PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

An Act to amend "The Residence Areas Act 1881."

An Act to provide for the remuneration of Attorneys and Solicitors.

An Act to amend "The Licensing Act 1876."

Given under my hand and the seal of the colony, at Melbourne, this fourth day of December in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and in the forty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

Resolved—

(1.) That it is desirable that regulations be framed by the Inns of Courts for the admission thereto of barristers who have been admitted to the bar of certain colonies.

(2.) That, while the two branches of the profession are kept distinct in Queensland, New South Wales, and Victoria, as at present, and the regulations affecting the call to such bars also remain substantially as they are at present, any member of such bars of three years' standing, stating his intention to practise at the English bar, and presenting a certificate of call to any such bars, duly authenticated, and also a certificate by a Judge of the Supreme Court of the colony, and by the Attorney-General or senior law officer thereof, that the applicant is a fit and proper person to be called to the English bar, may become a member of any Inn of Court, and be called to the English bar on keeping three terms without submitting to any examination.

SHIRES OF TAMBO AND OMEO.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, sec. 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Tambo, which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said Shire of Tambo and annexed to the Shire of Omeo.

Area described in the petition: Commencing at a point on the Great Dividing Range at the head of the watershed of the Timbarra River; thence down that river to its junction with the Tambo River; thence down the Tambo River to its junction with Monkey Creek; thence up that creek to its source in the range; thence by that range to Mount Baldhead; thence by the common boundaries of the Shires of Omeo and Tambo to the Great Dividing Range to the commencing point aforesaid.

Petitioners state that they reside in the Bruthen riding of Tambo Shire, but are separated from the other portions thereof by a distance of twenty miles of barren and uninhabited country. That they are almost practically excluded from any representation in the council by reason of the distance which members would have to travel thereto. That the portion of the riding in which they reside is immediately contiguous to the settled parts of the Shire of Omeo, with the residents of which they have interests in common, as shown by the Omeo Shire persistently paying attention to the improvement of the road from Omeo to Bruthen, which road forms their only mode of transit to the sea coast. That on account of the isolation of the portion sought to be severed from the other parts of the shire and the diversity of industry and interests of the two portions they are injured.

Petitioners therefore pray :—
“That your Excellency, in Council, will sever the area described from the Shire of Tambo and annex it to the Shire of Omeo.

NOTICE is hereby given that a lighthouse is erected on the western side of the new harbor of Samarang.

It is placed in the axis of the western pier.
It exhibits a white holophotal revolving light of the fourth order, showing one flash every thirty seconds; the lighthouse being a dodecagonal tower painted white, is 98.5 feet high, so that the light is elevated 106.5 feet above the level of the sea.

It illuminates the whole sea horizon within a range of visibility of 16 nautical miles when the observer's eye is placed 15 feet above the sea; this distance increases till 18 miles when the observer's eye is placed 30 feet above the sea, being then the Korowolean reef within the limit of visibility.

The lighthouse is placed in 110° 25' 3" longitude east and 6° 57' 9" latitude south (Chart Reede, Samarang, 1881).

1. Reef between Hual Island and the Boo Islands.
Halmahera Sea.

Mr. Francis Anderson, master of the English vessel *Archbar of Greenock*, reports the existence of the reef marked doubtful on the chart “Moluksche Archipel bl. I” in

lat. 1° 12' S., long. 128° 53' 5 E. with the bearings:

Pisang (centre) ... S. 4 W.
The western of the Boo Islands (centre) ... E. 4 N.

It is a coral reef, with about 2½ fathoms of water over it, extending nearly 1½ mile in W. direction, with a breadth of 200 yards.

PORT PHILLIP BAY.—SOUTH CHANNEL LIGHTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the township hereinafter mentioned to be a district where publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE OPEN COMPETITION OF JUNE 1885.

N.B.—The Regulations are liable to be altered in future years.

1. On the 2nd June 1885, and following days, an examination, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London.¹ Not fewer than persons will be selected, if so many shall be found duly qualified, viz.:—
for the Lower Provinces of Bengal (including Assam); for the Upper Provinces of Bengal (including the Punjab and Oudh); for Burma; for Madras, and for Bombay.²

2. No person will be deemed qualified who shall not satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners:—

- (i.) That he is a natural-born subject of Her Majesty.
- (ii.) That his age will be above seventeen years and under nineteen years on the 1st January 1885. [N.B.—In the case of natives of India this must be certified by the Government of India or of the Presidency or Province in which the candidate may have resided.]
- (iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.
- (iv.) That he is of good moral character.

