ADDITIONAL PORT REGULATION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Passengers Harbors and Navigation Statute 1865* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, might, from time to time, define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same; and also for the due protection and preservation, and the good government and management of all public wharfs; and might appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; and from time to time in like manner might alter, amend, or repeal any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations, and substitute others in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the following to be an additional Port Regulation, and to be observed accordingly:—

BATHING OF DOGS.

Bathing of Dogs is prohibited from any public wharf or jetty, or from any part of the foreshore, within one hundred yards of any public wharf or jetty.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights issued on or before the 1st December 1883 must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up from and after the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new Rolls in January next.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law; inasmuch as a penalty on conviction is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining electors' rights when not qualified.

No elector whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any division of a PROVINCE is entitled to an elector's right for such province, and no elector whose name is already on any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any division of an ELECTORAL DISTRICT is entitled to an elector's right for such District.

VICTORIAN NAVAL FORCES.—REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations, viz. :—

PERMANENT FORCE.

Entry of Officers.—The Council of Defence shall, on the nomination of the Naval Commandant, recommend to the Governor in Council competent Officers who have previously served in the Imperial Regular or Auxiliary Forces, or in any Colonial Naval Force, who may be considered suitable for appointment in the Victorian Navy, and have passed a medical examination.

Retirement of Officers.

- Lieutenants may be retired at the age of 45.
- Commanders may be retired at the age of 50.
- Captains may be retired at the age of 55.
- Engineers may be retired at the age of 50.
- Warrant Officers may be retired at the age of 50.

Entry of Men, &c.—All candidates must pass a medical examination.

Boys.—Boys may be entered between the age of 15 and 17 years, at the pay of 2s. (Two shillings) per diem, and may, if qualified, at the age of 20, be rated Training Seamen. Boys not so qualified shall be discharged.

Training Seamen.—Seamen between the age of 20 and 25 years may be entered as Training Seamen for five years at 3s. 6d. (Three shillings and sixpence) per diem. Such Training Seamen may, at or before the completion of their engagement, if found competent, be rated or re-engaged as Able Seamen, and sworn in for a further term of five years, at the pay of 4s. 6d. (Four shillings and sixpence) per diem and 6d. (Sixpence) per diem deferred pay.

Able Seamen.—Seamen to fill vacancies for Able Seamen may be selected as directed by the Naval Commandant until the Training Seamen are duly qualified for that rating.

Term of Service.—All Officers, Petty Officers, Seamen, and others, except Imperial Officers specially engaged and Boys, shall be sworn in for a period of five years.

Deferred Pay.—The system of deferred pay shall apply to all ranks below that of Warrant Officer and above that of Training Seaman.

Petty Officers, Seamen, and others now serving shall have the option of coming under the scheme for deferred pay.

Retirement.—No Petty Officer, Seaman, or others below the rank of Warrant Officer, except Cooks, Stewards, and Servants, shall be re-engaged above the age of 35 years.

Officers and men now serving who are above the specified age of retirement shall have the option of :—

1. Being discharged and receiving compensation, as provided under Clause 11 of *The Discipline Act 1883*, if entered prior to 24th December 1881 ;
2. Or of continuing to serve, if under 50 years of age, for 5 years ; if over 50 and under 55 years of age, until 55 years of age ; and if over 55 years of age, for 1 year.

Purchase of Discharge.—Petty Officers, Seamen, and others below the rank of Warrant Officer shall be permitted, subject to the approval of the Naval Commandant, to purchase their discharges on the following terms :—

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREVENTION OF THE SPREAD OF CONTAGIOUS DISEASES.

WHEREAS the contagious disease known as small-pox has been reported to be prevalent in certain cities, towns, boroughs, shires, or places in the colony of Victoria, and whereas the provisions contained in section 74 of the *Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious disease, have, by Order in Council, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 28th July 1884, been declared to be in force in the said colony, the Central Board of Health, in virtue of the powers conferred on them by the section last mentioned, doth hereby make the following Regulations for the prevention or mitigation of this disease, namely :—

These Regulations shall apply to any city, town, borough, shire, or place in which any case of small-pox shall have occurred within the month immediately preceding the date hereof, or in which any case of such disease shall occur while these Regulations shall remain in force.

