CLOSE SEASON FOR HARES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the Session held in the thirty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign, intitled *An Act to further amend an Act intitled "An Act to Protect Game," and to Repeal the Act No. 433*, it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything in the Act numbered CCCXI. contained, any person may, during such period in every year as the Governor in Council may, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time determine, kill or destroy hares, and buy, sell, and have in his possession, house, or control, hares so killed or destroyed: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the period during which any person may kill or destroy hares, and buy, sell, and have in his possession, house, or control, hares so killed or destroyed as aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the period in every year during which any person may kill or destroy hares, and buy, sell, and have in his possession, house, or control, hares so killed or destroyed, shall be from the first day of March to the thirtieth day of November, both days inclusive, in lieu of the period fixed by proclamation dated the 5th day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this first day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four and in the forty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

NOTICE TO CANDIDATES FOR THE POLICE FORCE.

A LIMITED number of Candidates being required for the Mounted Police Force, applications from persons desirous of being employed therein will be received at the Police Depot, Victoria Barracks, St. Kilda road, on Tuesday the 7th October next, at Ten a.m., and on the following Tuesday the 14th, at the same hour.

Each applicant must present personally a written application in his own handwriting, when, if considered suitable, he will be examined by the Board appointed by the Government for the purpose.

As no exceptions to the rule above set forth will be made, it will be useless to make application for admittance into the force in any other manner or place than as above prescribed.

Candidates will not be appointed if over the age of twenty-five or under the age of twenty years. They must be at least five feet seven inches high, must not exceed eleven stone seven pounds in weight, and must be able to ride well.

All candidates must be smart and active, of a strong constitution, and free from any bodily complaint or defect. To ascertain these facts independently candidates must undergo a strict medical examination.

They must be able to read and write well, and must indisputably produce satisfactory testimonials of character. Those candidates who have served in any other force or Government department must also produce their discharge therefrom.

No. IV.

REGULATIONS OF THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

WHEREAS by "The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883" it is enacted that the Victorian Railways Commissioners shall make Regulations for fixing the ages at which employes shall retire in the different branches of the Railway Service; for determining the scale on which employes in the various grades of the Railway Service shall insure their lives for the payment of a sum of money at their death should it occur before the age of such retirement, or for the payment to them of a sum of money at the date of their attaining the age of retirement from the Railway Service; also, that such insurance shall be continued and the amount thereof fixed and increased from time to time; and that such Regulations, when confirmed by the Governor in Council, shall have the same force and effect as if they had been contained in the said Act: Now therefore, in pursuance of the said enactment, the said Victorian Railways Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

1. All employes in every branch of the Railway Service, whether the same be officers or servants, shall retire from the Railway Service at the age of sixty years. *Provided*, however, that the Victorian Railways Commissioners may at their discretion, and with consent of the parties, require any of such officers or servants to continue in the said Service after the age of sixty years, if it shall appear to the said Commissioners that the retention of such officers or servants would be advantageous to the said Service.

2. No probationer shall have his appointment confirmed until he shall have insured his life as hereinafter mentioned; and all officers or servants appointed or to be appointed after 1st February, 1884, to the Railway Service shall hold their offices on the express condition that a deduction will be made half-yearly from their salaries or wages, for the payment of the premium on the policy, to keep their lives insured.

3. The insurance shall be by way of endowment, and shall be payable when the assured attains the age of sixty or sooner in the event of earlier death.

4. The insurance shall be effected with some Life Insurance Company carrying on business in Victoria approved by the said Commissioners, which shall have agreed with the said Commissioners, upon a condition, to increase the amount of insurance from time to time according to these Regulations, at the rates specified in the tables of the insurance company forming the basis of the contract, and without any further medical examination beyond that instituted by the said insurance company when the agreement or policy with each officer or servant shall have been taken out; it being the intention of these Regulations that the contract shall continue until the assured shall die or attain the age of sixty, whichever may first happen.

5. The amount of the insurance shall at all times be equal to at least one year's salary or wages of the assured, and shall be according to the following scale:—

Salary or Wages.	Amount of Insurance.
Under £100 a year ...	£100
£100 to £199 " ...	200
£200 to £299 " ...	300
£300 to £399 " ...	400
£400 to £499 " ...	500

and so on, the insurance being in every case increased from time to time by successive steps of £100 whenever and as often as the salary of the insured shall be increased.

6. All insurances shall be for a fixed sum and at rates according to Tables of the insurance companies, which shall be signed by the Manager or other accredited officer by order of the Board of Management, and shall be deposited with the said Commissioners, and the premiums shall be payable half-yearly in advance. The contract once entered into with a company shall not be varied, but all succeeding increases are to be made with the same company. The said increases, as hereinbefore provided, shall be made at the rates fixed by the said Tables according to the ages of the assured at the time of increased insurance being required consequent upon increased salary or wages according to these Regulations.