3. Should the evidence upon the above points be *prima facie* satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners, the candidate, on payment of the prescribed fee,³ will be admitted to the examination. The Commissioners may, however, in their discretion, at any time prior to the grant of the certificate of qualification hereinafter referred to, institute such further inquiries as they may deem necessary; and if the result of such inquiries, in the case of any candidate, should be unsatisfactory to them in any of the above respects, he will be ineligible for admission to the Civil Service of India; and if already selected will be removed from the position of a Probationer.

4. The examination will take place only in the following branches of knowledge:—

Candidates are at liberty to name any or all of these branches of knowledge. No subjects are obligatory.

5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks; and the number set opposite to each branch in the preceding regulation denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

6. The marks assigned to candidates in each branch will be subject to such deduction as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary,⁹ in order to secure that "a candidate be allowed no credit at all for taking up a subject in which he is a mere smatterer."

¹ An order for admission to the examination will be sent to each candidate on the 19th of May.

² The numbers will be announced hereafter.

³ The fee (£5) will be payable by means of a special stamp according to instructions which will be communicated to candidates.

⁴ A considerable portion of the marks for English History and Literature will be allotted to the works selected by the candidate. (See notice respecting the examination in the History of England and English Literature.) In awarding marks for this, regard will be had partly to the extent and importance of the periods or books selected, but chiefly to the thoroughness with which they have been studied.

⁵ The examination will range from Arithmetic, Algebra, and Elementary Geometry, up to the elements of the differential and integral calculus, including the lower portions of applied Mathematics.

⁶ The standard of marking in Sanskrit and Arabic will be determined with reference to a high degree of proficiency, such as may be expected to be reached by a native of good education.

⁷ Marks assigned in English Composition and Mathematics will be subject to no deduction.

7. The examination will be conducted on paper and *visd voce*, as may be deemed necessary.

8. The marks obtained by each candidate, in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, will be added up, and the names of the several candidates who shall have obtained, after the deduction above mentioned, a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining candidates, will be set forth in order of merit, and such candidates shall be deemed to be selected candidates for the Civil Service of India, provided they appear to be, in other respects duly qualified. Should any of the selected candidates become disqualified, the Secretary of State for India will determine whether the vacancy thus created shall be filled up or not. In the former case, the candidate next in order of merit, and in other respects duly qualified, shall be deemed to be a selected candidate. A selected candidate declining to accept the appointment which may be offered to him will be disqualified for any subsequent competition.

9. Selected candidates, before proceeding to India, will be on probation for two years, during which time they will be examined periodically, with a view of testing their progress in the following subjects:—

In these examinations, as in the open competition, the merit of the candidates examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each subject denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it at any one examination. The examination will be conducted on paper and *visd voce*, as may be deemed necessary. The last of these examinations will be held at the close of the second year of probation, and will be called the "Final Examination," at which it will be decided whether a selected candidate is qualified for the Civil Service of India. At this examination candidates will be permitted to take up any one of the following branches of Natural Science, viz.:—Agricultural Chemistry, Botany, Geology, or Zoology, for which 350 marks will be allowed.

10. Candidates will be tested during their probation as to their ability to perform journeys on horseback; and no candidate will be deemed qualified for the Civil Service of India who fails to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners of his competence in this respect.

11. Any candidate who, at any of the periodical examinations, shall appear to have wilfully neglected his studies, or to be physically incapacitated for pursuing the prescribed course of training, will be liable to have his name removed from the list of selected candidates.

12. The selected candidates who, at the final examination, shall be found to have a competent knowledge of the subjects specified in Regulation 9, and who shall have satisfied the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of nationality, age, health, character, and ability to ride, shall be certified by the said Commissioners to be entitled to be appointed to the Civil Service of India, provided they shall comply with the regulations in force at the time for that service.

13. Persons desirous to be admitted as candidates must apply on forms which may be obtained from "The Secretary, Civil Service Commission, London, S.W.," at any time after the 1st December 1884. The forms must be returned so as to be received at the office of the Civil Service Commissioners on or before 31st March 1885.⁹

The Civil Service Commissioners are authorized by the Secretary of State for India in Council to make the following announcements:—

1. Selected candidates will be permitted to choose, according to the order in which they stand in the list resulting from the open competition, so long as a choice remains, the Presidency (and in Bengal the Division of the Presidency) to which they shall be appointed; but this choice will be subject to a different arrangement, should the Secretary of State, or the Government of India, deem it necessary.¹⁰

2. The probationers, having passed the necessary examinations, will be required to report their arrival in India within such period after the grant of their certificate of qualification as the Secretary of State may in each case direct.

