TRESPASSING ON VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

THE Body Corporate of the Victorian Railways Commissioners doth hereby authorize and appoint each and every of the persons named and described in the schedule hereto annexed as its agent and officer for the purposes hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

Under the 128th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, to seize and detain any person trespassing on any line of State Railway or on any State Railway premises, whose name and residence shall be unknown to such agent, and to give such person in charge to a police constable, whose duty it is to bring the offender before a justice, and also to lay any information or complaint before any justice against such offender, and charge him with an offence against the 155th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*.

Also to lay any information or complaint before any justice against any person for any offence against the 155th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, and to summons such person before a justice and charge him with such offence, and to impound all "cattle" (which word shall here bear the same interpretation as given to it by the Act No. 478), and also to destroy all goats, pigs, and geese found trespassing on any railway now vested or hereafter to be vested in the Commissioners.

This authority is not to supersede any authority for the like purpose heretofore made and given by the Commissioners.

In pursuance of the 128th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, to seize and detain any person who shall have committed an offence against the provisions of Part III. of the said Statute, and whose name or residence shall be unknown to such officer or agent, and to give such person in charge to a police constable, whose duty it is to bring the offender before a justice, and also at any time hereafter to lay any information or complaint before any justice against any person for any offence against the provisions of Part III. of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, or of any bye-law made or to be made under the authority of such Act, or of such Act and *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*; and to summons such person before any justice or justices for such offence, or to charge him or her with such offence.

This authority is not to supersede any authority for the like purpose heretofore made and given by the Commissioners.

ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

THE Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a Despatch bearing date the 15th March 1884, intimated to the Governor of Victoria that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise Her power of disallowance in respect of the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the 47th year of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates of which are hereto subjoined, viz. :—

- No. 756.—“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Nine hundred and fifty-eight thousand two hundred and sixty pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three and four.” [Assented to 27th July 1883.]

NORWEGIAN SHIPS.

THE accompanying copy of an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the 2nd February last, exempting Norwegian ships from re-measurement for tonnage, and revoking the Order in Council of the 17th May 1876, which has been received by the Administrator of the Government from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, is published for general information.

PRESENT :

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862*, it is enacted that “whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships for the time being in force under the Principal Act have been adopted by the Government of any foreign country, and are in force in that country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to direct that the ships of such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry, or other national papers, and thereupon it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be re-measured in any port or place in Her Majesty's dominions, but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry, or other papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British ships is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships :—

And whereas by *The Merchant Shipping Act 1876*, it is enacted that “where Her Majesty has power, under *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, or any Act passed, or hereafter to be passed, amending the same, to make an Order in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty from time to time to make such Order in Council, and by Order in Council to revoke, alter, or add to any Order so made :—

And whereas it was made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships now in force under *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854* had been adopted by the Royal Norwegian Government, and came into force in Norway on the 1st day of April 1876 :

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 17th day of May 1876, Her Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct that the merchant ships belonging to the said Kingdom of Norway, the measurement whereof had, after the said 1st day of April 1876, been ascertained and denoted in the registers, and other national papers of such ships, testified by the dates thereof, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers, or other national papers, in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships : Provided nevertheless, that should the owner or master of any Norwegian steamship desire the deduction for engine room in his ships to be estimated under the rules for engine room measurement and deduction applicable to British ships instead of under the Norwegian rule, the engine room should be measured and the deduction calculated according to the British rules :

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that a new Royal Ordinance, which came into operation on the 5th day of May 1883, stipulates that the certificates of tonnage of Norwegian steamships may show the net tonnage calculated according to British rules :—

And whereas it has been made to appear desirable to Her Majesty that the provisions of the said recited Order in Council of the 17th day of May 1876 should be revoked, and a new Order in Council made and substituted in lieu thereof :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Acts, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that the said recited Order of the 17th May 1876 shall be, and the same is hereby revoked, and

in lieu thereof, and in substitution thereof, Her Majesty is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct as follows:—

1. As regards sailing ships: That merchant sailing ships of the said Kingdom of Norway, the measurement whereof shall, after the said 1st day of April 1876, have been ascertained and denoted in the certificates of registry, or other national papers of such sailing ships, testified by the dates thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such certificates of registry, or other national papers, in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British sailing ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships.
2. As regards steamships: That merchant ships belonging to the said Kingdom of Norway which are propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine room, the measurement whereof shall, after the said 1st day of April 1876, have been ascertained and denoted in the certificates of registry, or other national papers of such steamships, testified by the dates thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such certificates of registry, or other national papers, in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships: Provided nevertheless, that if the owner or master of any such Norwegian steamship desires the deduction for engine room in such ship to be estimated under the rules for engine room measurement and deduction applicable to British ships, instead of under the Norwegian rule, the engine room shall be measured, and the deduction calculated, according to the British rules; and that, in the event of the net registered tonnage of such steamships estimated under the British rules being denoted in the said certificates of registry, or other national papers, the same shall be deemed to be of the tonnage so denoted therein.

