SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the undermentioned Proclamations issued under the authority of the said Act, that is to say:-

BYE-LAW No. 8.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law for fixing the Charges and Tolls on Goods, and all Bye-laws of 31st January, 1884, conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

and so on at the rate of one day for every additional 100 tons register. Vessels not having full cargoes on board shall be allowed time in proportion, to be ascertained and fixed by the Pier-master or any other officer whom the General Traffic Manager may appoint. The same rule shall also apply to vessels taking in cargo.

Any vessel continuing to occupy a berth after the regulation days as above specified have expired, unless with the consent in writing of the General Traffic Manager or Pier-master acting under his authority, shall pay a toll of threepence (3d.) per ton register per diem until the removal of such vessel from the pier.

Nothing in this Bye-law shall prevent the Pier-master from removing any vessel at any time in terms of the 131st Section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*.

21. Regulations with respect to what are known as the Lower-level Sidings—

(1.) The unloading of trucks will be performed solely by the servants of the Victorian Railways Commissioners, and the unloading will proceed in the order the trucks arrive, and as soon thereafter as practicable, at the following scale of charges per truck load:—

Per Truck Load of over 5 tons—Firewood	s. d.
„ „ 5 tons	1 6

(2.) Storage will be charged upon all consignments allowed to remain on the ground over twelve hours after the truck is unloaded, and payment of the said storage at the rate hereinafter mentioned will be required on demand before the consignments are removed off the ground; but it shall be lawful for the Commissioners to lease any portion or portions of the said Lower-level Sidings, upon such terms as to rent as may in writing be agreed upon; and the payment of the said rent under agreement shall be in lieu of the storage rate hereinafter mentioned chargeable under this Bye-law.

(3.) The area of the said Lower-level Sidings is divided into allotments. Upon allotments for which terms may in accordance with preceding clause be from time to time agreed, hereinafter termed "Store Allotments," the Commissioners will require payment of rent monthly in advance. The limits of each Store Allotment, or of contiguous Store Allotments held by one and the same person, will be marked on the ground by a post fixed at each of the four corners of the area.

(4.) The rate of storage applicable to all consignments deposited upon other than Store Allotments, and upon which rent is not payable monthly in advance as aforesaid—is 1s. 6d. per diem per allotment of 25 feet frontage. Any portion of a day exceeding twelve working hours after a truck has been unloaded is to be computed a day, and any portion of an allotment to be computed as an allotment. And this charge applies to each foot of frontage which at any portion of its depth is occupied by consignments—that is to say, this charge for storage will not be increased or reduced by reason that the cubic capacity for stacking on the said frontage may or may not be made fully available.

(5.) Upon other than Store Allotments a space of 4 feet from the rails must always be kept clear by the consignee immediately a truck is discharged, or in his default the work will be done by the servants of the Commissioners, at a cost to the consignee of 1s. per hour per man for the time so employed; and if necessary for the quick and economical discharge of trucks, the work of stacking up or levelling down consignments must also be done by the consignee.

(6.) A receipt must be given for each truck load or consignment when the truck is at its place of discharge. Should the lessee or the consignee not be present by himself or his agent to give a receipt, the unloading of each truck shall nevertheless proceed, and the lessee who is not present, or neglects to give a receipt within twelve hours after the truck is discharged, shall be held as infringing the conditions of his lease. And upon other than Store Allotments consignments for which no receipts have been given, or for which the railway charges have not been paid on demand, or which have not been removed from the ground within twelve hours after the truck is discharged, shall be liable to the storage charges aforesaid, or to be warehoused, or to be sold at the cost and risk of the said consignee. And no claims shall be recognised by the Commissioners on account of trucks unloaded for which no receipts have been given; and after receipts have been given the lessee or consignee shall be bound to observe the Regulations as to Gate Passes.

GRANT TO PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS, 1883-84.

THE Administrator of the Government in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations, viz. :-

Regulations in connection with the grant of Nine thousand five hundred pounds (£9,500) for fencing and improving public parks and gardens under the control of borough councils, trustees, committees of management, &c.

