SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the undermentioned Proclamations issued under the authority of the said Act, that is to say :—

The Proclamation bearing date the eleventh day of August One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, so far as it relates to

The Great Eastern Diggings.

The Proclamation bearing date the twenty-second day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, so far as it relates to

Mount Camel;

and with the advice aforesaid do proclaim

The Township of Coadah

to be a District wherein publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th Section of the said Act.

THE Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following Orders under section 14 of *The Mining Statute 1865* :—

Pursuant to Orders of 27 October 1884.

Lands excepted from occupation for mining purposes or for residence or business under any miner's right or business license :—

(1.) All that piece or parcel of land in the colony of Victoria, county of Gladstone, in the Mining District of Maryborough, and containing by admeasurement three roods and twenty-two perches, be the same more or less : Commencing at the northern angle of the block, which point bears south sixty-three degrees twenty-seven minutes west seventy-five links, and south thirty-six degrees thirty-nine minutes east seventy-five links from the northern angle of lease block No. 2310, Maryborough, and bounded by lines bearing south thirty-six degrees thirty-nine minutes east three chains, south sixty-three degrees twenty-seven minutes west three chains, north thirty-six degrees thirty-nine minutes west three chains, and north sixty-three degrees twenty-seven minutes east three chains to the point of commencement.

(2.) Ararat District, Stawell.—The portions of Crown lands hereinafter described, subject, however, to existing rights, namely : Commencing at the south-west angle of T. Curran's allotment 20 A<sup>1</sup>, parish of Bellauna; thence north north-easterly by a road passing through Lake Lonsdale to the north boundary of the said parish; thence east to the north-east angle of the said parish; thence south to the south-east angle of allotment 13 B in the said parish; thence east south-easterly along a road to a point in the parish of Ilawarra bearing one mile due east from the boundary between Ilawarra and Bellauna; thence south to a road immediately south of Welshman's Flat; thence south-westerly and west by the said road to commencing point.

Beechworth District.—Commencing at the junction of the Rutherglen and Chiltern Railway lines; thence along the Rutherglen line to the southern boundary of the parish of Carlyle; thence east to the south-east corner of the parish of Carlyle; thence north to the south-west angle of allotment 1, section T, parish of Gooramadda; thence east to the south-east angle of allotment 4, section L, parish of Gooramadda; thence south to the nearest road; thence westerly along that road to a meridian line shown on the county plan; thence meridian south along that line to the Chiltern Railway line; thence by the Chiltern Railway line to commencing point.

Gippsland (in addition to reservations already made).—Commencing at the junction of the Icey Creek with the western branch of the Tangil River; thence west to top of the Dividing Spur between the Tangil and Latrobe rivers; thence south to the Latrobe River; thence by the Latrobe River to the junction of the Tangil River; thence by the Tangil River and the western branch thereof to the commencing point.

KYNETON SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.

REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881 and 1883, make the Regulations following :—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water

supplied by the Trust within the water supply district, that is to say :—

- (1.) For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Ten pounds annual value and under, the amount which, at the rate levied for the year, would be payable in respect of a tenement of Ten pounds annual value.
  - (2.) For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Ten pounds annual value, the amount payable in respect of such annual value at the rate levied for the year.
  - (3.) For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.
  - (4.) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler.
  - (5.) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every one thousand gallons.
2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water is supplied by measure shall be :—
- (1.) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
  - (2.) If for other than domestic purposes only, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.
3. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing house walls, or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter.
4. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
5. Any person, not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
6. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.
7. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters :—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value,  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value,  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.
8. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.
9. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.
10. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.
11. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.
12. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted.
13. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.
14. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.
15. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains, or is not remedied.
16. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said regulations, and not otherwise.

17. In the construction of these regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the "Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust."

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE BARMALH COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the 1st day of April 1879, the Managers of the Barmal Common, having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer, having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on the common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year:—

For every horse or working bullock, Ten shillings per annum.  
For every head of other large cattle, Four shillings per annum.  
For every head of small cattle, Five shillings per annum.  
Progeny (under six months old) of horses and horned cattle legally depasturing on the common, free.

3. All stock running on the common shall be mustered at the commencement of every quarter, and all cattle and horses not claimed at the time of mustering shall be liable to be impounded.

4. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common, and should any animal thereon become so affected the owner of such animal shall remove the same from the common within twenty-four hours after receipt of notice, in writing, from the managers or herdsman so to do, and in the event of such owner neglecting or refusing to remove the animal affected as aforesaid, the managers or herdsman may cause such animal to be removed or destroyed at the owner's expense.

5. The managers shall not be responsible for loss of or injury to stock legally depasturing on the common.

6. Bulls and entire horses shall not be permitted to depasture on the common without the consent, in writing, of the managers first obtained.

7. No stock duly registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the common, unless notice of intention so to do be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the stock removed.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

DISPOSITION OF CHURCH LAND ALLOWED.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of the Church of England, in the Diocese of Melbourne, in Victoria, under the provisions of *The Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion*, for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the twenty-seventh day of October 1884, and the following is the form in which such statement of trust has been allowed:—

*Description of Land.*—Two acres, county of Bourke, parish of South Melbourne, municipal district of St. Kilda: Commencing at a point bearing S. 45° E. sixty-eight links from the south angle of allotment 13; bounded thence by a road bearing N. 45° E. four chains thirty-two links, S. 45° E. four chains sixty-four links, and S. 45° W. four chains thirty-two links; and thence by Acland street bearing N. 45° W. four chains sixty-four links to the point of commencement.

*Names of Trustees.*—The Right Reverend James Moorhouse, Doctor of Divinity, Bishop of Melbourne; the Honorable William Edward Hearn, Doctor of Laws, Chancellor of the Diocese of Melbourne; the Honorable Thomas Turner a'Beckett, Registrar of the Diocese of Melbourne; Alfred Edward Wheatley, of Essendon, gentleman; and Henry Jennings, of St. Kilda, solicitor.

*Power of Disposition.*—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, or exchange or to erect buildings upon the land, subject to the approval of the bishop of the diocese of Melbourne, or, during the absence of the bishop from the diocese or the vacancy of the see, to the approval of the person for the time being administering the affairs of the diocese; the bishop or such person as aforesaid to have power to remove trustees and to appoint new trustees and to fill up all vacancies occurring in trusteeship, and to register these trusts under the provisions of the *Successory Trusts Act 1878*. The land, until otherwise disposed of, to be held for the purposes for which it was granted or reserved by the Crown.

*Purposes to which Proceeds of Disposition are to be applied.*—To such purposes of the Church of England in the diocese of Melbourne as may be agreed upon by—(1) The bishop or, during his absence from his see, or, during the vacancy thereof, by the person for the time being administering the affairs of the diocese. (2) The trustees, and (3) The minister entitled to officiate in, or occupy any building upon the land.
