REGULATIONS FOR THE VICTORIAN MILITARY FORCES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-eighth of December 1885.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it was provided that the Governor in Council might make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time amend, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order make the following additions and alterations to Part 3, section 1, of the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces, that is to say:-

Part 3, Section 1.

Sub-heading "*Married Establishment.*"—The figures "(1), (2), and (3)" are ordered to be omitted.

Sub-heading "*4. Drill Instructors.*"—The figure 4 is hereby altered to 3.

After paragraph under sub-heading "*3. Drill Instructors,*" the following paragraph is ordered to be inserted, viz.:-

4. *Permanent Staff of Torpedo Corps.*—Non-commissioned officers and sappers receive a free kit on joining, and a supply of clothing on the same scale as the Victorian Artillery.

*Conditions of Service.*—Men to engage for five years, with the option, if approved by the Commandant, of extending their service for a second period of five years on the completion of their first five years.

Recruits to be, if possible, artisans, and to be engaged and sworn in under the Discipline Act, to be not less than 19 or more than 35 years of age, minimum height 5 feet 8 inches, chest measurement not less than 35 inches, of good character, able to read and write, and to pass the medical examination.

Men recently discharged from the Imperial service under 45 years, and men of special qualifications, may be engaged and sworn in, if approved by the Commandant, provided they pass the medical examination, although they do not comply in every respect with the above conditions.

*Deferred pay.*—Sixpence per diem will be retained from the pay of all non-commissioned officers and sappers during the whole of their service as deferred pay, to be drawn on discharge.

Non-commissioned officers and sappers dismissed or discharged for misconduct, or on account of bad character, to forfeit all claim to deferred pay, if so directed by the Commandant.

One shilling per diem to be retained from pay to meet expenses of rations.

No man can claim his discharge until the expiration of his term of service, but a man of good character may, if he be permitted by the Commandant, purchase his discharge for £20.

And the Honorable Frederick Thomas Sargood, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

GRANTS FOR AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES, PARKS AND GARDENS, AND HORTICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named Grants-in-Aid 1885-86, viz. :—

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Fifteen thousand pounds (£15,000) granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies 1885-86.

1. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February 1886, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.

2. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement so verified, the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to two-thirds of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes not exceeding £25 each (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to, and such other exhibits the Minister may consider unsuitable), on condition that this sum do not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

3. Of the whole grant (£15,000), a sum not exceeding Fourteen thousand five hundred and ten pounds shall be so divided; and if the sums claimable be in excess of this amount they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. A sum of Four hundred and ninety pounds shall be paid to the Clunes and Talbot District United Agricultural Society towards the expenses of its spring show, held on the 8th and 9th October 1885, under the patronage of the Department of Agriculture.

5. No society located within twenty miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such society as hereinbefore specified amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least.

Instructions.

1. The blank spaces in the declaration, form E, for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations, between the 1st January 1885 and the 31st December 1885, must be filled up in words as well as in figures, and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account, when received, must be signed by the treasurer and be countersigned by the president, or the vice-president, or by

two members of the committee of management. It should then be returned to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne.

3. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid unless such cups have been finally awarded.

NOTE.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

Regulations in connection with the Vote of Nine thousand five hundred pounds (£9500) for Fencing and Improving Public Parks and Gardens under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c.

1. A sum not exceeding Ten shillings shall be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 1st January 1885 and 31st December 1885, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 1st February 1886. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st of January 1885 and 31st December 1885; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January 1885.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1884 (vide form A), and a sum equal to one-half of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of Eight thousand seven hundred and sixty-six pence two shillings and nine pence, they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. In every case in which a claim sent in is deemed unsatisfactory, an officer of the department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

5. Moneys expended in street planting or in fencing, formation or maintenance of land for racing, cricket, football, croquet, tennis, bowling, quoits, or other sports, or in erection or repairs of stands or pavilions for the purpose of witnessing sports, must not be included in any claim upon the vote.

6. The foregoing shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melbourne, or to the Edinburgh Garden, Fitzroy, or the Botanical Garden, Geelong.

7. A sum of Five hundred pounds shall be paid to the Trustees of the Royal Park, Melbourne, to be expended on such works as may be approved by the Minister of Agriculture, and on production of proof of expenditure during the year 1885 of a sum of One thousand pounds on improvements within the park.

Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Five hundred pounds granted by Parliament to Horticultural Societies, 1885-6.

1. That each society claiming to participate in the grant shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st

February 1886, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.

2. The distribution of the vote will be made one month after the above-mentioned date, when a sum equal to the amount of the prize money awarded and paid away will be allotted to each society having a claim, and be made payable to the treasurer thereof, provided that the sums claimed do not exceed in the whole Five hundred pounds, and if they do exceed this amount then they will be reduced *pro rata*, and the allotment made accordingly.

