When last visited it was estimated to be some four miles long by two miles wide, and 300 feet high.

I shall be obliged if you will inform all owners and masters of vessels who clear from your port for these seas of this fact.

Dear Sir,—I beg to report the existence of a new island (volcano). The position is in lat. $20^{\circ} 20'$ S., long. $175^{\circ} 25'$ W., by good bearings, afterwards confirmed by the bearing from the anchorage, Nukualofa, from which it bears N.N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. forty-nine miles. On the 16th October it was about two miles long, and from 100 to 200 feet high, but continually increasing in size from matter thrown up by a crater on the E.N.E. side of the island.

We first observed it on the morning of the 16th October, and ran within eight miles of it for the purpose of verifying its position. It was not safe to go nearer, as the wind was falling light and the current setting towards it, but being a clear day we were able to get good bearings and note its exact position. It was still active when we left Tonga on the 21st October, and by last reports was 300 feet high and four miles long.

When an inspector of sheep has to travel 20 miles or more to examine any sheep about to be introduced into this colony at any of the crossing-places proclaimed as such on the boundaries of this colony, he shall be entitled to charge and receive from the owner or person in charge of such sheep expenses at the rate of Fifteen shillings per day for the time he is absent from his station in making such examination.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA AND CONSTITUTION OF NEW SHIRE.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, sec. 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz. :—

The Petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Waranga which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Waranga and constituted a new shire, under the name or title of "The Shire of Rodney."

Area described in the petition :—
Commencing at the north-west angle of Kyabram East; thence due east along the northern boundary of said parish to the south-west corner of the parish of Undera; thence due north along the west boundary of said parish of Undera to the centre of the Goulburn River; thence south by the centre of said Goulburn River to the south-east corner of the parish of North Murchison; thence westward along the southern boundary of the said parish of North Murchison to the south-west angle of the said parish of North Murchison; thence north along the western boundary of the said parish of North Murchison to the north-west angle of the said parish of North Murchison; thence west along the southern boundary of the parish of Girgaree East to the south-west angle of the said parish of Girgaree East; thence due north along western boundary of parishes of Girgaree East and Kyabram East to the point of commencement, and comprising the parishes of Undera, Coomboola, Mooroolbark, Mooroolbark West, Kyabram East, Girgaree East, Toolamba, Toolamba West, and North Murchison.

Petitioners say that in consequence of the great distance from the seat of local government they are unable to get suitable representation; further, that Rushworth being a mining town, and the petitioners agriculturists, no community of interest exists between them; that the Shire of Waranga is unworkable from its large size, and proper supervision of contracts cannot be exercised, and if the new shire was constituted the rates would be more judiciously expended; that the area of the proposed shire is 300 square miles, with a revenue from a shilling rate alone of £2000.

TOWN OF GEELONG.

BYE-LAW No. 3.

A bye-law for the registration of cowkeepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk, and for cleansing milk stores and shops, and the suppression of any nuisances connected therewith.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the local board of health for the Town of Geelong doth hereby make the bye-law following, that is to say:—

1. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of January in every year, register himself with the local board of health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the local board of health an application in the form contained in the schedule hereto; and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of two shillings and sixpence.

2. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary of the local board of health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

3. Every person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale, to be kept thoroughly clean.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report in writing to the health officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in any person or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

5. Every person who shall commit a breach of this bye-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings.

6. This bye-law shall apply to, and be in force, in the whole of the place or places within the jurisdiction of the local board of health for the Town of Geelong.

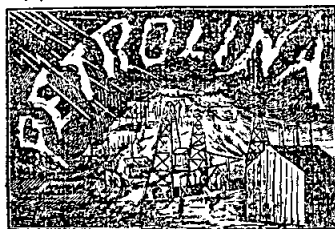
