SIR,—I have the honour to transmit to you a copy of an Act 46 and 47 Vict., passed in the last session of Parliament to amend the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1854 to 1880, with respect to Fishing Vessels and Apprenticeship to the Sea-Fishing Service and otherwise; and I have to call the attention of your Government to section 49 of this Act, declaring the meaning of 17 and 18 Victoria, cap. 104, section 109.

SECTION 49 OF THE "MERCHANT SHIPPING (FISHING BOATS) ACT 1883."

An unregistered British ship (which ought to be registered under the *Merchant Shipping Act 1854*) shall, for the purposes of section one hundred and nine of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, be deemed to have been registered in the United Kingdom.

GELONG RACES ON 31ST JANUARY AND 2ND FEBRUARY.

GRAIN TO THE AUSTRALIAN WHARF.

Grain consigned direct from country stations to vessels alongside the wharf adjoining the new siding will be run down without extra charge. If consigned to Melbourne only, and then reconsigned to the wharf without being unloaded or entailing extra shunting, a charge of 1s. per truck will be made. If unloaded in the sheds and afterwards reconsigned, a charge of 2s. per ton will be made. Demurrage, as per Goods Tariff, will be enforced on all grain not taken on board within eight working hours after being placed on the wharf.

GRAIN TRAFFIC.

No. 506, § 19, 38, and 49), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming any part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities, and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the sections of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of certain ratepayers of the Shire of Seymour therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the Seymour Riding of the Shire of Seymour the portion described in such petition, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be annexed to the Shire of Yea; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Seymour and the Seymour Riding thereof, as hereby reduced, and of the said Shire of Yea hereby added to, in manner following, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF SEYMOUR REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.

Commencing at the junction of Hughes Creek with the Goulburn River; thence easterly by that creek to the south-west angle of section A, parish of Avenel; thence north by the road forming the west boundary and east by the road forming the north boundary of that section to the road west of allotments 1b, 1b, and 1a, section G; thence north by that road to the north-west angle of the allotment last-named; thence east by the road forming the north boundary of the said parish of Avenel to the west boundary of allotment 33; thence north by the road

BOROUGH OF ARARAT.

Bye-law making a Rate for Water Supply purposes.

THE Council of the Borough of Ararat doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872, make the following rate for one year from the 1st day of January 1884, that is to say:—

I. The rates and charges hereafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Council otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes:—

- i. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £10 and under, the annual sum of Ten pence per centum on the amount of the valuation, and that Ten shillings be the minimum.
- ii. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10 and not exceeding £14, the annual sum of Nine pence per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- iii. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £14 and not exceeding £19, the annual sum of Eight pence per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- iv. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £19 and not exceeding £29, the annual sum of Seven pence per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- v. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £29 and not exceeding £39, the annual sum of Six pence ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- vi. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £39 and not exceeding £49, the annual sum of Six pence per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- vii. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £49 and not exceeding £59, the annual sum of Five pence ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- viii. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £59 and not exceeding £250, the annual sum of Five pence per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- ix. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £250 and not exceeding £300, the annual sum of Four pence ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- x. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £300 and over, the annual sum of Four pence per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- xi. Water supplied at stand-pipes, One shilling per load of 120 gallons.
- xii. Water for steam boilers to be charged at the rate of 20s. per annum on each inch measurement of the cylinder of the engine. If not attached to an engine, a special rate to be agreed on.
- xiii. Gardens to be charged at the following rates:—
One-fourth of an acre ... 20s. per annum
One-half of an acre ... 40s. per annum
Three-quarters of an acre ... 50s. per annum
One acre ... 60s. per annum
And at the rate of 60s. per acre for each additional acre.
- xiv. Water supplied for mining purposes at 5s. per day from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., and notice must be given to the Town Clerk the number of days required; part of a day not allowed for.

2. The Council may cause meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, such meter to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for at rate of 1s. per 1000 gallons over and above the amount for which they are rated. Siphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure. No meter shall be fixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering (1,000,000) one million gallons.

3. If any meter should cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repairs, the Council shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

4. Any person receiving water from the Council who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Council who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Council, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Council, he shall obtain from the Council a license in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

7. Before any such license shall be granted by the Council, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Council that he is a competent plumber, and pay the annual sum of Five shillings as the fee for such license. The Council shall have the power of cancelling such license at any time.

8. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Council, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Council, without the permission in writing of the Council being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

9. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Council, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Council, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Council, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the Council of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Council, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Council. Wrought-iron and lead piping of approved quality only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services. No service of a larger bore than 1/2-inch will be permitted, unless by special consent of the Council.

10. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Council into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Council that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Council may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as the said Council may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Council.

11. Any person supplied with water by the Council who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Council.

12. Any person whether licensed as aforesaid or not connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Council.

13. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

14. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

15. If any person supplied with water by the Council does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Council may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

16. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the directions of the officers of the Council, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

17. In the construction of this Bye-law the word "Council" shall mean the Borough Council of Ararat.

All bye-laws heretofore made relating to the Ararat Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder.

The foregoing bye-law was made and passed by the Council of the Borough of Ararat on the Sixteenth day of January 1884, and to take effect from the First day of January 1884, for one year.
