EMPLOYMENT OF PRISONERS.

REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the following Regulations in regard to the employment of prisoners, in lieu of those dated the 5th May 1862, which are thereby superseded.

Chief Secretary's Office,

1. *Supplies for public and Public Service generally.*—Any stores and supplies required by the public, or for the Public Service of the Colony, may, if found advantageous and practicable, be manufactured by prisoners. Heads of departments may obtain such supplies from the Penal Department, provided the Inspector-General is in a position to furnish them within the period named by the department requiring the same; and orders for such supplies are to be addressed direct to the Inspector-General.

2. *How charged to each department.*—No pecuniary benefit is to accrue to any department from its obtaining supplies of articles manufactured by prisoners. Each department will be charged for such supplies the full value of the articles, given in the Penal Department Price List, as approved of by the Minister, and published in the *Government Gazette* for the year, or such amounts as may be specially agreed upon, and the difference between the cost of the raw material used and the price charged will be carried to the credit of the General Revenue, as the proceeds of the labor of prisoners.

3. *Uniform, clothing, &c.*—Any articles of uniform, clothing, and accoutrements, which the members of the Penal Department, the Police Force, or of the service generally have to supply for themselves at their own expense, may be made by prisoners, and the payment provided for in such manner as the internal arrangements and regulations of those departments may from time to time authorize.

4. *Private work for penal officers.*—Prisoners may be employed in the performance of such private work as the officers and wardens of the Penal Department may require for their own personal and household necessities only, and such work must be paid for at the rates given in the Penal Department Price List each year, or, if no such rates, then at rates to be fixed by the Inspector-General, and the amounts received for such work shall be disposed of in the manner provided by the Regulations as to revenue.

Except as herein provided no work is to be performed by prisoners for the private benefit of the officers and men of the various gaols or of the department generally.

5. *Work for persons outside Penal Department.*—No work shall be done for, or supplies furnished to, persons unconnected with the Penal Department without the approval of the Inspector-General.

6. *Works of public utility.*—When the arrangements of the Penal Department will allow of it without inconvenience prisoners may be employed outside the boundaries of Penal Establishments on public works, on such conditions and at such rate of payment as may be agreed upon by the Inspector-General and the borough council or other public body constructing such public works, but no prisoners shall be employed on such works until the approval of the Chief Secretary has been obtained.

7. *All work to be paid for.*—No work, other than that required by the Penal Establishments, shall be executed by prisoners unless paid for by the department, public body, or person receiving the benefit thereof.

8. *Disposal of surplus articles, &c.*—The Inspector-General may sell by public auction or dispose of in such other manner as he may consider most advantageous any stone, broken metal, agricultural produce, or stock, and surplus articles manufactured in the department, that cannot be utilized, and appropriate proceeds thereof in the manner provided by the regulations as to revenue.

9. *Manufacturing branches.*—A separate account shall be kept of each of the manufacturing branches, showing the cost of the materials, the value of the labor, and the amount of the prisoners' earnings.

10. *Accounts generally.*—All accounts for monies due for goods and labor supplied by the Penal Department are to be rendered to the government department, public body, or person indebted, as soon as convenient after the execution of the order, and in the case of works of public utility monthly progress payments to be made for work done, but the Inspector-General may require payment before any order is executed.

11. *Departmental Accounts.*—The head of any government department on receiving from the Inspector-General a claim for supplies obtained from the Penal Department will forward the same in the usual manner to the Treasurer, who will pay the amount to the Inspector-General and debit the same to the department concerned, and the Inspector-General on receipt of such amount will pay into the Treasury the proportion due under the head of "Prison Labor," to be credited to the general revenue, and the remainder under the head of "Repayment to Stores" to be credited to the vote for contingencies for Penal Establishments against which the materials have been charged.

12. *Public Works—Penal Department.*—No additions, alterations, or repairs for the Penal Department, such as in other branches of the service would be executed by the Department of Public Works, shall be undertaken by prisoners unless of an urgent character, until the same have been approved of by the Inspector-General.

13. *Materials, purchase of.*—Materials required in the Penal Department for manufacturing purposes are to be purchased or obtained under the same regulations and conditions as control similar transactions in the departments of the service, and requisitions for such materials may be submitted from time to time for the approval of the Chief Secretary.

14. *Materials, how charged to vote.*—The cost of the materials furnished to the department will be charged to the item "Stores" in the vote for contingencies for Penal Establishments.

15. *Inspector-General, definition of.*—The words "Inspector-General" in the rules shall mean the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments, or the Acting Inspector-General of Penal Establishments for the time being.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR EXCURSIONS.