3. The seniority in the Civil Service of India of the selected candidates shall be determined according to the order in which they stand on the list resulting from the final examination.

4. An allowance amounting to £300 will be given to all candidates who pass their probation at one of the universities or colleges which have been approved by the Secretary of State, viz.:—The Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, Glasgow, Edinburgh, St. Andrew's, and Aberdeen; University College, London; and King's College, London; provided such candidates shall have passed the required examinations to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners, and shall have complied with such rules as may be laid down for the guidance of selected candidates.

⁹ Full instructions as to the course of study to be pursued will be issued to the successful candidates as soon as possible after the result of the open competition is declared.

¹⁰ These forms should be accompanied by evidence on the points mentioned in Regulation 2, and by a list of the subjects in which the candidate desires to be examined. Evidence of health and character must bear date not earlier than 1st March 1885. Applications for leave to alter or add to the list of subjects named will not be entertained unless received on or before the 4th of May.

¹¹ This choice must be exercised immediately after the result of the open competition is announced, on such day as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. Selected candidates desiring to remain in this country an additional year after the completion of their two years' probation for the purpose of taking a degree at one of the universities above-mentioned should apply to the Secretary of State for India for permission to do so. Besides the allowances above-mentioned, a bonus of £150 will, as a temporary and experimental measure, be paid to any candidate who, having obtained permission to remain an additional year, passes an examination qualifying for a degree in honors at Oxford or Cambridge. This privilege will be hereafter extended to any other of the universities above referred to, at which an academical distinction is obtainable which, in the opinion of the Secretary of State, corresponds to a degree in honors in Oxford or Cambridge, and to obtain which the additional year's residence in this country is necessary.

6. All selected candidates will be required, after having passed the first periodical examination, and before receiving the first instalment of their allowance, to attend at the India Office, for the purpose of entering into an agreement binding themselves, amongst other things, to refund in certain cases the amount of their allowance in the event of their failing to proceed to India. A surety will be required.

7. After passing the final examination, each candidate will be required to attend again at the India Office, with the view of entering into covenants by which, amongst other things, they will bind themselves to agree to such regulations for the provision of pensions for their families as may be approved by the Secretary of State for India in Council. The stamps payable on these covenants amount to £1.

8. Candidates rejected at the final examination of 1887 will in no case be allowed to present themselves for re-examination.

* EVIDENCE OF AGE TO BE REQUIRED FROM CANDIDATES FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

I.—Every candidate born in England or Wales should produce a certificate from the Registrar-General of Births, Marriages, and Deaths, or from one of his provincial officers. This certificate may be obtained at Somerset House, or from the superintendent registrar of the district in which the birth took place.

II.—A candidate who is a native of India must have his age certified by the Government of India, or of the presidency or province in which he may have resided.

III. Every other candidate not producing the certificate mentioned in clause I, must prove his age by statutory declaration, and should also, if possible, produce a record of birth or baptism from some official register; under which term may be included the parochial registers of baptisms, the non-parochial registers of baptisms and births deposited at Somerset House under Acts of Parliament, the register kept at the India Office of persons born in India, &c., &c. This Regulation applies—

1. To all candidates not born in England or Wales.

2. To candidates who, though born in England or Wales, cannot produce the Registrar-General's certificate.

The Civil Service Commissioners reserve to themselves the right of deciding in each case upon the sufficiency of the evidence produced, but they subjoin the following general rules for the guidance of candidates:—

(a.) The declaration should specify precisely the date and place of birth, and should, if possible, be made by the father or mother of the candidate. If made by any other person, it should state the circumstances which enabled the declarant to speak to the fact. If an entry in a Bible or other family record be referred to, the Bible or other record must be produced at the time of making the declaration, and must be mentioned in the declaration as having been so produced.

(b.) If the candidate was born in England or Wales, the declaration must contain a statement, that after due inquiry no entry has been found in the books of the Registrar-General; or a separate declaration must be made to that effect.

(c.) If no extract from any register is produced, the declaration must contain a statement, that after due inquiry no such record is believed to exist; or a separate declaration must be made to that effect.

(d.) Statutory declarations must be exactly in the form prescribed by the Act of 5 and 6 William IV., c. 62. A printed form, if required, will be supplied on application to the Civil Service Commissioners.

N.B.—Clergymen, who are not magistrates, are not qualified to take declarations.

