PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Warford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by. The Licensing Act 1876 (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district whering publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to

time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the undermentioned Proclamations issued under the authority of the said Act, that is to say:

The Proclamation bearing date the third day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, so far as the said Proclamation relates to an area comprised within a radius of one quarter of a mile around the Railway Station at Barrakee;

The Proclamation bearing date the thirtieth day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, so far as the said Proclamation relates to an area of half a mile radius around the Railway Station at Glenloth.

ALFRED GRAVING DOCK AND PATENT SLIP. Amendment of Number 2 of the Rules for the Management of the Alfred Graving Dock and Patent Slip.

OF THE ALFRED GRAVING DOCK AND PATENT SLIE.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed that number 2 of the Rules for the management of the Alfred Graving Dock and Patent Slip be amended by the addition of the words "the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners" after the words "the Victorian or any Colonial Government."

The rule as amended will read as follows:—

"All vessels belonging to H.M. navy, the Victorian or any Colonial Government, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners, or commissioned ship of Foreign nations, will be admitted into dock or on the slip without payment of the usual dock or slip dues, but only of such sum as is necessary for the reimbursement of actual expenditure of stores, wages, and materials.

"Any such vessel or steamer employed under contract with the Victorian Government to carry mails shall, with the special sanction of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, have precedence over vessels on the dock register."


