BORNEO, S.W. COAST.—DANGERS IN CARIMATA STRAIT.
THE commanding officer of H.N.M. surveying vessel *Hydrograaf* reported the following, relative to dangers in Carimata Strait.

1st. A dangerous granite reef, with nearly always a surf on it, is lying S.E. 4 miles from Mangkap Island.
This reef, of about 200 square yards surface, covers nearly at high-water. It is steep to all around, on the N. and E. side 5 to 8 fathoms were found, on the W. side 3 to 5 fathoms.

At about two cables S.E. from this reef lies a stone that dries at low-water, and nearly half way between the reef and Mangkap another stone was found on the reef which extends to E.S.E. from this island.

2nd. The Linge shoal. This danger is not isolated, but a patch on one of the large banks with less than 5 fathoms over them, which extends 32 miles from 10 miles W. of Mangkap in a S.E. and E. direction. Between these banks 6 to 10 fathoms were found.

This patch, on which 1½ fathoms least water was found at low-water, is lying S. 33° E. 13½ miles from Mangkap.

On the northern side it is steep-to, but on the other sides it is more flat, and caution is timely given by the lead.

At about two miles N.N.E. from this patch a heavy trunk was seen aground in 6½ fathoms, the upper end of which is visible about 3 feet above water at low-water.

E. point P. Goeroe, N. 49° 26' E.

It is an isolated stone of about 4 square yards surface, with 10 feet on it at low-water; 3½ and 4 fathoms were found all around.

BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS—BYE-LAWS.
PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby make the following bye-laws, under the 16th section of the said Statute, that is to say:—

1. No timber or timber sledge shall be dragged over, upon, or along the surface of any road under the control of the Board of Land and Works.
2. No timber or other obstruction of any kind shall be placed or allowed to remain on any side-cutting, embankment, bridge, or other roadway under the control of the Board of Land and Works.
3. Any person violating either of these bye-laws shall forfeit a sum not exceeding (£20) Twenty pounds.

PROHIBITION AGAINST REMOVAL OF SHELLS FROM CERTAIN CROWN LANDS IN THE PARISH OF MOOLAP RIVKON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke in part the Proclamations hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby revoke the Proclamations hereinafter set forth, so far as the same affect the removal of shells from the portions of Crown lands in the parish of Moolap, in the county of Grant, lying between allotments 9A, 10A, 11A, 12A, 13A, 14A, 15A, 16A, 18A, 19A, 20A, and 21A, and the shore of Stingaree Bay, and bounded on the west by the production northerly of the west boundary of allotment 21A, and on the north-east by the production north-westerly of the north-east boundary of allotment 9A, that is to say :—

1. Proclamation bearing date the 13th July 1874, prohibiting the cutting, digging, or removal of live or dead timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as were permanently reserved around any lakes, lagoons, rivers, creeks, bays, or fronting the Southern Ocean or Bass' Strait.

2. Proclamation bearing date the 23rd July 1877, prohibiting the removal of stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay, or from any Crown land situate within a distance of one chain from high-water-mark in that bay.

3. Proclamation bearing date the 7th February 1881, prohibiting the cutting, digging, or removal of stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from certain Crown lands in the parish of Moolap, county of Grant, described therein.—(83.L.18621.)

Description of land.—Two acres, county of Grant, town of Maddingley: Commencing at the intersection of the north-eastern side of Franklin street and the north-western side of Labilliere street: bounded thence by the former street bearing N. 15° W. four chains; thence by lines bearing respectively N. 75° E. five chains and S. 15° E. four chains; and thence by Labilliere street aforesaid bearing S. 75° W. five chains to the point of commencement.

The Archbishop, or such person as aforesaid, to have power to remove trustees, and to appoint new trustees, and to fill up all vacancies occurring in trusteeship.

Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.—To such purposes of the Roman Catholic Church as may from time to time be agreed upon by the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Melbourne and a majority of the trustees.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE ULUPNA COMMON.

In pursuance of the regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the 1st day of April 1879, the Managers of the Ulupna Common, having drafted the following regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers, within a distance of five (5) miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof, in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of August and the first day of February in every year, and shall be as follow, viz.:-

For every horse, ten shillings (10s.) per annum.
For every head of other large cattle, eight shillings (8s.) per annum.

For every head of small cattle, five shillings (5s.) per annum.

Progeny, under six (6) months old, of stock legally depasturing on the common, Free.

3. All stock remaining on the common fourteen (14) days after the period for which payment has been made, may be impounded without notice to the owner of such stock.

4. All persons entitled to depasture stock on the common shall deliver to the managers a written statement of the number and description of such stock, and shall pay the fees thereon for the current half-year.

5. All unlicensed stock found on the common shall be considered as trespassing thereon.

6. Owners of stock legally depasturing on the common shall muster them at such places as may be appointed by the managers, as often as the latter may deem necessary for the purpose of branding them, notice being given by the managers or herdsman at least four (4) clear days before such mustering.

