TRESPASSING ON VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

TRESPASSING ON VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

THE Body Corporate of the Victorian Railways Commissioners doth hereby authorize and appoint each and every of the persons mamed and described in the schedule hereto annexed as its agent and officer for the purposes hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:

Under the 128th section of The Public Works Statute 1865, to seize and detain any person trespassing on any line of State Railway or on any State Railway permises, whose name and residence shall be unknown to such agent, and to give such person in charge to a police constable, whose duty it is to bring the offender before any justice against such offender, and charge him with an offence against the 155th section of The Public Works Statute 1895.

Also to lay any information or complaint before any justice against any person for any offence against the 155th section of The Public Works Statute 1895.

Also to lay any information or complaint before any justice against any person for any offence against the 155th section of The Public Works Statute 1895, and to summons such person before a justice and charge him with such offence, and to intround all "cattle" (which word shall here bear the same interpretation as given to it by the Act No. 478), and also to destroy all goats, pigs, and geese found trespassing on any railway now vested or hereafter to be vested in the Commissioners.

ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

THE Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a Despatch hearing date the 15th March 1884, intimated to the Governor of Victoria that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise Her power of disallowance in respect of the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the 47th year of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates of which are hereto subjoined, viz.:—

Regulations for the Management of Lake Buloke Common.

In pursuance of the regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the first day of April 1879, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, having drafted the following Regulations for the management of Lake Buoke Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common.

Regulations.

- 1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five miles of the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer, having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land, occupied by him, may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.
- 2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly, in advance, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October, in every year:—For every head of large cattle over six months and under two years old, Four shillings per annum; for every head of large cattle two years and under three years old, Eight shillings per annum; for every head of large cattle three years old and over, Twelve shillings per annum; for every head of small cattle, Two shillings and sixpence per annum; progeny under six months old of horses and horned cattle legally depasturing on the common, free.

- 3. No person shall be allowed to depasture on the common stock of which he is not the bond fide owner.
- 4. Bulls or entire horses over the age of nine months shall not be allowed on the common without the written sanction of the managers, and sheep shall be allowed to depasture on such portions only of the common as may be set apart for that purpose by the managers
- 5. The herdsman of the common shall be in attendance at a place to be named on the first Tuesday in each quarter, for the purpose of registering stock, and receiving the fees thereon, and due notice of such attendance and the time and place thereof shall be given by the managers.
- shall be given by the managers.

 6. All persons taking stock to depasture on the common shall deliver them into the charge of the herdsman at the time and place appointed as aforesaid, together with a written statement of the number and brands of such stock, and the managers shall, on receiving the fees payable thereon, give a receipt for the same in the prescribed form, and the herdsman shall forthwith, with the assistance of the owner or the person in charge, brand such stock in a conspicuous place with the common brand, which shall be of pitch or tar, and such brand shall be renewed whenever necessary, so as to be plainly legible during the whole period that such stock may depasture on the common.

 7. No stock duly registered in the books of the managers shall
- 7. No stock duly registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the common unless notice of intention so to do be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the stock removed.
- 8. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of any stock from the common save as provided in clause 9.
- 9. The herdsman shall, on any stock straying from the common or on being removed therefrom without the owner's consent, notify the owner within ten days thereof, and if the herdsman fail or neglect to give the owner notice in writing within that time the former shall, should such stock be lost, be held responsible for the loss, which shall be computed at the rate of Two pounds sterling per head for horses and horned cattle, and may be deducted from the remuneration payable to the herdsman.
- 10. All stock upon which the prescribed fees shall not have been paid within two days after date for renewal of license shall be liable to be impounded.
- 11. All dead carcases found on the common, which the owner or owners thereof may refuse or neglect to remove after receiving twenty-four hours' notice in writing from the managers or herdsman, may be renoved or destroyed by burning or otherwise at the expense of such owner or owners.
- 12. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common, and as soon as the herdsman shall discover that any stock legally depasturing thereon is affected with any such disease he shall report the same to the managers, and shall give the owner of such stock notice in writing to remove them from the common.
- 13. All persons depasturing stock on the common shall place their respective fire-brands on the stock depasturing in their names.
- names.

 14. Whenever, in these regulations, any act or thing is required to be done by the managers it shall be considered to be well and truly done if done by any two or more of them duly appointed from time to time to act on their behalf.

 Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

Rules and Regulations.

- 1. That before any interment shall take place in the said cemetery, application for permission shall be made at the office of the trustees a reasonable time proviously, when an order in the form, or to the effect, set out in the schedule hereto annexed, marked A, will be given to the applicant on payment of the proper fees and charges.
- That all such fees and charges must be paid when the order for interment is given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
- 3. That fees and charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other sufficient evidence to the satisfaction of the trustees, that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the fees and charges.
- 4. That name, ago, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of applying for the order, according to the instructions in Schedule B.
- 5. That the time fixed for the funeral shall be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be observed as punctually as possible.
- 6. That, until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals shall be from Ten a m. to Six p.m. in the months of September to April, both inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals shall be from Two to Five o'clock p.m. throughout the year.
- 7. That the trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; and all orders for interment must be given at the office of the trustees, Newbridge, in sufficient time for that purpose, and to allow the necessary arrangements to be made.
- 8. That no fencing round any grave shall be erected until approved of by the trustees.
- That no servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty, or on behalf of the trustees, shall or will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
- 10. That no horses or other beasts of burden, carts, carriages, or conveyances shall be allowed to enter the cemetery, except the hearse and mourning coaches, and except horses and carts employed by the trustees, or their servants, for all necessary work in carrying and removing materials and dung from or in the said cemetery.
- 11. That the ground will be open to the public daily from

- 13. That no smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

That any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or otherwise infringing the above Act, or any rule, regulation, or bye-law made for protecting the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law discote.
- 15. That no child under 10 years shall be admitted into the cometery except in charge of a responsible person.
