VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BYE-LAW No. 15.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law for fixing the conditions on which Exhibits, Judges, and Attendants for Agricultural Shows shall be conveyed; and all Bye-laws of 31st January, 1884, conflicting therewith, and clause 15 of Bye-law 7 of 20th June, 1884, are hereby repealed:—

AGRICULTURAL MACHINES AND IMPLEMENTS, LIVE STOCK AND PRODUCE.

1. On consigning to the show, a certificate from the secretary of the society that the exhibits have been duly entered for competition must be handed in. They will then be charged full rates to the place of exhibition, but will be conveyed back to the station whence they were sent *free*, and, in addition, the exhibitor will be entitled to a refund of one-half the amount paid if a further certificate from the secretary of the society that they have been exhibited and not sold is handed in on consigning. Both certificates to be attached to the "free" way-bill.

2. The foregoing applies to exhibits conveyed in cattle or goods waggons and by goods trains; valuable animals may, however, be conveyed in horse-boxes by passenger trains under these conditions at goods rates, provided there is rolling-stock available.

3. For all exhibits which may have been sold, full rates will be charged for the return journey.

4. The journey cannot be broken under these conditions. Exhibits must be returned direct to the station whence they started, otherwise no refund can be made.

5. Judges to be carried at single fare for the return journey when on official duty.

6. Poultry and dogs will be charged full rates both ways.

7. Attendants on stock before starting to a show must furnish themselves with a certificate duly filled up and signed as per clause 12, and pay full fare to and from the place of exhibition; but after returning with their exhibits, if a full truck has been paid for, and if provided with a certificate that the stock exhibited has not been sold, and also with the second part of certificate as per clause 12 duly filled up and signed, a refund of both fares will be made. This applies only to attendants who travel in the trucks or in vans of goods trains with the stock. Only one attendant to be allowed to each truck. The certificate must be received by the attendant, and sent by the station-master to the Traffic Audit Office as a voucher.

8. All exhibits to be loaded and unloaded by consignors and consignees, and to be carried and signed for at owner's risk.

9. Exhibits unaccompanied by a certificate from the secretary of the show will be charged full rates both ways.

10. To insure despatch, forty-eight hours' notice should be given to the station-master of the number and description of vehicles required.

11. All freight to be made "Paid" in first instance, and "To Pay" (if charged) on return journey; and original sending station only to make refunds.

Must not be under 21 nor over 35 years of age. They must have served apprenticeship of 7 years to their respective trades, or if they have served for 5 years they must have worked as journeymen the additional time required to complete the term of 7 years. They must read and write with facility.

Candidates must be strong, healthy, and active, and must prepare their applications in their own hand-writing. They must produce to the Examiners satisfactory written testimony that they are of respectable character, and must furnish names of any Persons or firms with whom they may have been employed during the previous two years. They must also produce to the said Examiners a certified extract from the Register of their birth, or, in default, a statutory declaration as to their age last birthday, giving the date thereof; and before being finally approved they must pass the examination of a Railway Medical Inspector as being free from bodily ailments, defects, and colour-blindness, or defective sight of any kind. For such examination they are to pay 10s. 6d. into the hands of the Secretary.

At the last examination many Candidates were rejected on account of being under the standard height (5 feet 6 inches, without boots). Candidates are, therefore, desired to satisfy themselves that they reach the standard.

In case the number of Candidates be more than three times the number of persons so required, such Candidates will be reduced by lot to such number.

If a greater number of Candidates obtain certificates from the Examiners than are then required, such successful Candidates shall, in the presence of the Secretary, draw lots for the determination of the order of precedence for appointment in which their names shall be placed, and their appointments—subject to Medical Approval—will be made accordingly.

The persons in excess of the number required will be eligible for appointment in like order for a period of twelve months from the date of such determination without further examination.

All appointments will be made to the lowest grade in each of the various branches of the Railway Service, and on probation only, for a period of six months. After such probation, and upon production of a certificate of fitness from the head of the Branch in which the probationer was employed, and of evidence that his life is insured in Victoria as may be prescribed by Regulations, such appointment may be confirmed.

All applications must contain the correct postal address and the name of the nearest railway station thereto, and must be posted, duly stamped, so as to reach the Office of the Secretary, Victorian Railways, Spencer street, Melbourne, not later than 12 o'clock noon, on the 7th day of October proximo, such day and hour having been fixed by the Commissioners for opening and dealing with the applications received.

Candidates who have passed the preliminary registration will be communicated with as to the time and place, when and where, they shall attend for examination, and subsequently for medical inspection.

Envelopes addressed to the secretary, and with the words describing the office sought, may be obtained at all post offices and railway stations in Victoria, or at the Secretary's office.

1. That nothing whatever of any kind, whether explosive or otherwise, should be carried in the same magazine or receptacle with gunpowder.

2. That nothing whatever of any kind, whether explosive or otherwise, should be carried in the same magazine or receptacle with signals made of "gun cotton" or "cotton-powder."

3. And that rockets, blue lights, and all "fireworks" should be carried in separate boxes which should not be kept below the weather deck.

4. The Board's Officers have been directed to see that the above instruction are complied with before granting clearances or declarations to passenger steamers.

UNDERMANNING.

NOTICE.

The attention of the Board of Trade has been directed to the subject of Manning, by seamen, by underwriters, by the reports of their own officers, and by the facts disclosed in the official returns.

