The births of 1,001 children, viz., 474 boys and 527 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of September. In the month of August 954 births were registered, or 47 fewer than in the month under review. The births were 237 above the average of the previous ten years, but only 128 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in September numbered 520, viz., 270 of males, and 250 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 481. The deaths were fewer than those in August by 71, but exceeded the average of September during the previous ten years by 150. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by 97 only.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.29, and of deaths registered 1.71.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 79.0° on the 9th, and the lowest was 35.0° on the 17th. The mean temperature of the month (54.1°) was one and a third of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (33.5°) took place on the 18th, viz., from a maximum of 73.5° to a minimum of 40.0°. The least range (9.9°) was on the 15th, viz., from a maximum of 54.9° to a minimum of 45.0°. The mean daily range was 19.0°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.921 inches) was slightly above the average. Rain fell on 15 days, the amount of rainfall being .68 inch.

Males contributed 52 per cent., and females 48 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 38 per cent. to that mortality as against 32 per cent. in September 1883; 33 per cent. in September 1882; 28 per cent. in September 1881; 36 per cent. in September 1880; 31 per cent. in September 1879; 30 per cent. in September 1878; 38 per cent. in September 1877; 28 per cent. in September 1876; 35 per cent. in September 1875; and 25 per cent. in September 1874.

The deaths of twenty persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a female aged 75, who died of tumour of the liver; an upholsterer, aged 76, of paralysis; a male, of occupation unstated, aged 76, of diabetes; two females, aged 77 and 88 respectively, of cancer; a female, aged 77, of cirrhosis of liver; a brickmaker, aged 78, of heart disease; a female, aged 78, of congestion of the lungs; a female, aged 79, of gastritis; a gentleman, aged 90, of disease of the bladder; a laborer, aged 76, a female, aged 78, a gardener and of old age, each aged 82, a female, aged 84, a gentleman, a laborer, and a female, each aged 85, a female aged 86, and a female, aged 88, of a female age.

Twenty deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month of which 13 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male child, aged 3, died of injuries resulting from being run over by a cab; a boy, aged 9, and a carver and gilder, aged 65, were killed by railway trains passing over them; a housepainter, aged 21, by a fall from a scaffold; a boatswain, aged 36, died of effusion of blood on the brain, caused by a fall whilst drunk; a

laundress, aged 52, of fractured ribs, caused by falling out of bed; and a laborer, aged 22, of tetanus, resulting from being run over by a railway engine; a stonebreaker, aged 51, was found-drowned in a waterhole; a cabinan, aged 53, in the River Yarra; and two firemen, aged 32 and 35 respectively, were drowned in Hobson's Bay. A gentleman aged 45, was suffocated at supper, whilst intoxicated; and a female infant died of injuries to the head and brain received during birth. The homicidal deaths were those of a female, aged 16, who was shot in the head; of a storekeeper, aged 48, who was suffocated; and of a laborer—a prisoner of the Crown—aged 22, who was shot dead by a warder, whilst attempting to escape from legal custody. The suicidal deaths were those of a baker, aged 20, who shot himself; of a gentleman, aged 66, who cut his throat whilst of unsound mind; of a clerk, aged 15, who drowned himself in the River Yarra, and of a hawk, aged 50, who hanged himself.

One hundred and seventeen deaths, or 22½ per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—51 in the Melbourne Hospital, 17 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 11 in the Lying-in Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 11 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Pentridge Stockade, 1 in the Blind Asylum, and 1 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 199, of which 105, or 53 per cent., were of males, and 94, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 109 were under one year of age, 48 were between one and two, 25 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 321. Of these, 165, or 51 per cent., were males, and 156, or 49 per cent., were females; 17 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 25 were between fifteen and twenty, 29 were between twenty and twenty-five, 21 were between twenty-five and thirty, 20 were between thirty and thirty-five, 21 were between thirty-five and forty, 20 were between forty and forty-five, 24 were between forty-five and fifty, 32 were between fifty and fifty-five, 31 were between fifty-five and sixty, 10 were between sixty and sixty-five, 29 were between sixty-five and seventy, 14 were between seventy and seventy-five, 10 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 10 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases decreased from 105 in August to 90 in the month under notice. The diminution was chiefly in deaths from whooping-cough, which fell from 37 to 17, and in those from typhoid fever, which fell from 13 to 9. On the other hand, measles, which has again assumed an epidemic form, caused 34 deaths as against 22 in August. Since measles reappeared in the month of June 66 deaths have resulted therefrom. As many as thirteen deaths of women were set down to circumstances attendant on childbirth, and on comparing this number with the births registered, viz., 1,001, it is found that 1 death of a mother took place to every 77 children born alive.

