The births of 779 children, viz., 407 boys and 372 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of November. In the month of October 917 births were registered, or 138 more than in the month under review. The births were 81 above the average of the previous ten years, but only 19 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in November numbered 586, viz., 330 of males, and 256 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 193. The deaths outnumbered those in October by 52, and exceeded the average of November during the previous ten years by 138. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have lower than the average of those ten years by 74.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 2.56, and of deaths registered 1.92.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 92.9° on the 20th, and the lowest was 41.7° on the 9th. The mean temperature of the month (59.5°) was about the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (37.6°) took place on the 20th, viz., from a maximum of 92.9° to a minimum of 55.3°. The least range (7.8°) was on the 7th, viz., from a maximum of 60.8° to a minimum of 53.0°. The mean daily range was 19.0°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.946 inches) was nearly an eighth of an inch above the average, and was, with one exception, the highest recorded in the month of November in the last 11 years. Rain fell on 13 days, the amount of rainfall being 3.11 inches.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 53 per cent. to that mortality, as against 45 per cent. in November 1883; 49 per cent. in November 1882; 38 per cent. in November 1881; 41 per cent. in November 1880; 39 per cent. in November 1879; 35 per cent. in November 1878; 42 per cent. in November 1877 and 1876; 46 per cent. in November 1875 and 47 per cent. in November 1874.

The deaths of twenty-two persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years was recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a female, aged 75, who died of bronchitis; another female, aged 75, of diarrhoea; an accountant, aged 75, of old age; a female, aged 76, of dropsy; a saddler, aged 76, of meningitis; a female, aged 76, of bronchitis; a wood-splitter, aged 76, of pneumonia; an artist and a female, each aged 77, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 77, of pneumonia; a groom, aged 77, of ulceration of the stomach; a female domestic servant, aged 78, of chronic bronchitis; a female, aged 79, of paralysis and congestion of the lungs; a tailor, aged 79, of chronic bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 80, of diarrhoea; a gardener, aged 81, of dropsy; a female, aged 85, of chronic bronchitis; a cabinet-maker, aged 81, a veterinary surgeon, aged 82, a widow, aged 87, a housekeeper, aged 87, and a laborer, aged 91, of old age.

Twenty-three deaths were due to external causes, of which 17 were set down to accident, 1 to manslaughter, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A fellmonger, aged 48, was killed by a boiler explosion; a coachman, aged 48, died of injuries received by a fall from an omnibus; a contractor, aged 52, was killed by being thrown from a buggy; a laborer, aged 52, had his skull fractured by the fall of a piece of timber; a blacksmith, aged 53, was killed by a cart wheel passing over him; a publican, aged 54, and a stonemason, aged 61, by trains passing over them; a farmer, aged 57, had his neck dislocated by the upsetting of a dray; a butcher, aged 25, died of a gunshot wound; a bootmaker, aged 64, was accidentally poisoned by an overdose of laudanum; a female child, aged 5, two male children, aged 12 and 13 respectively, a man cook, aged 23, a laborer, aged 31, and a fireman, aged 33, were drowned; and a male infant, aged 6 days, was suffocated in bed. The case of manslaughter was that of a newly-born male infant, who died of hæmorrhage of the navel string, caused by the mother. Of the suicidal deaths, a ship's watchman, aged 58, shot himself; a carpenter, aged 60, poisoned himself with laudanum; a dealer, aged 50, drowned himself; and a carrier, aged 29, hanged himself; a laborer, aged 21, died of fracture of the skull, caused by jumping from a balcony.

Eighty-six deaths, or 15 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—30 in the Melbourne Hospital, 6 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 4 in the Children's Hospital, 10 in the Lying-in Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 2 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 308, of which 170, or 55 per cent., were of males, and 138, or 45 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 222 were under one year of age, 46 were between one and two, 20 were between two and three, 12 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 278. Of these, 159, or 57 per cent., were males, and 119, or 43 per cent., were females; 20 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 19 were between twenty and twenty-five, 15 were between twenty-five and thirty, 19 were between thirty and thirty-five, 21 were between thirty-five and forty, 15 were between forty and forty-five, 23 were between forty-five and fifty, 22 were between fifty and fifty-five, 21 were between fifty-five and sixty, 23 were between sixty and sixty-five, 16 were between sixty-five and seventy, 21 were between seventy and seventy-five, 7 were between seventy-five and eighty, 8 were upwards of eighty, and the age of 1 was unspecified.

As compared with the previous month, deaths from zymotic diseases increased from 120 to 132. Under this head deaths from diarrhoea rose from 6 to 50, but deaths from measles, fell from 56 to 34. Deaths from constitutional diseases fell from 112 to 88, chiefly accounted for by deaths from phthisis having decreased from 76 to 55. Deaths from developmental diseases rose from 36 to 87, the increase being in great part attributable to deaths from old age, which rose from 6 to 16, and to deaths from atrophy and debility, which rose from 17 to 48.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All orders for interment to be given at the office of the Secretary. Such notice to be given between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. the day previous.
2. All charges must be paid when the orders are given, before the ground or vault is opened.
3. Until otherwise ordered the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months.
4. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones, to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
5. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
6. Any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a

vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his representatives for ever.

7. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the secretary to the trustees. A certificate of permission in the form set out in the Schedule A will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the proper charges.

8. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in this cemetery on a certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the friends and relatives of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

9. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

10. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.

11. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

12. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

13. A plan of every monument and tombstone proposed to be erected and placed shall be exhibited to the said trustees before permission for the erection thereof is given, and the said trustees shall be at liberty to withhold such permission and prevent the erection of any monument or tombstone which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument or tombstone which may be proposed to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having regard to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.

14. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

15. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the secretary's office, and may be inspected, and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.

16. By *The Cemeteries Statute 1864* any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy or do or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, in the said cemetery, will be guilty of a misdemeanour, and, being convicted thereof, will be liable, for every such offence, to a penalty not exceeding £20, or at the discretion of the justices to imprisonment for any period not exceeding three months; and any person who shall do or cause to be done any injury to any such monument, vault, or tombstone, building, erection, railing, tree, shrubbery, or plant, whether the same shall have been done wilfully or wantonly or otherwise howsoever, shall be liable to pay damages and compensation, which shall be recoverable in any court of competent jurisdiction in the colony by the trustees of the said cemetery or any person injured by such damage.

17. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations, from time to time, in these regulations.

The above rules and regulations are framed in accordance with *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, section 8.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

SEA-SIDE EXCURSION TICKETS AND TOURISTS TICKETS.

The attention of passengers is requested to the notices posted at all the stations respecting the issue, until the 31st March, of sea-side excursion tickets and of tourists tickets until the 30th April.

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR EXCURSIONS.

Holiday Excursion Tickets will be issued to and from all stations (Suburban lines excepted) from the 15th December 1884 to the 5th January 1885, both dates inclusive (Sundays excepted),

available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example.—An excursion ticket issued on the 24th December will be available till the 24th January.