1. *Cleansing of Streets, Ways, and Places.*—The Local Board of Health in each district is hereby required to take effectual measures for the frequent and regular removal of all refuse matter from all streets, lanes, and rights-of-way ; for the regular cleansing of all drains or street channels ; and for keeping in an inoffensive condition all manure depots or places for the deposit of night-soil or refuse matter, by causing all such matters which may be deposited thereon to be immediately covered over with not less than six inches of clean earth.

The occupier of every house, dwelling, or other building shall cause the yard thereof to be at all times kept in a cleanly and inoffensive condition, and shall cause all rubbish or refuse matter produced on such premises to be placed in a box or other proper portable receptacle.

No person shall cause or suffer to be thrown or cast on to any street, right-of-way, or other place any rubbish, ashes, dust, or other refuse matter. The Local Boards of Health are specially enjoined to prevent any offensive matter being allowed to flow from any private premises into any public drain or channel.

2. *Removal of Nuisances.*—The occupier of any premises shall not permit any nuisances or matter causing offensive smell to exist thereon ; and shall cause all stables, cow-sheds, pigsties, manure receptacles, and yards thereon to be efficiently paved and drained, and shall cause all drains on or belonging to such premises to be properly cleansed at least once in every twenty-four hours.

3. *Isolation of Infected Houses.*—When a case of small-pox is reported to any Local Board of Health, the health officer shall visit it without delay. If he find that the disease is small-pox, he shall forthwith isolate the patient and premises, preventing ingress and egress. He shall at once report to the Local Board, and shall provide that the certificate prescribed in section 75 of the *Public Health Amendment Statute 1883* is duly signed and forwarded to the Central Board.

4. *Removal of Patients to Hospitals.*—When any person suffering from small-pox can be dealt with under section 81 of the *Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, he shall without delay be removed to the hospital provided. In other cases, subject to a written consent being obtained from the patient, he may be removed in like manner.

5. *Ambulance Service.*—In the Metropolitan district an ambulance for the purpose of removing patients to the Sanatorium can be procured by message to the office of the Central Board of Health.

6. *Medical Attendance on the Sick.*—The Local Board of Health in each district is hereby required to provide the necessary medical attendance and medicines for any person in such district who may be suffering from small-pox and who is unable to pay for the same.

7. *Interment of the Dead.*—The occupier of any house, dwelling, or place in which any person shall die of small-pox shall cause the body of such person to be interred with the least possible delay, and in no case shall the interment of such body be delayed for a longer period than twenty-four hours after death.

The trustees of any public cemetery are hereby required, notwithstanding the existence of any regulation of such cemetery to the contrary, to afford every possible facility for the speedy interment of the body of any person who shall die of small-pox ; and the trustees of such cemetery shall provide that there be at all times open and ready for use a sufficient number of public graves.

8. *Disinfection of Bedding, Clothing, and other Articles.*—The occupier of any house or dwelling in which there shall be any person suffering from small-pox shall cause every article of bedding used in the sick room, and every article of clothing or other textile fabric or other article likely to retain infection which shall have been used by or for any person suffering from small-pox, to be, immediately on the removal of such article from the room occupied by the person so suffering, disinfected by either being placed in boiling-water or subjected for at least one hour to a dry heat of not less than 250 degrees ; and shall also cause every article of clothing used in the sick room by the nurse or other person attending the patient, or by any member of the household or family who shall on any occasion visit the room of the patient, to be in like manner disinfected each time such article of clothing is changed, or before such article is worn by such nurse or other person outside of the premises in which the person suffering from small-pox shall be living. On the discretion of the officer of health, any articles which are liable to retain infection, and which do not admit of disinfection according to the above methods, may be destroyed by fire.

9. *Cleansing, Purifying, Ventilating, and Disinfecting of Houses.*—The occupier of any house or dwelling in which there shall be a case of small-pox shall cause each room or apartment therein, except the room in which there shall be any person ill of the disease, to be fumigated once in every twenty-four hours, by closing the door, windows, chimneys, or other apertures thereof, and by then burning therein a sufficient quantity of sulphur to entirely fill such rooms with dense fumes of the burning sulphur. The room in which the patient may be or may have been is to be fumigated immediately in the like manner, after the patient's recovery, and before it is again occupied by such patient or other person.