Holiday Excursion Tickets will be issued to and from all stations (Suburban lines excepted) from the 15th December 1884 to the 5th January 1885, both dates inclusive (Sundays excepted), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example.—An excursion ticket issued on the 24th December will be available till the 24th January. When the last day falls on a Sunday, the ticket will be available till next day. The journey must be commenced on the day the ticket is issued, but after a distance of fifteen miles has been travelled, the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger.

Sydney Excursion Tickets.—From the 15th December to the 5th January, both dates inclusive, Excursion Tickets will be issued at Melbourne to Sydney at the following return fares:—1st Class, £5 6s. 6d.; 2nd Class, £4 1s. These tickets will be available for two calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the express trains on the New South Wales line. The second-class tickets will be available by the Victorian Railways express trains as far as Wodonga only.

Luggage.—Excursion Passengers will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van must be at the station half an hour before the train starts, and pay excess luggage-rate for it.

Horses and Vehicles.—From the 22nd December to the 8th January, both dates inclusive, the Department cannot engage to forward horses and vehicles by any particular train.

Commercial Travellers' Samples.—From the 22nd December to the 5th January, commercial travellers' samples will not be taken to or from roadside stations, except by mixed or goods trains.

Parcels.—On the 24th and 31st December parcels must be at the Melbourne Parcels Office thirty minutes before starting time of ordinary trains.

North Melbourne and Newmarket Stations.—From the 21st to the 26th December and on 31st December and 1st January, tickets will not be issued at North Melbourne or Newmarket Stations for country stations, and down-country trains will not stop there. On the same dates the up North-Eastern train will not stop at Newmarket. The 5.5 p.m. down and the 6.43 a.m. up mixed trains are excepted from the foregoing arrangement.

Goods Sheds Holidays.—The 25th and 26th December and 1st January will be observed as holidays in the Goods Branch, and goods trains will not run. Perishable goods will, however, be delivered at all stations on application. Consignees of powder can ascertain from the station-master at Footscray when explosives will be received in lieu of these dates.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA AND CONSTITUTION OF NEW SHIRE.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, sec. 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Shire of Swan Hill, which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Swan Hill and constituted a new shire, under the name or title of "The Shire of Moorboonyabil."

Area described in the petition :—Commencing at the junction of the northern boundary of the parish of Jeruk with the Avoca River; thence easterly along the said northern boundary to the north-western corner of the parish of Marnal; thence by the northern boundary of the parish of Marnal to the south-eastern corner of the parish of Quambatook; thence south and east by the southern boundary of the parish of Gredgwin to the south-eastern corner of the said parish of Gredgwin; thence northerly by the western boundary of the parish of Leaghar to the north-western corner of said parish of Leaghar; thence by the northern boundary of the said parish of Leaghar to the centre of the River Loddon; thence by the centre of the River Loddon to the north-

western corner of the parish of Loddon; thence by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Loddon and Mincha West to the south-eastern corner of the parish of Macorna; thence by the eastern boundary of the parish of Macorna to the north-western corner of the parish of Mincha; thence by the northern boundary of the parish of Mincha to Kow Swamp; thence by the northern and eastern sides of Kow Swamp to the centre of Mount Hope Creek; thence southerly by the centre of Mount Hope Creek to its intersections with the south boundary of the county of Gunbower; thence by the said south boundary west to the Loddon River, at the north-west angle of the parish of Jarlin; thence further west by a direct line to the centre of the Avoca River; thence by the centre of the Avoca River to the commencing point.

Petitioners state that the Shire of Swan Hill is in extent the largest shire in the colony, its area being upwards of eleven thousand square miles; that since the constitution of said shire the population has increased to an enormous extent; that the revenue of the shire up to the year 1869 did not exceed £700, but has since increased to upwards of £18,000 per annum; that the enormous extent of the shire and the rapid increase of its municipal business has necessitated the employment of a larger staff of highly-salaried officers; that by reason of the largeness of area and the extent of the business of said shire the duties of the officers are, in many instances, neglected or performed in a perfunctory manner by assistants; that by reason of the distance of the shire offices and the consequent expense of attending to the duties of a councillor they are unable to obtain adequate representation in the council.

They therefore pray that the area above described may be constituted a separate municipality, and that the number of the councillors be nine (9).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Mallee Pastoral Leases Act 1883* (No. 766, sec. 43) it was enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, might from time to time declare any lands situate within the Mallee country or the Mallee border to be "Vermin Districts," for the purposes of the said Act and fix the boundaries thereof, and might from time to time in like manner cause any lands to cease to be Vermin Districts, or might vary the boundaries thereof: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do by this Proclamation declare that the land comprised within the boundaries of the Middle Vermin District, as defined by description published in the *Government Gazette* of the third day of October One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, shall cease to be a Vermin District, and do further declare the lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter defined to be "Vermin Districts" within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act, that is to say:—

VERMIN DISTRICTS.

