**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Narracan has requested that certain streets and roads in the Townships of Moe, Trafalgar, and Waterloo, within the said shire, be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands used, reserved, or acquired for the streets and roads hereinafter named and described, and situate in the Townships of Moe, Trafalgar, and Waterloo, within the said shire, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :—

**SHIRES OF MARONG AND HUNTLY—BOUNDARIES ADJUSTED AND RE-DEFINED.**

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fifth day of November 1884.*

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS by the *The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883* (47 Vict. No. 786) it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might make orders altering, for the purpose of adjustment, the boundaries of contiguous municipal districts or subdivisions without any petition: And whereas it has been deemed expedient to adjust the contiguous boundaries of the Shires of Marong and Huntly: Now therefore the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter and adjust the boundaries of the said Shires of Marong and Huntly, and doth re-define the boundaries of the said shires in manner following, that is to say :—

**THE SHIRE OF MARONG ADJUSTED AND RE-DEFINED.**

Commencing at a point on the Loddon River where the road forming the south boundary of the parish of Laanecoorie abuts thereon; thence magnetic east by a line passing through the centre of that road to the Melbourne and Sandhurst Railway; thence northerly by that railway to the southern boundary of the city of Sandhurst; thence by the southern and western boundaries of that city to the southern angle of the borough of Eaglehawk; thence by the south-western, western, and northern boundaries of that borough to the eastern angle thereof; thence by the north-western and northern boundaries of the aforesaid city of Sandhurst to the Bendigo Creek; thence northerly by the new surveyed line of the Bendigo Creek to an east and west road forming the southern boundary of section 20, parish of Huntly; thence westerly by the said road to the south-east angle of allotment 1, section 26, of the said parish; thence northerly by a road to the south boundary of allotment 3 E, section 15, parish of Huntly; thence easterly by a road to the south-east angle and northerly by the eastern boundary to the north-east angle of the said allotment; thence by a road westerly to the south-east angle of the parish of Neilborough; thence northerly by a road forming the eastern boundary of the said parish to the south boundary of the parish of Tandarra; thence west by the south boundary of the parish of Tandarra and a road in continuation thereof to the west boundary of the parish of Yallock; thence south by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 5 of section 15, parish of Salisbury; thence west by a road to the Loddon River aforesaid; and thence by that river upwards to the point of commencement. Excluding the borough of Raywood.

**THE SHIRE OF HUNTLY ADJUSTED AND RE-DEFINED.**

Commencing at the north-east angle of the municipality of Sandhurst; thence east four hundred and ninety chains to the west boundary of the parish of Axedale; thence north one hundred and six chains the north-west angle of allotment 10 section 11, parish of Axedale; thence east by the north boundary of the parish of Axedale to the River Campaspe; thence following the River Campaspe bearing northerly to the north-eastern boundary of portion 20, parish of Diggorra; thence by the northern boundary of said portion 20 and a direct line to the western boundary to the Railway Reserve; thence north-easterly by the said boundary of reserve to the north-east angle of portion 89, parish of Diggorra; thence by a line bounding on the north portions in said parish of Diggorra from No. 89 to No. 173, and from No. 91 to No. 68, in the parish of Warraumbamba, to the north-west angle of said portion No. 68; thence south by its west boundary to its south-west angle; thence by the south-west boundaries of portions 59 and 58, parish of Kamarooka, to the north-west angle of portion 58; thence south-westerly and west by the roads forming the north boundary of portions 61, 33, 24, 21, and 20 in the last-named parish to a point bearing magnetic north from a point on the road forming the east boundary of portions 125, 124, and 123, parish of Kamarooka, distant one hundred and seventy chains north of the south-east angle of portion 125 of parish of Kamarooka; thence magnetic south to the last-described point; thence by that road south to the said south-east angle; thence westerly by the road forming the south boundary of the parish of Tandarra to the north-east angle of Neilborough; thence south by a road forming the east boundary of said parish to a road forming the north boundary of allotment 3 E, section 15, parish of Huntly; thence east by the said road to the north-east angle of the allotment; thence south by the east boundary of said allotment; thence west by a road on the south boundary of said allotment to a road forming the west boundary of allotment 3 G, section 15, said parish; thence south by that road to the south-west angle of section 20; thence east by a road forming the south boundary of said section to the new surveyed line of the Bendigo Creek; thence southerly by the centre line of said creek to the northern boundary of the city of Sandhurst; thence by the northern boundary of that municipality to the commencing point. Wherever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road, shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