1. A sum, not exceeding Ten shillings, shall be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote, under regulations of 18th December 1883, for every One pound paid, or to be paid, under clause 2 of the said regulations.

2. A sum of Fifty-one pounds eleven shillings and fourpence (£51 11s. 4d.) shall be paid to the treasurer of the city council of Fitzroy, as subsidy for expenditure from 1st January 1883 to 30th June 1883, in the improvement of Edinburgh Gardens, Fitzroy.

3. A sum of Seventy pounds (£70) shall be paid to the treasurer of the borough council of Creswick, as subsidy for improvements made in Prince Leopold Park, Creswick.

4. A sum of Ninety pounds six shillings and tenpence (£90 6s. 10d.) shall be paid to the Treasurer of the borough

council of Tarnagulla, as subsidy for improvements made in Tarnagulla Public Park between 1st January 1881 and 31st December 1883.

5. A sum of Fifty pounds (£50) shall be paid to the Treasurer of the borough council of Dunolly, for the improvement of Dunolly Public Gardens.

6. A sum of One hundred pounds (£100) shall be paid to the treasurer of the committee of management for Sorrento Public Park, for improvements to be made in the said park.

TOWN PROCLAIMED UNDER "THE LAND ACT 1869."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor might divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and might also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and might divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* might define the boundaries of such counties, parishes or towns, and might distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions should thenceforward be recognized as a county, parish or town, by the name so given as aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby define the boundaries of the town hereinafter described and do distinguish the same by the name prefixed thereto, that is to say:—

TOWN OF WARRACKNABEAL.—County of Borung, parish of Werrigar: Commencing at a point on the eastern bank of the Yarrambiack Creek in line with the south boundary of allotment 1 (Warracknabeal East Homestead section); bounded thence by a line and the said allotment bearing N. 89° 52' E to the south-east angle of the latter; thence by a road bearing S. 02° 8' E. seventy-four chains forty-eight links; thence by a line, allotment 90 D, a line allotment 90 B, and a line bearing S. 89° 52' W. seventy-six chains fifty-six links; thence by allotment 13, a line, allotments 12, 11, 10, and 9, a line, allotments 8 and 7 A, a line, allotments 6, 5, 4, and 3, and a line bearing N. 0° 8' W. to the Yarrambiack Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek northerly to the point of commencement. The bearings are from the true meridian.—(S4.S.32537.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE INVERLEIGH AND TRESDALE UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON.
THE Councils of the Shires of Bannockburn and Leigh, in pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the

Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, having respectively approved the following regulations, drafted by a joint committee, for the management of the above-named common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works:—

Interpretation Clause.

The words "large cattle," "cattle," and "stock," hereinafter used, shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, calves, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, foals, asses, and mules; and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats, except where otherwise plainly specified.

Regulations.

1st. The managers of the Inverleigh and Teesdale United Town and Farmers' Common shall be Thomas C. Hope, James Harvey, and Alexander McCallum, members of the Shire Council of Bannockburn; and Alexander Armstrong, Matthew Farrar, and David Hamilton, members of the Leigh Shire Council. Their successors in office shall be appointed by the shire councils named.

2nd. It shall be lawful for such managers to appoint officers, who shall be responsible for carrying out the regulations for management, and for carrying out any special instructions issued to them for the prevention of trespass, or any other matter relating to the common. Such officers shall be paid out of the fund derived from commonage fees.

3rd. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers may respectively depasture on the above-named common, within a distance of five miles from their places of residence, four head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle shall be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

4th. The herdsman, assisted by the owners, shall, during the last week of each quarter, muster all stock then found on the common; and on such stock being paid for and their description and brands entered into a book as hereinafter provided, they shall be plainly pitch-branded with the commons brand; but if the owner of any cattle objects to have it or them so pitch-branded, and such cattle so unbranded shall go astray or be impounded, the managers and herdsman shall be free of all responsibility in respect thereof. Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the herdsman shall be required to use diligence for preventing all stock legally depasturing on the common under his charge from going astray. If, after the foregoing conditions have been complied with, any such branded cattle be impounded, the herdsman shall give notice thereof to the owners, and shall be responsible for one-half of the pound fees and other charges, and shall release such impounded cattle on the other half being paid by such owners.

