## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

**BYE-LAW No. 33.**

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law, and all previous Bye-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

## CHARGES ON GOODS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

1. All Goods mentioned in any of the Bye-laws as being carried at owner's risk, and not otherwise provided for in the Bye-laws, may be carried at the risk of the Victorian Railways Commissioners on payment of an addition of Ten per cent. to the owner's risk rates. Goods carried at owner's risk will require to be consigned on consignment notes in the form prescribed by the Commissioners.
2. Liquid Cattle Food to be carried under Special Class A Rates and Conditions if in lots of 1 ton and upwards, and under Special Class B Rates and Conditions if in lesser quantities.
3. Logwood to be carried under Miscellaneous Class Rates and Conditions.
4. Strippers to be carried at Second Class Rates, owner's risk.
5. The Haulage Charges on General Cargo and Grain from the Shed of the Peninsular and Oriental Steam Navigation Company to the ship's side at Williamstown Pier are abolished, the Company doing all the handling and taking receipts.

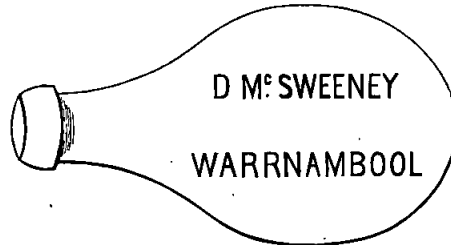
