LIABILITY TO QUARANTINE OF VESSELS, ETC., FROM THE ISLAND OF TIMOR DISCONTINUED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the twenty-eighth day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and issued in pursuance of *The Public Health Statute 1885*, it was notified that China, Japan, and the Eastern Archipelago were infected with Cholera, and that it was probable that such disease might be brought from such places to Victoria: And whereas the circumstances which led to the issue of such Proclamation have, so far as the Island of Timor is concerned, ceased to exist: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation so far only as it relates to the Island of Timor.

(Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-third day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and in the forty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.)

The births of 1,063 children, viz., 540 boys and 523 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of October. In the month of September 1,119 births were registered, or 56 more than in the month under review. The births were 312 above the average of the previous ten years, but only 168 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in October numbered 488, viz., 278 of males, and 210 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 575. The deaths exceeded those in September by 6, and were above the average of October during the previous ten years by 86. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been above that average by only 9.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.25, and of deaths registered 1.49.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 56.1° on the 30th, and the lowest was 36.5° on the 4th. The mean temperature of the month (56.0°) was two degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (36.3°) took place on the 15th, viz., from a maximum of 75.1° to a minimum of 38.8°. The least range (5.4°) was on the 2nd, viz., from a maximum of 55.9° to a minimum of 50.5°. The mean daily range was 18.2°. The highest atmospheric pressure (30.401 inches) was on the 3rd, and the lowest (29.532 inches) was on the 10th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.050 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 8 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.993 inch.

Males contributed 57 per cent., and females 43 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 29 per cent. to that mortality, as against 46 per cent. in October 1884; 30 per cent. in October 1883; 31 per cent. in October 1882; 33 per cent. in October 1881; 37 per cent. in October 1880 and October 1879; 27 per cent. in October 1878; 39 per cent. in October 1877; 29 per cent. in October 1876; and 39 per cent. in October 1875.

The deaths of thirty-four persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a laborer, aged 75, died of phthisis; a builder, aged 75, of cystitis; a male school-teacher, aged 75, of pyelitis; a gentleman, aged 76, of cirrhosis of liver; 2 gentlemen, aged 76 and 77 respectively, of heart disease; a dealer and a female, each aged 78, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 78, of brain disease; a gentleman, aged 78, of stomach disease; a female, aged 78, of jaundice; a veterinary surgeon and a gentleman, each aged 79, of influenza; a schoolmaster, aged 83, of congestion of the lungs; a carpenter, aged 79, of jaundice; a female, aged 75, 2 laborers, aged 83 and 85 respectively, and a female, aged 87, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 80, of peritonitis; a mason, aged 75, a female, aged 76, a female, aged 78, a bricklayer, aged 79, a gentleman, aged 80, a female, aged 80, a female, aged 81, a traveller, aged 83, a gentleman, aged 86, a female, aged 87, a female aged 91, and a laborer, aged 93, of old age.

Twenty-four deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 22 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 1 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A carpenter, aged 25, and a market-gardener, aged 32, died of fracture of the spine and skull respectively, the result of falls; a corndealer, aged 35, was thrown from a cart and killed; a carter, aged 40, died of fracture of the leg, caused by being passed over by a lorry; a laborer, aged 66, of injuries to the ribs and chest, caused by being passed over by a cab; a stonemason, aged 49, was killed, an iron girder falling on him; and a platelayer, aged 56, was killed by being struck by a van and truck; a female, aged 78, died of a scalp wound, caused by a ceiling falling on her; a female servant, aged 35, of burns, probably caused by a candle setting her bed-clothes on fire; a tinsmith, aged 57, was poisoned with chlorodyne (no evidence whether suicide or not); a boy, aged 10, a jockey, aged 15, a milliner, aged 32, a female, aged 37, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 40, a laborer, aged 45, a woollorter, aged 50, and a clerk of works, aged 68, were drowned; a female infant was suffocated at birth; a female infant, aged 1 month, was overlain; a hawk, an inmate of the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, aged 26, was choked by a piece of meat; and a male infant, aged 18 days, died of umbilical hemorrhage. The homicidal death was that of a female infant, which was suffocated at birth—verdict murder. The suicidal death was that of a carter, aged 68, who shot himself.