An area of half-a-mile radius, at Craigie Lee, on the East Charlton Railway,
a District where publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the said Act.

Mount Hatton, bearing S. 14° W., 32 miles distant.

SHIRE OF ST. ARNAUD.

Regulations for the Management of Lake Buloke Common.

In pursuance of the regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the first day of April 1879, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, having drafted the following Regulations for the management of Lake Buloke Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five miles of the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer, having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land, occupied by him, may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly, in advance, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October, in every year:—For every head of large cattle over six months and under two years old, Four shillings per annum; for every head of large cattle two years and under three years old, Eight shillings per annum; for every head of large cattle three years old and over, Twelve shillings per annum; for every head of small cattle, Two shillings and sixpence per annum; progeny under six months old of horses and horned cattle legally depasturing on the common, free.

3. No person shall be allowed to depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bond fide* owner.

4. Bulls or entire horses over the age of nine months shall not be allowed on the common without the written sanction of the managers, and sheep shall be allowed to depasture on such portions only of the common as may be set apart for that purpose by the managers.

5. The herdsman of the common shall be in attendance at a place to be named on the first Tuesday in each quarter, for the purpose of registering stock, and receiving the fees thereon, and due notice of such attendance and the time and place thereof shall be given by the managers.

6. All persons taking stock to depasture on the common shall deliver them into the charge of the herdsman at the time and place appointed as aforesaid, together with a written statement of the number and brands of such stock, and the managers shall, on receiving the fees payable thereon, give a receipt for the same in the prescribed form, and the herdsman shall forthwith, with the assistance of the owner or the person in charge, brand such stock in a conspicuous place with the common brand, which shall be of pitch or tar, and such brand shall be renewed whenever necessary, so as to be plainly legible during the whole period that such stock may depasture on the common.

7. No stock duly registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the common unless notice of intention so to do be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the stock removed.

8. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of any stock from the common save as provided in clause 9.

9. The herdsman shall, on any stock straying from the common or on being removed therefrom without the owner's consent, notify the owner within ten days thereof, and if the herdsman fail or neglect to give the owner notice in writing within that time the former shall, should such stock be lost, be held responsible for the loss, which shall be computed at the rate of Two pounds sterling per head for horses and horned cattle, and may be deducted from the remuneration payable to the herdsman.

10. All stock upon which the prescribed fees shall not have been paid within two days after date for renewal of license shall be liable to be impounded.

11. All dead carcasses found on the common, which the owner or owners thereof may refuse or neglect to remove after receiving twenty-four hours' notice in writing from the managers or herdsman, may be removed or destroyed by burning or otherwise at the expense of such owner or owners.

12. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common, and as soon as the herdsman shall discover that any stock legally depasturing thereon is affected with any such disease he shall report the same to the managers, and shall give the owner of such stock notice in writing to remove them from the common.

13. All persons depasturing stock on the common shall place their respective fire-brands on the stock depasturing in their names.

14. Whenever, in these regulations, any act or thing is required to be done by the managers it shall be considered to be well and truly done if done by any two or more of them duly appointed from time to time to act on their behalf.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

2. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under seven years of age, to be provided. The body shall be taken direct to the cemetery, and no more than one body shall be carried in the hearse at a time.

3. Coffins to be sufficiently long, deep, and wide for the corpse to lie extended at full length, and to be fastened down with screws. The contractor shall provide two inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

4. The graves to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Cemetery Regulations.

5. In the event of the contractor failing to attend punctually to the order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense, if any, incurred will be charged to the contractor.

6. When burials are required to take place on Sunday no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the cemetery authorities will be repaid to the contractor.

7. The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for the burial must, if practicable, be provided, and the contractor must inform the Police of the hour when the funeral service will take place, so that the friends of the deceased may attend at the cemetery if they wish. Such order to be produced at the cemetery when the contractor gives the order for interment. The contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial

service should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed, and that he received the fee for so doing; the receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

8. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne. The charge for the minister's fee should be included in the account for the funeral.

9. In the event of any charge of impropriety or neglect in conducting the funerals being established against the contractor, the Government may for the first offence deduct from the security money, by way of fine, £5; and for the second offence a similar amount, and, in addition thereto, may forthwith cancel the contract.

10. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited.

5. 4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient. **CHEQUES ON ACCOUNT OF DEPOSITS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.