## "THE MALLEE PASTORAL LEASES ACT 1883."—VERMIN DISTRICTS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Mallee Pastoral Leases Act 1883* (No. 766, sec. 43) it was enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, might from

time to time declare any lands situate within the Mallee country or the Mallee border to be "Vermin Districts," for the purposes of the said Act and fix the boundaries thereof, and might from time to time in like manner cause any lands to cease to be Vermin Districts, or might vary the boundaries thereof: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby revoke the Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, whereby certain lands therein described were declared to be "Vermin Districts," so far only as the said Proclamation relates to the "Northern District," and do by this Proclamation declare the lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter defined to be "Vermin Districts" within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act, that is to say:—

## VERMIN DISTRICTS.

**Northern District.**—All the Mallee blocks and all subdivisions thereof comprised within the following boundaries: Commencing at a point on the south bank of the Murray River where the boundary-line of Victoria and South Australia intersects the same; and bounded on the west by the said boundary-line southward to the south boundary of Mallee block No. 1; on the south by the southern boundaries of blocks Nos. 1, 2, 3, and 4; thence south by part of the west boundary of block No. 5 to the south-west angle of the last-named block; thence east by the south boundaries of blocks Nos. 5 and 6 to the south-east angle of the said block No. 6; thence south by the west boundaries of blocks No. 29, 28, and 46 to the south-west angle of said block No. 46; thence east by the south boundary of said last-named block to the south-east angle of the same; thence north by the east boundary of said block to north-east angle of same; thence east by part of south boundary of block No. 28 to south-east angle of said block No. 28; thence north by east boundary of same to north-east angle of said block No. 28; thence east by south boundaries of blocks Nos. part 13 and 14, and 15 to the south-east angle of last-named block; thence on the east by the east boundary of block No. 15 north to the River Murray; thence on the north by the River Murray, northerly to the reserved land opposite Euston; thence by the south boundary of that reserved land southward to the River Murray, again by that river southward and westward to the point where the Chalka Creek emerges from the River Murray; thence by that creek westward and northward until it again falls into the River Murray; thence again by that river northward and westward to the reserved land at Cowana; thence by the south and west boundary of that reserved land westward and northward to the River Murray; thence again by that river westward to the reserved land at the junction of the River Darling with the River Murray; thence by the east and south boundary of that reserved land southward and westward to the River Murray, again by that river westward to the point where the River Lindsay flows out of it; thence by the said River Lindsay westward till it again falls into the River Murray, and thence by the River Murray westward to the point of commencement.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Mallice Pastoral Leases Act 1883* it was amongst other things enacted that the Local Committee should within thirty days from its appointment, and thereafter in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate or assessment, specifying the amount thereof to be paid by the owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its vermin district, in respect of each square mile of land owned, held under lease, or occupied, under the provisions of the said Act; and also in respect of the sheep or cattle depasturing thereon; and it was further enacted that such rate or assessment on being proclaimed by the Governor in Council in the *Government Gazette* should be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the vermin district for the current year for the purposes of the said Act, and should be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the Local Committee duly appointed for the Northern Vermin District have recommended a rate of sixpence per square mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said vermin district: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim an annual rate of sixpence per square mile to be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the Northern Vermin District for the current year.

# **EAGLEHAWK.—RESERVE FOR CRICKET AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION.**

**WE**, George Loudon, J.P., Frederick Chapple, Matthew Mann, John Archer Roach, and John B. Roberts, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Cricket and other purposes of public recreation in the municipal district of Eaglehawk, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869* :—

## **REGULATIONS.**

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days as the reserve may be set apart for a cricket or football match, or for the holding therein of shows, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on the occasion of any of which a fee not exceeding 2s. 6d. may be charged for the admission of every adult person to the reserve.

2. The committee of management may allow any duly recognised committee of any shows, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements to use the reserve; and such latter committee shall abide by any order given by the committee of management in reference to the reserve or to buildings or other erections for the time being thereon.

3. No person shall remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

4. No person shall climb upon or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills or cut names thereon, or in any way damage the trees, seats, or any buildings whatsoever in the reserve, or roll or throw stones therein.

5. No person shall damage the shrubs or flowers in the reserve, or light fires therein.

6. No person shall put any horse, cattle, or sheep in the reserve, or take horses therein, without first obtaining the written consent of the committee of management.

7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any building in the reserve or any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management.

8. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the sale or exhibition of any article or animal, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

9. Any person committing in the reserve or in any of the buildings or other structures for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve :—

- (1.) Assaulting any person.
- (2.) Being drunk.
- (3.) Using profane or obscene language.
- (4.) Using abusive or insulting words.
- (5.) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (6.) Obtaining admission to the reserve or any buildings thereon, when not entitled to such admission, or refusing to surrender (if required) to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand production of the same any ticket duly authorizing admission to the reserve.
- (7.) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket match, football match, or sports, or during practice at cricket, or when crossing or trespassing thereon would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

# **MADDINGLY RECREATION RESERVE.**

**WE**, George Dickie, Thomas George Pearce, William Grant, Thomas Anderson, and Edward George Jones, the duly appointed trustees of the land temporarily reserved for recreation purposes at Maddingly, hereinafter designated "Maddingly Park," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869* :—

## **REGULATIONS.**

1. Maddingly Park shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on days set apart for shows, sports, fêtes, and holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a charge not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence may be made for admission of every adult person to the park.

2. The trustees may allow any duly recognised committee of any shows, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements to use Maddingly Park, and such committee shall abide by any order given by the trustees in reference thereto, or to the buildings or other erections for the time being thereon.

3. No person shall damage, in any way, the trees, tree guards, shrubs, or flowers in Maddingly Park, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall enter or remain in Maddingly Park who shall offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

5. No person shall climb upon or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills, or cut names thereon, or in any way damage the trees, tree guards, seats, or any buildings whatsoever, or roll or throw stones, or leave bottles or broken glass in Maddingly Park.

6. No person shall put any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animal on the Maddingly Park, or take horses therein, without first obtaining the written permission of the trustees.

7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in Maddingly Park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

8. No person shall discharge any firearms in Maddingly Park.

9. No person shall erect any dwelling in Maddingly Park, nor any booth or other structure for the sale or exhibition of any article or animal, without the consent, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.

10. Any person committing in Maddingly Park, or in any of the buildings or other structures for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall be liable to be removed from the park, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket, and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto :—

- (1.) Assaulting any person.
- (2.) Being drunk.
- (3.) Using profane or obscene language.
- (4.) Using abusive or insulting words.
- (5.) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (6.) Obtaining admission to the park, or any buildings thereon, when not entitled to such admission, or refusing to surrender (if required) to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the trustees to demand production of the same any ticket authorizing admission to the park.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

## CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR EXCURSIONS.

**Holiday Excursion Tickets.**—Will be issued to and from all stations (Suburban lines excepted) from the 15th December 1884 to the 5th January 1885, both dates inclusive (Sundays excepted), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example.—An excursion ticket issued on the 24th December will be available till the 24th January. When the last day falls on a Sunday, the ticket will be available till next day. The journey must be commenced on the day the ticket is issued, but after a distance of fifteen miles has been travelled, the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger.

**Sydney Excursion Tickets.**—From the 15th December to the 5th January, both dates inclusive, Excursion Tickets will be issued at Melbourne to Sydney at the following return fares:—1st Class, £5 6s. 6d.; 2nd Class, £4 1s. These tickets will be available for two calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the express trains on the New South Wales line. The second-class tickets will be available by the Victorian Railways express trains as far as Wodonga only.

**Luggage.**—Excursion Passengers will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van must be at the station half an hour before the train starts, and pay excess luggage-rate for it.

**Horses and Vehicles.**—From the 22nd December to the 8th January, both dates inclusive, the Department cannot engage to forward horses and vehicles by any particular train.

**Commercial Travellers' Samples.**—From the 22nd December to the 5th January, commercial travellers' samples will not be taken to or from roadside stations, except by mixed or goods trains.

**Parcels.**—On the 24th and 31st December parcels must be at the Melbourne Parcels Office thirty minutes before starting time of ordinary trains.

**North Melbourne and Newmarket Stations.**—From the 24th to the 26th December and on 31st December and 1st January, tickets will not be issued at North Melbourne or Newmarket Stations for country stations, and down-country trains will not stop there. On the same dates the up North-Eastern train will not stop at Newmarket. The 5.5 p.m. down and the 6.43 a.m. up mixed trains are excepted from the foregoing arrangement.