One hundred and ten deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—52 in the Melbourne Hospital, 13 in the Alfred Hospital, 7 in the Children's Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Austin Hospital, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 140, of which 82, or 59 per cent., were of males, and 58, or 41 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 102 were under one year of age, 25 were between one and two, 5 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 348. Of these, 196, or 56 per cent., were males, and 152, or 44 per cent., were females; 15 were between five and ten, 3 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 23 were between twenty and twenty-five, 29 were between twenty-five and thirty, 24 were between thirty and thirty-five, 30 were between thirty-five and forty, 26 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 23 were between fifty and fifty-five, 31 were between fifty-five and sixty, 22 were between sixty and sixty-five, 30 were between sixty-five and seventy, 21 were between seventy and seventy-five, 19 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 15 were upwards of eighty.

The mortality from zymotic diseases was low both in September and October, but an increase in the latter month took place in deaths from constitutional diseases, chiefly phthisis, which caused 74 deaths, as against 52 in September. Deaths from diseases of the respiratory system, which had been unusually numerous for several months, fell from 104 in September to 83 in October. The mortality of childbearing women in September was reported to be unusually high, as many as 13 mothers having died during or shortly after confinement; but this was not continued in October, only 3 such women having died in that month.

NOTE.—Officers in charge of schools may, at their discretion, issue milk, fruit, or vegetables, the produce of the school, in lieu of any article in the foregoing scale; and one quart of yeast, or four ounces of carbonate of soda, for every 100 children weekly. Additional on Tuesdays—one and a-half ounces split peas, or pearl barley, and four ounces of potatoes. Substitute for refractory inmates on Fridays—five ounces maize meal, one and a quarter ounces sugar, and thirds bread instead of firsts.

MILITIA RESERVE REGULATIONS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the subjoined Regulations for the Victorian Militia Reserve.

RESERVE REGULATIONS.

1. The formation of a Reserve for every Corps of Militia is sanctioned.

2. Members of the Militia Reserve will not be liable to be called on for service except in case of national emergency, notified by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.

3. All future recruits to be sworn in for five years, three of which to be in the Militia and two in the Militia Reserve.

4. Members desirous of leaving the Militia may be permitted by the Commandant (in lieu of paying the fine) to serve the remainder of their time in the Militia Reserve, provided they have not less than six months' effective service and are recommended by their Commanding Officer. Provided that no member shall have the right to claim transfer to the Reserve until he shall have completed three years' effective service.

5. Members who have left the Militia for a period not longer than one year may be permitted by the Commandant to re-enrol in the Militia Reserve for the balance of the five years, provided they had when they left the Militia not less than three months' effective service and are recommended by their Commanding Officer.

6. Any member of the Militia who may have been absent for a period of three months may, by order of the Commandant, be transferred to the Militia Reserve instead of being dismissed.

7. Members of Militia Reserve to be under the same obligations as members of Militia to notify change of address to their Commanding Officers.

8. Any member of the Militia Reserve may, at his own request, and with the sanction of the Commandant, be replaced upon the active list of his Corps to fill a vacancy on the establishment.

9. A member of the Militia Reserve may obtain his discharge on the same conditions as members of the Militia.

10. Members who have served three years in the Militia may be permitted by the Commandant to serve other two years in Militia instead of joining Militia Reserve.

11. Members, on completion of five years in the Militia, or in the Militia and Militia Reserve, may be permitted by the Commandant (a) to re-engage for an equal period in the Militia and Militia Reserve not exceeding in the aggregate five years nor less than two years, (b) or may re-engage for any period not less than two years in the Militia Reserve, provided that their age at the termination of such period shall not exceed 45 years.

