"THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS ACT 1883," NO. 767, SECTION 54, AND PART III. OF "THE PUBLIC WORKS STATUTE 1865."

THE Body Corporate of the Victorian Railways Commissioners doth hereby authorize and appoint each and every of the persons named and described in the schedule hereto annexed as its agent and officer for the purposes hereinafter mentioned, that is to say :—

In pursuance of the 128th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, to seize and detain any person who shall have committed an offence against the provisions of Part III. of the said Statute, and whose name or residence shall be unknown to such officer or agent, and give such person in charge to a police constable, whose duty it is to bring the offender before a Justice, and also at any time hereafter to lay any information or complaint before any Justice against any person for any offence against the provisions of Part III. of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, or of any bye-law made or to be made under the authority of such Act, or of such Act and *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*; and to summon such person before any Justice or Justices for such offence, or to charge him or her with such offence.

This authority is not to supersede any authority for the like purpose heretofore made and given by the Commissioners.

TRESPASSING ON VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

THE Body Corporate of the Victorian Railways Commissioners doth hereby authorize and appoint each and every of the persons named and described in the schedule hereto annexed as its agent and officer for the purposes hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

Under the 128th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, to seize and detain any person trespassing on any line of State Railway or on any State Railway premises, whose name and residence shall be unknown to such agent, and to give such person in charge to a police constable, whose duty it is to bring the offender before a justice, and also to lay any information or complaint before any justice against such offender, and charge him with an offence against the 155th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*.

Also to lay any information or complaint before any justice against any person for any offence against the 155th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, and to summons such person before a justice and charge him with such offence, and to impound all "cattle" (which word shall here bear the same interpretation as given to it by the Act No. 478), and also to destroy all goats, pigs, and geese found trespassing on any railway now vested or hereafter to be vested in the Commissioners.

SHIRE OF BERWICK.
PROPOSED RE-SUBDIVISION.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, sec. 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 39th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to be one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being on the municipal roll of the Shire of Berwick, and state they are desirous that the said shire be re-subdivided into four ridings, the fourth riding being formed by dividing the Pakenham Riding in manner following, viz.:—

To subdivide and alter the boundaries of the Pakenham Riding, and create a new riding to be called the Gembrook Riding of the Shire of Berwick, and that the boundary of the Pakenham Riding be as follows:—Commencing at a point east of the south-east angle of the parish of Cranbourne; west to the Kardinia Creek at said angle; up this creek to the south-west angle of the parish of Gembrook; east by the south boundary of the parish of Gembrook to the county boundary; thence south by the county boundary to the commencing point.

And that the boundary of the Gembrook Riding be as follows:—Commencing at the south-east angle of the parish of Gembrook; thence east by the south boundary of the parish of Gembrook to the county boundary; thence north and west by the county boundary to the east branch of Sheppard's Creek; thence by this creek to its junction with the Wood Yallock Creek; thence south by this creek and Menzie's Creek to Emerald township; thence by the west and south boundary of the Emerald township to the head of the Kardinia Creek; thence south by this creek to the commencing point.

Also, that the number of councillors be increased to twelve (12). They therefore pray as follows, viz.:—

"That Your Excellency, in conformity with the power vested in you by section 19 (VII.) of *The Local Government Act 1874*, 38 Vict. No. 506, will cause the prayer of your petitioners to be taken into consideration, and effect given thereto."

PROCLAMATION OF A SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICT REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation : Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation bearing date the thirteenth day of February One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four proclaiming

VERMIN DISTRICTS.**

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave, of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Mallee Pastoral Leases Act 1883* (No. 766, sec. 43) it was enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, might from time to time declare any lands situate within the Mallee country or the Mallee border to be "Vermin Districts," for the purposes of the said Act and fix the boundaries thereof, and might from time to time in like manner cause any lands to cease to be Vermin Districts, or might vary the boundaries thereof; Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation declare the lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter defined to be "Vermin Districts" within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act, that is to say:—

VERMIN DISTRICTS.