¹³ If a general register office certificate cannot be obtained, the instructions printed herewith * will show what evidence should be supplied. If evidence is already in the hands of the Commissioners, strike out "A certificate of my birth," and insert "Evidence is already in the possession of the Commissioners."

¹⁴ The terms indicated by the marks of quotation must appear in the certificate, which must be given after personal examination, and bear date not earlier than 1st March 1885.

¹⁵ Two testimonials must be sent bearing date not earlier than 1st March 1885. One of them should be given by an intimate acquaintance (not a relative) of not less than three or four years' standing; the other, if the candidate has recently left school, should be given by his late schoolmaster, or, if he has had employment of any kind, by his late employer. If the candidate has been at any university, he should send a certificate of good conduct from his college tutor.

The births of 917 children, viz., 469 boys and 448 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of October. In the month of September 1,001 births were registered, or 84 more than in the month under review. The births were 197 above the average of the previous ten Octobers, but only 94 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in October numbered 534, viz., 289 of males, and 245 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 383. The deaths outnumbered those in September by 11, and exceeded the average of October during the previous ten years by 154. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 100.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.01, and of deaths registered 1.75.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 86.0° on the 25th, and the lowest was 36.0° on the 7th. The mean temperature of the month (54.5°) was nearly two degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (35.9°) took place on the 14th, viz., from a maximum of 73.1° to a minimum of 37.2°. The least range (7.9°) was on the 22nd and 23rd, viz., on the first of those days from a maximum of 56.9° to a minimum of 49.0°, and in the second from a maximum of 58.4° to a minimum of 50.5°. The mean daily range was 18.6°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.891 inches) was slightly above the average. Rain fell on 17 days, the amount of rainfall being 3.036 inches.

Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 46 per cent. to that mortality as against 30 per cent. in October 1883; 31 per cent. in October 1882; 33 per cent. in October 1881; 37 per cent. in October 1880 and 1879; 27 per cent. in October 1878; 39 per cent. in October 1877; 29 per cent. in October 1876; 39 per cent. in October 1875; and 35 per cent. in October 1874.

The deaths of nine persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a gentleman, aged 77, who died of cancer; an engineer, aged 79, and a laborer, aged 80, of bronchitis; a laborer, aged 80, of burns; a gentleman, aged 86, of heart disease, and a baker, aged 76, a farmer, aged 78, a female, aged 79, and a laborer, aged 82, of old age.

Twenty-four deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month of which 22 were ascribed to accident, 1 to suicide, and 1 to execution. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A female child, aged 1, was crushed to death between a mangle and a door; a male child, aged 3, was killed, a cart wheel passing over him; a carter, aged 15, whilst driving a cart laden with bricks, the cart coming into contact with a post; a gardener, aged 21, by a kick from a horse; a female, aged 24, through being thrown from a buggy; a female, aged 61, by a train passing over her, and a laborer, aged 37, by a fall from a building. A cabdriver, aged 42, died of extravasation of blood on the brain, the effect of a fall from his cab; a bootmaker, aged 50, of fracture

of spine, caused by lifting heavy logs; an aboriginal, aged 30, of pyæmia, consequent on a gunshot wound, accidentally inflicted by himself; a boy, aged 6, of tetanus, the result of an injury to the hand; a laborer, aged 80, of burns, and a boy, aged 11, of snake-bite; a female, aged 30, a publican, aged 58, and a stonemason, aged 58, were drowned in the Yarra; a female infant, aged 1 year and 8 months, and a fisherman, aged 17, were drowned, the latter in Hobson's Bay; a female infant, aged 10 days, was overlain; a dressmaker, aged 40, was suffocated through lying on her face whilst intoxicated; a contractor, aged 52, died under the administration of chloroform; and a newly born male infant died of umbilical hæmorrhage. The suicidal death was that of a station manager, aged 52, who cut his throat. The execution was that of a laborer, aged 50, who was hanged in the Melbourne gaol for murder.