Provided always that when employes are promoted to the more hazardous occupations of guard, fireman, or locomotive driver, a loading may be added by the insurance company of Ten shillings per cent. upon the rates in the said Tables mentioned. All such promotions shall be advised to the Insurance Company by the Accountant to the Railways.

7. All insurances shall be in the names of the assured; but all policies shall be lodged with the Victorian Railways Commissioners, and shall remain in their possession, and shall be unassignable either at law or in equity.

Provided that the amount so insured shall be payable to the employe on his leaving the service at sixty years of age, or to his legal representatives should he die before attaining the age of sixty.

Provided further, that in case any employe shall be retained in the Railway Service after attaining the age of sixty, the amount then due to such employe under such contract of insurance shall be by him invested in Government stocks or debentures, mortgages, or such other securities as shall be approved by the Commissioners, and the securities shall be handed over to the said Commissioners until such employe die or leave the Railway Service, when they shall be handed over to him or to his legal representative in the event of his death.

8. No company shall be compelled to insure the life of any officer or servant for a larger sum than is provided by these Regulations; but any additional insurance shall be matter of contract between the assurer and the assured, and the policies in such cases shall not be lodged with the said Commissioners, or be in anywise subject to these Regulations.

9. A record of all insurances made in pursuance of these Regulations shall be kept by the Accountant to the Railways, and shall show the date and amount of the original insurance by the probationer, and of each successive increase. The said record shall also show any additional charge arising from hazardous occupation as aforesaid; and it shall be the duty of the said Accountant to arrange for deducting from the salary or wages of the assured, half-yearly at the due dates, the premiums due to the insurance company concerned, and to pay the same to the said company. It shall be a condition of all policies that in case of neglect or omission by the said Accountant to pay the said premium the insurance shall not lapse, and that the premium may be paid at any time thereafter with interest thereon at the rate of Five per cent. per annum.

10. Persons appointed by the said Commissioners, under the 28th section of the said Act, without examination or probation shall insure their lives as nearly as may be after the method prescribed by these Regulations.

11. Any employé, whether officer or servant, on resigning, being dismissed, or otherwise leaving the service of the said Commissioners, shall have all policies in his name delivered to him, and the said Commissioners shall not thereafter have any charge of the policies or liability in respect of the half-yearly

premiums; but the said Accountant shall give notice to the insurance company interested, and the said policies shall thereafter cease to be subject to these Regulations, but shall not be otherwise affected as a contract between the insurer and the insured so long as the premiums thereon are paid by the insured.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE GARVOC GENERAL CEMETERY.

I. Before any interment shall take place in the said cemetery application for admission shall be made at the office of the trustees a reasonable time previously, when an order in the form or to the effect set out in the schedule hereto annexed, marked A, will be given to the applicant on payment of the proper charges.

II. All such charges must be paid when the order for interment is given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

III. The charges will be remitted on the burial of a poor person in such cemetery on a certificate of a minister of religion, or sufficient evidence to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the cost and charges.

IV. If interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing, of the proprietor must be left with the orders.

V. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the orders.

VI. No grave for an adult is to be less than six feet deep. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or whom they may appoint.

VII. The usual hours of interment will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., from the 1st of September to the 30th April, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other months.

VIII. The funeral must take place punctually at the appointed hour.

IX. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in and cemented, or covered by slab of stone, slate, or iron.

X. A plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees for approval.

XI. All vaults, graves, monuments, and fences must be kept in proper repair and condition, at the expense of the owners, who must, within three days, remove the refuse of all materials used in their construction and repair.

XII. A plan of the ground and register will be kept.

XIII. All persons destroying the fences, or in any way injuring the cemetery, will be prosecuted as the law directs.

XIV. No servant employed by the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity from others.

XV. The ground will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

XVI. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration, from time to time, in the regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE LILLYDALE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

1. Orders for opening a grave must be given the day previous to interment. The burial may be more speedily effected when practicable, but cannot be guaranteed. And all charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground is broken or a vault re-opened.

2. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but persons desiring brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them at their own expense, under the direction of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be given on payment of the fees set forth in the schedule; and every coffin in a vault must be bricked in, or cemented, or covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

3. Any applicant desiring to bury a corpse in any private grave or vault (not his own) must bring the consent, in writing, of the owner of such grave or vault to be left with the order.

4. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order for interment.

5. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession will be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

6. The usual hours for the performance of funerals are from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. in the months from September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months; except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours will be from 12 noon to 4 p.m. throughout the year.

7. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones, must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

8. A plan or drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, monument, tablet, or fence proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval.

9. The trustees claim the right (notwithstanding the plans at present habitually used and referred to) to make any desirable alterations in the unsold portions of the cemetery, in the size of allotments, width or direction of paths, &c., always provided, that unobstructed access by existing paths be preserved to every grave previously purchased.

10. All persons damaging the fences or in any manner injuring the cemetery will be prosecuted as the law directs.

11. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration, from time to time, in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.