7. All stock not branded at the last muster shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and shall, except as hereinafter provided, be liable to be forthwith impounded by the herdsman.

8. Whenever the managers believe that any animal depasturing on the common is affected with any contagious disease, the owner of such animal shall remove the same from the common on receiving twenty-four (24) hours' notice in writing from the managers or herdsman so to do, and in the event of such owner neglecting or refusing to remove the animal so affected, the managers or herdsman may cause such animal to be removed or destroyed at the owner's expense.

9. Bulls and entire horses shall not be permitted to run on the common without the consent in writing of the managers, first obtained.

10. Sheep shall be depastured on such portions only of the commons as the managers may set apart for the purpose.

11. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for loss of, or injury to, stock legally depasturing on the common.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

RECREATION RESERVE IN THE TOWN OF GOORNONG.

Regulations for the care, protection, and management of a Reserve for public recreation, in the town of Goornong.

WE, Edmond Hayes, John Flaherty, Henry Streckfuss, William Rutherford, and Patrick Hallinan, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order of 16th January 1883, as a site for public recreation in the town of Goornong, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

Regulations.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall cut down or remove from the reserve any live or dead timber.

4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones or other missiles in the reserve.

6. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

7. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.

8. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

9. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees and shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF EDINBURGH GARDENS, IN THE CITY OF FITZROY.

WHEREAS by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted that the Board of Land and Works shall have power, from time to time, to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the said Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, and with the consent of the City Council of Fitzroy, doth hereby make the Regulations following for the care, protection, and management of the above-named gardens.

REGULATIONS.

1. All persons visiting or walking through the gardens shall keep on the footpaths.

2. No person shall interfere with the seats, trees, shrubs, or birds in these gardens, or throw stones or other missiles, or beat carpets, or commit any nuisance, or light fires therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast off clothing, or litter or refuse of any kind, or smoke when off the paths.

3. No person shall climb on or jump over the seats or fences in or around the gardens, or lie on the seats or on the grass, or stick bills on the fences or on the gates, or cut names, letters or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

4. No person, unless employed in the gardens under the direction of the curator thereof, shall bring into the gardens any horse or vehicle, or enter plots of ground enclosed for plantations or other purposes.

5. No person shall bring into the gardens any dog, unless the same shall be held by a chain or cord.

6. No children under seven years of age shall be allowed in the gardens unless in charge of adult friends or nurses.

7. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in the gardens any act of indecency, may be forthwith removed therefrom by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable.

8. All goats and poultry found within the gardens may be destroyed by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable.

9. The gardens shall be open from sunrise to sunset.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any

constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

SHIRE OF CRESWICK.

BYE-LAW No. 5.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Creswick made under section 213 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 5, for the purpose of adopting certain provisions of the 13th schedule to the said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Creswick order as follows:—

Part IX.—Miscellaneous Matters.

1. *Regulations as to bathing.*—Where any part of the sea-shore or strand of any river or creek used as a public bathing place is within the municipal district or within three hundred yards of the boundary thereof, and not within any borough, the council may make regulations for and with respect to the time and place of bathing at or within such part, and according to the sex of the persons bathing or otherwise, and also as to persons resorting to or passing by such part whether by land or water, and for the stands of bathing machines, and otherwise for securing reasonable privacy for bathers and the observance of decency.

2. *Damaging trees.*—If any person shall wilfully, and without the authority of the council, cut, break, bark, root up, or otherwise destroy or damage the whole or any part of any tree, sapling, shrub, or underwood growing in or upon any street, road, or place under the management of the council, although the injury done shall not be to the amount of one shilling, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. *Removing soil, &c., from public places.*—If any person shall, without the authority of the council, break, displace, or remove the surface or soil of any land belonging to or under the control or management of the council, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. *What shall be deemed a secure fence in case of goats.*—For the purpose of those provisions of any Statute now or hereafter to be in force whereby any person may be authorized to destroy goats, land shall be deemed to be securely enclosed and fenced if the same be enclosed or fenced with a substantial three-railed fence of the usual height, and the openings in which (if any) shall at the time of trespass be secured or barred with gates or other fastenings of like closeness and strength with the fence, or if such land be enclosed or fenced with any fence and gates or fastenings of equivalent closeness and strength with such first-mentioned fence.

5. *Exclusion of rats from borough.*—Whosoever wilfully and knowingly, save by the authority hereinafter in this section contained, shall convey into or through the municipal district or shall within the municipal district have in his possession or on his premises or receive any rats, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings for every such rat, and any person may seize and forthwith destroy any rat found within the municipal district whether confined or not.

6. The council may employ any person or persons to destroy sparrows and minahs, and may make regulations for the effectual destruction of such birds.

The whole of Part IX. of the 13th Schedule to "The Local Government Act 1874," is hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Creswick.

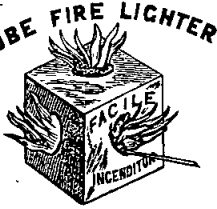