5th. The quarters shall commence on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in each year.

6th. The secretary of the common shall, on receiving fees for depasturing of cattle (which shall in all cases be paid in advance), give a receipt for such fees, and shall enter on the receipt and block thereof the fire-brands or other description of such cattle in the form prescribed by the general regulations under *The Land Act 1869* relating to commons.

7th. The fees for depasturing on the above-named common shall be as follows, viz.:—

- For every head of large cattle, 1s. 6d. per quarter.
- For every horse or mare, 2s. per quarter.
- For every sheep or goat, 6d. per quarter, or 4d. per week.

No person shall be permitted to depasture more than four goats, which shall be depastured at the owner's risk; calves or foals, if under nine months old, will not be charged for if running with their mothers.

8th. The managers shall have power to make special arrangements for the convenience of butchers requiring pasturage for cattle or sheep intended for slaughter, or may refuse to depasture any such cattle or sheep if they shall think fit.

9th. No bull or entire horse over the age of nine months shall be depastured on the common without the sanction in writing of the managers, who may refuse to allow thereon any beast which in their opinion would be dangerous to other stock. The herdsman shall report immediately to the managers, or the secretary, any indication of disease in cattle on the common, and shall give notice to the owners of such cattle; and the herdsman shall at once take steps to remove such cattle, but he shall not be responsible for any loss owners thereof may suffer.

10th. The herdsman shall not permit cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals to trespass on the common.

11th. The herdsman shall, on any cattle straying, or otherwise being removed without the owner's consent, acquaint him thereof within three days by written notice, or verbally in the presence of a witness, and in the event of no such notice being given within that time, and the cattle being lost, the herdsman shall be responsible for such loss, not exceeding Three pounds per head for cattle, and Five pounds per head for horses, to be deducted from his wages, or otherwise recovered. Provided that if the owner, or any person on his behalf, remove any cattle from the common without having first informed the herdsman of his intention to do so, and such cattle should subsequently be lost or impounded, neither the managers nor the herdsman shall be responsible for the loss or impounding; nor shall they nor he be responsible for the loss or impounding of cattle not delivered into the care of the herdsman, and in respect of which a receipt for fees has not been given.

12th. The herdsman shall assist the owners of cattle depasturing on the common to separate any that they may require to remove, and shall use all care and diligence to prevent or extinguish bush

fires. In the event of cows calving on the common, or of any beast being found dead or injured thereon, he shall give notice to the owner (if known) as soon as practicable.

13th. The managers may order special musters, and any expenses incurred for extra assistance at such musters shall be paid out of the commons fund. All unregistered cattle found on the common, the owner or owners of which are unknown, shall be at once impounded.

14th. All complaints against the officers of the common must be submitted in writing to the managers, and addressed to the secretary.

15th. No person residing more than five miles from the common shall be allowed to depasture cattle thereon, and no person shall be allowed to transfer his or her right of commonage. The managers may require any person applying for a license to depasture cattle on the common to make a statutory declaration that such cattle are his or her *bona fide* property.

16th. The accounts of the common shall be audited at least once in every year, by a person or persons appointed by the managers for that purpose; and an abstract of the accounts so audited shall be printed in some newspaper generally circulating in the district, and a copy of such newspaper containing such abstract shall be forwarded to the Minister of Lands. The annual accounts shall close on the 30th September in each year, and shall be audited and delivered to the managers not later than the 31st of October following. A quarterly statement of the accounts shall be delivered to the managers on their next meeting after the expiration of each quarter.

17th. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the managers of the common shall not be responsible for any loss of or injury to any cattle or stock depasturing on the common.

18th. As hereinbefore stated, all persons depasturing, or desiring to depasture, stock on the common shall pay the commons fees in advance; and any person depasturing stock on the common, the fees on which have not been paid in advance, shall be proceeded against according to law for the recovery of such fees.

19th. Any person who shall offend against any of these regulations shall, on conviction thereof before any court of petty sessions, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and every such penalty may be recoverable in a summary way.