**MELBOURNE RACES, SPRING MEETING 1884.**

From the 27th October to the 8th November, both dates inclusive, tickets available for return by any train up to the night of the 15th November inclusive will be issued at Holiday excursion fares from all stations (Deniliquin and Mathoura on the Deniliquin and Moama Line included) to Melbourne. Trains will run as per Time-table. From the 30th October to the 17th November inclusive, the department cannot engage to forward horses and vehicles by any particular train.

**LADDERS.**

The Ladders are to be of Red or Yellow Baltic Fir, free from large or loose knots, and perfectly straight in grain, sound and free from heart and sap. The rounds are to be cleft, of young and fresh Hickory, English Ash, or English Oak, straight in grain, and turned to 1¼ inch diameter in centre, and for ¾-inch holes at ends. The sides of the Ladders are to be bored to receive the rounds, and the holes are to be tapered outwards, so as to admit of the round being opened and wedged. All the rounds are to well fill the holes, and be wedged with glue into the sides, previously having received a coat of wet white lead. Every eighth round a tie-bolt ½ inch diameter with collar at each end 1¼ inch diameter is to be inserted below the round with nut and washer at each end, the rounds to be 9 inches apart centre to centre. The Ladders are to be finished with three coats of good lead and oil paint, of such colour as may be ordered.

The 36-foot Ladders are to spread at bottom 18 inches clear between the sides, which are to be 4¾ inches x 2¾ inches; and at top 9½ inches clear, and sides 2¾ inches x 1½ inches.

The 30-foot Ladders 18 inches clear at bottom, with sides 4½ inches x 2½ inches; and at top 10¼ inches clear, and sides 2¾ inches x 1½ inches.

The 24-foot Ladders 16 inches clear at bottom, and sides 4½ inches x 2 inches; at top 10 inches clear, and sides 2½ inches x 1¾ inches.

The 20-foot Ladders 15 inches clear at bottom, and sides 3¾ inches x 2 inches; at top 10 inches clear, and sides 2½ inches x 1¼ inches.

The 16-foot Ladders 14 inches clear at bottom, and sides  $3\frac{1}{2}$  x  $1\frac{7}{8}$  inches; and at top 10 inches clear, and sides  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inches x  $1\frac{1}{4}$  inches.

The 12-foot Ladders 13 inches clear at bottom, and sides  $3\frac{3}{8}$  x  $1\frac{3}{4}$  inches; and at top 10 inches clear, and sides  $2\frac{1}{2}$  x  $1\frac{1}{4}$  inches.

The 10-foot Ladders 13 inches clear at bottom, and sides  $3\frac{1}{4}$  inches x  $1\frac{3}{4}$  inches; and at top 10 inches clear, and sides  $2\frac{1}{2}$  x  $1\frac{1}{4}$  inches.

All the Ladders over 14 feet long are to be parallel in the sides to one-third of the height from the bottom; that is, the sides are to be of the same section one-third up as at bottom.

SPECIFICATION.

Whenever specially ordered, the castings shall be run from the very best "cold-blast iron," and of such particular brand, quality, and mixture as may be described in the order; or of such other substituted mixture as may be approved or directed by the Locomotive Superintendent, so as to produce a hard, close, soft, or other description of metal.

The castings are to be clean, sharp, free from surface scale, shell, cold shuts, blow holes, honeycomb, cinder, or any other imperfections, and are to be sound in every respect and thoroughly close in grain. When specially ordered, the castings are to be run with heads or runners of such weight as may be requested, and no extra charge shall be made or allowed for same, and the contractor will be required to remove the head or runner from the casting where possible, and charge the casting at the net weight only, trimmed and clean. In cases where it is necessary to cut off the head in a lathe or machine, such head will be cut off by the Government, and returned to the Station nearest to the contractor's works, there to be delivered to the contractor free of cost or carriage.

Whenever ordered, the castings are to be moulded in loam without a pattern, and loam price will be paid according to schedule, but no extra charge will be allowed for patterns, strickles, or loam-boards. The orders will express the kind or description of casting according to the schedule distinction; and the rates there filled in opposite each item will be allowed accordingly.

The Railway Department will supply all patterns, and deliver the same to the Station nearest to the contractor's works, free of cost, from whence the contractor must fetch them when required and when due notice of same has been given in writing. Any pattern lost by the contractor must be replaced by him.