12. A member of the Militia Reserve removing permanently from the district in which the head-quarters of his Corps is situated may, if he desires it, and with the approval of the Commanding Officer concerned, be transferred by the Commandant to the Militia Reserve of any Corps in his new district, in order to enable him to attend drills and rifle shooting, provided there be vacancies in the Militia Reserve of such Corps.

12a. Every facility to be given to the men of the Militia Reserve to go through the course of Annual Musketry with their Corps. Men of the Militia Reserve to be eligible for Musketry prizes.

12b. Free ammunition to be granted to Militia Reserve of each Corps, provided it is fired with the Corps.

13. Militia Reserve, while at rifle practice or on parade of any sort with their Corps, to be in every way subject to the provisions of the Discipline Act.

14. No pay will be issued to the Militia Reserve for any drills or rifle practice attended except when called out by proclamation.

15. Members of the Militia Reserve to be shown on a separate line on all returns of their Corps, and a nominal roll, giving addresses, to be sent to head-quarters on 1st July annually.

16. The number of men on the Militia Reserve of any Corps shall not exceed such a number as will raise it to its war establishment without the special sanction of the Minister.

17. Members of the Militia Reserve to have the same facilities for the purchase of rifles and ammunition as granted to Rifle Clubs by the new regulations.

18. An extra supply of rifles and accoutrements to be kept in the orderly-room by Corps for the use of the Militia Reserve when they come up to drill; but such arms and accoutrements not to be issued to the Militia Reserve.

19. All members transferred to the Reserve will hand in to their Commanding Officer all Government and Corps property.

WHEREAS by section 90 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, on the application of any Waterworks Trust, and after any such Trust has by Order in Council been duly constituted, make additional orders relating to such Waterworks Trust not inconsistent with the provisions of the now in part recited Act, and may in such additional Orders in Council, among other things, increase or diminish the extent of the Waterworks District of such Waterworks Trust: And whereas the United Echuca and Waranga Waterworks Trust, the same being a Waterworks Trust duly constituted by Order in Council dated the eleventh day of October 1882, has applied for an additional Order in Council increasing as hereinafter mentioned the extent of the Waterworks District of the said Waterworks Trust: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth hereby order that the extent of the district of the said United Echuca and Waranga Waterworks Trust, as set forth in a certain Order in Council dated the eleventh day of October 1882, shall be increased by the addition thereto of all that part of the county of Rodney, being portion of the shire of Echuca, bounded as follows, that is to say:—Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 90, parish of Nanneella, the said point being situate on the present western boundary of the Trust's Waterworks District; thence by a road north-westerly and westerly to the south-west angle of allotment 91 of the said parish; thence by a road northerly to the south-west angle of allotment 112 of the parish of Echuca South; thence by a road westerly to the south-west angle of allotment 123 of the said parish; thence by a line south-westerly to the south-east angle of allotment 74A of the said parish; thence by a road westerly to the south-west angle of said allotment 74A; thence by a road northerly to the bank of the Campaspa River, at the north-west angle of allotment 58A of the said parish of Echuca South; thence easterly, north-easterly, and north-westerly by the Campaspa River to the north-west angle of allotment 39 of the parish of Echuca North; thence by a line easterly to the north-east angle of allotment 31 of the said parish; thence by a road northerly to the north-west angle of allotment 49 of the said parish; thence by a road easterly to the north-east angle of allotment 51 of the said parish; thence by a road southerly to the south-east angle of allotment 77 of the parish of Echuca South; thence by a road easterly to the north-east angle of allotment 93 of the said parish; thence by a road southerly to the south-east angle of allotment 90, parish of Nanneella, the commencing point aforesaid. WHEREAS by *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* it was amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly: And it was further enacted that if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations, or additions, or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should state:—

(a.) The amount of money which the Governor in Council would grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same, and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and also the rate of interest which would be charged for such loan, such rate being at least One-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted.

(b.) Should proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District.