Every room, apartment, or place in or appertaining to such house shall be at all times kept thoroughly ventilated and in a cleanly condition, and all drains connected with such house shall be flushed daily with disinfectant solution. A useful solution consists of 1 lb. of alum and ½ lb. of chloride of lime to 1 gallon of water.

10. *Privies and Closets.*—All water-closets, earth-closets, and privies shall be kept in an inoffensive and cleanly condition. In any house in which small-pox shall be present, the stools of the sick person shall be regularly disinfected by means of chloride of lime or chloride of zinc, or carbolic acid.

11. *Houses to house Visitation.*—The Local Board of Health of any city, town, borough, or shire in which small-pox shall be present may cause a house to house visitation to be made of such city, town, borough, or shire, within such limits as the Local Board may determine, in order to ascertain whether any case of small-pox exists in any house therein ; and in the event of any case of such disease being found in any house, the Local Board of Health shall cause to be left with the occupier thereof a copy of these Regulations, and of any other regulations which shall hereafter be made by the Central Board of Health for the prevention of the spread of the said disease.

12. *Officer of Health.*—The officer of health in each district is to afford the inhabitants thereof every advice and assistance in his power with respect to the precautions to be taken against the

spread of the disease. It is to see that where any person dies of small-pox the house in which the death occurred is thoroughly fumigated, and all bedding and clothing therein effectually disinfected or burnt. On receiving from the teacher of any State school a report that any member of the family of any child attending such school is ill, he is to personally ascertain from what disease such person is suffering; and should such disease be small-pox, he is at once to report the fact to the head teacher of such school.

13. *Vaccination.*—When a case of small-pox is discovered, the public vaccinator of the district should be requested to vaccinate or re-vaccinate without delay all persons in the immediate neighbourhood, and all children attending the local State school who, in his opinion, are insufficiently protected.

14. *Local Boards to carry out these Regulations.*—The Local Board of Health in each district is hereby required to superintend and see to the due carrying out of these Regulations, and to do and provide all such acts, matters, and things as may be necessary for executing or superintending and aiding in the execution of the same. The Local Board of Health is further required to cause these Regulations to be printed and published in their district, and to cause a copy of the same to be supplied to the occupier of every house where small-pox is present.

Any person who shall fail to comply with any of the foregoing Regulations is, by section 168 of the *Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, No. 782, thereby guilty of an offence against the provisions of Part IV. of that statute, and is liable for such offence to a penalty of Twenty pounds, besides any expenses which may be incurred in remedying his default.

"THE MALLEE PASTORAL LEASES ACT 1883."—
CLAUSE 21.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-ninth day of September 1884.

WHEREAS by *The Mallee Pastoral Leases Act 1883* (No. 76) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations for carrying out the provisions of the said Act and the various parts thereof, and that such regulations having been signed by the Minister, upon being published in the *Government Gazette*, shall be valid in law as if the same were enacted in the said Act, and shall be judicially noticed: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

Conditions under which the consent of the Board of Land and Works may be obtained for the erection of Improvements on portions of Mallee Blocks occupied by Lessees for the limited period of five years.

Generally.—In applying for such consent, the lessee shall specify the particular improvements he proposes to effect, their position within the boundaries of the Mallee Block, and the several amounts proposed to be expended by him in effecting such improvements.

On the completion of the improvements, the lessee shall furnish to the Board of Land and Works a true and faithful account of the amount actually expended, accompanied by a declaration as to the accuracy thereof. Provided always that the Board shall not be deemed liable for any amount in excess of that set forth in the original application and consent.

(1) *Houses.*—The total expenditure which the Board will authorize for the erection of buildings intended to facilitate the carrying on of the business of lessee as a grazier shall not exceed the sum of £40.

(2) *Fencing.*—The character of the fencing to be erected, and the extent thereof, and the cost per mile, shall be clearly and distinctly stated in the application; the erection of brush fencing being under any circumstances absolutely prohibited.

The cost of half of the fencing erected as aforesaid shall not be chargeable against the Board to an extent exceeding the rate of £40 per mile.