Warracknabeal District.—Mallee allotments Nos. 1 to 116 both inclusive, also allotments 127, 131, 132, 133, and 137, county of Borong; and every subdivision or re-arrangement thereof; the boundaries of such district being shown by lines colored blue on the lithograph plan deposited in the office of the Board of Land and Works, Melbourne.

Middle District.—Mallee allotments Nos. 117 to 124 both inclusive, also allotments 129, 130, 135, 136, and Nos. 138 to 182

both inclusive, in the county of Borung, and Mallee allotments Nos. 1 to 21 both inclusive, in the county of Karkaroo; and every subdivision or re-arrangement thereof; the boundaries of such district being shown by lines colored blue on the lithograph plan deposited in the office of the Board of Land and Works, Melbourne.

that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live trees, which at a height of two feet from the surface of the ground are of less diameter than twelve inches, on or from the Smythesdale Timber Reserve, described in a Proclamation bearing date the eighth day of May One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees of the St. Kilda General Cemetery rescind the Rules and Regulations published previously in the "Government Gazette," and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
2. That any person desiring ground for a private grave or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery under the above Act, shall apply to the trustees thereof. If approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule A.
3. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply in writing to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a plan, design or drawing of such with full particulars for approval. Such permission will be subject to Clause 22 of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864* and Clause 4 of the Amended Act 1880; and no label is to be removed from any grave without written permission from the surveyor or manager, and must be again replaced under their supervision.
4. That any order for interment shall be given at the cemetery at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed without said notice.
5. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule C shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under directions of the Surveyor or manager, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron. (See Act No. 677, Clause 2, Sec. 1.)
7. That every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.
8. That every grave shall be at least seven feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground, after such interment.
9. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.
10. That in the case of an application for an interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.
11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from a deputy registrar of deaths or a coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered at the lodge before the funeral enters the cemetery.
12. That the hours fixed for burials shall be as follow:—On week days—September to April inclusive, from Eight a.m. to Five p.m.; May to August inclusive, from Eight a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from Two to Five p.m.
13. That no burials shall be allowed to take place between the hours of Seven p.m. and Seven a.m., except by special permission of a quorum of the trustees.
14. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery; and if not punctually observed the persons responsible shall be liable to a fine of 10s. 6d.
15. That every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance of the cemetery, and no vehicle except the hearse and mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter or to stand opposite the entrance gates. Breaking out of the procession after passing the gates is forbidden. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the cemetery.
16. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner. Should the owner's residence not be known or be out of the colony, the trustees to have power to do the work and keep an account against the owner.
17. That any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.
18. That any person putting up any erection or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery without the permission of the trustees shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the above act for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.
19. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No Bath, Caen, Oamaru, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stonework.
20. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance; and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter.
21. That no catacomb shall be allowed.
22. That no wooden erection shall be allowed.
23. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for reinterment either in said or any other cemetery.
24. That before any such exceptional case can be dealt with by the trustees, a written application setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal and verified by a statutory declaration shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased; and in the event of said application being granted, the permission of the minister administering the *Coroners' Statute 1865*, and the Act numbered CCCXXXVIII, in addition to that of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.
25. That any workman not employed by the trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the manager, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labor, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with dispatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.
26. That, unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance shall be open daily from Seven a.m. to Six p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from Seven a.m. to Five p.m. during the other months of the year.
27. That no child under ten years shall be admitted into the cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.
28. That no smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.
29. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery, and any found there are liable to be destroyed.
30. That any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or otherwise infringing the above Act, or any rule, regulation, or bye-law made for protecting the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.
31. That no person shall be allowed to take any flower or plant out of the cemetery.
32. That the manager shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the trustees, over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.
33. That no person employed under the trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the trustees.
34. That any person so employed accepting any such gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.
35. That licenses to grave dressers may be issued by the trustees in the form set out in Schedule C, to be renewed annually.

36. That a plan of the cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations and numbers of the graves, and a registry of all certificates of right of burial shall be kept at the office.

CITY OF PRAHRAN.—BYE-LAW 89.

A BYE-LAW OF THE LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH IN AND FOR THE CITY OF PRAHRAN

FOR regulating the times and manner of cleansing, emptying, and manning of earth closets, privies, cesspools, and places for the deposit of nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter; and for regulating the disinfecting or deodorizing of the nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter contained therein or removed therefrom; and for the prevention of nuisance or injury to health from the transport, deposit, or use as manure of nightsoil, offal, blood, or other offensive matter; and for the regulation of the position and manner of construction of privies, earth closets, and cesspools or urinals, made under the provisions of the Public Health Amendment Act 1883, and numbered eighty-nine.

