IN pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by "*The Trades Unions Act 1884*," and of every other power and authority enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION.

1. Every application to register a Trade Union shall be sent to the Registrar in Form A annexed hereto, and shall be supported by a statutory declaration in Form B annexed hereto. Form A.

CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION.

2. The certificate of the registration of a Trade Union shall be in Form C annexed hereto. Form C.

IDENTITY OF NAMES FORBIDDEN.

3. The Registrar shall not register a Trade Union under a name identical with that of any other existing Trade Union known to him, whether registered or not registered, or so nearly resembling such name as to be likely to deceive the members or the public.

VERIFICATION OF CHANGES OF OFFICERS AND RULES.

4. The statement of changes of officers, and the copies of alterations of rules and new rules made by Trade Unions, and the copies of the rules of Trade Unions as they exist, transmitted to the Registrar in accordance with section 22 of the Trades Unions Act, shall be verified by a statutory declaration in Form D hereto annexed. Form D.

MODIFICATION OF FORMS.

5. When anything is required to be in any of the forms hereto annexed, it shall be sufficient if it be to the like effect, and any of such forms may be modified by the authority of the Registrar to suit particular cases, and the Registrar may require further evidence by statutory declaration in addition to that expressly prescribed by the foregoing regulations in any case in which to him it may seem expedient.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1834* it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, the Governor in Council might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part VIII. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove live wattle trees or bark from such trees on or from the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries of the Yea Town Common, and situate within a distance of one chain from either bank of the Yea River.—(85.A.14844.)

tised: Now therefore I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do hereby place under the temporary management and control of the undermentioned Waterworks Trust the water reserves comprised within the boundaries hereinafter referred to, that is to say:—

PUBLIC RESERVES HEREBY PLACED UNDER THE TEMPORARY MANAGEMENT AND CONTROL OF THE SHIRE OF SPAWELL WATERWORKS TRUST.

WALLALOO.—Forty acres, county of Kara Kara, parish of Wallaloo, being the site temporarily reserved, by Order of the 3rd July 1882, for Camping and for affording access to Water, and the portion of the land permanently reserved for Public purposes, by Order of the 23rd May 1881, comprised within the boundaries of that site, as described in the *Government Gazette* of the 7th July 1882.—(84.C.43289.)

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Mallee Pastoral Leases Act 1883* it was amongst other things enacted that the Local Committee should within thirty days from its appointment, and thereafter in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate or assessment, specifying the amount thereof to be paid by the owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its vermin district, in respect of each square mile of land owned, held under lease, or occupied, under the provisions of the said Act; and also in respect of the sheep or cattle depasturing thereon; and it was further enacted that such rate or assessment on being proclaimed by the Governor in Council in the *Government Gazette* should be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the vermin district for the current year for the purposes of the said Act, and should be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the Local Committee duly appointed for the Northern Vermin District has recommended a rate of Two shillings and sixpence per square mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said vermin district: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim an annual rate of Two shillings and sixpence per square mile to be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of lands within the Northern Vermin District for the current year.

The births of 987 children, viz., 493 boys and 494 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of January. In the month of December 961 births were registered, or 26 fewer than in the month under review. The births were 252 above the average of the previous ten years, but only 147 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in January numbered 592, viz., 321 of males, and 271 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 395. The deaths were fewer than those in December by 84, but exceeded the average of January during the previous ten years by 19. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than the average in those ten years by 63.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.24, and of deaths registered 1.94.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 98.4° on the 12th, and the lowest was 42.0° on the 28th. The mean temperature of the month (64.2°) was nearly 1½ degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (46.4°) took place on the 3rd, viz., from a maximum of 94.4° to a minimum of 48.0°. The least range (9.8°) was on the 13th, viz., from a maximum of 68.3° to a minimum of 58.5°. The mean daily range was 23.0°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.888 inches) was a fraction above the average.

Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 43 per cent. to that mortality, as against 44 per cent. in January 1884; 18 per cent. in January 1883; 49 per cent. in January 1882; 45 per cent. in January 1881; 43 per cent. in January 1880; 44 per cent. in January 1879; 47 per cent. in January 1878; 49 per cent. in January 1877; 52 per cent. in January 1876; and 66 per cent. in January 1875.

Twenty-one persons died during the month who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years. Of these:—A female, aged 75, died of phlegmonous erysipelas; a female, aged 75, and a farmer, aged 85, of apoplexy; a female, aged 76, of paralysis; a laundress, aged 76, and a laborer, aged 83, of congestion of the lungs; a cabman, aged 77, and a female, aged 81, of cancer; a female, aged 77, and a gentleman, aged 81, of heart disease; a saddler, aged 78, of pneumonia; a dealer, aged 82, of nephritis; two females, each aged 76, a male pensioner, aged 79, a female and a baptist minister, each aged 80, a gentleman, aged 81, a female, aged 84, a surveyor, aged 87, and a laborer, aged 92, of old age.

