WITH reference to the Regulations, made on the 7th May 1884 and published in the *Government Gazette* of 13th May 1884, p. 1357, respecting Warrant and Non-commissioned Officers of the Victorian Military Forces, the Governor in Council has approved of the following addition to the 4th class in the Classification of Warrant and Non-commissioned Officers, viz. :-

"Battery and Company Quartermaster Sergeants."

VICTORIAN ARTILLERY.—REGULATIONS.

WITH reference to the Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of 11th August 1882, directing the formation of a Battery of Artillery under *The Discipline Act 1870*, and to subsequent orders relating thereto, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following alterations in the conditions of service and pay, which will apply to all men joining the battery after the date hereof, that is to say :-

Gunners.—Three shillings per day for first two years' service. Three shillings and threepence per day for subsequent three years' service.

Three shillings and sixpence per day for 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th, and 10th years' service.

With quarters, fuel, light, and water, but subject to the deductions hereinafter mentioned.

Trumpeters will be paid as gunners.

Conditions of Service.—Men to enlist for 5 years, with the option, if approved by the Commandant, of extending their service for a second period of 5 years, on the completion of the first 5 years.

Recruits to be sworn in under the *Discipline Act*, to be not less than 19 or more than 30 years of age. Minimum height, 5 feet 8 inches; chest measurement not less than 35 inches. Of good character; able to read and write fairly, and to pass medical examination.

Men recently discharged from the Imperial Service, under 45 years, and men of special qualifications may be enlisted, if approved by the Military Commandant, provided they pass the medical examination, although they do not comply in every respect with the above conditions.

Deferred Pay.—Three-pence per day will be retained from the pay of all non-commissioned officers and men during 3rd, 4th and 5th years' service, and 6d. per day during 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th and 10th years' service, as deferred pay to be drawn on discharge; but men dismissed or discharged for misconduct, or on account of bad character to forfeit all claim to deferred pay, if so directed by the Military Commandant.

One shilling per day to be retained from pay to meet expenses of rations. No man can claim his discharge until the expiration of his term of service, but a man of good character may, if he be permitted by the Military Commandant, purchase his discharge during the first 3 years of service for £20, during the 4th for £10, and thereafter may be granted a free discharge.

Contingencies, Allowances, &c.—The sum of 6d. per diem will be allowed for a district gunner at each of the Ports of Queenscliffe, Swan Island, Point Nepean, and South Channel, when armed.

REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by section 44 of *The Water Conservation Act 1881*, do make the following Regulation:—

No. 2.—*Regulation for the supply of water for irrigation or any other purpose excepting for the watering of stock or domestic requirements, and the mode of imposing and receiving charges for such supply of water.*

(1.) Any person, persons, company, or irrigation trust desirous of being supplied with water for irrigation or any other purpose, excepting for the watering of stock or domestic requirements, from any reservoir, tank, dam, weir, lake, watercourse, conduit, or stream of any kind belonging to the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust shall give to the Commissioners of the said Trust or their secretary seven days' notice in writing prior to the date on which he or they desire to obtain such water.

(2.) Every such notice must be accompanied by a declaration setting forth the amount of land which it is intended to irrigate if the water be required for irrigation purposes.

(3.) The charges for water shall be at the rate of Five shillings for every million of gallons or fractional part thereof, and all such charges shall be paid, previous to any water being used or taken, to the secretary of the Trust, or such other officer as the Commissioners of the said Trust may appoint for the purpose of receiving such rates and charges.

(4.) The supply of water shall be determined by meter or gauge.

(5.) Should the Commissioners deem it necessary from any cause to stop the supply of water, they shall be at liberty to give any party with whom they have contracted to supply water notice to desist from drawing off or using any more, and thereupon such party shall so desist, and their contract shall absolutely cease and determine.

(6.) No person, persons, company, or irrigation trust shall take or use water from any reservoir, tank, dam, weir, lake, watercourse, conduit, or stream of any kind under the control of the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust for irrigation or any other purpose without the written consent of the Commissioners, nor shall continue to use or take water belonging to the said Trust after any contract for the supply of water has been determined.

(7.) Any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

The foregoing Regulation No. 2 was made by the Commissioners of the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of section 44 of *The Water Conservation Act 1881*, this 7th day of May 1884.

The births of 939 children, viz., 482 boys and 457 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of June. In the month of May 997 births were registered, or 58 more than in the month under review. The births were 172 above the average of the previous ten years, but only 61 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in June numbered 511, viz., 264 of males, and 247 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 428. The deaths were fewer than those in May by 36, and exceeded the average of June during the previous ten years by 114. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than the average of those ten years by 57.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3·08, and of deaths registered 1·68.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 68·1° on the 2nd, and the lowest was 34·0° on the 30th. The mean temperature of the month (50·2°) was more than a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (26·2°) took place on the 2nd, viz., from a maximum of 68·1° to a minimum of 41·9°. The least range (6·2°) was on the 10th, viz., from a maximum of 54·6° to a minimum of 48·4°. The mean daily range was 14·5°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29·971 inches) was a fraction below the average.