The Local Board of Health in and for the City of Prahran doth hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

REMOVAL OF HOUSE-REFUSE.

The occupier of every house, building, or premises within the City of Prahran shall cause to be provided and kept therein a box or other such covered receptacle, which receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same may, with the contents thereof when full, be readily and conveniently movable by the public scavenger, for the purpose hereinafter mentioned, and shall cause all dust, ashes, rubbish, or other house-refuse produced, collected, or accumulated on any such premises to be from time to time placed in such box or receptacle; and every such box or receptacle shall be placed, at such times as are hereinafter mentioned in this Bye-law, either in the yard of such premises and close to the entrance thereof, or otherwise in the adjoining street, lane, or right-of-way, contiguous to such premises, in order that the contents of such box or receptacle may be readily and conveniently discharged and removed by the public scavengers or other person or persons authorised or appointed to collect and remove the same by the Local Board of Health for the said city. The occupier of every house, building, or premises within the said borough shall cause the box or receptacle hereinbefore mentioned to be placed as aforesaid between the hours of Seven and Eleven in the forenoon on the days set forth in the first schedule hereto.

REMOVAL OF HOUSE-REFUSE.

The occupier of any house, building, or premises within the City of Prahran shall cause the yard and ground adjacent or belonging thereto to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard, ground, or premises, as often as such refuse matter shall amount to a quantity equal to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such rubbish or refuse-matter so removed as aforesaid, the Local Board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

STABLES, COW-SHEDS, AND PIGSTIES.

The occupier of any land within the City of Prahran in which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and shall cause all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of any such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the Local Board of Health at the expense of such occupier.

CLEANSING OF CESSPOOLS.

The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the City of Prahran shall cause every cesspool thereon to be emptied and cleansed from time to time, as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of six inches from the top of the wall, sides, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except by some nightman duly authorised or licensed as such by the local authority for the said City of Prahran; and that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m., and that any cesspool situate in any one of the blocks of the city set forth in the 2nd schedule hereto shall only be emptied upon the night set apart for such block, except by leave of an inspector of the board; and provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith a quantity of chloride of zinc, carbolic acid, common salt, or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same. No cesspool shall have connected therewith or attached thereto any pipe or other appliance capable of being used for the purpose of discharging or removing the contents of such cesspool upon or under the surface of any adjoining ground or into any drain or sewer.

If any person shall desire or intend to deposit, or cause or suffer to be deposited, on any land, field, farm, or garden within the City of Prahran, any nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing, he shall cause the same, before the removal thereof, to be deodorized and disinfected by the admixture therewith of carbolic acid in the proportion of one part of the latter to two parts of the former of bulk, and previously notify his intention so to deposit the same to the inspector of the board.

NOXIOUS AND OFFENSIVE TRADES.

The occupier of any premises within the City of Prahran used for the purposes of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatsoever shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, bones, water, liquids, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom, at least once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any effluvia; and if the occupier of any such premises shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any such offensive matter as

aforesaid, such offensive matter may be removed by the Local Board of Health, or their officers, at the expense of such occupier.

POSITION AND CONSTRUCTION OF PRIVIES, ETC.

No privy, earth closet, or cesspool, and no urinal shall be placed or built in front of any dwelling or at a less distance than four feet from any public highway, or from the door or window of any dwelling, or from any lane or street of a width at any part thereof of sixteen feet or upwards, or from any street channel, or at a less distance than two feet from any partition fence.

Every privy or earth closet shall be constructed of the dimensions and materials set forth in one or the other of the specifications in the 3rd Schedule hereto, except in cases where the Board shall otherwise order or direct.

Every cesspool shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly rivetted and soldered so as to be watertight, with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street or lane exceeding 16 feet in width.

PENALTIES.

Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this bye-law, No. 89, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty or sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and not less than Five shillings; or if such breach be a continuing act or default, shall forfeit and pay a penalty or sum for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings.

SPECIFICATIONS OF PRIVIES.

No. 1.—Privy of Wood.