(c.) Should state what are the principal works proposed to be constructed; and

(d.) Should contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the now in part recited Act) as according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case the Governor in Council should think fit.

And it was further enacted by *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883* that the Governor in Council might, where a Waterworks District is either wholly or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof within one or more ridings of any municipal district, appoint the councillors for such riding or ridings, together with any other persons not exceeding three in number, to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such district. Now therefore His Excellency the

Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the councillors of the Mountain riding of the Shire of Gisborne, for a loan of One thousand pounds to carry out certain waterworks for the domestic supply of a waterworks district under the said Act, embracing certain land within the said riding, as shown on the general plan and description accompanying the said application deposited in the Department of Mines and Water Supply, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

(1.) The construction of the said waterworks as are herein-after described.

(2.) The councillors of the Mountain riding of the Shire of Gisborne for the time being, and Thomas Christian, to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such district.

(3.) That the amount of the loan hereby granted shall be One thousand pounds sterling, for the purpose of carrying out approved works and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payment of which interest shall be made half-yearly.

(4.) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be the lands included within the Mountain riding of the Shire of Gisborne hereinafter described, that is to say:—In the parish of Macedon, commencing at the north-east corner of allotment 4 of section vi.; thence south-westerly along the north boundary of the said allotment to the north-west corner thereof; thence by the west boundary of the said allotment in a south-easterly direction to the north-west corner of allotment 3 of section vi.; thence by the north boundary of the same north-easterly to the north-east corner of the same; thence south-easterly by the north-east boundary of allotments 3, 2, and 1 of section vi. to the south-east corner of said allotment 1; thence north-easterly along the southern boundary of allotments 6 B and 7 of section vi. to the south-east corner of said allotment 7; thence in a general direction southerly along the Willimigongon Creek to the south-east corner of allotment 4 of section i.; thence westerly along the south boundary of said allotment 4 and by the same line produced across the main road to a point in the eastern boundary of allotment 10, same section; thence south-easterly along the eastern boundary of said allotment 10 to the south-eastern corner thereof; thence westerly along the south boundary of the same allotment to the Turitable Creek; thence in a general direction northerly along the Turitable Creek to the north-west corner of allotment 12 of section ii.; thence easterly along the north boundary of the said allotment to the north-east corner of the same; thence north-east to the south angle of allotment 6 of section iii.; thence northerly by the west boundary of allotments 6, 7, 8, and 9 of section iii. and 1 of section v. to the north-west corner of said allotment 1; thence westerly by the north boundary of allotment 2 of section v. to the Turitable Creek; thence in a general direction northerly along the Turitable Creek to the north-west corner of allotment 5 of section v.; thence north twenty-three degrees forty-five minutes west two thousand six hundred and seven links; thence north thirty-two degrees one minute west seven hundred links; thence north seven degrees thirteen minutes west five hundred and twenty-two links; thence north thirty-two degrees three minutes west four hundred and twenty-three links; thence north seventy-two degrees twenty-seven minutes west one hundred and ninety-five links; thence north seventy-three degrees fifty minutes west four hundred and sixty-six links; thence south eighty-seven degrees forty-seven minutes west four hundred and four links; thence north eighty-seven degrees thirty-one minutes west one thousand nine hundred and thirteen links; thence north forty degrees forty-three minutes west two hundred and seven links; thence north fifty-four degrees forty seven minutes west two hundred and eighty-nine links; thence north thirty-four degrees twelve minutes west three hundred and eighty-three links; thence north two degrees twenty-three minutes west three hundred and seventy-four links; thence north nine degrees thirty-seven minutes east four hundred and twenty-five links; thence south twenty-six degrees forty-four minutes east three thousand nine hundred and forty-four links; thence south thirty-one degrees east three thousand eight hundred and fifty links to the north-eastern angle of allotment 4 of section vi., the commencing point aforesaid.

(5.) That the principal works to be constructed shall consist of the following, viz.:—

(a.) Bringing water from the Turitable Creek to the village of Upper Macedon by means of a line of cast-iron and wrought-iron pipes, of a total estimated length of one hundred and ninety chains, be the same more or less.