Twenty-five deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 17 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide and 6 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 4, died of injury to the leg (cause not stated); a bottler, aged 13, of injury to the spine, caused by diving in shallow water; a compositor, aged 16, of injuries received by falling from a tree he was climbing; a tinsmith, aged 18, was killed by falling down stairs; a chemist, aged 61, died of injury to the leg, the result of a fall; a female, aged 33, of fracture of the leg, caused by a fall whilst under the influence of drink; a laborer, aged

24, of fracture of the spine, a wheelbarrow falling on him whilst at work; a seaman, aged 32, of injuries to the head, received on board ship; a contractor, aged 46, was crushed to death between the buffers of two coal trucks at the Spencer street railway station, and a farmer, aged 56, died of injuries received from a horse. A male infant, aged 7 months, died of burns; 2 schoolboys, aged 8 and 10 respectively, a bootcleaner, aged 20, and a male, of occupation unknown, were drowned, the two latter in the River Yarra; and a plasterer, aged 29, and a female, aged 30, were found drowned. The homicidal deaths were those of a female infant who was found dead, supposed to have been murdered at birth; and a boy, aged 5 years, who died of fracture of the skull, caused by being thrown out of a waggonette—verdict of manslaughter against the driver. The suicidal deaths were those of a male, occupation unknown, aged 34, and an accountant, aged 40, who shot themselves in the head; a warehouseman, aged 40, and a coachbuilder, aged 52, who cut their throats whilst of unsound mind; and a female, aged 28, and an army pensioner, aged 65, who hanged themselves.

Eighty-nine deaths, or 15 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—43 in the Melbourne Hospital, 8 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 8 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 2 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 287, of which 163, or 57 per cent., were of males, and 124, or 43 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 242 were under one year of age, 31 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 2 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 305. Of these, 158, or 52 per cent., were males, and 147, or 48 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 18 were between twenty and twenty-five, 27 were between twenty-five and thirty, 26 were between thirty and thirty-five, 18 were between thirty-five and forty, 35 were between forty and forty-five, 21 were between forty-five and fifty, 27 were between fifty and fifty-five, 23 were between fifty-five and sixty, 27 were between sixty and sixty-five, 13 were between sixty-five and seventy, 17 were between seventy and seventy-five, 10 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 11 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the previous month, a decrease took place in all classes of disease except the developmental, chiefly, however, in the zymotic and local classes, which fell from 153 to 129, and from 284 to 231 respectively. Under the former head, deaths from small-pox fell from 2 to nil, those from measles from 19 to 3, and those from dysentery and diarrhoea from 74 to 61. Under the latter head, deaths from diseases of the brain and nerves fell from 94 to 75, those from lung and chest affections from 68 to 46, and those from bowel and stomach complaints from 80 to 65. Only 6 deaths occurred among child-bearing women during the month, and comparing this number with the births, which numbered 987, it follows that 1 death of a mother took place to every 164 infants born alive. In the previous month, 11 deaths were due to circumstances attendant on child-birth, or 1 death of a mother to every 87 infants born alive.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Malvern, made under section 213 of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered 14, for regulating traffic through and over the roads and streets of the shire, and for preserving order therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the president, councillors, and ratepayers of the Shire of Malvern order as follows:—

1. Any street musician or vocalist shall, when required by any householder or his servant, or by any member of the police force, depart from the neighbourhood of the premises of such householder.

2. No procession of persons or of vehicles, or both, for other than funeral purposes, shall parade or pass through any of the streets or roads, unless with the previous consent in writing of the president, or, in his absence, the secretary of the shire, and only by the route specified in such consent, nor unless and until the recipients of such consent shall have given at the least twenty-four hours' notice, with the particulars of such consent and route, to the officer in charge at the police station.

3. Whenever for the prevention of accident or the maintenance of order, and for such time as by notice in writing under the hand or by direction of the president, or, in his absence or the case of any sudden emergency, under the hand of the shire secretary or the officer in charge of the police stationed at Malvern, any carriage way, foot way, street, or other public place shall be declared to be closed against traffic of vehicles or persons, or both, the drivers of vehicles and all persons contemplated by such notice shall, when so required by any member of the police force, obey and conform to such notice by abstaining from going or by withdrawing and removing from where mentioned therein. And the drivers of all vehicles, whether private or public, which may be there, shall, when so required by any member of the police force, remove their vehicles thence; and, if desiring to remain in the vicinity, shall proceed to any other carriage way, street, or public place which may be indicated by the police for that purpose, and there arrange and order their vehicles in the manner directed by any member of the police force.

4. Upon any occasion when any number exceeding ten vehicles shall be assembled and waiting at any one and the same place, the driver of every such vehicle shall, as to the placing and otherwise thereof, comply with the directions given by any member of the police force placed on duty there for the preservation of safety and order.

Being of the Local Board of Health Bye-law No. 2.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Public Health Amendment Statute 1883, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Local Board of Health for the city of Melbourne doth hereby make the bye-law following, that is to say:—  
No person shall use, cause to be used, or assist in using, any steam whistle at any factory or other establishment within the corporate limits of the city of Melbourne so as to be a nuisance to any person; and no person who occupies or has the management or control of any factory or other establishment shall suffer or permit any steam whistle to be used thereat, so as to be a nuisance to any person.

No. 19.—FEBRUARY 20, 1885.—3.

Every person who shall commit a breach of this bye-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings.