**Goods Sheds Holidays.**—The 25th and 26th December and 1st January will be observed as holidays in the Goods Branch, and goods trains will not run. NOTE.—During the quarter ended 30th September the increase by excess of registered births over registered deaths was 4432, viz., 2029 males and 2403 females; that by excess of recorded arrivals by sea over recorded departures by sea was 2701, viz., 1869 males and 832 females. The total increase of population was thus 7133, viz., 3898 males and 3235 females, as shown in the table. This increase exceeded by 855 that recorded in the corresponding quarter of the previous year, viz., 6278. It should be stated that, whilst it is probable nearly all the deaths and arrivals by sea are noted, it is certain that some births and departures by sea are not recorded; it should moreover be borne in mind that no attempt is made to take an account of persons who come and go overland.

## SHIRE OF CHILTERN.

## BYE-LAW No. 6.

A Bye-law making Rates and Charges for Water supplied within the Water Supply District of the Shire of Chiltern, and for Regulating the Supply.

BYE-LAW No. 4 of the Shire of Chiltern, dated May 5th 1881, is hereby repealed.

The Council of the Shire of Chiltern doth hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872, make the following rate from the date hereof upon all lands, tenements, &c., within the Water Supply district, such rate to take effect on and after the first day of January 1885, on which date the first rate shall be due and payable for the half-year then next ensuing.

1st. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied, other than by measure, for domestic purposes:-

1st. On every house and tenement of the annual value of £10 and under, Fifteen per centum on the amount of the valuation.

2nd. On every house and tenement of the value of £10, and not exceeding £20, One pound ten shillings per annum.



3rd. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, and not exceeding £30, One pound seventeen shillings and sixpence per annum.

4th. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £30, and not exceeding £40, Two pounds five shillings per annum.

5th. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £40, and not exceeding £50, Two pounds twelve shillings and sixpence per annum.

6th. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £50, and not exceeding £60, Three pounds per annum.

7th. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £60, and not exceeding £80, Three pounds fifteen shillings per annum.

8th. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £80, and not exceeding £100, Four pounds ten shillings per annum.

9th. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £100, and not exceeding £150, Six pounds per annum.

10th. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £150, and not exceeding £250, Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.

11th. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £250, Nine pounds per annum.

12th. Water from the stand pipes and public taps will be supplied to licensed persons only at the following rates:—

A license to cart water for sale (with horse and dray) from the stand pipes, One pound per annum.

A license to cart water (with horse and dray) for the use of the licensee only, Ten shillings per annum.

A license to carry away water from the public taps, other than by horse and dray, Five shillings per annum.

13th. Water for steam boilers will be supplied by measure or by special agreement.

14th. Water troughs, Seven shillings and sixpence per annum.

15th. Livery stables, Fifteen shillings per stall (one stall allowed for every £50 of annual value).

16th. Hotel with stabling (not being livery stables), Six shillings per stall (one stall allowed for every £50 of annual value).

2nd. The Council may cause meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, such metres to be provided and affixed at the expense of the consumers, and the water supplied to be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1000 gallons over and above the amount for which they are rated. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure. No metre shall be affixed until its register shall be approved by the Council.

3rd. If any metre cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repairs, the Council shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

4th. The Council reserves the right to make the supply from the main intermittent instead of continuous, and to fix the hours during which such intermittent supply shall be turned on to each portion of the town.

5th. The Council also reserves the right to forbid the use of hose for watering the streets or footpaths of the town, at any time when it may be considered necessary. Any person watering the streets or footpaths with a hose, after receiving notice from the Council not to do so, will be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

6th. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for irrigation (which term irrigation shall include any mechanical or artificial contrivance for carrying water to the roots of plants without labour, or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose).

7th. Any person receiving water from the Council, who shall allow any unlicensed person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8th. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Council, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

9th. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Council, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Council, he shall obtain from the Council a license in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting, as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

10th. Before any such license shall be granted by the Council, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Council that he is a competent plumber, and pay the annual sum of Five shillings as the fee for such license. The Council shall have the power of cancelling such license at any time.

11th. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Council, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Council, without the permission in writing of the Council being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

12th. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Council, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Council, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some

officer of the Council, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the Council of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Council. Wrought iron and lead piping of approved quality only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services. No service of a larger bore than  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch will be permitted, unless by special consent of the Council.

13th. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Council into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Council that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Council may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off such service-pipe or otherwise as the said Council may deem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none the owner, shall, in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipes being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Council.

14th. Any person supplied with water by the Council, who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Council.

15th. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dials of the metre, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Council.

16th. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

17th. If any person supplied with water by the Council does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Council may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied, or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

18th. In the construction of this Bye-law, the word "Council" shall mean the Shire Council of Chiltern.