From these returns it appears that the number of seamen carried in proportion to tonnage is in the aggregate diminishing year by year, and further that there are differences in the numbers of men carried in ships belonging to different owners which it is difficult to account for. It further appears that in some sea-going steamers the number of seamen carried is not sufficient to provide a proper watch.

It is obvious that insufficient manning may be a cause of wreck or casualty, and the Victoria Steam Navigation Board propose in every future enquiry into a wreck, to direct attention to the question whether the ship was properly manned.

NO. 716.**

Authority to George Richard Hayes and William Barker to construct certain Irrigation Waterworks within the Shire of Echuca.

PARTICULARS RELATING TO ROBERT COOK.

Robert Cook is a native of Holbeach, near Gedney, Lincolnshire, England. He arrived in Adelaide about the year 1865 or 1866, and subsequently worked on stations about Mount Gambier, the Darling, Swan Hill, and Nhill. About the year 1870 he was employed on Tintandra Station, about ten miles from Swan Hill, the then owner being Mr. Beveridge. When he left Mount Gambier, with his wife and the child above referred to, he had with him a brown horse branded L on near shoulder, two hind feet white, and a light-colored four-wheel american waggon with canvas cover. Cook is described as being about 36 years of age, about 5 feet 4 or 5 inches high, medium build, dark sallow complexion, black straight hair, dark-brown eyes, medium nose inclined to be thick at the point, rather small round features, and when last seen had a full black beard, whiskers, and moustache. He is said to have a scar-mark over one eye; is supposed to walk rather stiffly, from an injury to one hip; and is also supposed to bear a tattoo-mark on one arm. When he left Mount Gambier he could not write, and it is doubtful whether he could read. He generally had a double-barrelled gun and a dog, and was very fond of shooting.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 69* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby abolish or diminish (as the case may be) the undermentioned Commons, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE HEXHAM UNITED FARMERS' AND TOWN COMMON, proclaimed by Order of the 11th July 1864, and increased by Order of the 7th May 1878, is hereby abolished.

THE RICH AVON EAST COMMON, proclaimed by Order of the 24th October 1881, is hereby abolished.

THE BALLAARAT EAST TOWN COMMON, proclaimed by Order of the 28th January 1861, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom 2900 acres, more or less, of land, being the portion comprised within the boundaries of the Ballaarat and Creswick State Forest.

SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.

Regulations for Management of the Winchelsea Common.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the 1st April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Winchelsea, having drafted the following Regulations for management of the Winchelsea Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council.

Regulations.

Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five miles of the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer, having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of April and the first day of October in every year:—

For every horse or mare, Ten shillings per annum.

For every head of other large cattle, Six shillings.

For every head of small cattle, Six shillings.

Foals or calves under three months old, if running with their mothers, free.

3. No person shall be allowed to depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.

4. No bulls or entire horses over the age of nine months shall be allowed on the common without the written sanction of the managers first obtained.

5. The herdsman shall be in attendance at a time and place to be appointed, prior to the commencement of each half-year, for the purpose of registering stock intended to be depastured on the common, and to receive the fees thereon (for which the managers will give receipts in the prescribed form), together with a schedule of particulars of the animals to be depastured, signed by the owners thereof.

6. The herdsman, on delivery to him of any stock, and after payment of the prescribed fees, shall, with the assistance of the owner or person in charge, mark, brand, or affix a badge (as directed by the managers) to such stock.

7. No stock duly registered shall be removed from the common without and unless notice in writing be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the stock removed.

8. The herdsman shall, on any stock straying from the common, or being removed therefrom without the owner's consent, notify the same, in writing, to the owner thereof within ten days; and, in default of notice within that time, the herdsman shall, if the stock be lost, be held responsible, and the loss shall be computed at a rate not to exceed Two pounds sterling for each animal.

9. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common.

10. The herdsman shall report immediately to the managers the indication of any contagious disease in any stock on the common, and shall give notice thereof in writing to the owner of such stock.

11. Whenever in these Regulations any act or thing is required to be done by the managers, it shall be considered to be well and truly done if done by any two or more of them, duly appointed from time to time to act on their behalf.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

SHIRE OF RIPON.—BEAUFORT RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, the Council of the Shire of Ripon, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Beaufort Recreation Reserve, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, except upon such days as the committee of management may otherwise determine.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage, in any way, the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, without the authority in writing of the committee of management first obtained.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or otherwise damage the fences, trees, seats, or other property, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth, or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. No person shall carry or discharge firearms in the reserve, or snare or destroy any wild fowl therein.

10. No person shall, without authority in writing of the committee of management, vend or otherwise dispose of in the reserve any fruit, provision, refreshments of any kind or other article of any description.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

Making a Rate for Water Supply Purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874" and "The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Boroondara order as follows:—

That Sections 41 and 42, Subdivision 9, Part I, Schedule 13, of "The Local Government Act 1874," viz:—

- (41) If any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common, and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land or any other dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle; and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody. And any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form, addressed to such owner as "owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighborhood, may, after the expiration of

twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases; and the justice may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded, and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid, if demanded, within one month, to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded, then to the municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid, the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered, the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known, in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered:

(42) If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding twenty shillings; and if such cattle shall, by reason of having been so found at large, have been impounded by the council, the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices or by law to be recovered; and, in the case of any information under this section, the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section, so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction shall apply—

are hereby adopted and confirmed as Bye-law No. 2 in and for the Shire of Boroondara.