If the fencing be erected on the subdivisional line of the portions into which a Mallee Block is divided, the Board shall be liable in respect of one-half only of such fencing.

(3) *Wells.*—The cost of sinking wells, and securely slabbing or otherwise protecting the sides of such wells, shall be calculated at a rate per foot sunk not exceeding Twenty-five shillings, and no claim for repayment of the cost of any such well so secured shall be enforceable unless a supply of wholesome water

fit for the use of sheep and cattle has been obtained, and is available for such use at the time repayment is claimed, to the extent of 500 gallons per diem.

(4) *Reservoirs.*—The capacity of proposed reservoir shall be stated by the lessee, and the liability of the Board shall be limited to One shilling per cubic yard of the space obtained by excavation; but such cost shall not be recouped by the Board unless it be proved to its satisfaction that, after an average annual rainfall computed upon the known rainfall as measured at the Swan Hill station for the past seven years, water has been collected into such reservoir, and actually used in watering a number of stock, in the ratio of at least 1000 sheep to £100 expenditure, for a period of three successive months during the summer season.

(5) *Tanks.*—The liability of the Board to recoup the lessees the expense incurred in excavating and protecting a tank sunk for the purpose of conserving water for domestic purposes shall not exceed the sum of £20.

(6) *Dams.*—The liability of the Board to recoup the expense incurred in constructing a dam shall be estimated according to the cubic contents of the embankment that forms the same, and shall not be chargeable at a higher rate than Fifteen pence per cubic yard of material in the embankment, including all necessary pitching or other protection required for the preservation of the structure.

Other Improvements—Ringing of Timber.—The lessee in his application to the Board shall specify the number of acres over which he proposes to ring timber, and the nature of the timber thereon.

The ringing of country more or less covered with useless stunted box timber being recognised by the Board as tending largely to increase the grazing capability of such country, a consent will be given for the ringing of such useless box timber; but the Board will not become liable to recoup the expenditure thereon beyond the rate of One shilling per acre, and then not until it has been proved to its satisfaction that all such useless box timber has been thoroughly and efficiently destroyed within the area specified in the application to which the consent of the Board may have been given.

TOWN OF NHILL.—County of Lowan, parish of Balroonan: Commencing at a point on the north-western side of the road from Lawloit, where the north boundary of allotment 2 abuts thereon; bounded thence by the said boundary and a line bearing S. 89° 59' W. thirty-six chains thirty-five links; thence by a line bearing N. 0° 1' W. eighteen chains; thence by allotment 1 bearing N. 89° 59' E. thirty-one chains, and N. 0° 1' W. twenty-five chains sixty-eight links; thence by J. WHEREAS by *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, from time to time, by proclamation, place under the temporary management and control of, or might absolutely vest in, any Waterworks Trust any public water reserve or any waterworks, stream, or reservoir, either on any Crown lands, or begun, constructed, or provided for by moneys

heretofore or hereafter voted by Parliament: Provided, however that notice of intention to make such proclamation should be advertised for a period of at least one month previously to the making thereof in the *Government Gazette* and in some newspaper generally circulating in the neighborhood of the property to be vested by such proclamation: And whereas it is expedient to place under the temporary management and control of the undermentioned Waterworks Trust the reserves hereinafter described, notices of intention of which have been duly advertised: Now therefore I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do hereby place under the temporary management and control of the undermentioned Waterworks Trust the water reserves hereinafter described, that is to say :—

PUBLIC WATER RESERVES HEREBY PLACED UNDER THE TEMPORARY MANAGEMENT AND CONTROL OF THE WIMMERA UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST.

DOOEN.—Four hundred and eighty-two acres five perches, county of Borung, parish of Dooen, being the site temporarily reserved, by Orders dated respectively the 10th August and the 14th December 1874, for Camping and Watering purposes, as reduced by Orders dated respectively the 18th September 1876 and the 11th March 1878.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor might make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and might from time to time, after one month's notice should be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works might issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee, as should from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, in accordance with the provisions of the 53rd section of the above-recited Act, further alter and revoke (in part) the Proclamation relating to the Grampian State Forest as hereinafter described, that is to say :—