One hundred deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—52 in the Melbourne Hospital, 10 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 10 in the Lying-in Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Yarra Beryl Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, and 2 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 243, of which 121, or 50 per cent., were of males, and 122, or 50 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 117 were under one year of age, 65 were between one and two, 25 were between two and three, 19 were between three and four, and 17 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 291. Of these, 168, or 58 per cent., were males, and 123, or 42 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 34 were between twenty and twenty-five, 23 were between twenty-five and thirty, 17 were between thirty and thirty-five, 25 were between thirty-five and forty, 26 were between forty and forty-five, 24 were between forty-five and fifty, 33 were between fifty and fifty-five, 22 were between fifty-five and sixty, 15 were between sixty and sixty-five, 17 were between sixty-five and seventy, 11 were between seventy and seventy-five, 5 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 4 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the previous month, deaths from zymotic diseases increased from 90 to 120. The increase was chiefly confined to deaths from measles, which rose from 34 to 56. As many as 122 deaths have resulted from that complaint since its appearance in an epidemic form in June. Deaths from developmental diseases, on the other hand, fell from 66 to 36, the decrease being chiefly in deaths from child-birth, which fell from 9 to 4, in those from old age, which fell from 19 to 6, and in those from atrophy and debility, which fell from 26 to 17.

BYE-LAW No. 21.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law, and all Bye-laws of 31st January, 1884, conflicting therewith are hereby repealed :—

CHARGES ON GOODS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOW :—

1. Tallow from Graham-street Siding to Port Melbourne Pier, to be charged 3s. per ton in truck loads. Owners to load.
2. General Goods from Port Melbourne Pier to Graham-street Siding, to be charged 4s. per ton.
3. Manure Salt, to be charged and carried under Agricultural Produce Rates and Conditions.
4. Soap, in cases, in lots of not less than 5 tons, to be charged and carried under Miscellaneous Class Rates and Conditions.
5. Wire Netting, in lots of not less than 5 tons, to be charged 2nd Class Rates.
6. Goods *ex* vessels at the Port Melbourne Pier to Geelong, to be charged 5s. per ton, according to Bill of Lading, without regard to Classification.
7. Coal from Geelong to Gas Co.'s Siding, West Geelong, to be charged 1s. 9d. per ton in truck loads.
8. Sugar, in casks, cases, and baskets, to be charged 2nd Class Rates.
9. Bicycles, in pieces, packed in cases, to be charged 4th Class Rates.
Ditto, complete, packed in cases or skeleton cases, 4th Class Rate and a half.
Ditto, complete, loose, 4th Class Double Rate, owner's risk.
10. Asbestos, in its raw state, in bags, to be charged and carried under Special Class A Rates and Conditions.
11. The following Rates for Railway Contractors' Trains in the Bye-laws of 31st January, 1884, are hereby repealed, that is to say :—

"RAILWAY CONTRACTORS' TRAINS."

- " 1. An engine, light, 1s. 6d. per mile, under steam.
- " 2. A train of 10 waggons, ballast or material—contractors' own engine, trucks, and men—or haulage of a dead engine, 2s. 6d. per mile; minimum, 50s. per train. Ballast or material trains are not charged for the return journey empty.
- " 3. A train of contractors' empty waggons, Department finding engine and men, 5s. per mile; minimum, 50s. per train.
- " 4. A train of 10 contractors' waggons loaded with material for their own contract, Department finding engine and men, 7s. 6d. per mile; minimum, 50s.
- " 5. Contractors' empty waggons attached to ordinary goods trains, 3d. per truck per mile; minimum, 15s. each.
- " Contractors' waggons cannot be sent by ordinary goods trains unless provided with spring buffers.
- " All contractors' waggons and engines must be examined and passed by the Locomotive Superintendent before being allowed to run.
- " Contractors' men in charge of engines or trains must also give satisfactory proof of their knowledge of the line, and general fitness, before being permitted to run.
- " The Department finds pilot in all cases, whose wages and expenses are to be paid by contractors."

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR EXCURSIONS.

Holiday Excursion Tickets will be issued to and from all stations (Suburban lines excepted) from the 15th December 1884 to the 5th January 1885, both dates inclusive (Sundays excepted), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example.—An excursion ticket issued on the 24th December will be available till the 21st January. When the last day falls on a Sunday, the ticket will be available till next day. The journey must be commenced on the day the ticket is issued, but after a distance of fifteen miles has been travelled, the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger.

Sydney Excursion Tickets.—From the 15th December to the 5th January, both dates inclusive, Excursion Tickets will be issued at Melbourne to Sydney at the following return fares:—1st Class, £5 6s. 6d.; 2nd Class, £4 1s. These tickets will be available for two calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the express trains on the New South Wales line. The second-class tickets will be available by the Victorian Railways express trains as far as Wodonga only.

Luggage.—Excursion Passengers will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van must be at the station half an hour before the train starts, and pay excess luggage-rate for it.

Horses and Vehicles.—From the 22nd December to the 8th January, both dates inclusive, the Department cannot engage to forward horses and vehicles by any particular train.

