.

POWER TO COMPEL CESSPOOLS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF MURTOA TO BE FILLED UP.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; a Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign, called *The Public Health Amendment Act 1876*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the said Act to any part of Victoria, and from and after three months from the coming into operation of the said section in any part of Victoria, if the owner of land whereon there should be a cesspool for the reception of nightsoil, which cesspool in the opinion of the local Board should be in such a condition or position as to be calculated to generate disease or be a public nuisance, should be required by notice from the local Board to fill up the same within a time to be expressed in such notice, not being more than one month from the date thereof, such owner should be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day from the expiration of the time mentioned in such notice that such cesspool should not be filled up as thereby required: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the above-recited Act to

in the Shire of Dummukle.

**CASTLEMARINE AND SANDHURST WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.**

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

**THE** Governor in Council, in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Water Works Act 1865*, has made the Rules, Regulations, and Orders following respecting the Castlemarine and Sandhurst District Water Supply, being a work constructed under the authority of the said Act:—

1. The district which shall be rated for the Castlemarine and Sandhurst District Water Supply shall be the whole of the borough of Castlemarine, the whole of the borough of Chewton, the whole of the united shire of Mount Alexander, the whole of the united shire of Metcalfe, the whole of the city of Sandhurst, the whole of the borough of Eaglehawk, the whole of the shire of Marong, the whole of the shire of Huntly, the whole of the shire of Strathfeldsaye, and that portion of the shire of Maldon comprised in the extension to Winter's Flat.

2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the board within the said district, that is to say:—

- (1.) On every house or tenement of £20 annual value and under, One pound per annum.
- (2.) On every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £300 inclusive; Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £700; and Two pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £700.
- (3.) On every shop, not used as a domicile, above the annual value of £20, a rate of Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £300 inclusive; Two pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £700; and One pound five shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £700.
- (4.) The rates to be charged for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be One shilling per 100 gallons.
- (5.) The rate to be charged for water supplied by the board from the mains by measure shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, except in the cases hereinafter specially mentioned.
- (6.) For water supplied from the mains for sluicing purposes, the rate shall be Twopence per 1,000 gallons.
- (7.) For water supplied from the mains for mining purposes other than sluicing, the rate shall be Fourpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (8.) For water supplied from the channels to crushing-mills, pyrites-works, &c., the rate shall be Threepence per 1,000 gallons.
- (9.) For water supplied to gardens and nurseries, cultivated for trade purposes, and to cricket-grounds, the rate shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (10.) For water supplied to any cemetery, the rate shall be Fourpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (11.) For water supplied to any public parks or gardens, the rates shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (12.) a. The rate to be charged for water supplied from the main aqueducts and from any of the branch aqueducts which diverge therefrom shall be One halfpenny per thousand gallons, in quantities of not less than one million gallons per month.

b. The rate to be charged for water supplied in fixed quantities of less than one million gallons from any portion of the main aqueduct, or from any of the branch aqueducts, shall be for quantities—  
 Under 250,000 gallons ... 2d. per 1,000 gallons.  
 Above 250,000 gallons but under 500,000 gallons—  
 The first 250,000 gallons ... 2d. per 1,000 gallons.  
 For the excess ... 1d. "  
 Above 500,000 gallons but under 1,000,000 gallons—  
 The first 500,000 gallons ... 1d. per 1,000 gallons.  
 For the excess ... 1d. "

Delivery of the water shall be taken within one month from the time of purchase, failing which, the purchaser shall forfeit all his right thereto.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—

- (1.) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity of which, the charge at 1s. per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure; and
- (2.) If for other than domestic purposes only, 25,000 gallons per quarter.

4. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carrier's stables, or a supply for any manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labor), or for water-power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose. No hose or pipe is to be

applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees or plants, or washing the house walls, or a carriage, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter. Siphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

5. Any person receiving water from the board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the board who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the board, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the board, he shall obtain from the board a license in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. Before any such license shall be granted by the board, the person applying for same shall satisfy the board that he is a competent plumber.

9. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the board, without giving two days' notice to the board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the board, without the permission in writing of the board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

10. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe, to communicate with the pipes of the board, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board. Wrought-iron piping, of approved quality, and lead piping of the following weights only, will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:—

No service of a larger bore than  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch will be permitted, unless by special consent of the board.

11. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the board may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

12. Any person supplied with water by the board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

13. If any meter should cease registering, and, during the time it is undergoing repairs, the board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

14. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

15. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

16. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

17. Any person supplied with water by the Board does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought not to be done,

or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the board may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

19. The streets shall not be watered from hydrants or fireplugs by means of a hose, but the water is to be applied to the streets by carts or by manual labor, or by special stand-pipes of approved size and form.

20. The water supplied in the above-named district shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the same regulations and not otherwise.

