The births of 882 children, viz., 431 boys and 451 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of March. In the month of February 751 births were registered, or 131 less than in the month under review. The births were 128 above the average of the previous nine years, but only 29 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in March numbered 524, viz., 291 of males, and 233 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 358. The deaths were above than those in February by 41, but below the average of March during the previous ten years by 21. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than the average of those ten years by 99.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 2.90, and of deaths registered 1.72.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 96.9° on the 25th, and the lowest was 37.1° on the 17th. The mean temperature of the month (63.3°) was seven-tenths of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (37.9°) took place on the 6th, viz., from a maximum of 91.1° to a minimum of 53.2°. The least range (5.9°) was on the 28th, viz., from a maximum of 70.0° to a minimum of 64.1°. The mean daily range was 19.9°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.030 inches) was slightly above the average.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 42 per cent. to that mortality as against 37 per cent. in March 1883; 43 per cent. in March 1882 and 1881; 47 per cent. in March 1880 and 1879; 49 per cent. in March 1878 and 1877; 50 per cent. in March 1876; 58 per cent. in March 1875; and 46 per cent. in March 1874.

The number of people recorded during the month as having died who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years was 22, viz.—A night-watchman, aged 75, who died of apoplexy; a farmer, aged 75, of injuries to the arm, caused by a bull rushing him; a commercial traveller, aged 77, of heart disease; a female, aged 78, of stomach disease; a male patient in the Lunatic Asylum, aged 80, of brain disease; a female, aged 80, of abscess of the liver; 2 females, each aged 82, of congestion of the lungs; a gentleman, aged 82, of "Bright's disease;" a female, aged 83, of dysentery; a female, aged 83, of bronchitis; a female, aged 84, of cancer; a farmer aged 75, a male of occupation unknown aged 76, a female aged 76, a bricklayer aged 78; a maltster, a gentleman, and a quarryman, each aged 80, a gentleman aged 84, a female aged 84, and a female aged 85, of old age.

Twenty-five deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 19 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male infant, aged 6 months, died of injury to the spine, caused by being upset from a perambulator; a male child, aged 4 years, was killed by a fall in the street from a waggon; a laborer, aged 26, died of fracture of the neck, caused by a fall whilst turning a somersault; a laborer, aged 48, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall whilst in a fit; a stoker, aged 48, of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall from a scaffold; a drayman, aged 30, of fracture of the liver and kidneys, caused by a fall off a dray; a female, aged 50, and a tailor, aged 74, of fracture of the ribs, both resulting from falls whilst drunk; a male, of occupation unstated, aged 55, of injury to the spine, caused by a fall down the stairs of the *Luzitania*; a laborer, aged 18, of injury to the lung, being crushed whilst turning a horse and dray; a bricklayer, aged 37, was killed by a train passing over him, and a farmer, aged 75, died of injuries to the arm, caused by a bull rushing him. A carter, aged 26,

was accidentally shot; an engineer, aged 28, died of lead poisoning; two boys, aged 3 and 10 respectively, were drowned, the latter in the River Yarra; a female, aged 36, and a blacksmith, aged 55, were found drowned, and a male infant, aged 2 months, was suffocated. The homicidal deaths were those of two female infants, who were suffocated at birth, and of a female infant, aged 1 day, who died of hemorrhage of the navel-string, wilfully caused. Of the suicidal deaths, a farrier, aged 46, shot himself in the head; a lumper, aged 31, cut his throat; and a milkman, aged 35, drowned himself. Those who committed suicide were all set down as being of unsound mind at the time of their committing self-destruction.

One hundred and seventeen deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—58 in the Melbourne Hospital, 11 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 9 in the Lying-in Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 14 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, and 4 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 218, of which 119, or 55 per cent., were of males, and 99, or 45 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 165 were under one year of age, 37 were between one and two, 6 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 306. Of these, 172, or 56 per cent., were males, and 134, or 44 per cent., were females; 6 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 18 were between fifteen and twenty, 29 were between twenty and twenty-five, 26 were between twenty-five and thirty, 20 were between thirty and thirty-five, 30 were between thirty-five and forty, 17 were between forty and forty-five, 25 were between forty-five and fifty, 22 were between fifty and fifty-five, 25 were between fifty-five and sixty, 27 were between sixty and sixty-five, 13 were between sixty-five and seventy, 15 were between seventy and seventy-five, 8 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 14 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the previous month, deaths from zymotic diseases increased from 100 to 112, and those from local diseases from 96 to 110. Under the former head, the increase was chiefly in deaths from typhoid fever, which rose from 24 to 27, and in those from dysentery and diarrhoea, which rose from 38 to 48. Under the latter head, the increase was chiefly in deaths from dropsy, which rose from 1 to 4, and in those from tubercles mesenterica, which rose from 9 to 21. Seven deaths from childbirth and metria took place during the month, or 1 death of a mother to every 126 children born alive.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulation, that is to say:—

SCALE OF FEES FOR DEPARTMENTAL SURVEYS, TO DATE ON AND FROM THE 1ST JANUARY 1882.

This scale is based on the graduated scale for selection surveys as determined by contract, and is generally applicable.

By the terms maximum and minimum are to be understood the fees payable for the survey of 320 acres and 20 acres respectively in the contract district in which the lands to be surveyed are situated.

1. *Survey of Business Sites and School Sites up to 3 acres.*

A single allotment three-fifths of the minimum. (In cases of urgency, when the surveyor is instructed to make a special journey of over three miles forthwith, the minimum will be allowed.)

2. *Country Lands.*

One allotment, fee as per graduated scale.
Two allotments adjoining, three-fourths graduated scale each.