The inside dimensions in clear shall be five feet by four feet, the framing to be of clean hardwood, the studs seven feet long 3" x 2", all tenoned into the top and bottom plates, except the corner ones, which are to be 3" x 3" in sections, the bottom and top plates to be 3" x 3" and 3" x 2" in section respectively, morticed for the studs, secure the framing to No. 4 red gum blocks 4" x 4" in section set solid on the clay, the tops of which shall be three inches above the surface of the land; form an opening in the back framing to receive a full-size portable cesspool, two feet long, and one foot six inches deep, clear dimensions; cover the walls with one-inch weatherboards securely nailed to the studs, to lap at least one inch and butt against proper angle stuffs 2½ inches wide and 1½ inch thick, all wrought; the floor joists to be hardwood 4" x 2" in section secured to the plates; the floor boards to be one-inch clean Scotch deal, grooved and tongued, laid to close joints, and nailed to the joists; the rafters to be Oregon, 4ft. x 1½ft., ridge piece seven inches deep, 1½ in. thick.

The barge boards for the gable ends to be 3½ in. deep, 1½ in. thick, chamfered on lower edges. Cap the same with one-inch deal, four and a half inches wide, so as to seal the joints of the iron or slate covering; make and hang with 18-inch T hinges a common one-inch deal ledged door, five feet nine inches long, two feet six inches wide, fitted with a common size Norfolk latch, and a four-inch tower bolt on the inside. Make and at the back of the privy to enclose the cess-pan a common ledged door out of one-inch deal 2ft. by 1ft. 6in., hung with 18in. T hinges, and fitted with bolt, as before stated; fix a deal ground around the said opening out of 1½ in. x 2½ in. deal, on which to hang the door and stop the weatherboarding; cover in the roof with corrugated iron or slates, secured with screws or nails 1½ in. x 2½ in. deal battens; the ridge capping to be galvanized iron 1½ in. wide.

Fix a common seat in privy, with full-size hole and cover, 20in. wide on proper bearers, out of 2½ in. x 1½ in. deal, and a one-inch deal riser 20in. deep.

No. 2.—Privy of Brick.

Inside dimensions, 5ft. by 4ft., walls of clean hard-burnt bricks, 9in. thick, 7ft. in height above the stone foundations, which is to be common rubble work one foot in thickness set or built upon the solid clay; in all cases the stonework to be not less than four inches above the level of the surface of the land; the masonry and brickwork to be built in mortar made from Geelong or Waratah Bay lime and clean sharp sand made up in proportion of two parts sand and one of lime. Before building the brickwork lay all round the walls of stone foundations a damp coarse compound of tar and clean sharp sand, half-inch in thickness, strike the joints of the brickwork on both sides, and twice lime white the walls on the inside.

Make and fix a solid frame at back of closet, opening for portable cesspool out of 4½ in x 3 in deal 2 feet x 1 foot 6 inches, clear dimensions, on which hang a ledged door, before described.

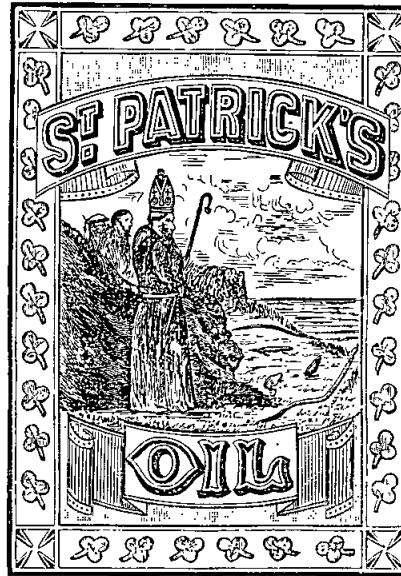

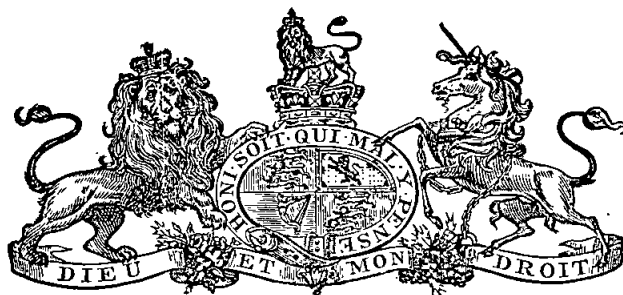

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

- An Act to amend the "Statute of Trusts 1864."
- An Act to amend and consolidate the laws relating to the Sale and Occupation of Crown Lands, and for other purposes.
- An Act to amend and continue the laws relating to the Suppression of Rabbits.
- An Act amend "The Volunteer Statute 1865," and for other purposes.
- An Act to authorize the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited to construct tramway branches in the Cities of Melbourne and Collingwood and in the Borough of St. Kilda, and to amend "The Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company's Act 1883," and for other purposes.
- An Act to amend an Act intituled "An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions," and for other purposes.
- An Act to continue various Expiring Laws.
- An Act to amend the Rosstown Junction Railway Act No. DCXIV., and for other purposes.