21. In the construction of these rules and regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole; and the word "board" shall mean the Board of Land and Works.

22. The Rules, Regulations, and Orders affecting the Castle-maine and Sandhurst District Water Supply, made on the 7th January 1878, the 4th February 1878, the 4th March 1878, the 12th August 1878, the 28th October 1878, the 4th March 1879, the 28th February 1881, and the 26th September 1882, respectively, are hereby repealed.

PUPIL SURVEYORS AND DRAUGHTSMEN.

APPLICATIONS will be received, addressed to Mr. W. K. Andrews, Secretary of the Board of Examiners, up to Thursday the 11th of October next, from Candidates desirous of being appointed as Pupil Surveyors and Draughtsmen in connection with this department.

CONDITIONS.

An applicant for appointment must be not more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which could interfere with the proper exercise of his profession.

He must possess one of the following qualifications:—Having matriculated at the Melbourne or other recognized University, passing in Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic; or, having passed the Civil Service Examination, including the subjects above named; or he shall produce such a certificate as to his competency in those three subjects as shall satisfy the Board of Examiners in those three subjects as shall satisfy the Board of Examiners for Authorized Surveyors. He shall also, with such certificate, send in a specimen of his plan drawing.

COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, he will undergo a competitive examination in trigonometrical computation, plotting, and plan drawing, on Thursday, 18th October, when the three competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Board of Examiners will be recommended for appointment, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

TERM OF SERVICE.

The pupil's service in the department will be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, also plotting for field-book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time is not deemed satisfactory, he will be liable to be dispensed with, but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

He will be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing examination for land surveyors (without payment of fees), for the purpose of obtaining the formal certificate of the Board of Examiners as to his qualifications.

REMUNERATION.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupillage:—1st year, £52; 2nd year, £52; 3rd year, £60; 4th year, £84.

SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

During the whole term of his pupillage and service in the department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Civil Service of Victoria dated 31st of December 1866, or any subsequent substituted or additional regulations.

BONDS REQUIRED.

Each successful candidate for appointment as pupil surveyor and draughtsman will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds of £150 each for the faithful performance of his duties.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Stawell order as follows:—

1. Throughout this By-law, the expression "machine" shall mean a bicycle, tricycle, or velocipede.

2. A person shall not drive, ride, or impel a machine upon any footway made or set apart for the use of foot passengers.

3. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to the machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

4. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriageway, and whenever he shall overtake with such machine any wagon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the carriageway, he shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing such wagon, cart, or carriage, horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or whistle, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his machine.

5. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine who overtakes and passes any vehicle, or any horse, or any other beast of burden, shall keep such machine to the right or off side of such vehicle or animal.

6. In every case where a person driving, riding, or impelling a machine meets or overtakes any wagon, cart, or carriage, or any horse or other beast of burden, and where any animal drawing such wagon, cart, or carriage, or such horse or other beast of burden may, on such meeting or overtaking, become restive or alarmed, or may cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such wagon, cart, or carriage, or such horse or other beast of burden, the person riding such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

7. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## TOWN OF WARRNAMBOOL.

BY-LAW No. 56.

A By-law of the Town of Warrnambool, made under section 479 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 56, for regulating the Corporation Cattle Market and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein, or in the immediate approaches thereto; and for fixing the days and hours during each day on which the market shall be held.

IN pursuance of the "Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Warrnambool order as follows:—

1st. That the cattle market shall be called the Victoria Market, and shall be open from sunrise to sunset; that Saturday be market-day, and that no stock be received after 10 a.m., ex-

cept horses, cows, bullocks, steers, calves, heifers, which shall be received up to 11 o'clock.

2nd. That there shall be appointed for such cattle market an officer, to be called the inspector thereof, whose duties shall be as follows:—

To see that the market regulations are duly observed.

To demand and receive all market tolls and dues.

To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of parties bringing stock to the market for sale, in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such inspector to be most convenient.

The various auctioneers to draw lots for priority of selling in each class.

To preserve order and cleanliness within such market, and to summarily eject therefrom any person creating a riot or disturbance, or cursing or swearing, or using any gross or indecent language, or being guilty of gross or indecent conduct therein.

3rd. The auctioneers shall provide their own labor.

4th. That any person or persons who may obstruct the inspector or his assistants in the performance of his or their duty, or shall release any stock from the market, or shall remove the same from one part of the market to another without the authority of the inspector, or shall wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, or premises of the market, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £5 (five pounds), and in addition thereto be required to make good any such damage at his or their private expense.

5th. That the auctioneers or parties placing stock in the market for sale shall be responsible for all market dues and tolls accruing thereon; and in no case shall any stock be taken out of the market until all dues, tolls, and charges demandable on such stock under these regulations shall have been first fully paid and satisfied.

6th. The sale by auction shall commence for—