Commercial Travellers' Samples.—From the 22nd December to the 5th January, commercial travellers' samples will not be taken to or from roadside stations, except by mixed or goods trains.

Parcels.—On the 24th and 31st December parcels must be at the Melbourne Parcels Office thirty minutes before starting time of ordinary trains.

North Melbourne and Newmarket Stations.—From the 24th to the 26th December and on 31st December and 1st January, tickets will not be issued at North Melbourne or Newmarket Stations for country stations, and down-country trains will not stop there. On the same dates the up North-Eastern train will

not stop at Newmarket. The 5.5 p.m. down and the 6.43 a.m. up mixed trains are excepted from the foregoing arrangement.

Goods Sheds Holidays.—The 25th and 26th December and 1st January will be observed as holidays in the Goods Branch, and goods trains will not run. Parishable goods will, however, be delivered at all stations on application. Consignees of powder can ascertain from the station-master at Footscray when explosives will be received in lieu of these dates.

ANNUAL TICKETS FOR ALL LINES.

Holders of the above intending to renew them for next year, are respectfully requested to hand in their names at the head booking office, Spencer street, as early as possible, so that the necessary metals may be prepared in time.

SECOND CLASS PASSENGERS BY EXPRESS TRAINS ON THE NORTH-EASTERN LINE.

The number of Second Class Passengers who can be booked by either the up or down Express train on the North-Eastern line is limited to fifty (50).

ALTERATION OF TRAIN ON BOORT LINE.

On and after Tuesday, 2nd December, the train now leaving Boort for Korong Vale, Sandhurst, and Melbourne at 10 a.m., will leave Boort at 6.42 a.m., Myia at 7.17 a.m., Booring at 7.33 a.m., and arrive at Korong Vale at 7.55 a.m.

ADDITIONAL TRAIN FROM FRANKSTON ON MONDAYS.

Commencing on Monday, 8th December, an additional train will leave Frankston for Melbourne at 7.10 a.m. on Mondays, arriving in Melbourne at 8.40 a.m.

ADDITIONAL TRAIN ON THE QUEENSLIFFE LINE ON SATURDAYS.

On Saturday, 6th December, and each succeeding Saturday till further notice, an additional train will run on the Queenscliffe line as follows, viz.:—Leave Geelong for Queenscliffe at 9.15 p.m. in connection with the 7 p.m. train from Melbourne and the 7.10 p.m. train from Ballarat; and leave Queenscliffe for Geelong at 8 p.m., connecting with the 9.15 p.m. train to Melbourne.

CUTTING, DIGGING, OR REMOVING TIMBER FROM CERTAIN CROWN LANDS PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything therein before contained, the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live timber on or from the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the following boundaries, viz. —

County of Kara Kara, parish of Charlton West: Commencing at a point on the left bank of the Avoca River, where it is intersected by the eastern side of the road from Charlton to Swan Hill; thence by the said road northerly and north-easterly to the south-west angle of allotment 13 (P. McKenzie's); thence by part of the south boundary of that allotment and a line bearing S. 84° 49' E. to the aforesaid river; and thence by that river upwards to the point of commencement. — (54 J. 11472.)

BOROUGH OF WALHALLA.—THE WALHALLA CRICKET AND RECREATION RESERVE.

*Regulations for the Care, Protection, and Management of the
Walhalla Cricket and Recreation Reserve.*

THE Council of the Borough of Walhalla, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Cricket, and other purposes of Public Recreation in the municipal district of Walhalla, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Walhalla Cricket and Recreation Reserve shall be open free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on days set apart for shows, sports, fêtes, and holiday amusements, on which occasions a charge for admission may be made as under, viz. :—

For every person who has attained the age of fourteen years, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

2. - (3.) Using profane or obscene language.
- (4.) Using abusive or insulting words.
- (5.) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (6.) Obtaining admission to the reserve or any buildings thereon when not entitled to such admission, or refusing to surrender (if required) to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand production of the same, any ticket duly authorizing admission to the said reserve.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such Regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

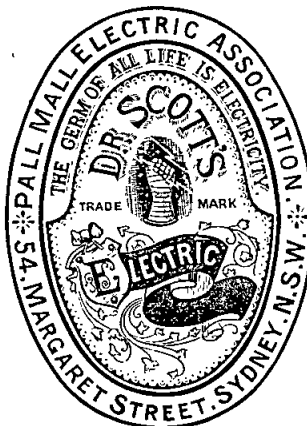
