Sir,—I have the honour to transmit to you a copy of an Act
46 and 47 Vict., passed in the last session of Parliament to amend

THE Council of the Borough of Ararat doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872, make the following rate for one year from the 1st day of January 1884, that is to say:

VII. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £39 and not exceeding £49, the annual sum of Six pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

VIII. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £49 and not exceeding £59, the annual sum of Five pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

VIII. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £59 and not exceeding £59, the annual sum of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

IX. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £50 and not exceeding £300, the annual sum of Five pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

IX. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £250 and not exceeding £300, the annual sum of Four pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

XI. Water for steam boilers to be charged at the rate of 20s. per annum on each inch measurement of the cylinder of the engine. If not attached to an engine, a special rate to be agreed on.

One-fourth of an acre ... 20s. per annum One-half of an acre ... 40s. per annum One-half of an acre ... 40s. per annum And at the rate of 60s. per acre for each additional acre.

XIV. Water supplied for mining purposes at 5s. per day from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., and notice must be given to the Town Clerk the number of days required; part of a day not allowed for.

2. The Council may cause meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, such-meter to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for at rate of 1s. per 1000 gallons over and above the amount for which they are rated. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering (12000,000) one million gallons.

3. If any meter should cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repairs, the Council shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

4. Any person receiving water from the Council who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Council who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service pipe, shall be liable to a ponalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Council, he shall obtain from the Council a license in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfer with any pipe of the Council, he shall obtain from the Council a license in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Any person whether hoensed as atoresaid or not connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Council.

13. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

14. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

15. If any person supplied with water by the Council does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Council may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

16. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the directions of the officers of the Council, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

17. In the construction of this Bye-law the word "Council shall be and the Sorough Council of Ararat.

All bye-laws heretofore made relating to the Ararat Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder.