The percentage of deaths of males during the month was 52, and that of females was 48. Children under 5 years of age contributed 32 per cent. to the total mortality as against 28 per cent. in June 1883; 35 per cent. in June 1882; 32 per cent. in June 1881; 36 per cent. in June 1880; 27 per cent. in June 1879; 20 per cent. in June 1878; 38 per cent. in June 1877; 30 per cent. in June 1876; and 32 per cent. in June 1875 and June 1874.

The deaths of 21 people who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a female, aged 76, and a widow, aged 77, died of apoplexy; a female, aged 75, 2 females, each aged 84, a female, aged 85, and a female, aged 89, of bronchitis; a male pastrycook, aged 76, of brain disease; a female, aged 76, and a contractor, aged 81, of heart disease; a female, aged 77, of liver disease; a laborer, aged 78, of nephritis; a male, of occupation unstated, aged 78, of orchitis; 2 females, aged 77 and 92 respectively, of paralysis; a female, aged 79, of pneumonia; a female, aged 78, a female, aged 80, a female, aged 86, a baker, aged 89, and a female, aged 93, of old age.

Seventeen deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 13 were set down to accident and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A female child, aged 2, was killed through being thrown out of a cart; a farmer, aged 65, died of paralysis, consequent upon fracture of the spinal column, the result of a fall into a clay-hole; a female child, aged 4, of inflammation of the wind-pipe, caused by inhaling hot steam from the spout of a tea-pot; a butcher, aged 49, of

the effects of a sunstroke; a female child, aged 2, was poisoned through swallowing some green paint powder; two males, aged 30 and 45 respectively, whose occupations were unstated, 2 carpenters, aged 49 and 53 respectively, and a laborer, aged 51, were found drowned in the River Yarra; two female infants, aged 13 and 15 days respectively, were suffocated through being overlain; and a laborer, aged 63, was choked, some sausage meat becoming impacted in his gullet whilst eating. The suicidal deaths were those of a bank clerk, aged 22, who shot himself through the head with a revolver; a meat-preserver, aged 42, who cut his throat with a razor; a merchant, aged 38, who poisoned himself with strychnine; and a caterer, aged 48, who drowned himself in the bay whilst of unsound mind.

One hundred and eighteen deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—48 in the Melbourne Hospital, 12 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 9 in the Lying-in Hospital, 14 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 10 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, and 1 in the Inebriate Retreat.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 165, of which 92, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 73, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 106 were under one year of age, 32 were between one and two, 16 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 346. Of these, 172, or 50 per cent., were males, and 174, or 50 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 2 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 37 were between twenty and twenty-five, 27 were between twenty-five and thirty, 19 were between thirty and thirty-five, 29 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 31 were between forty-five and fifty, 34 were between fifty and fifty-five, 30 were between fifty-five and sixty, 30 were between sixty and sixty-five, 23 were between sixty-five and seventy, 15 were between seventy and seventy-five, 11 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 10 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases showed a decrease of 31 in the month of June as compared with the previous month. Under this heading deaths from diphtheria fell from 7 to 3, those from croup from 7 to 5, those from typhoid fever from 30 to 28, those from dysentery and diarrhoea from 28 to 11, and those from want of breast-milk from 11 to 5. On the other hand, measles, which had not proved fatal during May, caused 4 deaths in June, and whooping-cough caused 17 deaths, as against 13 in the former months. The high rate of mortality among childbearing women which was noticed last month was maintained during the present month, as many as 12 deaths having been set down to circumstances attendant on childbirth. On comparing this number with the births registered, viz., 939, it follows that 1 death of a mother occurred to every 78 children born alive.

ROMSEY PARK.

Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the Public Park in the parish of Monegeetta, known as "Romsey Park."

WE, John Cornelius Kelly, Frederick Octavius Neal, Lachlan Robertson, Patrick Kelly, Gerard Blackburn, William Tweeddale Moffat, and William Grant, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Public Park in the parish of Monegeetta, known as "Romsey Park," having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management

thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage, in any way, the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the park, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the park.
5. No person shall put in the park any cattle, goats, or pigs, without the authority of the committee of management in writing.
6. No person shall bring into the park any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority of the committee of management in writing.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the park, nor any booth, or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

Sec. 41. If any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land or any other dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody; and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases; and the justice may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of

seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid if demanded within one month to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid, the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered the whole of the said amount, may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

Sec. 42. If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings; and if such cattle shall by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the council, the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged, respectively before the release or sale of such cattle shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction shall apply.

Sec. 43. If any goat shall have been impounded under the provisions of either of the two last preceding sections or under the provisions of this bye-law relating to the impounding of cattle for trespass in the streets, and shall not after the expiration of twenty-four hours be released and the penalty, costs, fees, and charges be paid by the owner thereof, any justice may by warrant under his hand directed to any constable authorize the destruction of such goat, and the same may be destroyed accordingly.