3. No society whose expenditure in prizes between the 1st January 1885 and the 31st December 1885 amounts in the total to less than Fifty pounds shall be entitled to participate in the vote.

Instructions.

1. The blank spaces in the declaration form E for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations between the 1st January 188 and the 31st December 188 must be filled up in words as well as in figures; and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account is then to be prepared by making the Government *Dr.* for the amount declared to have been awarded and paid away in prizes.

3. The account must be signed by the treasurer, and be countersigned by the president or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management; it should then be returned to the Department of Agriculture with the declaration and statements appended.

*It may expedite the payment of the money to fill in at the top of the account the name of the nearest post office in the space left blank for the purpose. It is necessary to bear in mind that, if that space be not filled up, the account will be payable at Melbourne only.*

4. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid, unless such cups have been finally awarded.

NOTE.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

MELBOURNE RACES, NEW YEAR'S DAY, 1ST JANUARY 1886. VICTORIAN CLUB RACES, SATURDAY, 9TH JANUARY 1886.

On each of the above mentioned dates trains will run from Spencer street between 10.30 a.m. and 2 p.m., and at 2.30 and 3 p.m. The usual arrangements as to entrance at Spencer street will be carried out.

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR'S AND SEASIDE EXCURSIONS.

Holiday Excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (Suburban lines excepted) from the 18th December 1885 to the 5th January 1886, both days inclusive (Sundays excepted), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example—An excursion ticket issued on the 22nd December will be available till the 22nd January. When the last day falls on a Sunday, the tickets will be available till next day. The journey must be commenced on the day the ticket is issued, but after a distance of fifteen (15) miles has been travelled, the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger.

*Sydney Excursion Tickets.*—From the 15th December to the 5th January, both days inclusive, excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne to Sydney at the following return fares:—1st class, £5 6s. 6d.; 2nd class, £4 1s. These tickets will be available for two calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the express trains on the New South Wales line. The second-class tickets will be available by the Victorian Railways express trains as far as Wodonga only.

*Luggage.*—Excursion passengers will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van must be at the station half-an-hour before the train starts, and pay Stamped Parcels rate for it.

*Horses and Vehicles.*—From the 22nd December to the 8th January, both days inclusive, the Department cannot engage to forward horses and vehicles by any particular train.

*Commercial Travellers' Samples.*—From the 22nd December to the 5th January, commercial travellers' samples will not be taken to or from roadside stations except by mixed or goods trains.

*North Melbourne and Newmarket Stations.*—By the early morning down trains on 1st January tickets will not be issued at North Melbourne or Newmarket stations for country stations, and down country trains will not stop there. On the same date the up North-Eastern train will not stop at Newmarket. The 5.10 p.m. down and the 6.43 a.m. up mixed trains are excepted from the foregoing arrangement.

*Goods Sheds Holiday.*—The 1st January will be observed as a holiday in the Goods Branch, and goods trains will not run. Perishable goods will, however, be delivered at all stations on application. Consignees of powder can ascertain from the

#### CITY OF SANDHURST.—LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

##### BYE-LAW NO. 2.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noisome trades, slaughter-yards, &c., and for regulating the management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorising nightsoil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the City of Sandhurst, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said city.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said city shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said city on which there shall be erected any stable, cowyard, cattleshed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises, as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said city shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time, as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Twelve p.m. and Five a.m.; and provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have been mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodoriser sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorise and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil or on belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and finished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

In the City of Sandhurst a nightman licensed by the municipal authorities shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for such removal of nightsoil.

9. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than 6 inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the city used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance, or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

13. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding 10 feet in width.

14. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of ten pounds for every such breach, or of five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than five shillings—to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that the local board of health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

**BYE-LAW No. 1, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.**  
**THE** Local Board of Health in and for the City of Sandhurst, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being bye-law No. 1 of the said local board of health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.
2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in and throughout the city of Sandhurst.

**REGISTRATION OF COWKEEPERS, DAIRYMEN, AND PURVEYORS OF MILK.**

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of January in every year, register himself with the local board of health in manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the secretary of the local board of health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of Five shillings per annum.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary for the local board of health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said local board, and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or limewashed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or

member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice [thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force who shall immediately inform the local board of health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

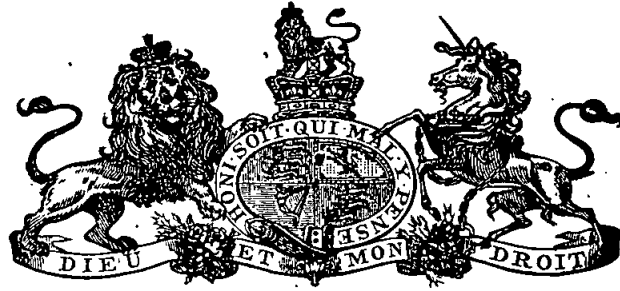