North-Western District.—All Mallee blocks embraced within the following boundaries: Commencing on the River Murray at the point where the boundary-line between South Australia and Victoria cuts the same, and bounded on the west by the said boundary-line southward to the north-west angle of Mallee block No. 38; on the south by the northern boundary of said block No. 38, of blocks 45 and 46, and part of 48 eastward to the south-west angle of Mallee block No. 27; on the east by the western boundary of said block No. 27 and of block No. 26 northward to the south boundary of block No. 13; thence by the said south boundary westward to the south-west angle of the said block; and thence again by the west boundary of the said block northward to the Chalka Creek, and by that creek northward till it re-enters the Murray River, and again on the east and on the north by the said River Murray to the commencing point.

EASTER EXCURSIONS.

Holiday excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (suburban lines excepted) from the 8th to the 16th April, both dates inclusive (Sunday excepted), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example.—An excursion ticket issued on the 9th April will be available till the 9th May. When the last day falls on a Sunday the ticket will be available till next day. The journey may be broken on these tickets, but the first half of them must be used on day of issue.

Luggage.—Excursion passengers will only be allowed to carry such luggage "free" as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van must be at the station half-an-hour before the train starts and pay excess-luggage rate for it.

Horses and Vehicles.—From the 9th to the 23rd April, both dates inclusive, the Department cannot engage to forward horses and vehicles by any particular train.

Sydney Excursion Tickets.—From the 8th to the 16th April, both dates inclusive, excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne to Sydney at the following return fares:—1st class, £5 6s. 6d.; 2nd class, £4 1s. These tickets will be available for two calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the "express" trains.

Commercial Travellers' Samples.—From the 10th to the 15th April commercial travellers' samples will not be taken to or from roadside stations except by mixed or goods trains.

Parcels.—On the 10th and 12th April parcels must be at the Melbourne Parcels Office thirty minutes before starting time of the ordinary trains.

Goods Sheds Holidays.—The 11th and 14th April will be observed as holidays in the Goods Branch, and goods trains will not run. Perishable goods will, however, be delivered at all stations on application. Consignees of powder can ascertain from the stationmaster at Footscray when explosives will be received, in lieu of these dates.

North Melbourne and Newmarket Stations.—From the 10th to the 15th April, both dates inclusive, tickets will not be issued at North Melbourne or Newmarket stations for country stations, and down country trains will not stop there. The 5.5 p.m. "down" and 6.43 a.m. "up" North-Eastern trains are excepted from the foregoing arrangement.

TWENTY POUNDS REWARD.

10. A separate *bona fide* tender must be sent in for each service. No. 14 of "general conditions" of contract, relating to assigning or sub-letting, will be strictly enforced.

11. The tender of any person failing to comply with the foregoing conditions will not be entertained.

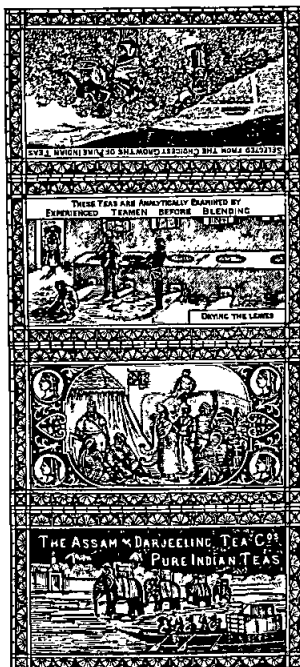

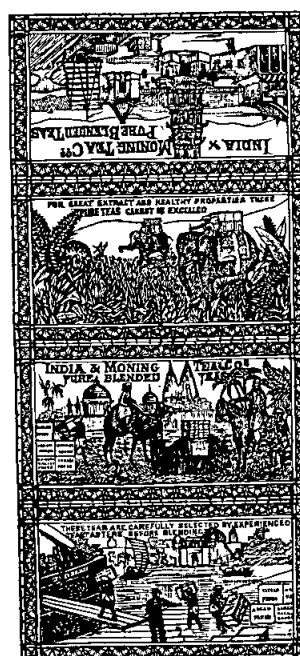
