WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the village hereinafter mentioned to be a District wherein publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR VOLUNTEER CADET CORPS.

THE Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the subjoined Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. Cadet companies may be established in schools, in detachments of not less than 20 at any one school.
2. Detachments or companies shall only be formed in schools where a teacher is qualified to instruct (the qualification to be a certificate from the Military School of Instruction or the commanding officer, *vide* paragraph 12), or where the services of a qualified drill instructor are available at least twice a week.
3. No boy shall be enrolled under the age of 13 years in State schools and 13 years in grammar schools, except with the approval of the commandant, and he must have the consent of his parents or guardian.
4. The detachments or companies shall be drilled not less than twice each week, each drill to be not less than half an hour.
5. The various detachments shall be formed into companies, and battalions shall be formed in suitable localities, to consist of not less than four companies.
6. The various companies shall assemble for battalion drill not less than four times a year, two of which shall be half-yearly general musters.
7. Arms and accoutrements shall be kept in the school, and be used only for drill purposes. The head master shall be held responsible for the preservation of all Government property issued to him, reasonable wear and tear excepted.
8. Any cadet who may use the carbine or rifle issued to him for any other purpose than parades, drills, or target practices, shall be dismissed from the company.
9. The cadet companies shall be under the command of the military commandant, and shall be inspected at least once every six months by an officer detailed from head quarters.
10. The course of training shall be as prescribed by orders issued from head quarters.
11. Cadets must appear (on all occasions) either in the authorized uniform of the company or in purely civilian dress.
12. The various companies shall be under the general command of an officer duly appointed, who will be designated the commanding officer.
13. The commanding officer may appoint non-commissioned officers, and may, subject to the approval of the military commandant, also appoint acting subalterns.
14. All applications for the formation of companies or detachments must be forwarded by the commanding officer through the military commandant to the Minister for the approval of the Governor in Council.
15. Applications for enrolment must be sent for approval to the commanding officer, stating name and age of each boy. The commanding officer will be held responsible that the provisions of sec. 3 are complied with.
16. Drill instructors of the Victorian Military Forces may be detailed, at such times as they are not required for their ordinary duties, to drill cadet companies or detachments in grammar, public, and State schools, and shall receive from such school 2s. 6d. for each drill.
17. State school teachers who receive pay for instruction in drill shall be responsible for the military training of the cadet companies or detachments in their respective schools, and shall be liable to be called upon to act as officers of the corps in their respective schools or districts.
18. Members of any cadet company may, after leaving school, still remain members of the company until they are 19 years of age; or, if above the age of 17 years, may be enrolled in any corps of militia, provided they fulfil the regulations as regards height and physique, and have served in a cadet corps for not less than 2 years.
19. Arms and stores issued by the Government shall be inspected by order of the military commandant at least every three months; and, where there is any evidence of neglect or wilful damage, the stores may be at once called in, and the person responsible for such damage be called upon to defray the cost of all repairs.
20. Every member shall deliver up to the appointed officer, in good order and condition, fair wear and tear alone excepted, any Government property which may have been issued to him.
21. The non-commissioned officers of the cadet companies shall be appointed from the ranks of the force, and shall have distinguishing badges to designate their rank.
22. In the case of any company being unfavorably reported on at the half-yearly inspection, the military commandant may dobar such company from taking part in any rifle or other military competition till the next inspection.
23. Any company which is unfavorably reported on at three successive half-yearly inspections will be disbanded.
24. An officer must be present with the boys at target practice, and must exercise the utmost vigilance to prevent accidents, observing that *each boy handles his rifle with the care necessary to prevent the possibility of danger to himself or others.* (Where no officer is competent to undertake the work, it will be necessary to secure the services of a drill instructor.) The ammunition must be retained in the officer's own possession, being handed, one round at a time only, to each boy as he is about to load, and every precaution must be taken to ensure that none remains in the hands of the boys at the close of the practice. The officer must see that each boy aims at the proper target; that, should the "Danger"

flag be raised at the mantlet, the firing is stopped, and the red flag raised at his firing point; and that the boys are kept close together in rear of the one firing.

25. Ammunition shall only be issued to cadets certified by the commanding officer as qualified to use it.
 26. The power in regard to ordinary promotions of non-commissioned officers, and to reductions to a lower grade or to the ranks, will be exercised by the commanding officer. The power of dismissal from the company for misconduct, &c., will also be exercised by this officer, subject to the approval of the military commandant.
 27. All correspondence relative to cadet companies shall invariably be addressed to the commanding officer.
 28. Uniform—
Jumper: Blue, faced with red.
Trousers: Blue.
Cap: Blue.
 29. Accoutrements—
Waist-belt and pouch (no cross-belt).
 30. Minimum establishment of company—
3 Lieutenants.
1 Colour-sergeant.
3 Sergeants.
4 Corporals.
1 Bugler.
60 Privates, of whom 4 may be acting corporals if required.
- Total, 72 All ranks.
Increase in number of privates will carry a proportionate increase of non-commissioned officers.
31. Cadets on leaving the companies, provided they have also left school, may obtain from the commanding officer a certificate of discharge, specifying length of service and general conduct.
 32. The head master of each school in which a detachment or company is formed will keep the muster-roll book of the prescribed form, and be responsible that such returns as are required by head quarters be forwarded to the commanding officer.

PROCLAMATION UNDER THE GUNPOWDER ACT REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Importation and Custody of Gunpowder Statute 1864* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council might proclaim any town, township, or borough, not being a seaport town, as a district into which no gunpowder should be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine; and if any person should bring more than one hundred pounds of gunpowder into any such district, and should not forthwith deposit the same in a magazine as aforesaid, it should be forfeited: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-first day of August A.D. One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, the Borough of Ararat was constituted a district into which no gunpowder should be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke from and after the first day of March One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five the Proclamation hereinafore mentioned, whereby the Borough of Ararat was constituted a district into which no gunpowder should be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine.

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby abolish the undermentioned commons, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE CAMPERDOWN FARMERS' COMMON, proclaimed by Order of the 18th March 1861, and increased by Order of the 21st January 1862.—(84.H.26773.)