(b.) Purchasing three-inch cast-iron, and two-inch, one and three-quarters-inch, and one-inch wrought-iron pipes for the above purpose, in the estimated quantities following, be the same more or less:—

Of 3" cast-iron pipes	30 chains.
Of 2" and 1½" wrought-iron pipes	138 chains.
Of 1" wrought-iron pipes	22 chains.

(c.) Constructing four tanks or cisterns at different points along the line of pipe, in order to equalize the pressure in the mains.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations made in pursuance of *The Victorian Conservation Act 1881* (No. 716, sec. 44).

REGULATION OF PROCEEDINGS OF THE SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA WATERWORKS TRUST AND ITS OFFICERS.

REGULATION of the Shire of Yarrawonga Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of *The Water Conservation Act 1881* and *The Water Conservation Act 1883*, made by the said Trust this seventh day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

REGULATIONS.

1. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. *Minutes of meetings to be read at next subsequent meeting.*—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at such preceding meeting; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the chairman of the meeting; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Trust at any meeting may be read at the close of such meeting.

3. *Order of business at meetings.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid the order of the business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follow, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the convenience of the Trust at any meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- I. Reading copies of letters sent by authority of the Trust.
- II. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- III. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- IV. Presentation of reports of committees.
- V. Payments.
- VI. Ordinary business.
- VII. Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- VIII. Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- IX. Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- X. Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice-paper thereof.

4. *Divisions.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any commissioner the commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. *Addresses to the Governor.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

6. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the secretary of the Trust at the close of the meeting of the Trust, or, if not required by law to be given at a meeting then, three clear days prior to the next meeting of the Trust; and the secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. *Notice of motion to be given.*—No commissioner shall make any motion initiating a subject but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. *Petitions.*—No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

9. *Motions to be moved in order in motion book.*—Except by leave of the Trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the secretary of the Trust in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. *Motion to be proceeded with by commissioner giving same except with consent.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with, in the absence of the commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. *Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.*—No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

12. *Order, &c., of debate.*—Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment, must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

14. *Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

15. *Motion to be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded, but a commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. *Mover of motion.*—A commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.
17. *Designation of commissioners.*—The commissioners in meeting of the Trust shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of chairman or commissioner, as the case may require.
18. *Priority of commissioners.*—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.
19. *Chairman to rise in addressing the Trust.*—The chairman shall rise in addressing the Trust to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.
20. *Commissioner not to speak second time on same question.*—No commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.
21. *Points of order.*—The chairman, when called on to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.
22. *Commissioners not to digress, &c.*—No commissioner shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other commissioner in a previous debate, and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.
23. *Commissioner to apologise for disorderly, &c., expression.*—Whenever any commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.
24. *Commissioner called to order to sit down.*—A commissioner, when called to order, shall sit down unless permitted to explain.
25. *Commissioner twice offending liable to a penalty.*—Any commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw and apologise for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of these regulations.
26. *Strangers.*—Any person not being a commissioner who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of these regulations.
27. *Commissioner not attending order for a call.*—Any commissioner not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole of the commissioners of the Trust, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of these regulations.
28. *Commissioner may demand documents.*—Any commissioner may of right demand the production of any documents applying to the question under discussion.
29. *Voting.*—The Trust shall vote by a show of hands, and any commissioner present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of these regulations.
30. *Question how declared.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Trust, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.
31. *Motions, &c., to be in writing.*—At every meeting of the Trust all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.
32. *No second amendment until previous one disposed of.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment has been disposed of.
33. *Effect of rejection of words in original motion.*—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.
34. *If amendment be negatived a second one may be moved.*—If an amendment be negatived then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Trust for discussion at a time.
35. *Mover of motion to have right of reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.
36. *Motion for adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Trust, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.
37. *Protests.*—Any commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall, in every case, be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days, at least, before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary of the Trust, and be signed by such commissioner, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given, previous to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth or in terms disrespectful to the Trust.
38. *Lapsed questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted, by the number of the commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was interrupted, on motion, upon notice.
39. *Lapsed order of the day may be restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-book for a future day, on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.
40. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committees' minute-book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the Trust; and the secretary of the Trust, when practicable, shall attend all the meetings of committees.

