REGULATIONS FOR THE VICTORIAN MILITARY

FORCES. At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-eighth of December 1885.

WHERAS by The Discipline Act 1870 it was provided that the Governor in Council might make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order make the following additions and alterations to Part 3, section 1, of the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces, that is to say:—

Part 3. Section 1

Sub-heading "Married Establishment."—The figures "(1), (2), and (3)" are ordered to be omitted.

Sub-heading "4. Drill Instructors."—The figure 4 is hereby

Sub-heading "4. Drill Instructors."—The figure 4 is hereby altered to 3.

After paragraph under sub-heading "3. Drill Instructors," the following paragraph is ordered to be inserted, viz.:—

4. Perunent Staff of Torpedo Corps.—Non-commissioned officers and sappers receive a free kit on joining, and a supply of clothing on the same scale as the Victorian Artillery.

Conditions of Service.—Men to engage for five years, with the option, if approved by the Commandant, of extending their service for a second period of five years on the completion of their first five years.

Recruits to be, if possible, artisans, and to be engaged and sworn in under the Discipline Act, to be not less than 19 or more than 35 years of age, minimum height 5 feet 8 inches, chest measurement not less than 35 inches, of good character, able to read and write, and to pass the medical examination.

Men recently discharged from the Imperial service under 45 years, and men of special qualifications, may be engaged and sworn in, if approved by the Commandant, provided they pass the medical examination, although they do not comply in every respect with the above conditions.

Deferred pay.—Sixpence per diem will be retained from the pay of all non-commissioned officers and sappers during the whole of their service as deferred pay, to be drawn on discharge.

Non-commissioned officers and sappers dismissed or discharged for misconduct, or on account of bad character, to forfeit all claim to deferred pay, if so directed by the Commandant.

One shilling per diem to be retained from pay to meet expenses of rations.

No man can claim his discharge until the expiration of his term of service, but a man of good character may, if he be permitted by the Commandant, purchase his discharge for £20.

GRANTS FOR AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES, PARKS AND GARDENS, AND HORTICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named Grants-in-Aid 1885-86, viz.:—

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Fifteen thousand pounds (£15,000) granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies 1885-80.

- 1. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February 1886, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.
- form marked E.

 2. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement so verified, the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to two-thirds of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes not exceeding £25 each (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to, and such other exhibits the Minister may consider unsuitable), on condition that this sum do not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.
- 3. Of the whole grant (£15,000), a sum not exceeding Fourteen thousand five hundred and ten pounds shall be so divided; and if the sums claimable be in excess of this amount they shall be reduced pro rate.

 4. A sum of Four hundred and ninety pounds shall be paid to the Clunes and Tallot District United Agricultural Society towards the expenses of its spring show, held on the 8th and 9th October 1885, under the patronage of the Department of Agriculture.
- 5. No society located within twenty miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such society as hereinbefore specified amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least.

Instructions.

- 1. The blank spaces in the declaration, form E, for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations, between the 1st January 1885 and the 31st December 1885, must be filled up in words as well as in figures, and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.
- 2. The account, when received, must be signed by the treasurer and be countersigned by the president, or the vice-president, or by

t wo members of the committee of management. It should then be returned to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne.

3. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid unless such cups have been finally awarded.

NOTE.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

Regulations in connection with the Vote of Nine thousand five hundred pounds (£1550) for Fencing and Improving Public Parks and Gardens under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c.

Trustees, Committees of Management, &c.

1. A sum not exceeding Ten shillings shall be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 1st January 1885 and 31st December 1885, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 1st February 1886. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the form B.

- 2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st of January 1885 and 31st December 1885; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the abovementioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January 1885.

 3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1884 (ride form A), and a sum equal to one-half of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of Eight thousand seven hundred and sixty-six pounds two shillings and nine pence, they shall be reduced pro rata.

Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Five hundred pounds granted by Parliament to Horticultural Societies, 1885-6.

1. That each society claiming to participate in the grant shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st

February 1886, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.

2. The distribution of the vote will be made one month after the above-mentioned date, when a sum equal to the amount of the prize money awarded and paid away will be allotted to each society having a claim, and be made payable to the treasurer thereof, provided that the sums claimed do not exceed in the whole Five hundred pounds, and if they do exceed this amount then they will be reduced pro rata, and the allotment made accordingly.

3. No society whose expenditure in prizes between the 1st January 1885 and the 31st December 1885 amounts in the total to less than Fifty pounds shall be entitled to participate in the

For keeping free from noisone matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter yards, dec., and for regulating the management of curth-closets, privies, dec., disinfecting and deodorising nightsoit and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

The E Local Board of Health in and for the City of Sandhurst, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to nots done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health and immediately after its publication in the Gorenment Gacette.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said city

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said city shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a missance or injurious to health, and shall cause all flith, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said city on which there shall be erected any stable, cowyard, cattleshed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises, as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within

the occupier of such premises shall noglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said city shall cause every cosspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time, as soon as any portion of the contents of such cosspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cosspool. Provided that the contents of any cosspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Twelve p.m. and Five a.m.; and provided also that the contents of any cosspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Twelve p.m. and Five a.m.; and provided also that the contents of any cosspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have been mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodoriser sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorise and disinfect the same.

Every occupier and every porson having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week compty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cosspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and finished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effuvia therefrom.

In the City of Sandhurst a nightman licensed by the municipal authorities shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for such removal of nightsoil.

9. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or therefore the premise of any

13. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding 10 feet in width.

Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of ten pounds for every such breach, or of five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than five shillings—to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than five shillings—to be readil; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that the local board of health may be emprovered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fuminated, disinfected, or limewashed, as may be in any such order

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or

member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid faver or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force who shall immediately inform the local board of health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until. in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper; dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be
