REGULATIONS OF THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of *The Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1876*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following regulations with respect to the control and clearance of sheds vested in the Commissioners by *The Melbourne Harbor Trust Further Amendment Act 1883*, that is to say:—

Control and Clearance of Sheds.

Examined goods.—Except as hereinafter mentioned, all imported goods placed in any shed shall be removed therefrom within forty-eight hours after such goods shall have been examined by the customs authorities.

Bulk cargoes.—Bulk cargoes of goods (other than tea) placed in any shed shall be removed therefrom within eight days from the final discharge of the ships from which such goods shall have been landed.

Cargoes of tea.—Cargoes of tea placed in any shed shall be allowed two days therein for every one hundred tons of cargo, which time is to be calculated from the commencement of the discharge of such cargo.

Unentered goods and goods entered, but not examined.—All unentered goods placed in any shed, and all entered goods placed therein, but not examined, shall be removed therefrom within ten days after the same shall have been landed.

Any goods of whatever description which shall not be removed in compliance with any of the foregoing regulations may be removed by the Harbor Master, with the cognisance and approval of the Customs authorities, and stored at the risk and expense of the owners or consignees of such goods.

"THE FISHERIES ACT AMENDMENT ACT 1878."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Fisheries Act Amendment Act 1878*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make proclamations which should be published in the *Government Gazette*, to provide for the more effectual government, management, protection, and improvement of fish and any waters in which fishing might be carried on: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit any person fishing in the Richardson River, at Donald, for two miles above the weir, and one mile below it at any time.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-eighth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and in the forty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

SHIRES OF PORTLAND AND GLENELG.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA FROM THE SHIRE OF PORTLAND, AND ITS ANNEXATION TO GLENELG.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Portland which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Portland, and annexed to the Central Riding of the Shire of Glenelg.

Area described in the petition :—

“Commencing at the eastern boundary of South Australia at the south-west corner of the township reserve of Lindsay; thence along its southern boundary and in continuation east to the River Glenelg; thence down that river to the south-east corner of the parish of Werriko; thence west along the south boundary of the parishes of Werriko and Ardno to the South Australian boundary; thence north along that boundary to the commencing point.”

Petitioners say, in support of their petition, that their wants with regard to roads in such area are entirely neglected, that their rates are expended in other parts of the shire, and without reference to their interests; that their commercial relations are with Casterton, in Glenelg Shire, which is only about one-third of the distance from them that Portland is; and they fully believe that, if annexed to the shire of Glenelg, their roads would be made, and their wants generally attended to.

They therefore pray that the area above described may be severed from the shire of Portland, and annexed to the Central Riding of the shire of Glenelg.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

RECREATION RESERVE IN THE PARISH OF WANDIN YALLOCK.

Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the reserve for Cricket and other purposes of public recreation in the parish of Wandin Yallock.

WE, James Baker, James Wallace, George Hunter, Thomas Payne, and John Hand, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for Cricket and other purposes of public recreation in the parish of Wandin Yallock, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage, in any way, the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth, or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some

justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees of the Boroondara General Cemetery rescind the Rules and Regulations published previously in the *Government Gazette*,

and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
2. That any person desiring ground for a private grave or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery under the above Act, shall apply to the trustees thereof. If approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in schedule A.
3. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a plan, design, or drawing of such with full particulars for approval.
4. That any order for interment shall be given at the cemetery at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed without said notice.
5. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in schedule C, shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under directions of the manager, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate or iron. (See Act No. 677, clause 2, sec. 1.)
7. That every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.
8. That every grave shall be at least seven feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground after such interment.
9. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.
10. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.
11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from a deputy registrar of deaths, or a coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered at the lodge before the funeral enters the cemetery.
12. That the hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:— On week days—September to April inclusive, from Eight a.m. to Five p.m.; May to August inclusive, from Eight a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Two to Five p.m.
13. That no burials shall be allowed to take place between the hours of Seven p.m. and Seven a.m., except by special permission of the trustees.
14. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.
15. That every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance of the cemetery, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter or to stand opposite the entrance gates. Breaking out of the procession after passing the gates is forbidden. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the cemetery.
16. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection, shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.
17. That any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.
18. That any person putting up any erection or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery without the permission of the trustees shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the above Act for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.
19. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No Bath, Caen, or other soft stone, shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stonework.
20. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter.
21. That no catacomb shall be allowed.
22. That no wooden erection shall be allowed.
23. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for reinterment either in said or any other cemetery.
24. That before any such exceptional case can be dealt with by the trustees, a written application, setting forth the reasons

for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of said application being granted, the permission of the Minister administering the "Coroner's Statute 1865" and the Act numbered CCCXXXVIII. in addition to that of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and airtight coffin prior to removal.

25. That any workman not employed by the trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the manager, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labour, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.

26. That, unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance shall be open daily from Six a.m. to Six p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from Seven a.m. to Six p.m. during the other months of the year.

27. That no child under ten years shall be admitted into the cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.

28. That no smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

29. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.

30. That any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, road, path, or any erection, or otherwise infringing the above Act, or any rule, regulation, or bye-law made for protecting the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

31. That no person shall be allowed to take any flower or plant out of the cemetery.

32. That the manager shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the trustees, over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

33. That no person employed under the trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the trustees.

34. That any person so employed accepting any such gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.

35. That licenses to grave dressers may be issued by the trustees in the form set out in schedule B.

36. That a plan of the cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations and numbers of the graves, and a registry of all certificates of right of burial, shall be kept at the office.

Third, that the said grave or vault, and the said wall, fence, building, monument, or tombstone, shall be maintained and kept up by the said _____ and his representatives in proper repair, to the satisfaction of the said trustees. Fourth, that the said _____ and his representatives shall, in the use of the said piece of ground, and access thereto, be subject in every respect to such rules, regulations, and bye-laws as the trustees of the said cemetery may from time to time make; and shall not be entitled to exercise the right to bury or inter therein except on payment of such charges as shall from time to time be established by the said trustees.