Whenever only one or two castings are required, and they can be moulded from the broken originals, the contractor will be bound to mould from such patterns without requiring the Victorian Railways Commissioners to supply a wooden or other pattern for same, and no extra price will be allowed.

All pipes and bends must be moulded in loam whenever required, and a loam pattern made. A loam pattern must be struck up for any casting when a pattern cannot be supplied, and when only one casting or so is required, and when of that simple form that it can be made from a loam pattern; and no extra rate or charge will be allowed for the loam pattern beyond the loam price stated in schedule. The Victorian Railways Commissioners will supply all necessary striking boards, but no plates or cramps.

All patterns, loam-boards, &c., supplied by the Victorian Railways Commissioners must be returned by the contractor in good order, with the castings, and delivered to the Railway Stores at Williamstown.

Notwithstanding the delivery of any castings and a receipt having been given for them, should such castings turn out unsound, not in accordance with pattern or instructions, or in any way whatever defective, or of different quality of iron to that ordered, they must be removed at the expense of the contractor, and other castings must be supplied in lieu thereof, without delay and without additional charge.

Should the contractor, in the opinion of the Engineer-in-Chief or the Locomotive Superintendent, fail to furnish work in accordance with the specification, then, in seven days after due notice to that effect shall have been given in writing, the Secretary for Railways shall have full power to re-advertise and re-let this contract to any other person the Victorian Railways Commissioners shall think fit; and at the expiration of seven days after such notice shall have been given to the contractor, this contract shall become null and void.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the proclamation bearing date the tenth day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, proclaiming the township of Bruthen to be a District wherein No. 125.—OCTOBER 24, 1884.—4.

Publicans' Licenses may be specially granted; and, with the advice aforesaid, do proclaim the locality hereinafter mentioned to be a district where publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

An area comprised within a radius of twenty chains from the south-west angle of Crown allotment 24, parish of Tambo, county of Dargo.

BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.—BYE-LAW.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby make the following Bye-law, under the 16th section of the said statute, that is to say:—

1. No person shall drive, take or drag, or cause to be driven, taken, or dragged, any timber or timber sledge, over, upon, or along the surface of any road under the control of the Board of Land and Works.

2. No person shall cause any timber or other obstruction of any kind to be placed on any sidelong cutting, embankment, bridge, or other roadway under the control of the Board of Land and Works.

3. No person shall drive or take, or cause to be taken or driven, any waggon or vehicle of any kind across any bridge until such bridge is clear of any other waggon or vehicle.

4. No person shall drive or take, or cause to be driven or taken, any waggon or vehicle, and no person on horseback shall ride across any bridge at any other than a walking pace, or pass each other, or pedestrians, in the various sidelong cuttings or bridges under the control of the Board of Land and Works at other than a walking pace.

5. No person, except by the authority of the Board of Land and Works, shall remove or cause to be removed, or damage in any way, any fences or obstructions of any kind placed by the officers or servants of the Public Works Department on or across any of the roads, cuttings, or roadways under the control of the board before mentioned, placed for the purpose of closing such roadways or cuttings, &c., during their repair or otherwise.

6. No person shall be allowed to drive any vehicle whatsoever on any of the before-mentioned roads, roadways, or cuttings without reins, or be allowed to drive over table drains, fender logs, culvert posts, or any other similar preventative or preservative means placed on such roads by the authority of the Public Works Department or its servants.

7. No person in charge of any loaded or unloaded waggon shall have more than five horses or bullocks yoked to such waggon, and no person shall carry more than (2) two tons of loading in such waggon over or on any road under the control of the Board of Land and Works unless in each last-mentioned case the tires of such waggons shall be (5) five or more inches in width.

8. By *The Public Works Statute 1865* any person violating this Bye-law shall forfeit a sum of not more than (£20) Twenty pounds.

PROHIBITION AGAINST CUTTING OF REDGUM TIMBER FROM CERTAIN CROWN LANDS IN THE PARISH OF TOOLAMBA REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything therein before contained, the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: And whereas by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of September One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, it was amongst other things declared that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live redgum timber on or from certain Crown lands therein specified: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby revoke the above-mentioned proclamation so far only as it affects the cutting or removal of redgum timber of a greater diameter than Eighteen inches or from the Crown lands in the parish of Toolamba, hereinafter described, that is to say:—

Parish of Toolamba, county of Rodney, bounded on the south by allotments 124 and 100, on the west by allotments 114 and 66, on the north by a line being the production of the north boundary of allotment 66 to the Goulburn River, and on the east by the Goulburn River.—(S1.W.26385.)