57. *Penalties.*—If any person shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

- All fees must be paid to the treasurer before the ground is opened.
- The charges will be remitted for the burial of any poor person on evidence being produced to the trustees that the friends of such person are not able to pay such fees.
- The name, age, late place of residence, and date of death of deceased, with cause of death, and denomination, must be stated at the giving of the order for burial.
- On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument or fence in the cemetery being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted in the form set forth in the schedule.
- All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair at the expense of the owner.
- Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
- All persons found destroying the fences, or in any manner injuring the cemetery, will be prosecuted as the law directs.
- When a meeting of trustees is required, it shall be called by the secretary; three to form a quorum.
- The trustees reserve the right of making any alterations, from time to time, in their regulations, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council.
- The friends of the deceased must cause all graves to be dug, and erect all monuments, tombs, or fences, under the direction of the trustees, or whom they may appoint.
- For all graves the coffin to be not less than three feet from the surface.
- No vehicle will be allowed to enter the cemetery ground.
- The hours for interment shall be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. during the other months, with the exception of Sundays, when the hours shall be from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

14. No new grave can be made without paying for the ground, or satisfying the trustees that it has been already paid for.
 15. All fees and charges to be paid to the secretary, from whom the key of the gates can be had.

BOROUGH OF CARISBROOK.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

A Bye-law of the Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Carisbrook for regulating the times of cleansing and managing of earth-closets, privies, and places for the deposit of nightsoil or other refuse matter, and for regulating the disinfecting or deodorizing of the nightsoil, blood, offal, or other refuse matter contained therein or removed therefrom; and for the prevention of nuisance or injury to health from the transport, deposit, or use as manure of nightsoil, offal, blood, or other offensive matter.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Carisbrook, in the colony of Victoria, being the municipal council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Act 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board, in this behalf and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board of health, doth make the following Bye-law No. 1 of the said local board of health, that is to say:—

The occupier of any house, building, or premises within the borough of Carisbrook shall cause the yard and ground adjacent or belonging thereto to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all rubbish and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such rubbish or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

Stables, cow-sheds, and pigsties.—The occupier of any land in the borough of Carisbrook on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of any such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the local board of health at the expense of such occupier.

Cleansing of cesspools.—The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the borough of Carisbrook shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of six inches from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except by some nightman duly authorized or licensed as such by the local authority for the said borough of Carisbrook, and that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodoriser sufficient to effectually deodorise and disinfect the same.

Emptying receptacles for nightsoil.—Every occupier and every person having the arrangement or control of any premises once at least in every week shall empty and cleanse or shall cause to be emptied or cleansed every earth-closet, privy, or place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

Nightsoil to be removed by licensed nightmen only.—No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom, duly licensed by the municipality.

Places for disposal of nightsoil.—All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board of health from time to time for the final reception of same

and every person so placing or depositing or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place shall immediately on the deposit thereof cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

Noxious and offensive trades.—The occupier of any premises within the borough of Carisbrook used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever shall cause all rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquids, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom at least once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if the occupier of any such premises shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any such offensive matter it may be removed by the local board of health or their officers at the expense of such occupier.

Every closet pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street or lane exceeding 16 ft. in width.

Penalties.—Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this Bye-law No. 1 shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty or sum not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or, if such breach be a continuing act or default, shall forfeit and pay a penalty or sum for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings.

This bye-law shall be in force and have effect within the whole of the said borough of Carisbrook.

The foregoing Bye-law No. 1 was duly made and passed by the local board of health in and for the borough of Carisbrook upon this fifth day of October One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.






